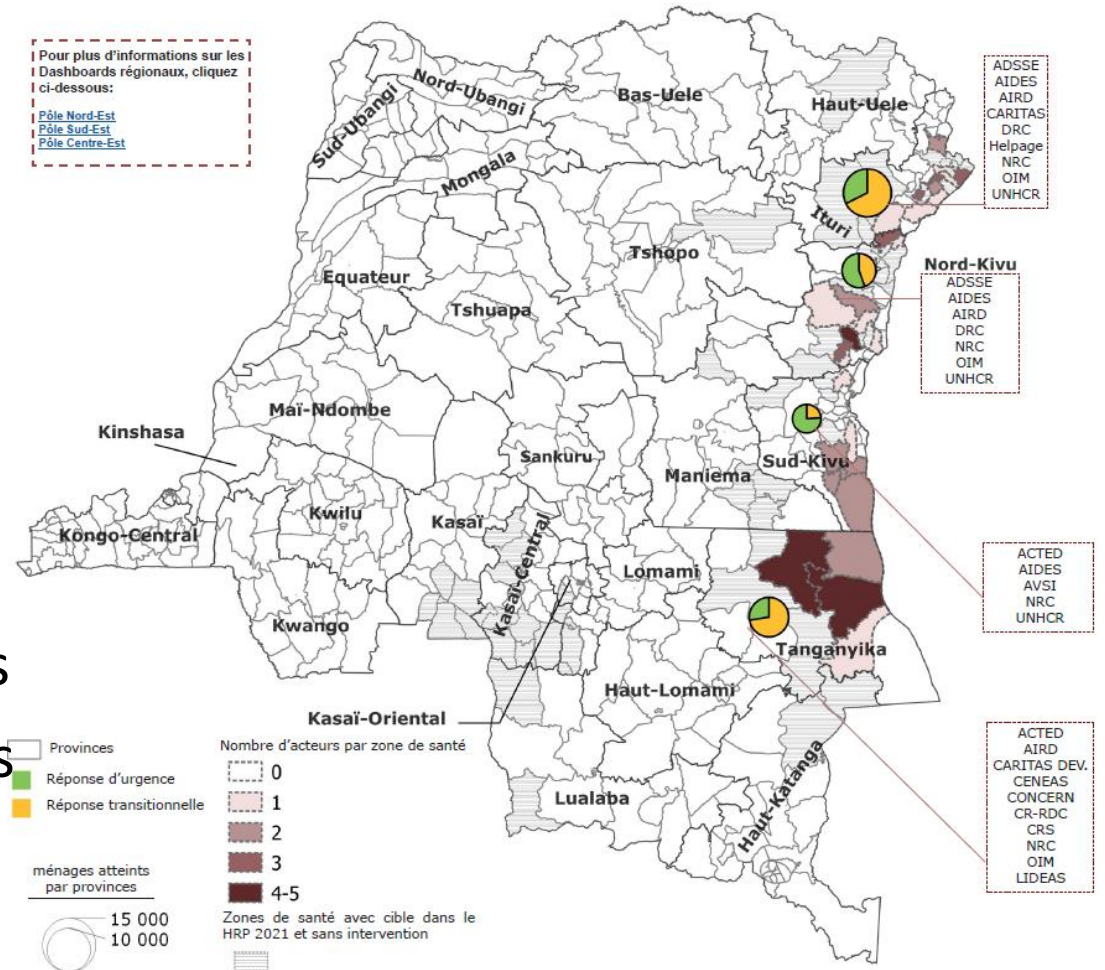

- 5 major crisis in the East & disasters
- 2M people target for Shelter & 1.5M for NFIs
- 3rd biggest Shelter crisis in the world

