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Aleppo: NFI sector partners distributing NFIs to the IDPs in the north of Aleppo city.

GOPA in cooperation with OCHA distributed non-food items including clothes, shoes and blankets to the IDP families in Tall Refaat, north of Aleppo city.

MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS

- Winterization Plan Update:** The sector partners have distributed winter items during the winter season from September 2018 till end of March 2019. Eight sector partners shared their winter plan (AAH, Caritas, GOPA, RSRP, SIF, UNHCR, UNICEF and UNRWA) and eight sector partners (AAH, Caritas, GOPA, RSRP, SIF, UNHCR, UNICEF and UNRWA) have distributed different winterization items. The total target for 2018-19 winterization was 1.6 million people however we reached over 1.7 individuals who have been assisted with the winter items until the end of March 2019 which marks the end of the winter season.
- Al Hol Emergency:** Since December 2018, More than 18,000 NFI kits and winter clothing kits have been distributed to people in need in Al Hol camp and some 5,000 solar lamps are planned for future distribution. Future arrivals will continue to receive basic non-food items; including mattresses, blankets, solar lamps, and boots.
- Al Rukban:** 3,600 individuals have left Rukban camp to Homs, NFI sector partners are releasing items and is in contact with SARC on daily basis to release additional needed assistance. UNHCR is providing items per individual's needs including blankets, mattresses, solar lamps, kitchen set, jerry cans, plastic sheets, sleeping bags, and sleeping mats, male and female jackets. And our partners will continue to support SARC on a needs-basis.
- Manbij Convoy:** On 7 March, 2019 a mission to Manbij launched, NFI was one of the priority needs in this mission, especially in the eastern neighborhoods of Menbij City, where there are 6,233 vulnerable IDP families. IDP families need Jerry cans or water tanks due to the lack of clean water storage resources. The NFI sector partners delivered the following NFIs during this mission: 10,000 Blankets, 2,000 Plastic sheets, 4,000 IKEA Mattress, and 2,000 Winter Clothing kits.

► GAPS AND CHALLENGES

- Based on last year NFI Post Distribution Monitoring, a limited number of NFIs, poor NFI quality including distribution of damaged items (i.e. broken solar lamps, or wet mattresses), and unorganized distribution are the top distribution issues that beneficiaries confronted with. Other reported distribution challenges include unequal distribution, delayed distribution of seasonal items, far distribution point, and non-adherence to minimum standards of distribution point.
- Access and safety are the key challenges in some parts of the country as well as partner capacity and heavy processes along with funding constraints.
- Lack of actual data on distribution recipients prevents the sector to better measure the actual reached and served beneficiaries.
- Lack of income-generating activities to provide the necessary financial means continues to hamper access to basic household items among the most vulnerable population in need.
- Limited participation of sector members affects coordination and the overall sectorial reach.
- Lack of reliable consolidated information for interagency convoy reach affects the sector's ability to determine the extent and impact of its convoy contribution.
- Opportunities for systematic field-based data collection remain very limited due to access or authorization restrictions, resulting in incomplete needs analysis in some areas.

CRISIS BACKGROUND: The crisis in Syrian Arab Republic that started in March 2011 has transformed into a complex emergency that has displaced around 6.2 million people in various parts of the country. As per the 2019 Humanitarian Needs Overview, around 11.7 million people are in need of humanitarian assistance of which around 5.4 million people are in need of NFI support and other multi-sectorial assistance as they continue to struggle in an unsafe and uncertain environment. The degree of resilience and positive coping mechanism of the affected population have gradually reduced due to the protracted nature of the hostilities. Purchasing power and the ability to provide for their basic household needs have decreased due to economic recession that left many people unemployed and the prospect of accessing essential household items has also declined due to limited access in some areas.

REBUILD SYRIA RECONSTRUCTION PROGRAM "RSRP"

"WARMTH HAS FINALLY RETURNED TO OUR FAMILY"

Saeed, a loving father of five children (Mohammed, Mohanad, Oma, Aya and Heba) and his wife were forced to flee their home in Al-Baghouz village/Deir-ez-Zor and face the cruelty of an abrupt displacement.

"We had to walk many kilometers in the dark and under the heavy shooting. We couldn't take anything with us but the clothes we were wearing that day and we couldn't rest until we arrived to Al-Bukamal. There we stayed in an abandoned and unfinished building since it was our only choice", Saeed told RSRP in an interview. "I lost my mother throughout this ruthless journey, she couldn't come with us", he added filled with sorrow and agony.

