### NEEDS

Ongoing conflict and natural disaster were the key drivers of humanitarian needs during the reporting period (01 April – 30 June 2018).

Approximately 53,302 individuals displaced by conflict were in need of emergency shelter and NFI assistance mainly in Jawzjan, Faryab, Kunduz, Takhar and Badakhshan Provinces, the north and northeast regions of Afghanistan. In 46 hard to reach conflict-affected districts, families are living in precarious shelter conditions. Most of the shelters are partially damaged which do not protect the families from the elements including their privacy and safety. This is compounded with overcrowded conditions resulting to some families sharing same accommodation with their livestock. This is particularly a concern for women and girls.

All 59,136 individuals affected by mainly flash flood particularly in the northern and eastern regions were in need of NFIs. Of the 59,136 individuals affected, 19,425 individuals whose homes were completely destroyed needed emergency shelter while 39,453 individuals needed assistance to repair their damaged shelters. Moreover, 20,629 individuals displaced by drought in the western region were mostly in need of emergency shelter.

### RESPONSE

As of 01 April – 30 June, a total of 136,139 individuals including 20% men, 20% women, 30% boys and 30% girls were provided with various shelter and NFIs assistance through in-kind and cash modalities.

- 125,756 individuals supported with NFIs
- 8,037 individuals received emergency shelter including cash for rent,
- 2,346 vulnerable individuals received a variety of shelter support including the upgrading of existing makeshift or damaged shelters while a few were supported to construct transitional shelters.

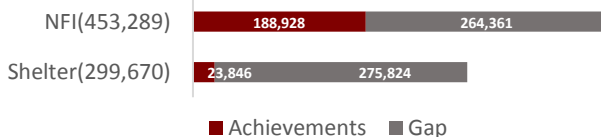
Approximately 22,356 individuals received additional shelter and NFIs assistance.

As of 01 January – 30 June 2018, the cluster assisted a total of 188,928 individuals with NFI assistance and 23,846 individuals for shelter assistance against the total targets for 2018.

### GAPS / CHALLENGES

The cluster is only 18% funded leaving an 82% gap of its total requirements for 2018. Limited funding is a major challenge impacting response to critical shelter needs. A number of vulnerable families continued to live in their partially damaged/self-made makeshift shelters. Moreover, the plans to support transitional shelter solutions to create a safer and dignified living conditions for vulnerable families including female headed households are far from being achieved.

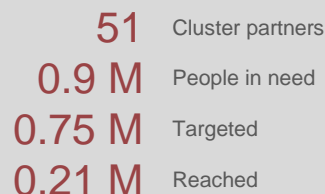

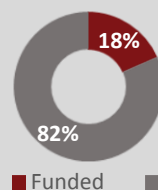