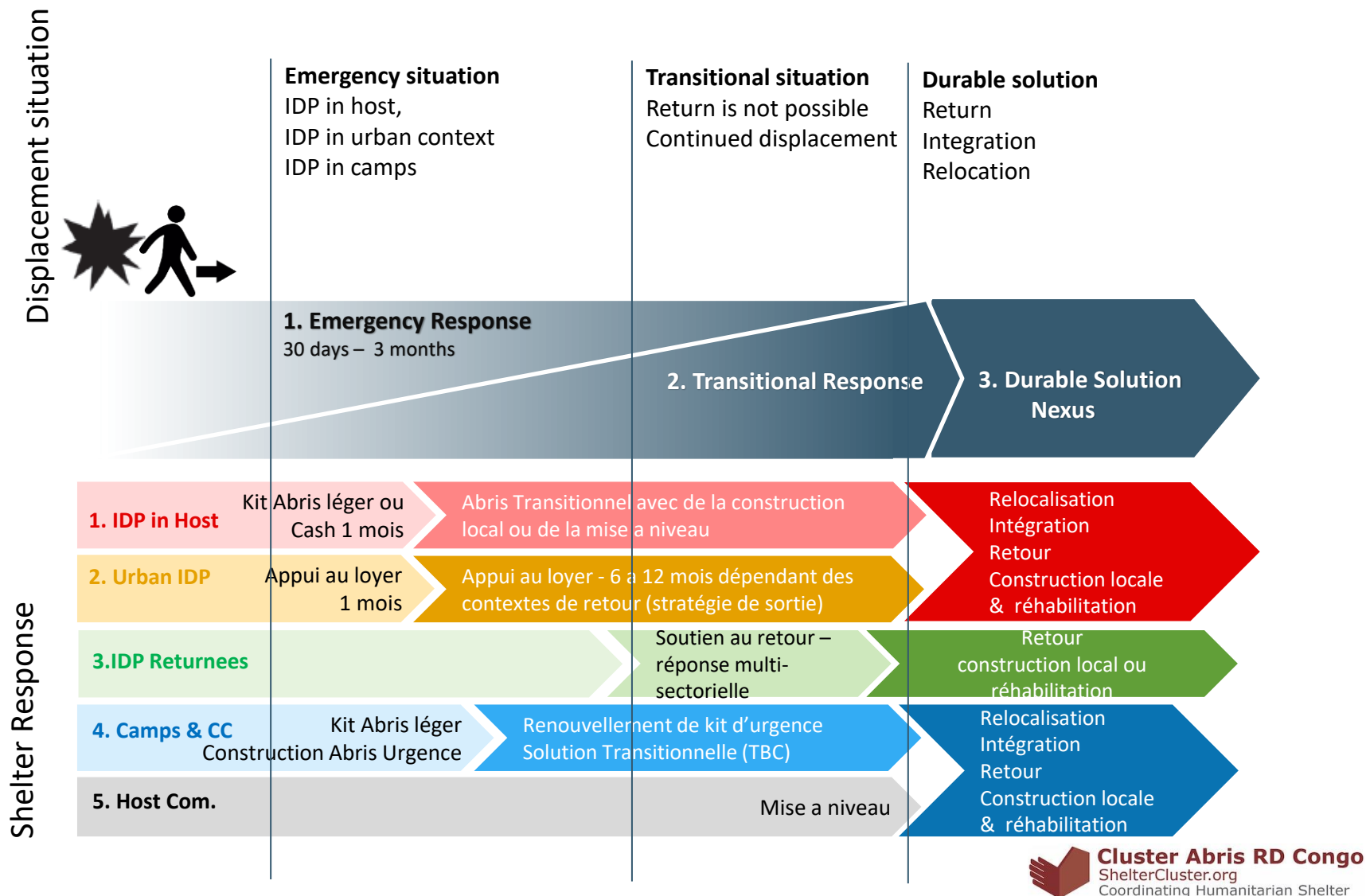

Shelter Strategy & Response



NFIs Strategy & Response

- Operational response
 - Rapid response involving flexible funding mainly for geographical areas
 - Rapid response: around 15 actors
 - 3 interventions' modalities – cash, in-kind, fairs
 - Ongoing harmonization with the emergency shelter response

Strategic Priority for 2021

1. Review the host family support package - shelter
2. Protection mainstreaming & HLP
 - NFI & Shelter – developing tools, check-lists, trainings (child-protection WG, PSEA)
3. HLP training (ongoing)
4. Environmental impact of shelter programme

NYIRAGONGO VOLCANO RESPONSE

Nyiragongo Volcan Response

Timeline

- W1: 22 May eruption
- W2: displacement 410,000 people
- W3 progressive return 4,000 HH destroyed
- W4: Govt request to build camps

Response

- Light shelter response for IDPs
- Govt took lead in building camps
- HC & SC partners limiting camps assistance favoring rental option
- Response overall coverage
- Durable solution under discussion

