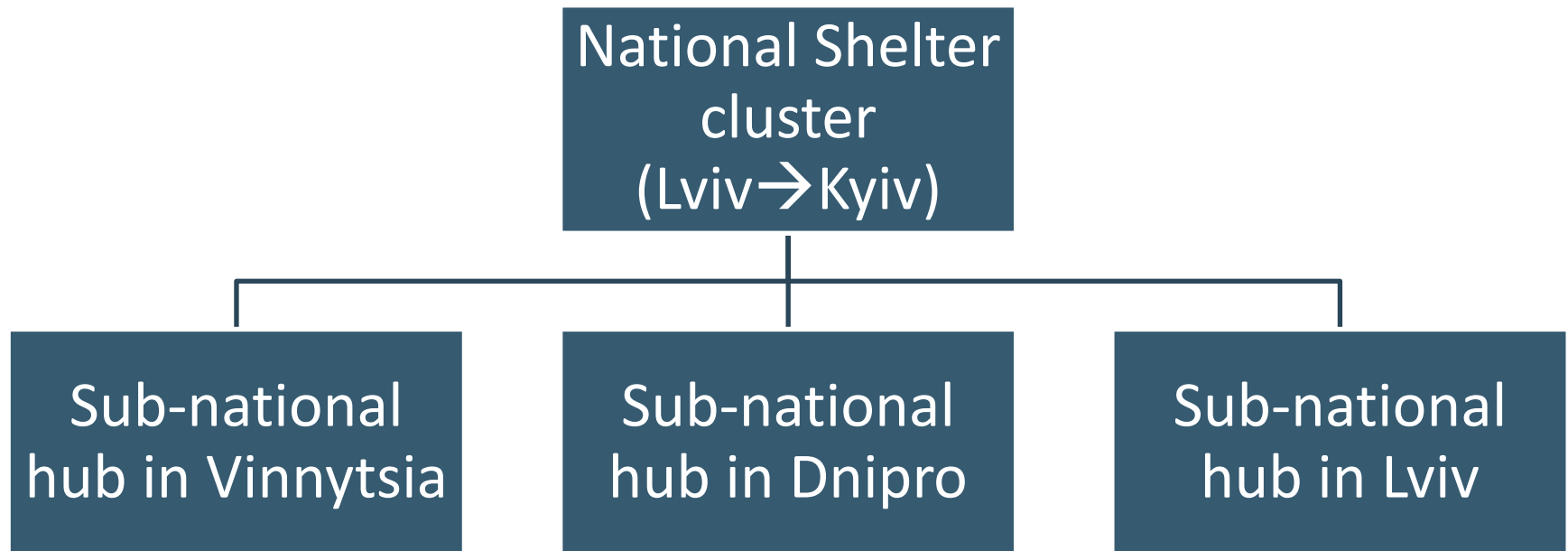

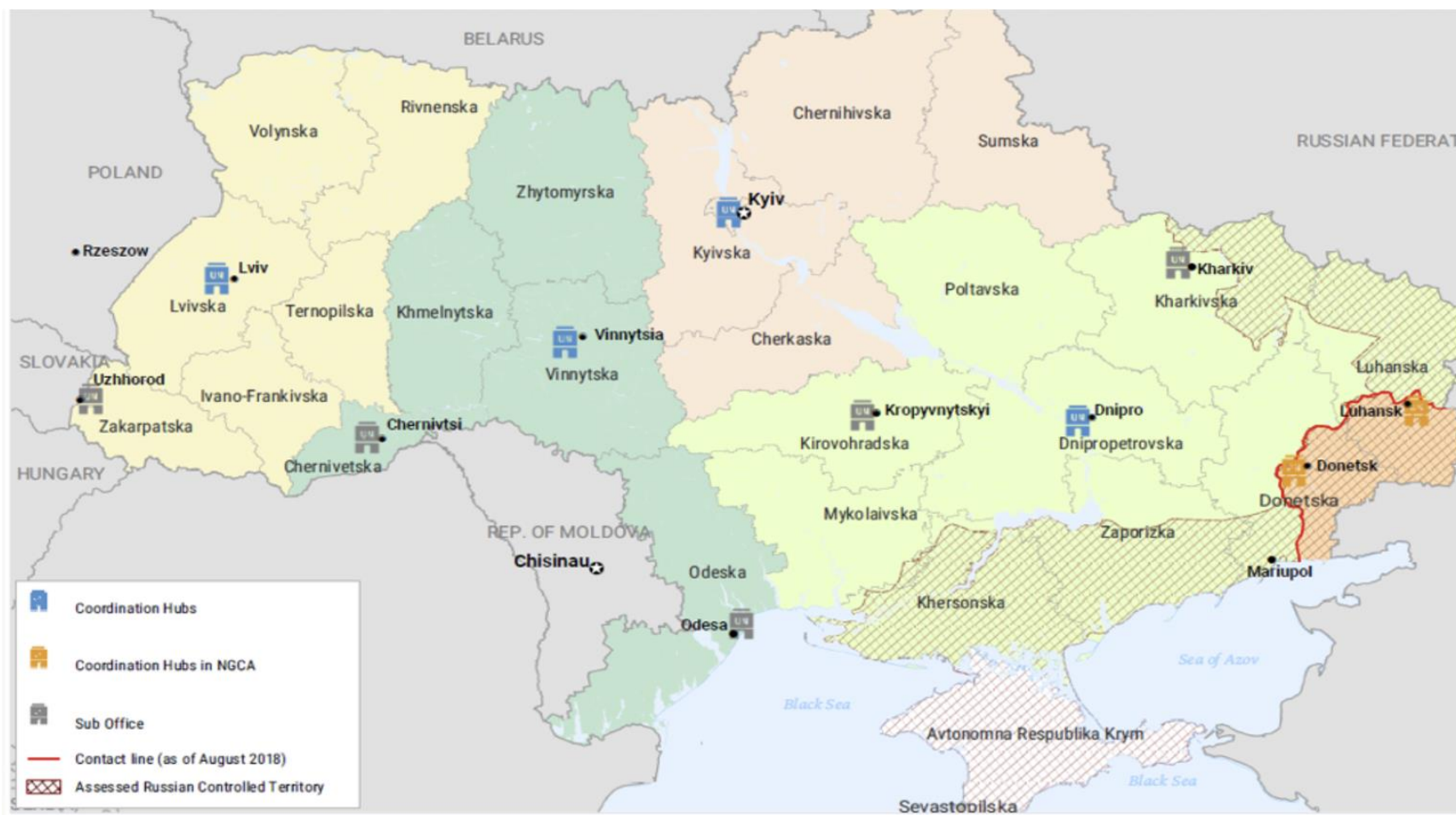

# Shelter Cluster Strategy

- O1. Most vulnerable people affected by conflict are (displaced and non-displaced) have access to adequate shelter and NFI assistance (in kind and in cash modalities)
- O2. Most vulnerable people affected by the conflict receive shelter support that contribute to long-term recovery.
