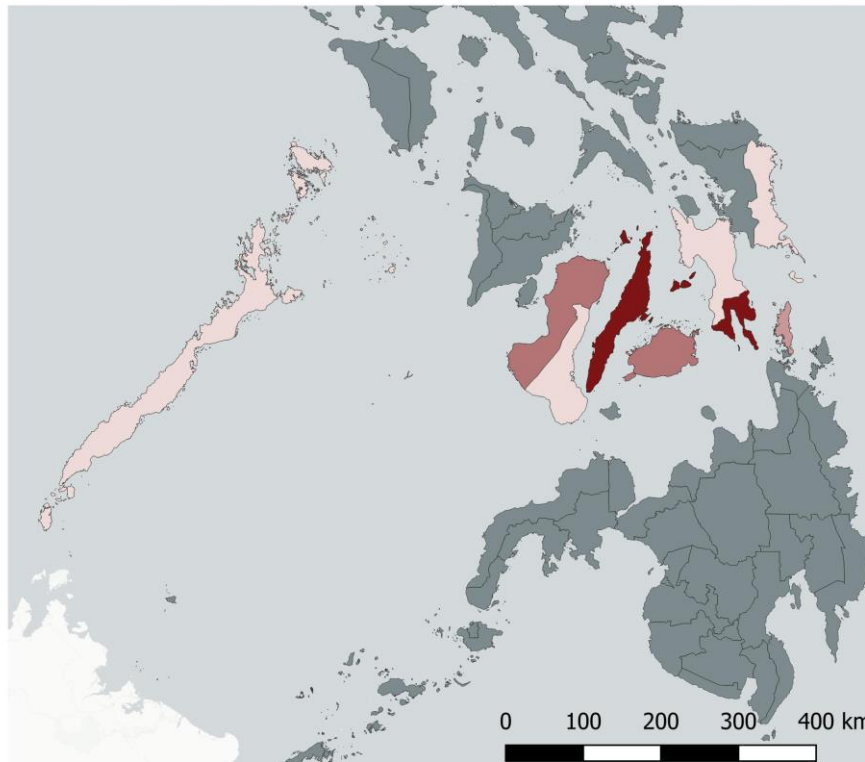
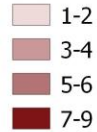

# Environmental issues



## Typhoon Rai/Odette – Initial Environmental Scoping January 7, 2022

### Key issues

- Compliance with Environmental Laws and Regulations
- Disaster Debris
  - up to 90% of all debris can be recovered and reused or repurposed
- Temporary Shelter and Reconstruction
  - Land tenure / hazard zones
- Cooking and stoves
- Shelter and environmental impact
  - Packaging and Plastic
  - Coconut trees
  - Mining of River and Beach Sand
