0- Update from Wash Cluster in Buzi		
<p>UNICEF emphasised the need of collaboration with CCCM colleagues as without some minimal road infrastructure, they could not access the camps.</p> <p>Oxfam will soon stop the water trucking in Buzi Sede as is very expensive, in the meanwhile they are repairing water points.</p> <p>Wash Cluster stressed the lack of shelter support in Buzi Sede, all neighbourhoods.</p>		
1. Presentation: why Shelter Cluster in Buzi	Action	Responsible
<p>Shelter Cluster informed about the critical shelter needs unmet in Buzi district after the early emergency, when more partners were involved.</p> <p>Shelter Cluster asked organisations working in Buzi in different sectors than shelter (Save the Children, Oxfam, Food for the Hungry) if they could consider working in Shelter.</p> <p><b>Out of the meeting (19/07/2019), during the local government weekly meeting on Friday 7AM, it was reported that some families are sleeping outside of the shelter in order to make a fire to deal with the cold temperatures inside the tarps and the lack of blankets.</b></p>	To consider working in shelter projects.	Partners from other sectors.
<p>Shelter Cluster is currently working with local government (Administradora and SPDI) to make a priority list of areas to support both families in the resettlement sites and families that were not relocated.</p> <p>SC shared with partners the DRAFT and there was a general agreement on the priorities, especially Estaquinha and Buzi Sede.</p> <p><b>From the meeting (18/07/2019), priority list to start on the resettlement sites:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Estaquinha Machedmedje</li> <li>2. Estaquinha Sede</li> <li>3. Estaquinha Begaja + Inajou.</li> <li>4. Guara Guara + Bandua</li> </ol> <p><b>From the meeting (18/07/2019), priority list for the families not relocated:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>Guara guara, 2038 HH</b> (in order to solve the rising tensions between the families resettled and the host community)</li> <li>2. <b>Chunga, 190HH</b> (small remote community that didn't receive any support, they are living without any shelter)</li> <li>3. <b>Bairro de Massane in Buzi Sede</b> (apparently is the only neighbourhood that didn't receive support from Food for the Hungry or IFRC. Local government said they will assess the community and give result within 15 days but is estimated at 200 HH)</li> <li>4. <b>Estanquinha, priority Machedmedje.</b> Oxfam staff in the field indicated they are in very basic conditions. We know CICR was distributing shelter kits in Estanquinha, but not sure if in Machedmedje.</li> </ol>	Finish the list	SC roaming coordinator

<p>IOM confirmed they will be covering shelter needs in all the resettlement sites:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• GUARA GUARA (Masquil alto 1, Masquil alto 2 and Mussocossa)</li> <li>• BANDUA (Bandua 1, Bandua 2, Chingamidji)</li> <li>• ESTANQUINHA (Sede, Begaja, Machedmedje, Inajou)</li> </ul> <p>IOM shelter kit is composed by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ 2 tarps</li> <li>○ 2 blankets</li> <li>○ 8 wooden poles</li> <li>○ 1 tool kit</li> <li>○ Solar lamp (arriving in August)</li> </ul> <p>IOM has planned to start with Guara Guara this week and finish around 27th July, but they could be starting in Estanquinha, if this is a priority. (Out of the meeting, see above recommendation to start in Estaquinha)</p>	Inform IOM about priorities once list finalised with government.	SC roaming coordinator
Patricia (IOM) will send list of the locations where they are working to UNHCR, just to confirm that we all have the same understanding about the Resettlement Sites in Buzi district.	Send list IOM → UNHCR	Patricia IOM
UNHCR did a previous assessment in Buzi together with IOM and UNICEF, and they will send the information to Patricia IOM Shelter	Send assessment UNHCR → IOM	Aline UNHCR
CARE will not distribute in Bandua 2, as IOM is covering all the resettlements now. CARE will cover any other community outside of the resettlement sites.	SC coordinate with Melvin.	SC roaming coordinator
<p>IOM CCCM Bonifacio informed that about 672 new families will be resettled in Guara Guara coming from apparently Buzi Sede. All partners surprised about this sudden addition of families and wondering if this is a more long-term governmental strategy for resettlements.</p> <p>Out of the meeting 18/07/2019 Administradora said that some families wants to resettle in Guara Guara and government can't prevent that, but this families wont have the same treatment as the one's that were resettled for emergency reasons.</p>	Check with SDPI /Administradora	SC roaming coordinator
<p>IOM CCCM informed that they are two "new resettlement sites", Gurudja and Muchamege that were not listed, but where SDPI started to demarcate plots. World Vision are working there and for them this is not a resettlement site.</p> <p>Out of the meeting (18/07/2019), Administradora said that there is not a special regulation to decide what is a resettlement site or not, as the resettlement are done for emergency reasons. If is people in need, government with SDPI will look for a safer place and will start to demarcate plots.</p>	SC to clarify with government	SC roaming coordinator
IOM CCMM inform about 2 partners building houses in the resettlement sites that are not connected with the cluster.	Pass these 2 organisations the SC contact.	Bonifacio, IOM CCCM.
<b>3. Partners emergency projects outside of the resettlement sites.</b>	<b>Action</b>	<b>Responsible</b>
<p>UNHCR will cover, on the next 3 weeks, 3000HH outside of the resettlement sites. UNHCR kit includes only 1 tarpaulin and SC inform that the official shelter kit approved by the government include 2 tarpaulins, as is not possible to make a shelter with less than 2. Also, local government is dealing now with the problem of distributing one more tarpaulin to the families that only received one in early emergency.</p> <p>SC will coordinate with partners to try to find extra tarp to include in UNHCR distribution (for instance IOM). UNHCR will be implemented by World Vision</p>	Follow up with IOM and other partners on tarps availability.	SC roaming coordinator

<p>UNHCR shelter kit is composed by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ 1 tent/tarpaulins</li> <li>○ 1 kitchen set</li> <li>○ 4x blankets</li> <li>○ 4x sleeping mats</li> <li>○ 2x mosquito net</li> <li>○ 1 solar lamp</li> <li>○ 2 buckets</li> <li>○ 1 jerry can.</li> </ul> <p>812 families will receive a tent instead of tarpaulin.</p>		
<p>CARE will be distributing in Chicoio, where they already started assessments.</p>		
<p>IOM informed partners that they could be providing tarpaulins to cover areas that other partners have previously identified.</p>	<p>Contact IOM if is the case</p>	<p>Patricia IOM</p>
<p>WORLD VISION inform that they are distributing until 18/07 shelter kit and NFI in Inharongue for a total of 3263 HH. Inharongue was one of the priorities on the government list.</p>	<p>Inform the government</p>	<p>SC roaming coordinator</p>
<p>For general information and to avoid duplication at the emergency stage, IFRC distributed to 3788 HH in Buzi sede (only to the completely destroyed houses, the partially destroyed houses still have important needs) and some south Buzi as below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bairros (target distributions): Chiquesane, Massane, 2000, Inhabirira, Chiquesane, Macurungo, and Bandire.</li> <li>• South Buzi communities (blanket distributions): Buphita, Martinote, Muchanessa, Penha, Mandiri 1 and Mandiri 2.</li> </ul> <p>Also, Wold Vision are very active in Buzi in different sectors and a good information to avoid duplications.</p> <p><b>Shelter Cluster encourage partners to fill 4W to have updated information's and avoid duplications.
