Agenda Item	Key Points	Actions
Winter	<p>General</p> <p>It was reconfirmed again that caravans meaning the physical structures, roofs, floors are the responsibility of the IDPs. IDPs should not touch electrical connections, wires, etc.</p> <p>Camp Managers need to deal with these complaints directly with IDPs. BRHA has provided information on caravan needs, as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 73 in Mamrashan in need of roof repair - 200 in Mamrashan in need of floor repair - 300 in Dawoudia in need of floor repair (partial) - 500 in Rawanga in need of floor repair 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNHCR to provide plastic sheeting (X2 per caravan) for the 73 caravans in Mamrashan to stop leakage, as a temporary measure. GRC to implement.
	<p>Camps</p> <p>The Ministry of Oil has provided IDPs in camps with eight coupons. Each coupon enables families to receive 100L of kerosene for an amount of 15,000-20,000 IQD in addition to the transportation cost. It was reported that camps located in the North face difficulties in receiving kerosene as distribution is being conducted in two stations (Sheikhan and Faida) and they are quite far from Zakho camps.</p> <p>The SNFI cluster has raised all concerns linked to kerosene distribution (distance, refusal at distribution points, etc.) with senior management and MoMD.</p> <p>It was reported that the Garmawa camp has not received any kerosene.</p> <p>UNHCR raised the issue of refilling fire extinguishers in camps. Additionally, an update on winter support was given: 8,008 IDPs in camps assisted with winter CRI, plus additional 925 cases referred by BRHA for a second round of distribution.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SNFI cluster to check with MoMD and camp management and follow up on all kerosene issues and in particular the Garmawa one. Access is also a challenge, request for in-kind distribution. • Some residents of Sharya camp were told at the distribution point that out of camp IDPs are being prioritised. UNHCR and CCCM Cluster are following up.

	<p>Out of camps</p> <p>UNHCR through its implementing partner Qandil and Zain telecommunication company is disbursing cash for winter. However, a number of issues emerged and there are many pending cases due to multiple SIM cards, beneficiaries giving wrong mobile numbers or general confusion as to what is the right way to access. So far, 13,500 HH have been registered.</p> <p>Cash for winter support (234,000 IQD/HH) for IDPs OoC is ongoing till end of February.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNHCR Dahuk and Qandil are following up and assisting people with technical issues in camps. • SNFI Cluster to follow up with Cash colleagues in Erbil.
Camps	<p>Camps <u>Bajet Kandala</u></p> <p>162 communal tents with an area of 72m2 are hosting 476 families (2,482 individuals). 45 families (244 individuals) living in kitchens and self-constructed storages around the communal tents. Tents were put up in 2014, camp management mentioned that plastic sheets were provided in 2017.</p> <p>A visit to the camp showed that even when plans for upgrades are made in the past, many of the residents do not want to move to family tents (less space) and apart from the flooding issue, as content with this type of tent. Most tents and frames are intact, but water is coming from underneath and from the fides during rains.</p> <p>Medair has decided not to intervene due to shortage of time, no funding guaranteed and there was no final decision on what could be the best way to solve the issue. PWJ has postponed an assessment and possible intervention for the summer. PCCR offered to upgrade the slabs for 10 of the communal tents but camp management refused.</p> <p>ACTED: AFAD tent replacement is going ahead as planned. Apart from the 1,908 tents currently occupied, the empty ones are just plots (no frames) so ACTED will have to readjust their procurement requirements. Shelter Activities with Kurds to be finalized by the end of January and handed over to BRHA. New partner for shelter in camps is now ACTED.</p> <p>UNHCR informed partners that they have SOK (Sealing-Off Kits) available for organisations to request and to be used for people living in critical shelter (abandoned or unfinished buildings).</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bajet Kandala to remain as an open point for discussion for the coming months, until a decision is found. Interested partners are encouraged to inform of their capacity to intervene. • BRHA has provided a BoQ of USD 89,000 for partners to consider, which includes raising the slabs and extending the open channel around the communal tents, as a proposed solution.

Out of camps	Medair: securing NFI for IDPs in Kharab Babke (Zakho), 725 kits. SNFI advised Medair to consider using the updated CWG vulnerability tool to identify recipient families and use voucher modality. Medair is going to conduct a market assessment in the district.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This project is still in the initial phase: Medair to keep BRHA and SNFI updated on the progress.
Updates from National Cluster	SNFI cluster continues to advocate for critical MoMD tent replacement with senior management and donors.