After arriving to Al-Bukamal, Saeed heard about the family registration for the distribution of warm winter clothes and decided to participate in the program. He provided the needed information and received winter clothes for his entire family. They were one of the 9.915 families who have been supported by our winterization campaign. This family and all the other selected beneficiaries of the project truly needed and deserved the support to overcome the hardship and suffering caused by the cold Syrian winter. Warmth has finally found a place in Deir-ez-Zor.

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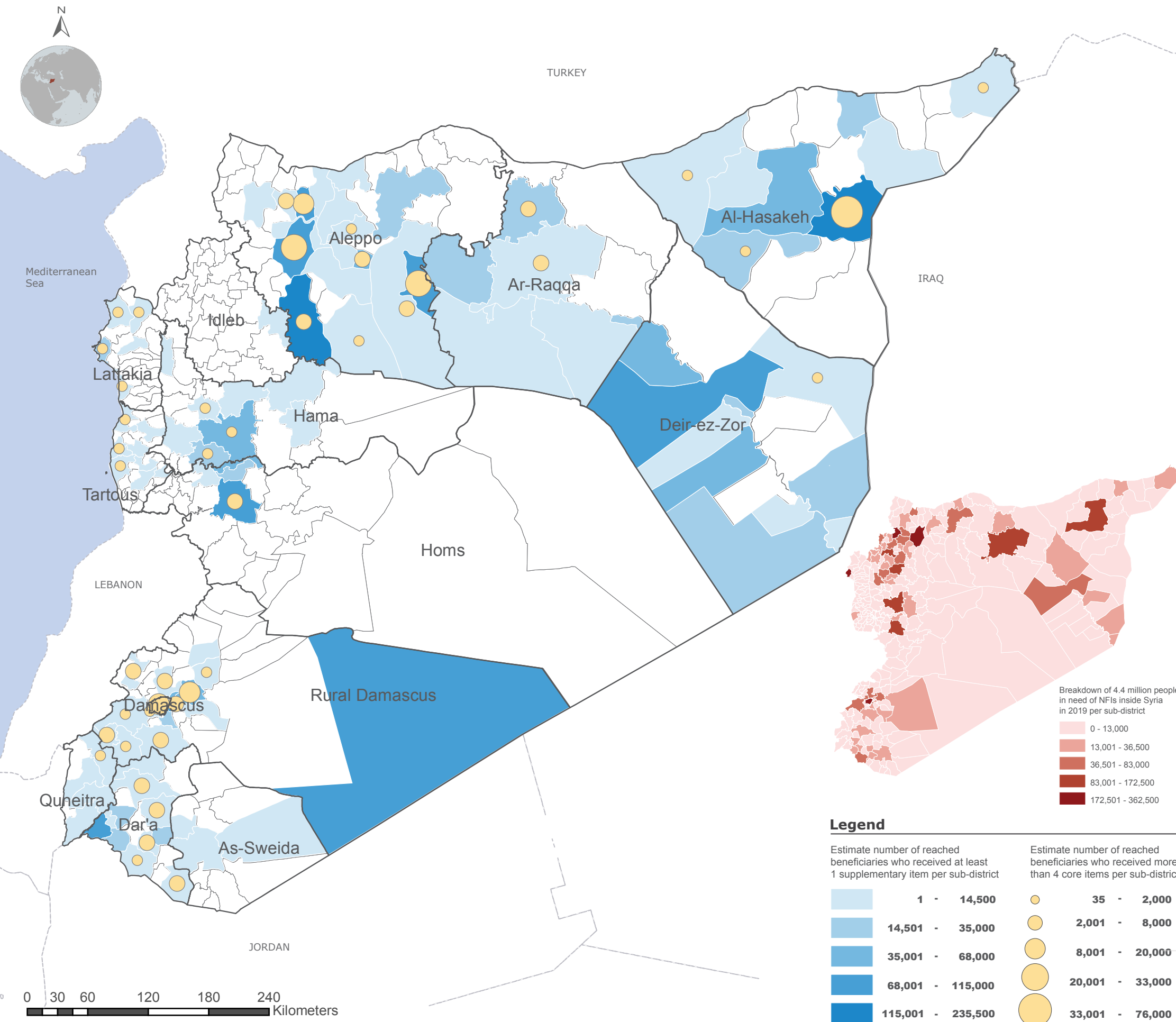

