1. Updated key figures 4Ws

As per 16 February, Shelter Cluster partners have reached or planed 136,513 HH. See presentation for detailed figures. Next deadline for 4W partners reporting is Wednesday 2 March 8 PM.

2. Gaps field validation: key informant assessment

The Shelter Cluster is planning a Key Informant Assessment. The objective is to triangulate the results of the earlier conducted damage severity and vulnerability analysis (see here), to also gain insights in whether those are still relevant and up to date and whether the prioritization should be revisited.

This KI Assessment consists of shorts interviews with Key Informants at municipal level. The initial focus areas are the 32 priority municipalities, but if there is capacity, we can include other municipalities. The Shelter Cluster is asking support from its partners for identification of KIs and conducting interviews

3. Shelter Cluster hub arrangements (Southern Leyte and Region VII)

Shelter Partners endorsed Arnold Gasta from CRS as Philippine Shelter Cluster focal point for Southern Leyte. Many thanks to CRS partners for their support.

4. Update on ICCG meeting /HLP / NBZ concerned raised by Protection Cluster

Protection Cluster raised issues concerning the assistance to beneficiaries located in the Non-Build Zone areas. An advisory note is being produced to be delivered to the HCT and one ad hoc working group will be created. Shelter Cluster will co –lead this working group together with the Protection Cluster.

Shelter Cluster asked partners during the meeting if they are experiencing these issues on the field. CFSI informed that in Southern Leyte while some LGU officials are indifferent to the NBZ areas they have heard about some others that prevent agencies to provide assistance.

No other partners reported issues on HLP during the meeting. **Please contact us bilaterally if you have been experiencing HLP issues.**

5. Connection with WASH CLUSTER

The Shelter Cluster met with the Wash Cluster and informed on their decision to distribute “toilet repairs kits” in part of the areas where Shelter Partners distributed “shelter repair kits”, to complement the assistance.

6. Update on Southern Leyte meeting with PDRRMO / PSWDO on 14th February.

Shelter Partners in Southern Leyte met on 14 February with PDRRRMO / PSWDO.

Governor ordered the Provincial Engineering Office to create a uniform design for the housing project. Provincial Government will provide construction materials (CGI sheets, umbrella, nails, plywood) and Municipal Mayors will provide lumbers. Mayors will look for relocation sites.

1st priority is that Affected families/communities to be resettled on the same area where their houses were built (must be away from hazard-prone area) and 2nd priority is to relocate to resettlement site to be identified by the LGU.
