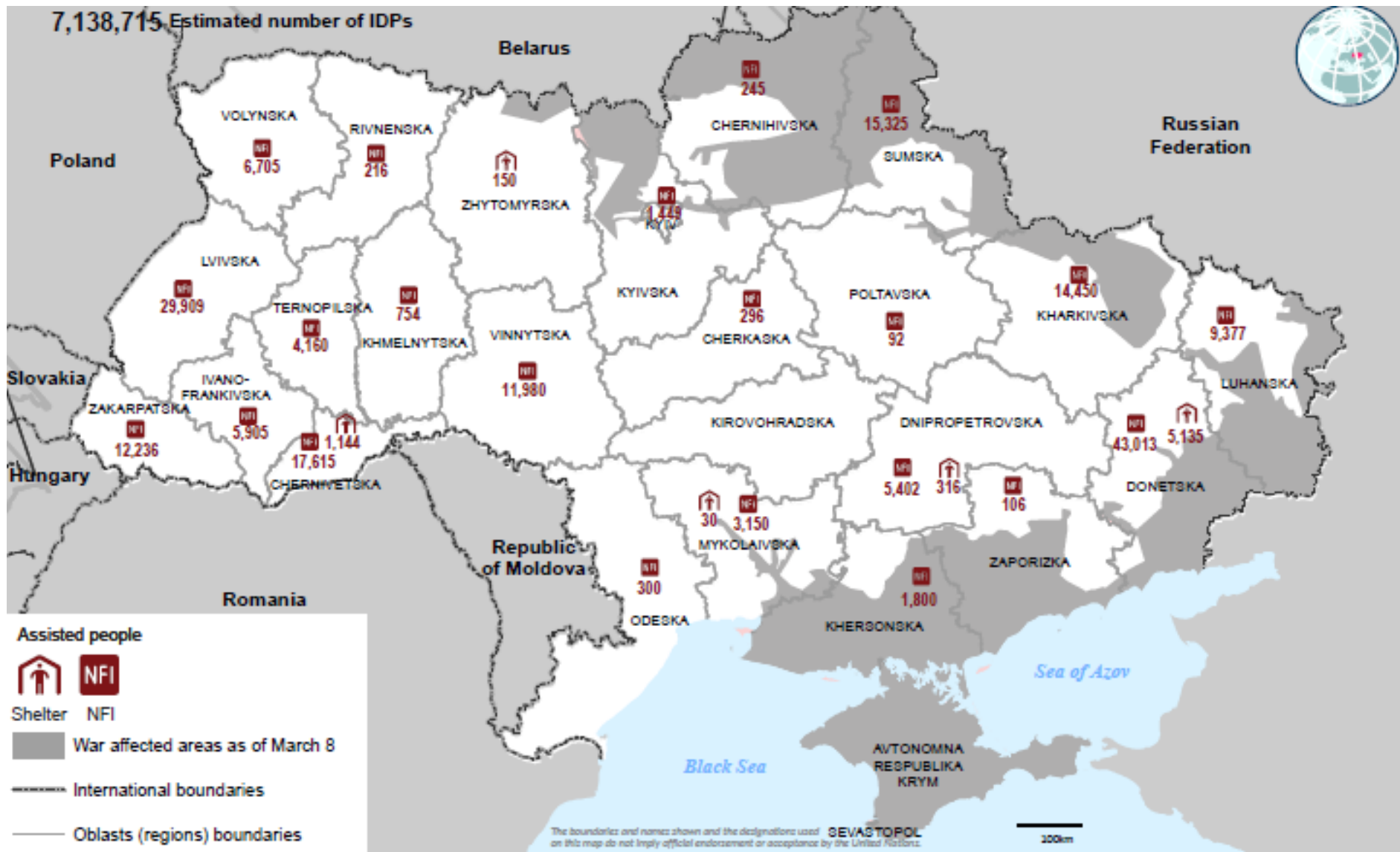

Response update

- As of 14 of April, 191,260 people have received shelter and NFI support from the SC partners since 25 February.
 - NFI kits to collective centers: 72,035 people
 - NFI kits to households: 93,788 people assisted
 - Winterization support: 3,036 people
 - Shelter kits: 19,567 people

Update on hosting families' support

- Humanitarian organizations require direct implementation of the hosting families support activity
- The information needs expressed by the SC partners are:
 - List of internally displaced persons registered in the municipality
 - Access to specific information to apply the vulnerability criteria
 - Information for the identification of the hosting family
- Program complementarity and alignment approach:
 - The Pryhystok programme, designed by the Ukrainian government at this stage does not apply any prioritization criteria for the selection of the IDPs, does not apply any requirements to the host family regarding the housing conditions and has not established any formal agreement among the hosted and the hosting parts.

Update on hosting families' support

- SC partners hosting families support would align to the Pryhystok programme with regards as much as possible, particularly in the compensation amount calculated by the government (14.77 UAH (0.5 USD) per day per person)
- could complement the Pryhystok programme by targeting the most vulnerable displaced individuals with a harmonized prioritization criteria among the partners.
 - SC partners would apply a common approach on the requirement of minimum conditions for the hosting house
 - And would define a general agreement with the support of the HLP working group to define the obligations and rights of both parties.
- The SC partners implementing this activity will coordinate with the municipal authorities and inform in a monthly basis of the payments to avoid duplication.

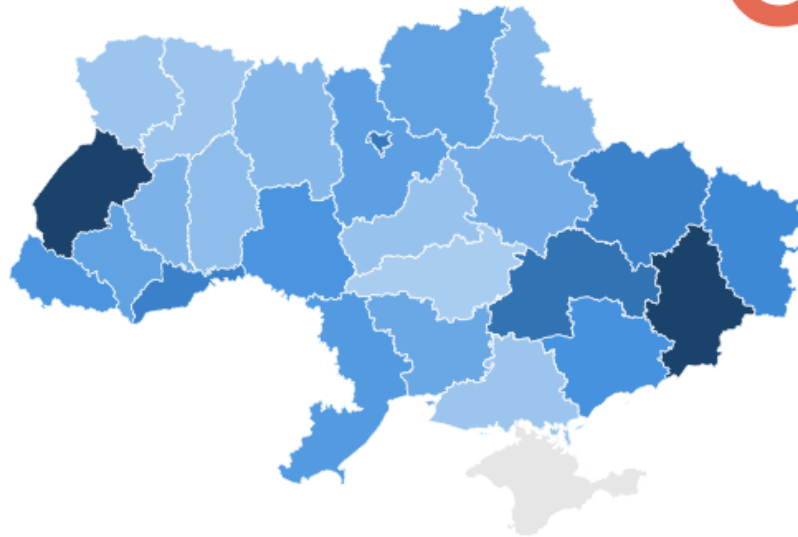

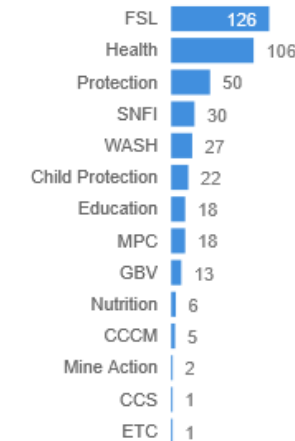

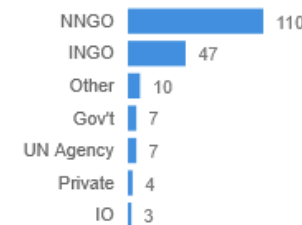
Presence of Partners
