2. Information Management updates

Submission of 5Ws, Stock and Pipeline Update: The IM team provided update on the submission of monthly reports. All partners successfully met the deadline and submitted all the data.

FTS: The cluster's funding rate is now at 4.5M USD, no change from what is reported in the last CCM. The IM team encouraged partners to upload all 2019 funding to the website. It is also proposed that to support partners on using excel template or uploading to a website, if any. Partners were asked if there were challenges faced for discussion.

4. MYR 2019 summary and Prioritization

a. MYR 2019

For MYR 2019, 3.2 M people are in need and the cluster targeted 2.4M which includes returnees, conflict IDPs, climate induced IDPs, affected host communities and assumption of 25% of IDPs will return to their place of origin. The support will include full and partial shelter repair kits, NFI kits, ESNFI kits, rental support, communal shelter and trainings. The requested funding is 80M which was less from what was requested at the beginning of the year (112M). Due to market and local currency fluctuation, the SAG revised the operation cost to 38% for in-kind distribution while maintaining the 25% for Shelter/NFI through cash.

b. Prioritization

1st Priority: The cluster assumed 35% of houses in returning areas are completely damaged, this is based on DTM 17 which indicates 55% and loss and damage assessments from West Guji/ Gedeo and East Wellega and West Wellega. Households living outside in open areas, totally damaged houses, sheltering in community or with other families are enveloped in this category a total of 114,405 HHs are categorized under priority one.

2nd Priority: The cluster assumed 25 % of houses in returning areas are partially damaged, this is based on DTM 17 which indicates 37% and loss and damage assessments from West Guji/ Gedeo and East Wellega and West Wellega. HH living in partially damaged houses lays in this category and a total of 85,059 HHs are categorized under 2nd priority.

5. Regional and Return update

West Guji and Gedee:

Because of the security issue in West Guji

Due to security **GOAL** suspended implementations in Gelana and some kebeles in Abaya as of August 6. It also affected RRF funding.

CRS: Suspended implementation in Kercha

Gedee: Joint targeting exercise and registration of IDPs is completed but it excludes 40,000 IDPs in the zone. Partners discussed on the common approach they need to follow to address this issue.

IRC experience in East and West Wellega is having Intensive discussion with the region to include the excluded. They establish committee which consists technical experts rather than the government officials.

Gaps and challenges: 1) Partners are not following the Operation Plan, instead of following the cluster's guidance's some partners followed DRMOs 2) Loss and Damage Information coming from the woredas has been a challenge 3) Lack of proper reporting form the partners 4) Still no access to IDPs

IOM: Distribution of 500 Full ESNFI kits in Gedee in three locations, Targeting and prioritization is ongoing. Marketing assessment in Gedee is completed and planned to reach 600 HHs.

East & West Wellega:

Unconfirm reports indicates that around 14,000 IDPs in West Wollega and 3,000 in East Wollega are displaced from areas of return in Kamashi and border woredas of Wellegas. 700 families sent back to Oromia from Benishangul Gumuz are in East Wellega, The BGR authorities stated that they do not have land or ownership of lands as such they are belong to BGR.

IOM: distribution for 1400 HHs is on going and did cash for rent assessment

NRC: 1300 Full ESNFI kit distribution in ODA

Challenges: 1) Road access problem in Kemashi zone is observed. 2) Exclusion of IDPs is still a challenge.

East and West Hararge

In East Hararge activation of Cluster coordination was completed. There was good attendance of government officials. Gap analysis for East Hararge was conducted based on the figures from zonal government. Significant gap was observed in Meyu, Deder and Chnaksen woredas and there is duplication of effort in Babile. There is a duplication of ESNFI kits and WASH NFI kits, harmonization of NFI kits with WASH is recommended. TWiG in East and West Hararge was established however, there is a lack of technical staffs to participate and contribute when developing a standard kit.

6. Standardization of Shelter Responses and TWiG

TWiG: Established in West Guji and Geddo. Responsible for chairing and co-chairing the TWiG meetings was discussed it is recommended that national NGO should co-chair the meetings. Draft schedule will be shared by Grema.

Standardization: the standardization factors local practice, material availability, cultural practice in particular areas and cost of materials are considered. Different scenarios like if only the roof is damaged, it is considered as partial damage and some or all parts of the wall damaged considered as full damage. The SOP considered all populations including extremely vulnerable population. With limited resources and with high number of returnees it will not be feasible to give the whole package for some while leaving out the rest of the returnees.

The price of materials is also standardized: The cost of completely damaged houses constructed using local material is USD 422, partially damaged constructed using Local material is USD 200.

IOM: Market assessments from different areas (cost of each cost) and labor cost should also be considered. It will help partners to choose their interventions whether to implement cash-based interventions or in-kind support.

Challenge: Lack of skilled expertise.

7. Partners Update

ZOA:

- 1591 HHs are supported with cash for ESNFI kits in Hudet and Moyale. 3200 birr per household is distributed.
- Secured two proposals to support IDP and returnees in Moyale and Hudet.
- Conducting PDM

IOM:

- 500 HHs supported in Gedeo zone in three locations
- Targeting and prioritization is on-going
- 600 HHs planned to reach in East and West Wellega. Market assessment is completed.
- 300 HHs in East Wellega and 300 HHs in West wellega were supported with cash for rent
- 100 HHs supported with partial shelter construction
- 300 Partial kits distributed in West Guji
- 500 kits distributed in Gedeo

CRS:

- Will share PDM reports

SP:

- No shelter activities. Opening in west Guji.

GOAL:

- 1000 HHs in Yaso are supported with UNHCR kits
- Support in Haro Limu is postponed
- Planned 100 Shelter construction in West Guji and Gedeo (50 in Yirgachefe and 50 in Gelana)
- RRF funding approved to support 1590 HH in Gedeo zone in Kercha, Gelana and Gedeb woreda

ERCS:

- Plan to support 500 HH in North Gondar
- 300,000 individuals affected by flood in South west Shoa, because of huge number of affected persons ERCS can't to reach all
- Planned to reach 2000 HHs in Arsi Sude with partial kits
- 292 partial kits distributed in Benishangul Gumuz, Metekel zone

CARE:

- Planned to support 1000 HHs in West Gondar, Metema and Quara with Cash for ESNFI
- Planned to support 3000 HH in East Hararge, Babile woreda with full shelter kit

NRC:

- 6600 HH supported in cash and in kind
 - 1735 HH in West Wellega, Nejo and Boji Dirmeji
 - 1500 HH in West Guji
 - 1999 In Siti zone
 - 500 In Kochere woreda