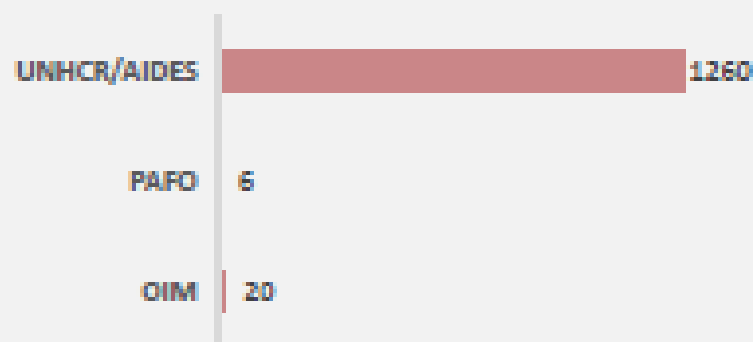

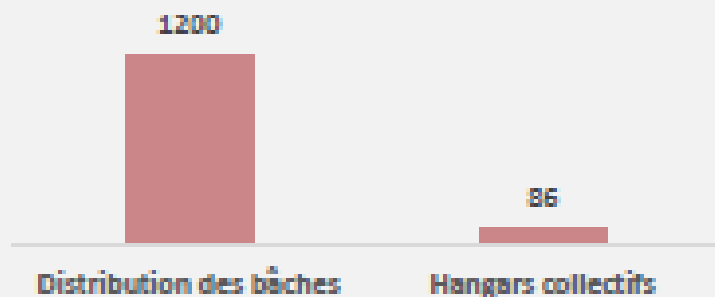

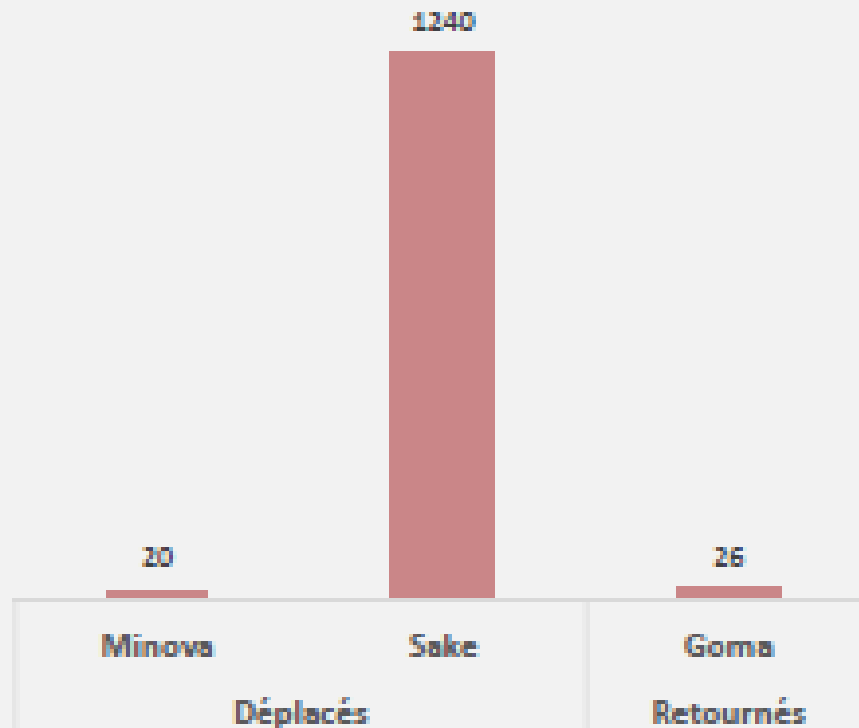
Ménages atteints par acteur

