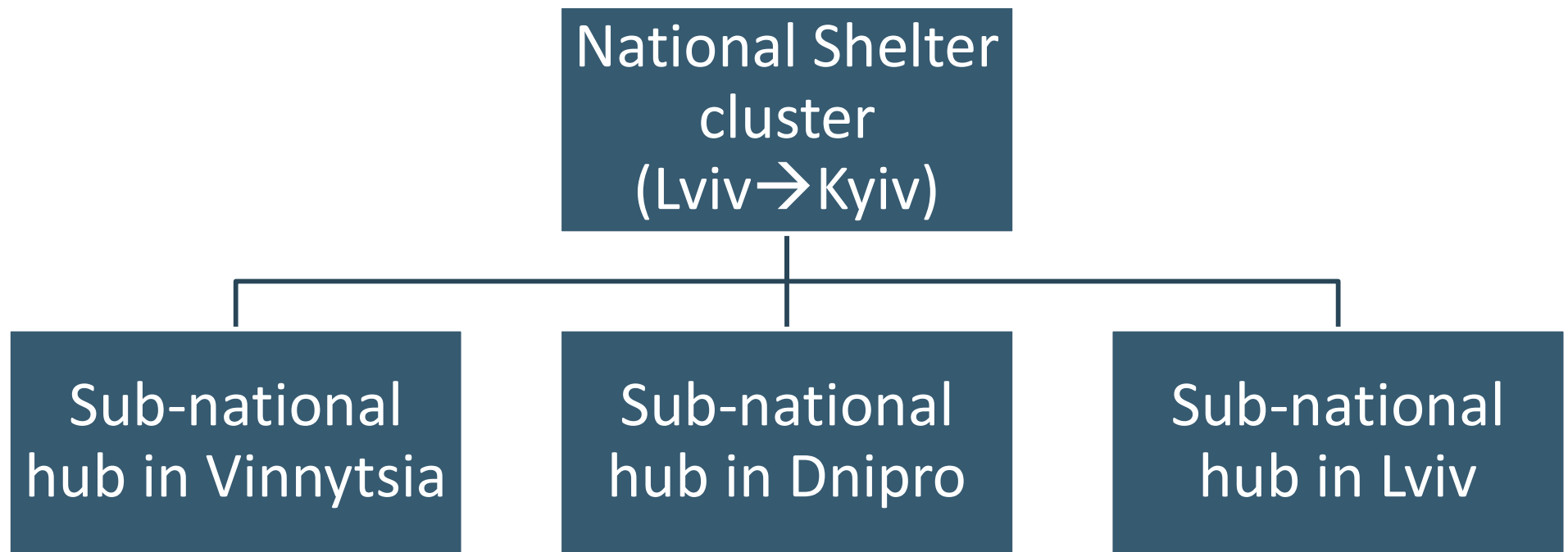

Shelter Cluster Strategy context

- **Context 1:** Oblasts receiving displaced populations, mainly western and some central oblasts.
- **Context 2:** Conflict-affected oblasts, mainly eastern ones.
- **Context 3:** Newly accessible areas, liberated and where it is foreseen the situation might remain stable in terms of security.
- **Context 4:** Non-Government Controlled Areas (NGCA)

Shelter Cluster Strategy objectives

- Most vulnerable people affected by conflict (displaced and non-displaced) have access to adequate shelter and NFI assistance (in kind and in cash modalities).
- Most vulnerable people affected by the conflict receive shelter support that contribute to long-term recovery.

Winterization Strategy



Overview of Needs: Contextual Considerations

- 38.6 million sqm of damaged housing (estimation by the government of Ukraine)
- \$34 billion for the housing sector current damage estimation
- Over the last 3 months through the Shelter Cluster, humanitarian actors have prioritized emergency shelter support - total of 1.57 million displaced people and 1.26 million non-displaced war affected people targeted.
- 1.1m in collective centres; school decongestion prioritized for alternative accommodation: other CCs, rent, hosting, return (270K target)

