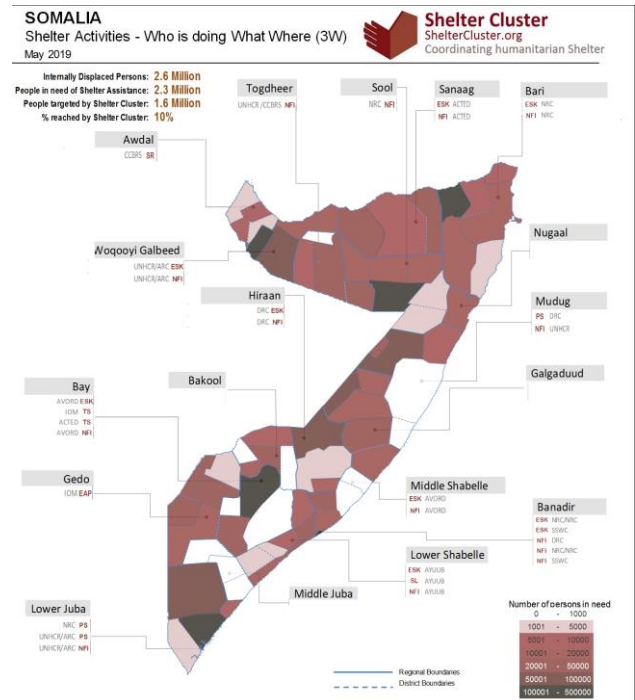




Emergency Shelters in Marka Somalia – AYUUB NGO



## CLUSTER SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- SO1:** Contribute to the protection of newly displaced people, IDPs / refugee returns / host community and those affected by natural hazards. (NFIs, ESKs)
- SO2:** Improve the living conditions and contribute to local reintegration of the protracted internally displaced persons (IDPs) and refugees returning back to their place of origin (Transitional shelters, Permanent shelters, NFIs)
- SO3:** Improve the quality of shelter assistance and ensure accountability through effective mechanisms (AAP, M&E)

## NEEDS ANALYSIS

- There are about 2.6 million of the IDPs are living in crowded settlements, without sufficient access to basic services, with poor shelter conditions that raise protection and health concerns. They remain in need of improved Shelter and NFIs support.
- The IDPs have limited access to livelihood opportunities and limited opportunities for durable solutions.
- New displacements are happening due to drought and conflict.

## GAPS / CHALLENGES

- There limited shelter/NFI stocks available that is not enough to respond to new displacements.
- As of May 2019, the Shelter Cluster is seriously underfunded that has impacted the ability of cluster partners to deliver the life-saving shelter/NFI assistance.
- Eviction of IDPs undermines the humanitarian services invested in the sites.

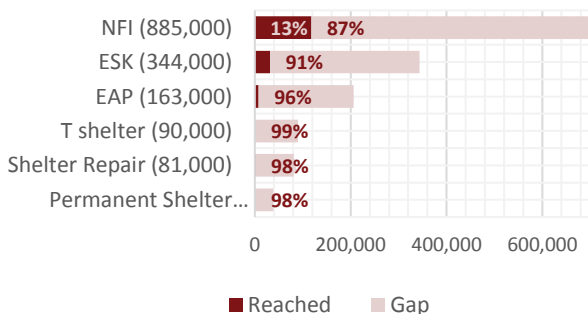
## RESPONSE

During the month of May 2019, the Shelter and NFI Cluster partners assisted:

- 21,145 persons with NFI kits consisting of plastic sheets, solar lamp, blankets, jerry cans, sleeping mats and kitchen sets.
- 3,104 persons were assisted with emergency shelter kit.

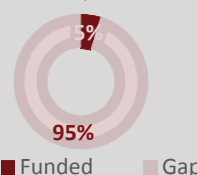

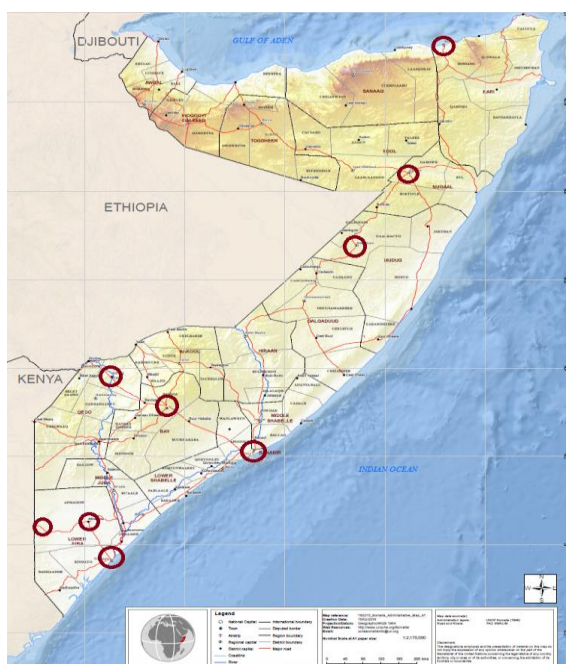
## IDP RELOCATION BRIEF

There 2.6 million people are internally displaced in Somalia as a result of drought, conflict, flooding and other reasons. The majority of the IDPs have self-settled in informal private IDP settlements and are identified as the poorest and most vulnerable. In some cases IDPs are evicted multiple times.

Local authorities are struggling to cope with increasing numbers of IDPs especially in urban areas. In the past years, several district and state authorities have allocated public land for displaced populations in order to improve service delivery and living conditions and to mitigate the negative effects associated with private IDP sites such as gatekeepers and evictions.



Local authorities have allocated land for IDPs settlements in Bossaso, Garowe, Galkayo, Dollow, Baidoa, Mogadishu, Kismayo, Afmadhow and Dhobley.

In **these locations**, permanent shelters have been provided to the relocated IDPs in a planned way.



However, low funding for the shelter Cluster has restricted the ability of Shelter partners to provide safe and dignified living conditions for the displaced people who are not able to return to their places of origin.
