1. Review of previous meeting action plans

Update on the status of the last action points as follows:

2. Information Management updates

Stock and Pipeline Update: The IM team provided update on how much is available in stock and pipeline as July 2019 for partners and proposed new data capturing template which tracks better than the previous tool. Partners had discussion on the proposed template. IRC proposed that the template should also capture centrally allocated stocks and pipeline. The IM team will share the template for further comment and will start using it starting from July 2019.

Returnee Gap Analysis: The IM team also briefed the participants about the returnee gap analysis. The analysis aimed to calculate the gap in terms of returnee response, by considering the following elements:

- HHs IDPs reportedly returned.
- The status of the Stock & Pipeline.
- Progress on the response, looking into 5Ws activities that reached Returnee.

The analysis highlights that 294,487 households (HH) returned and in need across Ethiopia, 225,016 returnee HHs targeted with ESNFI Kits, 201,379 returnee HHs targeted with Repair Kits, this after looking to the Returnee needs, kits' shortfall, the status of stock & pipeline and the returnee reached up to date.

FTS: The cluster's funding rate is now at 3.1M USD, slight from what is reported before, 1.8M USD. The IM team estimated around 19.3M USD as funding received up to now based on cluster's distribution (5Ws). It is also observed that some partners already uploaded on FTS. The cluster also proposed one to one communication with partners on how to upload to the website.

3. Regional and Return update

Somali region:

GU assessment for Somali region has been finalized, report will be published soon. Total of 1.05million IDPs, climate and conflict induced IDPs are affected. The number of conflicts induced IDPs expected to decline. CERF and EHF funds diverted to Daawa zone because of high number of returnees. The IDP returnees are in need of shelter responses.

Challenges: 1) IDP/Returnee Figure discrepancies, 2) Market fluctuation: partners encouraged to use cash support in Somali region.

IOM: supported 104HHs in Tuligulied with shelter kits.

East & West Wellega and Benishangul Gumuz:

Assessment report finalized and it will be published by OCHA this week. It is reported that returnees are displaced again. Multi sectoral response ESNFI, WASH, nutrition. 2190 from CERF is allocated for Wellegas

Challenges: Number of returnees in Benishangul Gumuz is high but getting data is not easy, access issue: The government not allowed to do joint targeting, Lack of infrastructure, Targeting: List is not correct, and inclusion and exclusion error is observed.

CRS: 900 ESNFI and 420 return packages are distributed.

IRC: After the discussion with Beth and OCHA, priority is given to Ito Gida woreda to support with both ESNFI kits and Return package. Initially it was planned to support Sasiga. Joint targeting at kebele and woreda level will start soon.

SCI: Team went to conduct market assessment and will share the finding.

East and West Hararge

West Hararge: IRC led the assessment

- Four woredas planned and the team added one woreda: Daru Lebu, Hawi Gudina, Miesso, Gumbi Bordode and Doba.
- IDPs in this zone are from Oromia border, Somali Border and Djibouti
- IDPs are in collective centers or in transition

Priority:

- Daru Lebu: the IDPs are in bad situation and need ESNFI and Shelter support
 - Some of the IDPs are on transit and the zonal administration planned to allocate them to Miesso and other woredas
- Hawi Gudina: their shelter is relatively good (constructed by themselves) and need ESNFI kits

Needs:

- NFI, Shelter, Seeds for agriculture, WASH, rehabilitation, job opportunity

Support provided:

- The government is distributing 5400 quintals of seeds
- Shelter construction for Hawi Gudina, Miesso and Gumbi Bordode is undergoing.
- NFI for Daro Lebu and Miesso is distributed

Challenges:

- Rainy season
- Market access: In Hawi Gudina in cash response is not recommended and Chiro, Meisso and Mechara are suitable for in cash response.

CRS: Planned to distribute 840 ESNFI kits from the RRF fund, 1700 ESNFI Kits from EHF.

IRC: will start distribution of 850 ESNFI distribute to Miesso woreda.

East Hararge:

- Four woredas assessed: Meyu, Chinaksen, Gursum and Babile
- Poor living situation of the returnees, destroyed shelter, not clean drinking water used, no agriculture and drought are observed
- Shelter, NFI, food and WASH are critically needed supports
- No Market in Meyu woreda but other woredas have accessible and near markets.
- Limited number of agencies

West Guji and Gedee:

continuous response delivery in both Gedee & West Guji zones by cluster partners, shelter re-construction and distribution of ESNFI to close-out phase one of operation response plan. Absence of land documents with targeted returnee families remains the main challenge. The cluster will share the due diligence report.

IRC: faced challenges while constructing shelter for returnees. Returnees who doesn't meet the criteria and HH with more than one wife claims for shelter construction. CRS will share a note with the cluster and raise the issue on the HLP working group meeting.

WVI: In Kercha targeting is an issue because of uncertainty of security, because of transportation issue the material purchased are of poor quality.

DRC: 2870 HHs in seven kebeles in Kercha are supported with multipurpose cash.

4. MYR, Prioritization Returnees and IDPs

The cluster coordinator briefed the member of the cluster on Mid-Year Review and the New Shelter NFI Prioritization Criteria (see the Shelter NFI Prioritization annexed), particularly 1) targeting Returnees and IDPs, 2) shelter responses to the IDPs, and 3) costing guidance. In regarded of targeting Returnees and IDPs, the coordinator mentioned that 1) IDPs and returnees should be addressed as displaced affected population, 2) the number of IDPs that do not returned-OCHA provided the information, and 3) additional IDPs should be included in planning, considering election and tension in the country. In regarded of shelter responses to the IDPs, the coordinator mentioned that 1) the response activities with the host community is going to be rental support and extend the house or repair, 2) look at the situation they are living in tailor the response, 3) to support community integration support rehabilitation of infrastructure other than health posts and schools, and 4) communal center where IDPs resides. In addition, the coordinator also mentioned 1) the 25%

operation and support cost/HHs is revised to 38%, and the Host community calculation support will be maintained between 10 and 15% and will be based assessment report. The assignment of zones and woredas needs revision. GOAL has already existence in Hawi Gudina and IRC is already been in Meisso. Partners needs to revise the assignment again.