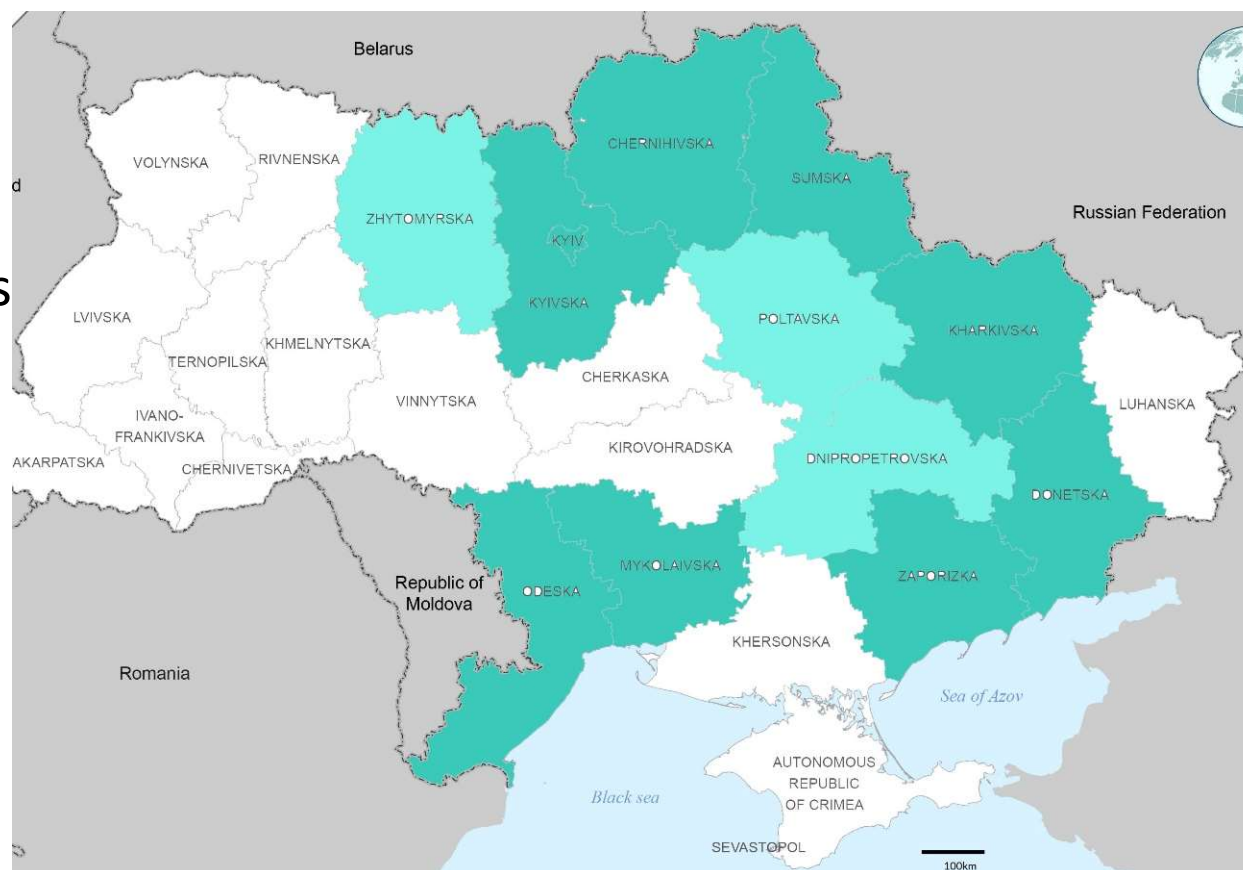

- Provision of solid fuel
- Winter NFI
- Insulation



Proposed Response:

Key considerations in the winterization program design

- Affected population groups with specific vulnerabilities (IDPs, non-displaced, returnees, hosting families)
- Accommodation context (communal premises, those residing in their own homes, those being hosted and those renting); status of building heating system (working, or in need of repair).
- Status of the infrastructure (availability of functioning centralized heating systems, gas and electricity grids): ***gov coordination with central/local***
- Accessing and supporting markets, local supply and affordability
- Access (availability of a functioning markets of solid fuel, stoves, winter clothes, etc; availability of safe/affordable transportation to and from markets).

Proposed response: Technical Approach

1. **Cash for Rent:** targeted and supplementary
2. **Cash and voucher** support for additional winters costs associated with solid fuel, utility and heating costs
3. **Non-food items (NFI):**
 - appropriate items for winter to increase thermal comfort
 - winter clothing sets
 - household heating appliances
4. **Solid fuel** in-kind distribution of coal, wood, pellets, etc. Whenever needed, distribution of solid fuel will be mandatorily coupled by the provision of a stove.

