CLUSTER SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- SO1:** Contribute to the protection of newly displaced people, IDPs / refugee returns / host community and those affected by natural hazards. (NFIs, ESKs)
- SO2:** Improve the living conditions and contribute to local reintegration of the protracted internally displaced persons (IDPs) and refugees returning back to their place of origin (Transitional shelters, Permanent shelters, NFIs)
- SO3:** Improve the quality of shelter assistance and ensure accountability through effective mechanisms (AAP, M&E)

NEEDS ANALYSIS

- There were about 2.3 million people in need of Shelter and NFIs assistance at the beginning of the year. Most of them are IDPs.
- More than 360,000 people have been displaced in Somalia due to floods and are in need of emergency shelter and NFI. Those returning will need support for shelter rehabilitation and reconstruction.
- IDPs living in protracted situation are in need of durable shelter.
- Most of the IDP settlements are unplanned. Settlement planning is required in order to make the settlements safe and secure, ensure that services are accessible and fire risk is mitigated.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- The available shelter/NFI stocks is not enough to respond to needs.
- The shelter sector is severely underfunded with only 13% of the funding requirement received by end of November. The scale of needs is much higher than available funds.
- High cost of air transport and lack of prepositioned stocks hamper comprehensive shelter response

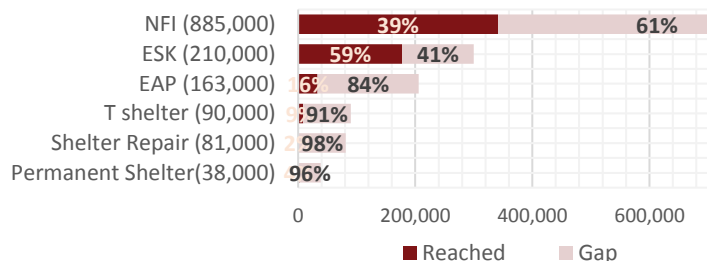
RESPONSE

During the month of November 2019, the Shelter and NFI Cluster partners assisted:

- 75,384 people with emergency non-food items (NFI) kits. Standard emergency non-food item kit consists of plastic sheets, blankets, jerry cans, mats, solar lamp, mosquito net, sleeping mats and kitchen sets.
 - 21,000 persons were assisted with Emergency Shelter Kits. An emergency shelter kit includes plastic sheets, timber poles, nails and rope for tying down the structure.
 - 21,120 persons were assisted with EAP which contains a light mix of emergency shelter and NFI items.
 - 600 persons were assisted with Permanent Shelter
- This brings the total number of people assisted by Shelter Cluster partners to 563,786 or 35% of the 2019 target

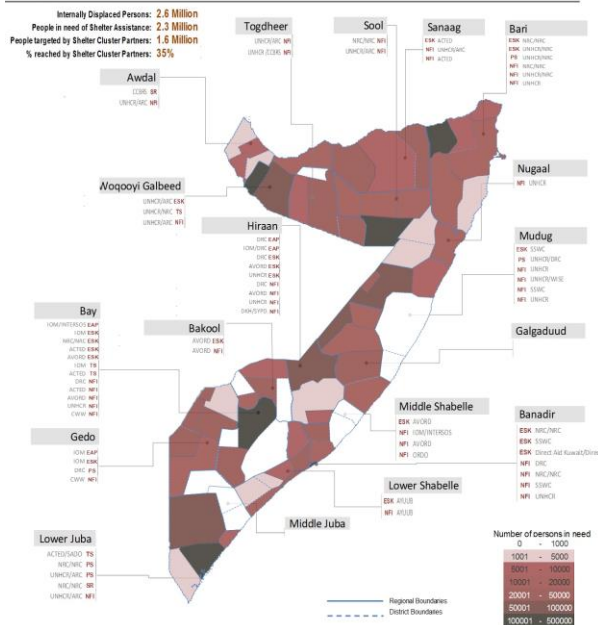
REACHED AGAINST TARGET (Individuals)

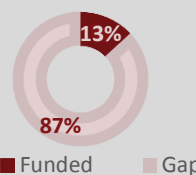