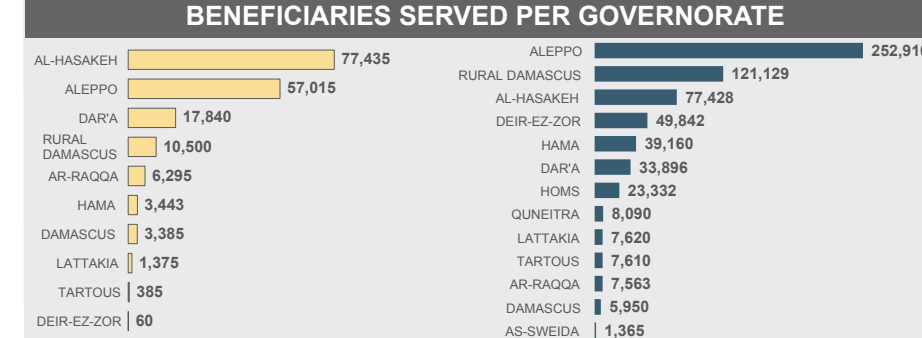

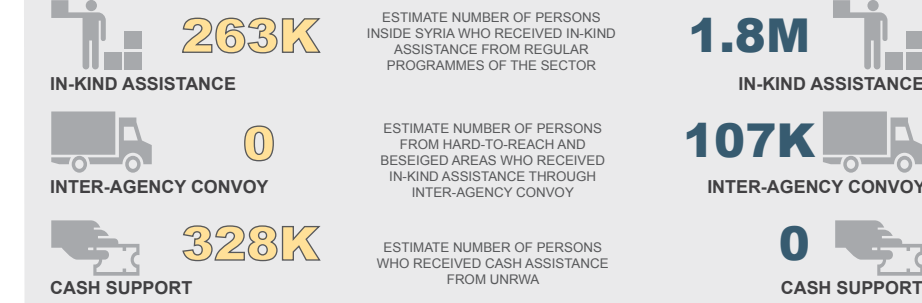
BENEFICIARIES SERVED



BENEFICIARIES SERVED PER GOVERNORATE

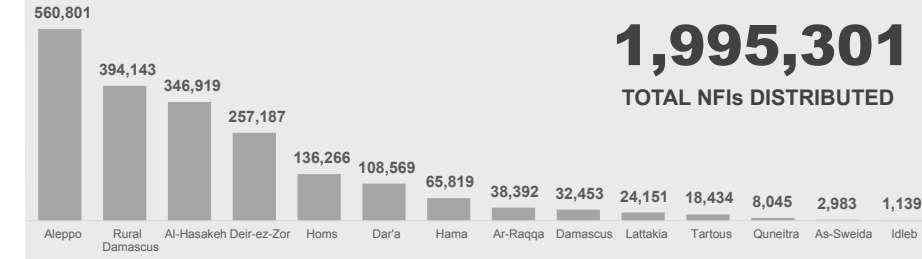


BENEFICIARIES SERVED BY TYPE OF SUPPORT

