

## Shelter/NFI Cluster Coordination Meeting, Dahuk

Agenda Item	Key Points	Actions
Winter	<p><b>General</b>            It was reconfirmed again that caravans meaning the physical structures, roofs, floors are the responsibility of the IDPs. IDPs should not touch electrical connections, wires, etc.            Camp Managers need to deal with these complaints directly with IDPs.</p> <p>The cluster is collecting referrals for winter cases and will attempt to find partners to address the needs.</p> <p><b>Camps</b>            The Ministry of Oil has provided IDPs in camps with eight coupons. Each coupon enables families to receive 100L of <b>kerosene</b> for an amount of 15,000-20,000 IQD in addition to the transportation cost. It was reported that camps located in the North face difficulties in receiving kerosene as distribution is being conducted in two stations (Sheikhan and Faida) and they are quite far from Zakho camps.</p> <p><u>UNHCR</u> through its implementing partner Qandil, provided 8,008 IDP families in 17 IDP camps with winter core relief items (CRIs) in the Duhok Governorate. A winter CRI kit is comprised of one heating stove, two plastic sheets and two kerosene jerry-cans. In addition, UNHCR distributed complementary items; one hygiene kit and three mats per family for IDPs in Dawoudia, Bersive I, Bersive II, and Mamilian IDP camps, located the coldest geographical areas.</p> <p><b>Out of camps</b>            ICRC supported more than 600HH with cash for winter (500,000 IQD), 2 barrels of kerosene and 100 winter clothes and 100 heaters ended by end of November, 2018.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• BRHA to provide updated figures of caravans and needs.</li> <li>• UNHCR to provide Helpline Complaint Contact Number to BRHA.</li> </ul>

	<p><u>UNHCR</u> through its implementing partner Qandil and Zain telecommunication company concluded the sim-card registration events. The registered and verified IDP families living in non-camp areas will receive their winter assistance entitlement which is IQD 234,000 through Zain and Asia sim-cards.</p> <p>Cash for winter support (234,000 IQD/HH) for IDPs OoC is ongoing till end of February.</p> <p><u>UNICEF</u>: Distribution of winter clothes for kids under 14 is ongoing in: Bajed Kandala 1 and 2, Bersive 1 &amp; 2, Chamishko, Rawanga, Khanke and Mamilian Camps.</p> <p>PWJ: 600 L/shift of kerosene for schools in camps and Amedi area. 495 HH host community in Zakho, Akre and Dohuk center were supported.</p>	
Flood Response	<p><b>Contingency Planning</b> In camps UNHCR and MoMD take the lead to respond with all SNFI activities.</p> <p>Out of Camps should be addressed in the following order:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) MoMD and RC/RC</li> <li>2) Partners</li> <li>3) UNHCR as PoLR</li> </ol> <p>Partners were asked to check whether they can provide support and feedback to the cluster.</p>	
Camps	<p><b>Camps</b> <u>Bajet Kandala</u> 162 communal tents with an area of 72m2 are hosting 476 families (2,482 individuals). 45 families (244 individuals) living in kitchens and self-constructed storages around the communal tents. Tents were put up in 2014, camp management mentioned that plastic sheets were provided in 2017.</p> <p>Medair has decided not to intervene due to shortage of time, no funding guaranteed and there was no final decision on what could be the best way to solve the issue.</p> <p><u>MoMD tents</u> All MoMD tents available to BCF have been installed in Khazer M1 and Ashti. The Cluster is checking whether more stock is available.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PWJ in coordination with UNHCR to run assessments and propose solutions in the summer.</li> </ul>

	Shelter Activities with Kurds to be finalized by the end of January and handed over to BRHA. New partner for shelter is now <u>ACTED</u> .	
Out of camps	Medair: securing NFI in kind for IDPs in Kharababke – Zakho, 725 kits