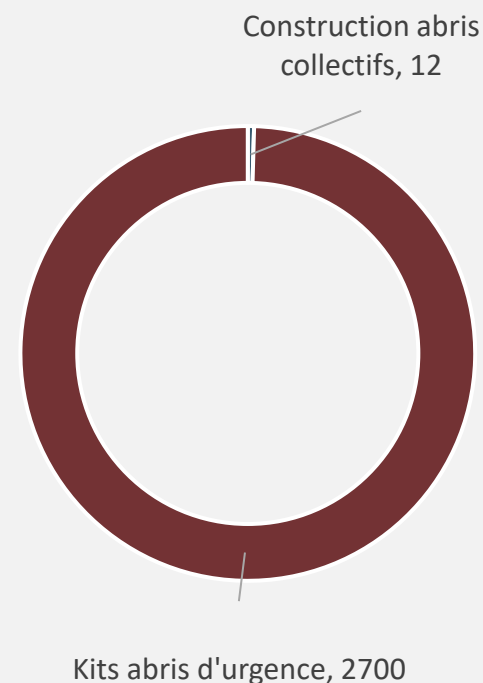

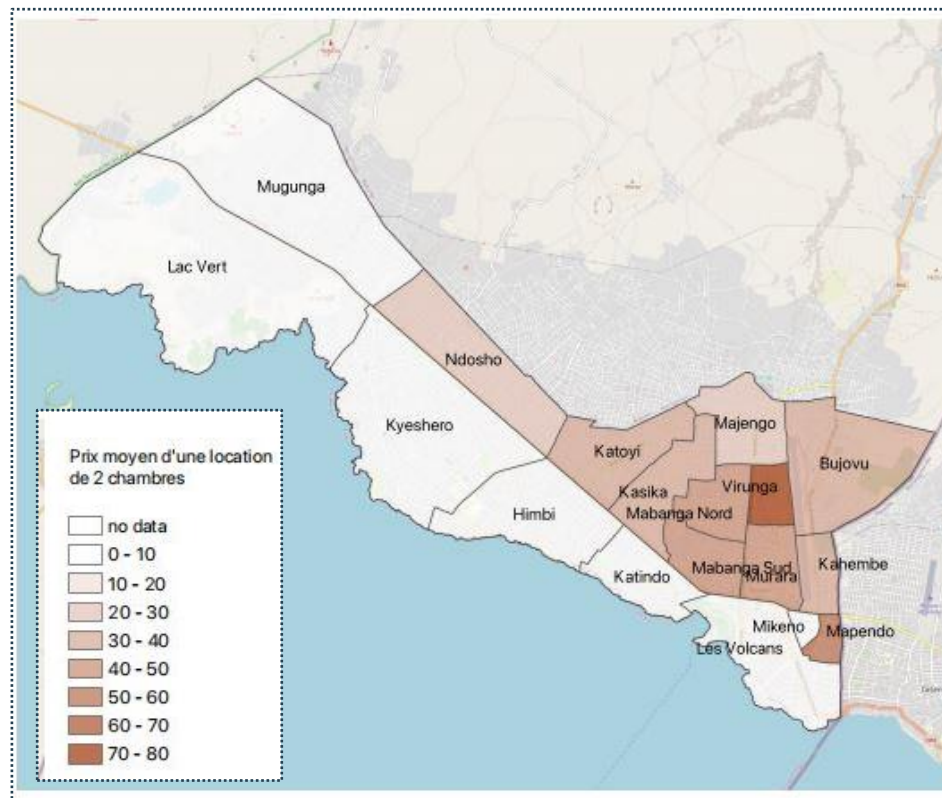

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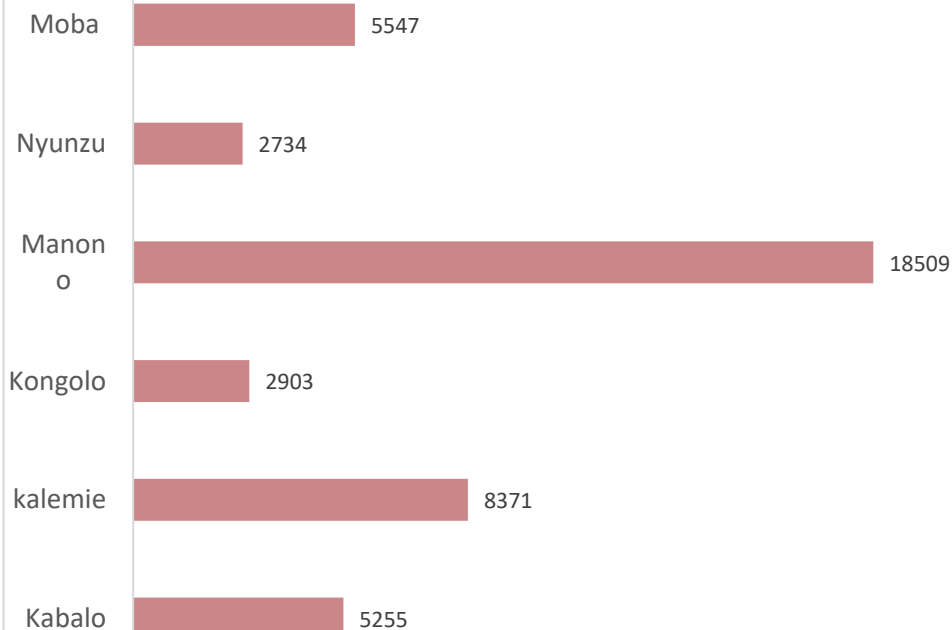

