Ninewa updates by Partner	<p><b>Blumont</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Blumont completed all the Shelter remaining to be rehabilitated in the Old City in West Mosul, but ended up with 137 HH never reaching the required level of phase 1 completion.</li> <li>Any partner to take over those HH? UNDP?</li> </ul> <p><b>Medair</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Medair identified 18 shelters in West Mosoul, Boqs are already completed.</li> <li>Medair Identified 62 shelters in Tilkaef district, Wana sub-district(Qara Kharab and Ghuzayil villages) , vulnerability assessment was done using SEVAT tool.</li> <li>Medair plans to complete the activity by end of May 2020</li> <li>Acces difficulties faced, NOC letter received on the 19/02</li> <li></li> </ul> <p><b>CRS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>CRS will continue monitoring the houses under repair (cat.1,2,3) . 46HH (86 families) already received 1st tranche of payment; 27HH (57 families) already received 2nd tranche of payment;</li> <li>CRS started new registrations in Mualemeen, Naser, Zahra, Wahda, and Kifah Al-Shemali neighborhoods 52 new families werer registered so far. They plan to finish the selection by the end of August 2020 depending on gaps and needs. If there are gaps/needs and CRS get funding, then they will keep assessing. However, considering only the current funding, then those assessments should be completed earlier.</li> </ul> <p><b>NRC</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Is continuing household assessments in al-Ahmadia, Hamam Manqoosha, Nabi Jarjis and Al-Mshahada Neighborhoods in the Old City of Mosul for Cat 2 rehabilitations using Cash for Shelter. 176 HH were assessed. They also started the first package of shelter rehabilitation (Cat 2) through CASH grant. 58 HH were already reached.with first tranche(around 600\$)</li> <li>NRC also finished conducting SEVAT and technical assessments in Sinjar (Barbarosh, Perzekre, Al-Qadisyia, Al-Salam and Al-Taakhe NBHs) and Ba'aj (Al-Risala, Al-Yarmook, Al-Qadsyia, Al-Thawra and Al-Askari NBH) for Cat 2 WDS Rehabilitation programs. 273HH were assessed. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In baaj:</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p><b>AP:</b> Partners are reminded to report all of their achievements and plans in the Activity Info database throughout the month as soon a s the AI database is open</p>

	<p>The mayor asked approved beneficiaries list (as other NGOs gave) before the rehabilitation process, the reason behind of this demand as the mayor said is Baaj an open area and the security forces cannot fully control the district and people easily cross borders. Negotiation is ongoing in this regard.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ In Sinjar Because of HLP issues, NRC are planning to use electrical, water bills as proof of ownership, but have to deal with 2 mayors, one official one living in Faida (Til Kaef district) and another one unofficial in Sinjar. Therefore Beneficiaries have to travel to Faida to get the mayor (Official) signature. So, some people are not willing to go to Faida. [Edit] Fortunately on the 23/02 the official mayor has set a committee to check and sign documents in Sinjar instead people travelling to Faida.</li> <li>• NRC is also facing access pb to both Sinjar and Baaj from Mosul</li> </ul> <p>ACTED</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ACTED is starting a new WDS rehabilitation project in Telafar centre of 450 houses cat. 2. They will start vulnerability assessment next month.</li> <li>• ACTED faces access pb to access Telafar from Dohuk</li> </ul> <p>EADE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Project with ZOA in Anbar, they finished the assessments and are in process of conducting voucher distribution for 1000 SoKs, NFI distributions (donated by UNHCR), Cash for rent and shelter repairs (237 houses Cat 1) in Amiriyat Al Fallujah (electrical and sanitary minor repairs) planned to end on 31/7/2020</li> <li>• Project with UN-HABITAT currently finalizing the SEVAT assessment and planning to start the distinction of 1000 NFI Kits (donated by UNHCR) in (Fallujah centet, karma and Saqlawyieh) planned to en on 20/3/2020.</li> </ul> <p>PUI</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Planning Shelter activity in Zumar(Telafar district)</li> </ul> <p>PAH</p>

Winterization	<p>Situation In Camps</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IOM delivered on the 28/01 726 tents to ACTED in Salamiyah, but some tents got damaged in the transportation</li> <li>• ICCG mission on 02/02 in Jadah camps. The Shelter condition ok but still 200 tents still to be replaced</li> </ul> <p>Situation out of Camps</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Very harsh winter conditions in Sardanti informal settlement(Sinjar Mountains), 2300 families. Mission East distributed NFI, but they are still some needs to be fulfilled, in particular need for kerosene, but no sign from Gol</li> <li>• IDPs residing out of camp should be targeted using the Cash Working Group Socio-Economic Vulnerability Assessment Tool (SEVAT). Cash or voucher-based winter programming is encouraged, especially in areas where other partners are partially covering needs through a similar modality so as not to cause tensions among people assisted with different means.</li> </ul>	<p><b>AP:</b> Partners who are planning to provide winter assistance should reach out to Avedis immediately.</p> <p>IOM:to check the level damages on tents delivered</p>
