<p>As the main partners operating in Buzi district are based in Beira, we met in Beira (Cafeteria Riviera) one day before the Coordination Meeting in Buzi. Shelter Cluster will make the liaison with the districtal government on the field and will introduce the partners and the update of activities.</p> <p>Nevertheless, meetings in Buzi are important because IOM CCCM teams on the field attend them and provide useful information from the resettlement sites. CEDES is distributing mats in the communities were Medair distributed tarps. Medair and CICR where the only partners working in the district in the early emergency. <p>WV(out of the meeting) inform that women in the rural areas will start to work in the machambas very soon (around 20 August) and they won't have time to pick up capim to make the roofs for the houses that they started to rebuilt, so giving them tarpaulins is a good solution for them to cover their houses until October (end of maxamba work) where they would have the time to make the roofs. Both Maxambas and roofs are works done by the women, so cannot be done at the same time.</p>		
<p>Sra. Bernardette, Buzi Administrator, (out of the meeting) said that it would be very interesting to do a flight assessment to have an accurate idea of the needs 5 months after the cyclone. ANNEX 1. UPDATE 13 08 2019 PARTNERS AND ACTIONS IN BUZI DISTRICT

1. RESETTLEMENT SITES.

For the **resettlement sites IOM SHELTER will cover all (Guara Guara, Bandua, Estaquinha and Gurudja)** IOM has estimated more to 4000 HH to cover in total.

They have finished the assessment in the 4 areas, and they will start distributing around 16 August.

They have 3 teams and they will make distributions in this order, following the priorities of Districtal government and general partners agreement:

1. **Estaquinha Machedmedje**
2. **Estaquinha Sede+**
3. **Estaquinha Begaja + Inajou.**
4. **Gurudja (1480, Bonifacio to send the list)**
5. **Bandua + Guara Guara**

IOM kit is composed by:

- 2 tarps
- 6 wooden poles
- 2 bundles of Bamboo
- 1 tool kit for every two households

Blankets and Solar lamps (en-route)

2. FAMILIES OUTSIDE OF THE RESETTLEMENT SITES.

For the families **outside of the resettlements sites** it was a confusion as some of the “povoados” has the same name as the resettlement sites (for instance Gurudja and Machedmedje) and UNHCR and CARE asked for clarifications. Following the district governmental priorities clarifications in here:

1. **Guara Guara vila** (2038HH), located in **Bairro 2000** and **Bairro Masquil** (same name as the resettlement site, but this is a neighbourhood). CARE has distributed shelter kits on 14/08 around 1300 HH (most vulnerable) in Bairro Masquil and they informed both neighbourhoods are actually the same (people use both names to refer to them). UNHCR/WV will assess to see if they are still needs there and to confirm that the neighbourhoods are the same.
2. **Chunga 149HH** Only reachable by boat 30min from Buzi. UNHCR/WV already finished the assessment and **they will distribute on the week of 19th August.**
3. **Bairro de Massane 157HH.** in Buzi sede. UNHCR/WV already finished the assessment with partially destroyed houses that didn't receive any assistance. **They will distribute on the week of 19th August.**
4. **Gurudja**, one part will be covered by UNHCR/WV, around 3000 families, in 30 povoados. Some of them already received from IOM 2 tarpaulins or 1 shelter kit, as follow: (information from WV Carlos Sainte).

CEDES has tarps but doesn't have tools, so it is requested by shelter cluster to cover the povoados **in yellow** below. CEDES to confirm.

IOM will complement UNHCR (via WV) with another tarpaulin to reach the standards.

5. **Estaquinha (priority povoado Machedmedje).** CARE (Cesar, official de abrigo) informed that there are 18 povoados, not 15, and confirmed that they will work there, but he needs to confirm how many povoados CARE can cover.