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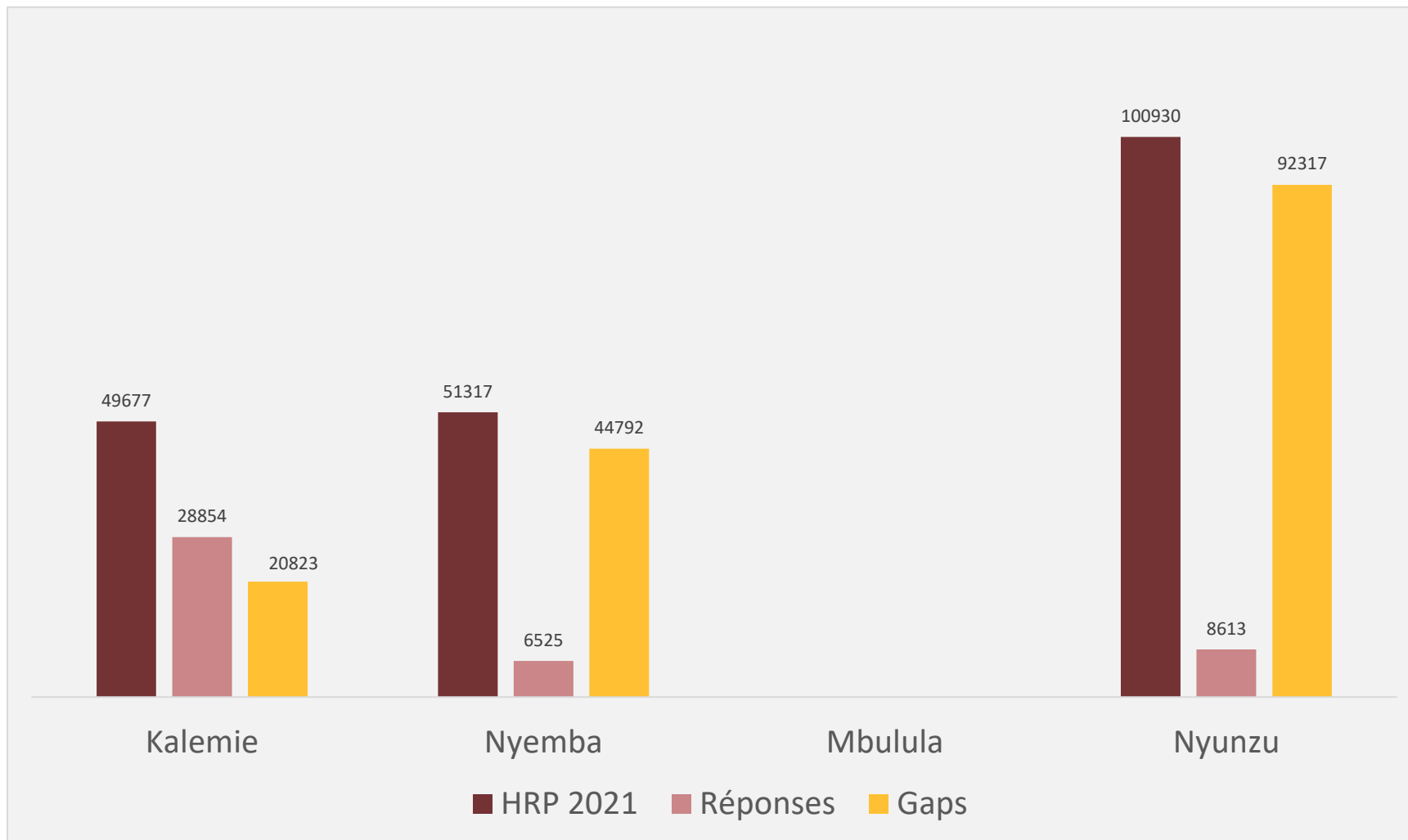

Needs, Response & Gaps



CHALLENGES & OPPORTUNITIES

NFI response challenges

- Restricted humanitarian access due to insecurity
- Challenging logistical & physical access
- Flexibility on intervention modality
- Flexibility on geographical intervention zone with humanitarian funds
- Challenge to improve the speed of the response

NFIs response opportunities

- Synergies with other sectors
 - With Food sec Cluster to improve the multisectoral response to a crisis
 - With Logistics Cluster to facilitate NFIs kits transportation and storage
 - With WASH cluster for kits composition determination (NFIs kits / Wash kits)
 - With GBV AoR on hygiene kits
 - With RR WG for strategic orientations on rapid response

Shelter Response Challenges

- Type of displacement, pendular, cyclical, long-lasting shelter needs
- Scale of the needs
- Access to certain areas, increase insecurity
- Lack of available and flexible funding for emergency and transitional responses but also to build durable solutions
- Environmental impact of the shelter response
- Pressure on the use of construction materials (CGIs) without market consideration

Shelter Response Opportunities

- Joint advocacy Shelter NFI & Protection (GBV & HLP)
- Synergies with other sectors, specifically WASH and Protection with HLP WG
- Environmental consideration of shelter programming
- Growing membership of the shelter cluster and growing interest in shelter in DRC since the activation in 2020