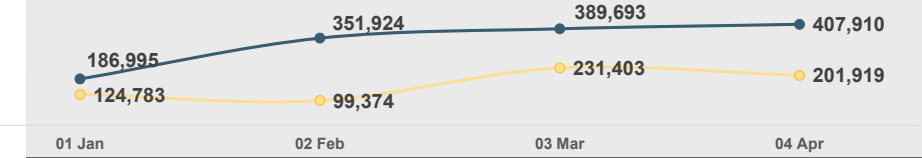
TOTAL NFI DISTRIBUTED PER GOVERNORATE

TOTAL NFI DISTRIBUTION PER MONTH



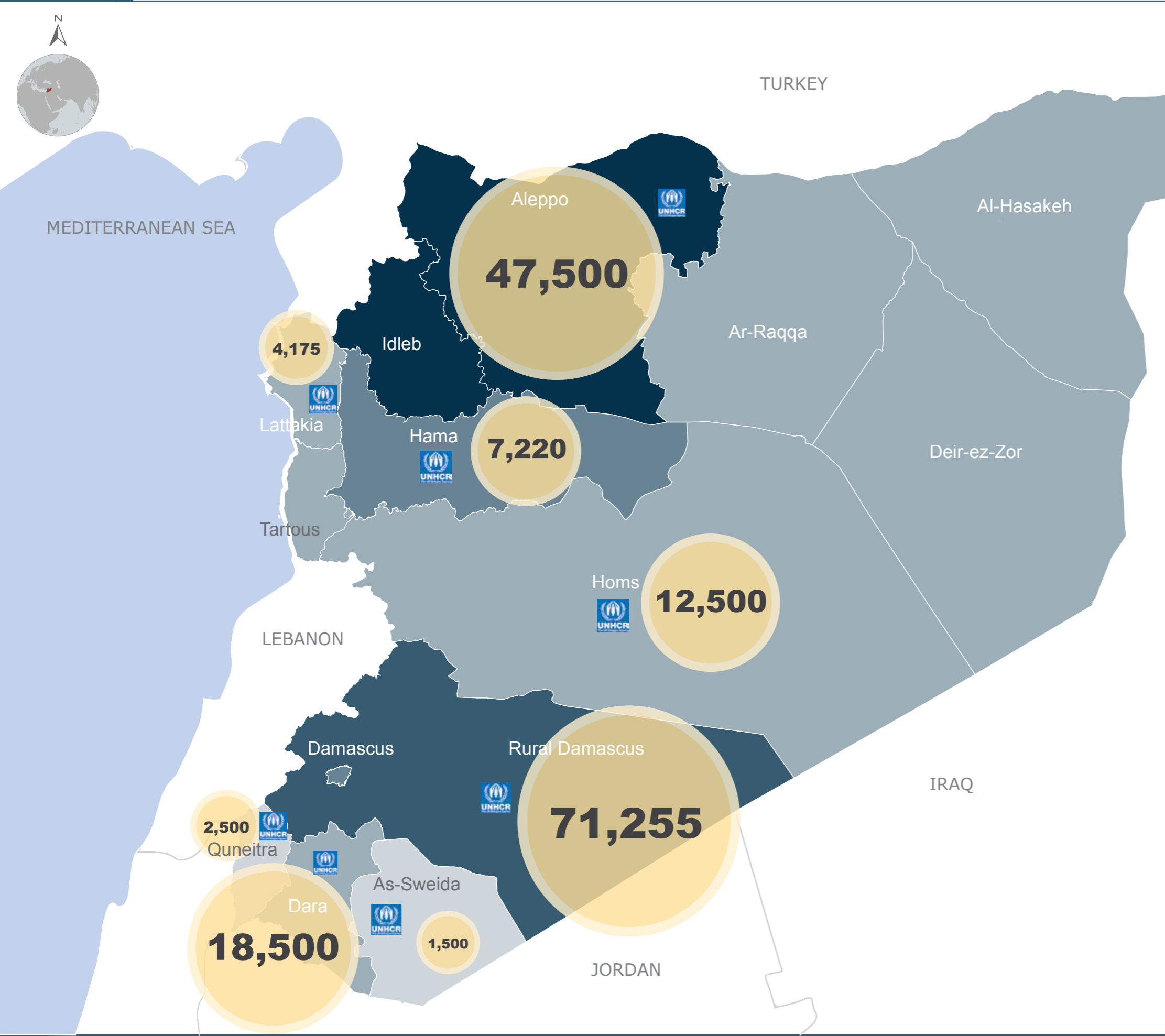

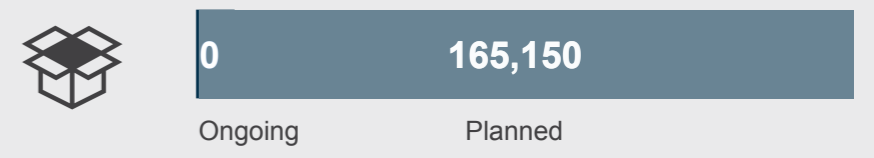

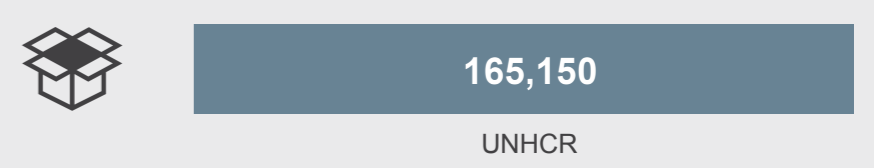
