**1. Review of previous meeting action plans**

After an update on the status of the last action points as follows:

**2. Information Management updates**

Gap analysis update as of August 2019: IM team provided update on gap analysis which indicates enormous gap in terms of Repair Kits (51,421) and ESNFI Kits (247,060). Most of the gap are in the Oromia, Somali, SNNP, and Benishangul Regions respectively. The gap analysis also highlights alarming gap in Borena (Repair: 14,101, ESNFI: 26,158), West Harage (Repair:4,784 , ESNFI:15,230), West Guji (Repair:4,913 , ESNFI:50,106) and Dawa (Repair:4,120 , ESNFI:3,190) Zones. In addition, the operational presence of cluster partners coupled with the amount of Shelter/NFI assistance provided in Borena and West Harage is still an ongoing challenge for Shelter/NFI cluster.

Stock & pipeline update as of August 2019: IM team provided update on status of the Stock & Pipeline. Analysis provided highlights significant shelter re-construction gap in key return areas; as only 420 items are reportedly available in stock and 32,937 in pipeline. On the other hand, the analysis shows that 50,520 ESNFI items are available in stock and 37,539 ESNFI items in pipeline respectively.

### 3. Regional update

East/West Wellega and Benishangul: Report from field shows 1) uncertain number of returns from Kamashi zone to East & West wollega, 2) ongoing conflict in west wollega (Mana sibu & Gulisso woreda), People who have returned back often cite lack of access to services in Kamashi, loss of land or fear (ineffective peacebuilding) as reasons for returning, 3) and Lack of food is an ongoing problem.

The following challenges was mentioned: 1) In West Wellega, there is a need to increase cash for rent modalities to support those who are displaced - they do not have land to build shelter with ES. 2) Housing damage numbers are likely underestimated for West Wellega due to lack of access/security. 3) There is a gap 2,200 for ESNFI in Benishangul and a gap for reconstruction of over 2,000 houses.

West Guji and Gedee: Report from filed shows 1) no new displacements so far, 2) Loss and damage information received for both Gedee & West Guji; up to kebele level and significant increase in the number of affected shelters, 3) Kebele allocation for ESNFI distribution completed (NRC, IOM, WV, GOAL and ANE) jointly with the DRMOs, 4) and In Gedee Zone the EOC is over, now there is a DRM WG for early recovery.

The following challenges was mentioned: 1) The major challenge was lack of proper loss & damage figures, now we agreed on a figure as a threshold (as below), but still we need to verify all the shelter:

- West Guji: 21,083 shelters damaged, Gaps (for shelter reconstruction) 8,286 shelters.
- Gedee: 8,856 shelters damaged, Gap (for shelter reconstruction) 1,596 shelters

2) HLP issues like: Land swapping, luting of land documents, incapacity of paying rent may result in evictions.

3) Lack of information about all the conflict affected populations may leave some people without receiving assistance.

Somali Region: According to Regional DRMB 220 HHs newly displaced due to conflict arrived in Wobble Kebele of South Jigjiga woreda of Fafan Zone. In addition, report from filed shows 1) ongoing ethnic conflict at border areas between Somalis and Afar regions (especially kebeles under Mieso and Afdem woedas of Siti Zone), 2) the current heavy rains in the country caused more flooding reported from downstream located woredas in particular Mustahil and Kalafo, 3) chronic drought linked to insignificance of Gu' 2019 rains in pastoralist communities "Dollo, Shabelle, Korehe, Liban and Dawa zones".

The following challenges was mentioned: 1) There is a gap of 1,650 for ESNFIs for flood induced IDPs in in Kalafo and Mustahil woreda of Shabelle zone and 2,810 ESNFIs displaced due to inter-conflict in Filtu woreda of Liban zone. 2) IDP returnees; Shelter re-construction gap in dawa Fafan zones. 3) Lack of sustainable solution for protracted climate induced IDP's. 4) Predicted road inaccessibility; due to the onset of Deyr rains in October, mainly Shabelle, Afder, Liban and Dawa zones.

### 4. Selection Criteria for Returnee response update

Cluster provided update on the status of the developed selection criteria. NDRMC communicated the need to gather partners impression and feedback before validation from the government. As after validation from NDRMC, there will be no room for comments or feedback from partners.

## 6. AOB:

### Update on Shelter & WASH TWiG:

Cluster provided update on the development of the Multi-sectoral NFI kits; Based on reviewed findings from the PDM reports of both clusters (WASH & Shelter), the TWiG discussed on the necessity to include specific dignity kits as components of the multi-sectoral kits. However, this warrants consultation from the protection cluster to gather key/specific items to be included on the MS kit. Discussion still in progress on the need for inclusion. First draft of the muti-sectoral kit has been developed and shared with both cluster coordinators for revision and comment through the SAG's. The TWiG recommended the need for a unified PDM tool that will enable gather useful beneficiary feedback on outcome, impact and preferences to the developed Multi-sectoral tool, this tool will aid effective reviews of kits, while focusing on standard indicators to be measured, tools should be made flexible for agencies to adopt to enable them meet their organizational requirement and donor demand.

### Strengthening coordination in East & West Hararghe:

To enable effective coordination in E&W hararghe, the cluster provided a 3 months operational plan to OCHA, effective October - December. Coordination support is deemed necessary to properly guide location prioritization for response

delivery and mitigate response fatigue due to overlaps in E&W hararghe. In addition, critical locations with significant need and gap have been observed neglected for Multi-sectoral response delivery, due to weak coordination mechanism on the ground.

**HLP engagement in East/West Wellega and Benishangul:**

Activation of HLP engagement with first meeting in the Wollegas with the BCPDO on Tuesday. The BCPDO based in Nekemte covers the Wellegas, all of Benishangul-Gumuz and shortly also Gambella. First meeting focused mainly on HLP and other development issues. Burning issues including all HLP challenges and that people report not being able to access the dispute resolution committees in Benishangul.

**Upcoming assessment:**

IOM communicated a planned market assessment in Afar region, mainly focusing on zone 1 & 3, from 22nd – to – 31st of October. Operational partners with capacities are welcomed to join this assessment.
