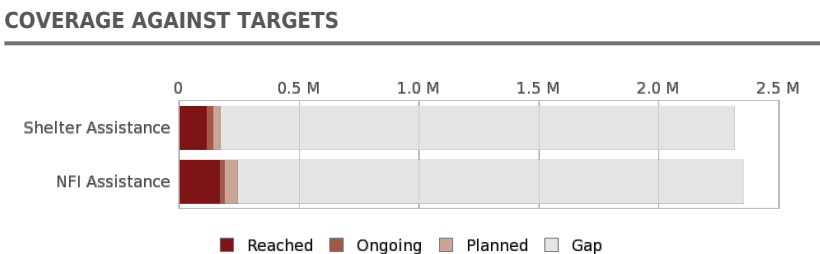


HIGHLIGHTS

During the month of June 2021, the Shelter Cluster partners assisted:

- 24,303 people with non-food items (NFI) kits. Standard non-food items kit consists of plastic sheet, blankets, jerry cans, sleeping mats, mosquito net, solar lamp and kitchen set.
- 4,776 persons were assisted with Shelter. The shelter assistance were emergency shelter kits to 4,122 people, and transitional shelter to 654 people.



NEED ANALYSIS

Around 3.2 million people are in need of Shelter and NFI assistance in Somalia. According to PRMN report, conflict and drought has displaced over 477,000 people between January and June 2021. Most of the displaced have arrived in Banadir, Baidoa, Jowhar, Beletweyne, Luuq and Xudur districts. The displaced are in urgent need of emergency shelter and NFI according to partner assessments.

RESPONSE

Cumulatively in 2021, the Shelter Cluster partners have reached 172,055 individuals (7%) of 2.3 Million targeted with NFI assistance, and 116,905 individuals (5%) of the 2.4 million targeted with shelter assistance.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- There are limited NFI kits in stock countrywide with no shelter kits in stock. The available stock and stock in pipeline are not sufficient to respond to the shelter and NFI needs of the newly displaced population as well as the needs of the IDPs living in protracted situation.
- Additional funding is urgently required to respond to the displacements and to pre-position the NFI and shelter items for potential displacements in near future.

Provision of Emergency Shelter and NFIs in Belet Xaawo District, Gedo Region

The project 'Provision of Emergency Shelter and NFIs in Belet Xaawo District, Gedo Region' targets 2,333 households translating to 14,000 people, most of who are new arrivals to Ajuaran, Jaron, Odaa, Gawido, Malkarie, Idan and Bula Amin camps. The camps collectively host over 32,000 IDPs, almost 29% of them having arrived in 2021 after being displaced by drought, flooding, evictions and conflict. HAPEN had in March 2021 identified the need to support them with shelter and NFIs through a rapid needs assessment conducted jointly with DRC.



HAPEN staff in a consultative forum with community members at community mobilization stage where objectives of the project, the role of the community and beneficiary selection criteria are agreed on. Due to covid-19 prevention measures, only small crowds are allowed unlike previously when much bigger crowds would assemble in a single forum.

The assistance has been made possible through an SHF emergency shelter and NFI project that runs from May 2021 to January 2022.

Community mobilization followed an official launch of the project bringing together the local administration, management of the camps and partners involved in various interventions in the same area. Registration of beneficiaries has already started and will be completed in July 15th. The project is being implemented as part of a wider intervention involving WASH; Child Protection; and CCCM & Housing, Land and Property services by DRC, SEDHURO and NOFYL respectively. The approach is already enabling the organizations to pool and optimize resources in capacity building and harmonize efforts in approaching and negotiating with local administration, community mobilization, selection of beneficiaries, enhancing protection and referrals, use of complaints and feedback mechanisms and generally complementing services provided by each partner.

One of the lesson learnt in this is to have the communities ideas in the projects for example one of the committees who were among the female headed household said "now that we are among the consulted team representing the communities we feel empowered and humbled and can now talk about our problems and solutions"

Apart from providing shelter and NFI kits in kind, HAPEN will also be engaged in basic planning of the sites to lessen congestion and facilitate access for service providers in future.
