Winter	<p>General</p> <p>It was reconfirmed again that caravans meaning the physical structures, roofs, floors are the responsibility of the IDPs. IDPs should not touch electrical connections, wires, etc.</p> <p>Camp Managers need to deal with these complaints directly with IDPs. BRHA has provided information on caravan needs, as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 73 in Mamrashan in need of roof repair (UNHCR provided plastic sheeting (X2 per caravan) to stop leakage, as a temporary measure. - 200 in Mamrashan in need of floor repair - 300 in Dawoudia in need of floor repair (partial) - 500 in Rawanga in need of floor repair <p>Camps</p> <p>Issues were observed in Garmawa and Shariya IDP camps regarding the distribution of kerosene coupons, where coupons were not provided to a number of families for not owning PDS cards. The CCCM Cluster raised the issue to the directorate of public distribution system (PDS) in the Duhok Governorate who are in contact with the PDS directorate in Ninewa. In order for families to receive coupons, civil documents are required. In this regard, all the 26 families in addition to families with new born cases in Shariya IDP camp are referred to Harikar by UNHCR's protection unit to be provided with the required legal assistance.</p> <p>The SNFI cluster has raised all concerns linked to kerosene distribution (distance, refusal at distribution points, etc.) with senior management and MoMD.</p> <p>BRHA: MoMD started distributing 50L of kerosene in IDP camps in March. The distribution has started in camps located in the North and will be continued to cover the rest of the camps.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Camp managers to use the CCCM Cluster tool to provide updates on kerosene distribution. • The final winter report to be shared by SNFI Cluster with partners

	<p>Out of camps</p> <p>UNHCR has requested Zain Telecommunication Company to provide cash to 13,800 IDP families and the cash out process has started.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNHCR with Qandil to follow up with technical issues related to the winter cash intervention program.
Camps	<p>Camps</p> <p><u>Bajet Kandala</u></p> <p>162 communal tents with an area of 72m2 are hosting 476 families (2,482 individuals). 45 families (244 individuals) living in kitchens and self-constructed storages around the communal tents. Tents were put up in 2014, camp management mentioned that plastic sheets were provided in 2017.</p> <p>A visit to the camp showed that even when plans for upgrades are made in the past, many of the residents do not want to move to family tents (less space) and apart from the flooding issue, as content with this type of tent. Most tents and frames are intact, but water is coming from underneath and from the fides during rains.</p> <p>Medair has decided not to intervene due to shortage of time, no funding guaranteed and there was no final decision on what could be the best way to solve the issue. PWJ has postponed an assessment and possible intervention for the summer. PCCR offered to upgrade the slabs for 10 of the communal tents but camp management refused.</p> <p>PWJ reported that they are waiting for Asphalt factories to be open in order to start with the construction of speed bumps on the main road between Bajed Kandala I and II camps. this project will take place following continuous advocacy by the Shelter and CCCM Clusters, as there have been a number of car accidents on the main road that have caused eight fatalities from the IDP community. In addition, PWJ is currently installing lighting on the main road. This impact of the speed bumps and lighting will be monitored by the CCCM Cluster to determine</p> <p>The Shelter/NFI Cluster conducted filed visits to five MoMD IDP camps in the Duhok Governorate to observe the statues of shelter and infrastructure in these camps. The Shelter-NFI Cluster mentioned that through these visits it was found out that 70% of these tents were in a good condition, however, there were issues of water leakage into the tents from underneath the tents. The tents and the surroundings are on the same level which causes water leakage.</p> <p>ACTED: working on the tent replacement project in Bersive 1 and Shariya IDP camps in the Duhok Governorate. ACTED is in the process of finalizing the technical specification for 1,809 tents for Bersive 1</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bajet Kandala to remain as an open point for discussion for the coming months, until a decision is found. Interested partners are encouraged to inform of their capacity to intervene. • PWJ to share the progress of their intervention in Bajet Kandala camps • The Shelter-NFI Cluster to share the most updated figures of the required MoMD tents to be replaced.

	<p>camp and 4,000 tents for Shariya camp. The potential specifications were shared with the Shelter-NFI Cluster and will be shared with BRHA for final approval. ACTED mentioned that 1,800 tent covers will be provided along with 100 frames and covers for Bersive I camp.</p> <p>UNICEF concluded the distribution of winter clothes targeting ten IDP camps including Sinjar Mountain. Over 15,000 children aged from zero to 14 years old benefitted from this distribution. The camps include Bersive 1, Bersive 2, Chammishku, Darkar, Shariya, Khanke, Bajed Kandala 1, Bajed Kandala 2, Rwanga, Mamilian, and Sheikhan IDP camps.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ACTED to provide feedback once the Technical Specifications are approved
Out of camps	<p>Medair: conducting house-to-house assessments for IDP families living in Khrababke non-camp area in Zakho District, using the vulnerability assessment tool that was developed by the cash working group. Following the assessment, eligible families will be provided with vouchers to receive basic NFI kits.</p> <p>CRS concluded the distribution of cash for winter for NFI in Shairya and Seje non-camp areas. Where IDPs and the host community families received 200 USD cash.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CRS to send an email to SNFI and request areas with gaps and needs to be provided with assistance.
Updates from National Cluster	SNFI cluster continues to advocate for critical MoMD tent replacement with senior management and donors.	
AOB	<p>The Shelter-NFI Cluster does not have any plans for Summarization assistance under HRP.
