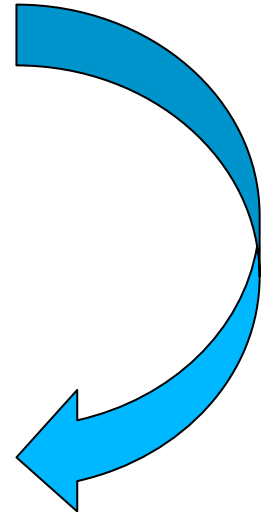

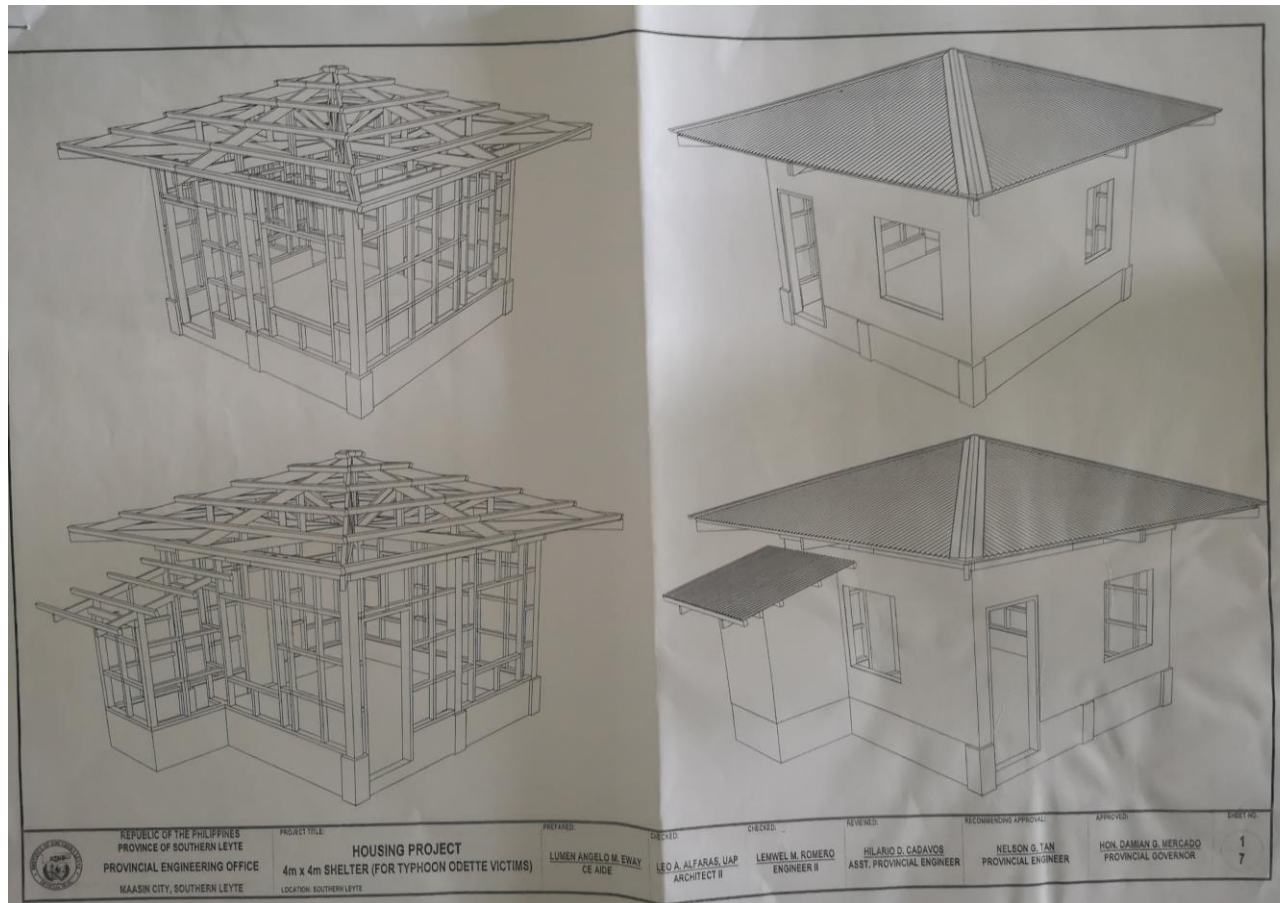

Southern Leyte province wish to use a uniform model of permanent housing to avoid inequalities among beneficiaries. The model was presented by the local engineer on the 28th February meeting and a working group lead by Shelter Cluster focal point has been establish to to ensure the compliance of the Build back safer messages to ensure the model is typhoon resilient.

7. Local coordination / Southern Leyte

- 34,000 Totally Damaged Houses | 17,000 Partially Damaged Houses
- Provincial Government to provide construction materials (CGI sheets, umbrella, nails, plywood) and Municipal Mayors to provide lumbers
- Mayors to prepare 1,200 sqm for resettlement
- 1st priority: Affected families/communities to be resettled on the same area where their houses were built (must be away from hazard-prone area)
- 2nd priority: Resettlement site to be identified by the LGU
- To implement building of houses 20 meters away from the shoreline (for municipalities) and 3 meters (for city) considering that the area is safe.
- Governor ordered the Provincial Engineering Office to create a uniform design for the housing project
