

Minutes of Meeting- Virtual Shelter Cluster Coordination Meeting

Super Typhoon Odette (Rai)- 27th December 2021

In attendance

1. Updates on Impact of Typhoon Odette

Acknowledging that partners have urgent work, we are keeping the updates to a minimum.

- As of Dec 26th, the number of homes impacted continues to rise. 523k still displaced (DROMIC) and 149k totally & 330k partially damaged homes (NDRRMC)
- Gov priority is to move people to safer, less congested conditions and return to normalcy.
- OCHA is putting the message forward that Emergency shelter is a priority.
- The weather system forming over the Pacific, will likely bring more rains to eastern Visayas and Bicol regions over the holidays exacerbating flooding and the suffering of those families living in emergency shelters.
- Last meeting, we used DSWD/ DROMIC numbers, but the National Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council Sit Rep has higher numbers (by 70K) for Dec 26 Date

- Noticeably high number of affected families in the higher density populations of Reg 6, but we understand that the populations of Regions 8 and 13 are more vulnerable due their economic situation.

Floor was open to additional assessment points from partners, but none added.

2. Shelter Cluster Partners Operational Updates

No operational updates on the call due to time constraint, partners asked to submit a couple lines that will be shares in MoM.

- Lokal Lab is a Siargao-based NGO that creatively collaborates with and supports local communities through sustainable projects with the goal of creating equal access to sustainable lifestyles and

opportunities. They are responding through relief distributions and are planning on other shelter related support activities and are keen to learn. They are disseminating the BBS messages.

- IOM- As of Dec 26, Distribution of 5598 Tarps to Cebu, Bohol, South Leyte, Dinagat Island, Surigao del Norte. Planned delivery through PH coast guard, 14,00 tarps, 250 modular tents, 1,310 Solar lamps and 1000 Shelter Repair kits (CGI, lumber, tarps, fixings and tools)



- Lutheran World is working on cost estimates for shelter repair and reconstruction to propose cash based assistance.
- PRC is carrying out assessments and relief distributions. They are considering the provision of SRA OR FULL shelter assistance and may conduct a detailed assessment to determine the amount and type of shelter assistance suitable in each affected province. IFRC has launched a Red Cross Movement Wide Emergency Appeal for 26 million to support the PRC. The strategy includes 12,500 households to be supported with Emergency shelter, Shelter Repair and Full shelter assistance.
- Single Drop for Safe Water is carrying out assessments in Palawaan, Municipality of Roxas and Puerto Princesa City and preparing to distribute pre-position tarpaulins along with other WASH activities. Mentions building supplies are limited due to run on the market in the urban areas and the need for everything to be brought in by boat for all of Palawan.

of common structures and/or shelters constructed or rehabilitated

Are any other indicators proposed? What about other activities? We recognize this is early to ask, we are assuming the response strategy will not differ from recent Typhoons in the country.

- From Jansen Mayor, Lutheran World, Will Cash distribution be an indicator? *No, it's an activity, and the intention, maybe shelter assistance, is the indicator.*

5. HNP work

- Key points from the published document;
- Overall, 530,000 persons require USD 107.2 M
- Emergency shelter is a priority, targeting 90,000 persons, requiring USD 15 M in priority regions VIII and XIII
- Shelter response should address related Protection, Inclusion, PSEA, environmental consideration and COVID transmission.
- Cash and voucher where possible, link to Multi Purpose
- Large scale dissemination of BBS, all levels
- UN has allocated unprecedented USD 12 million from CERF

6. Update from IOM on CERF funding allocation

Conrad Navidad, National Emergency Coordinator IOM

- Deadline for proposals in 28th COB. Currently writing the proposals. 12 million USD available across sectors for the South Leyte and Caraga areas.
- Proposals selected based on meeting lifesaving immediate needs, in the priority areas, as described in the HNP, in-kind (shelter kits and materials) and Cash options, in first 3 months preferably. Guidance from Goni response package, 20 M square living area, maximize people reached
- Application by local partners is encouraged and may be through INGO

7. Key messages for the Shelter Sector

Kimja Vanderheyden, GSC Focal Point for Advocacy. She is part of the larger Global team that supports operations. Services include Research, HLP, IM, and Assessment, so let's not hesitate to ask for help if we need it.

- Objective: contribution to harmonization of messaging on shelter response needs within the overall response and sharing of resources for shelter practitioners (Build Back Better, Safer key messages, GBV, PSEA).
- 5 key messages.
- "Living" document: will be continuously adapted per needs and priorities of the shelter responses.