Proposed response: Technical Approach

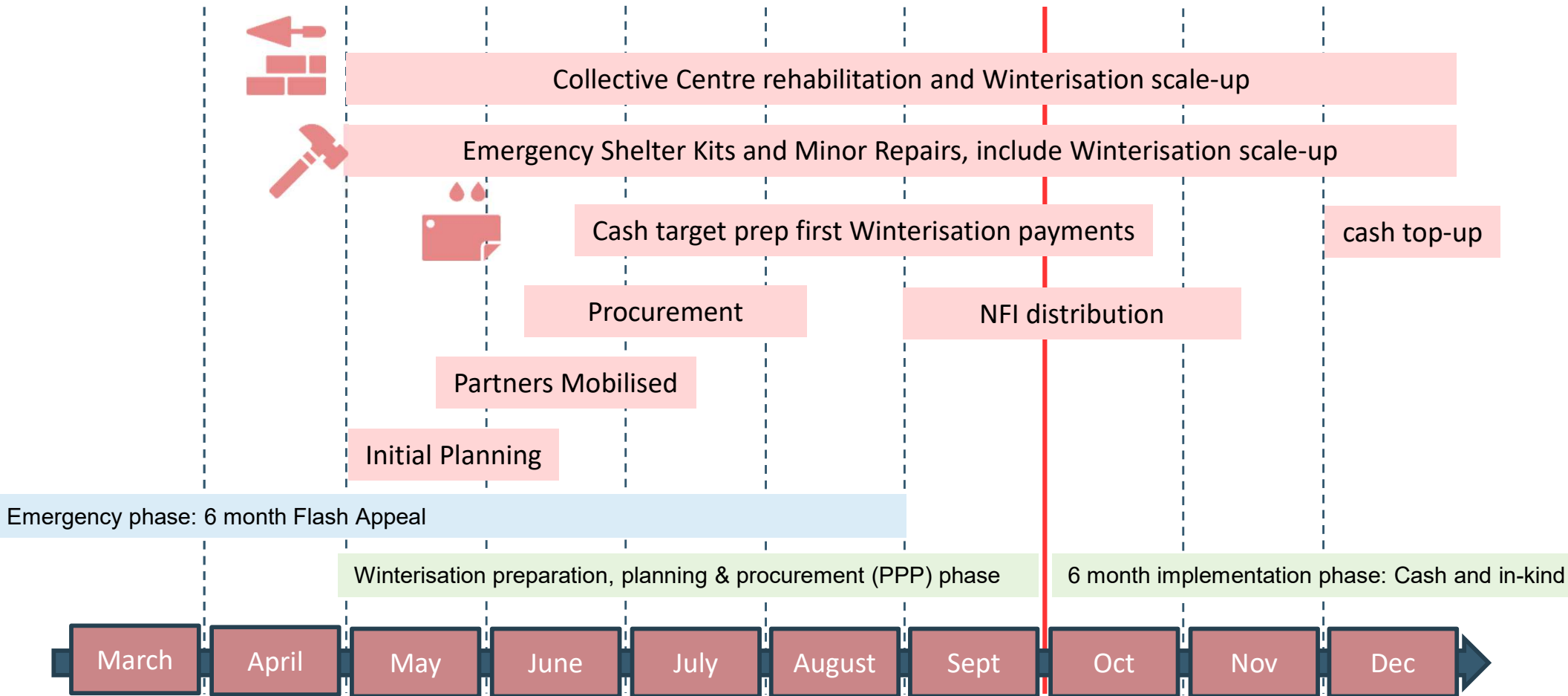
5. Winterization of Collective Centres: two types of interventions will be considered:

- fixing leaking roofs, sealing gaps and replacing inefficient windows, with the aim at assuring minimum insulation standards
- repairing the existing (or installing a new) heating systems.
- Scaling up targets for longer-term habitation

6. Insulation: for individual homes for displaced and non-displaced, accompanying repairs programs as appropriate and also those families newly settled in rural cottages.

7. Repairs to local infrastructure in locations where central heating is provided at settlement level, in partnership with local government and service providers and WASH cluster priorities.

Overview of Winterisation Response: Timeline





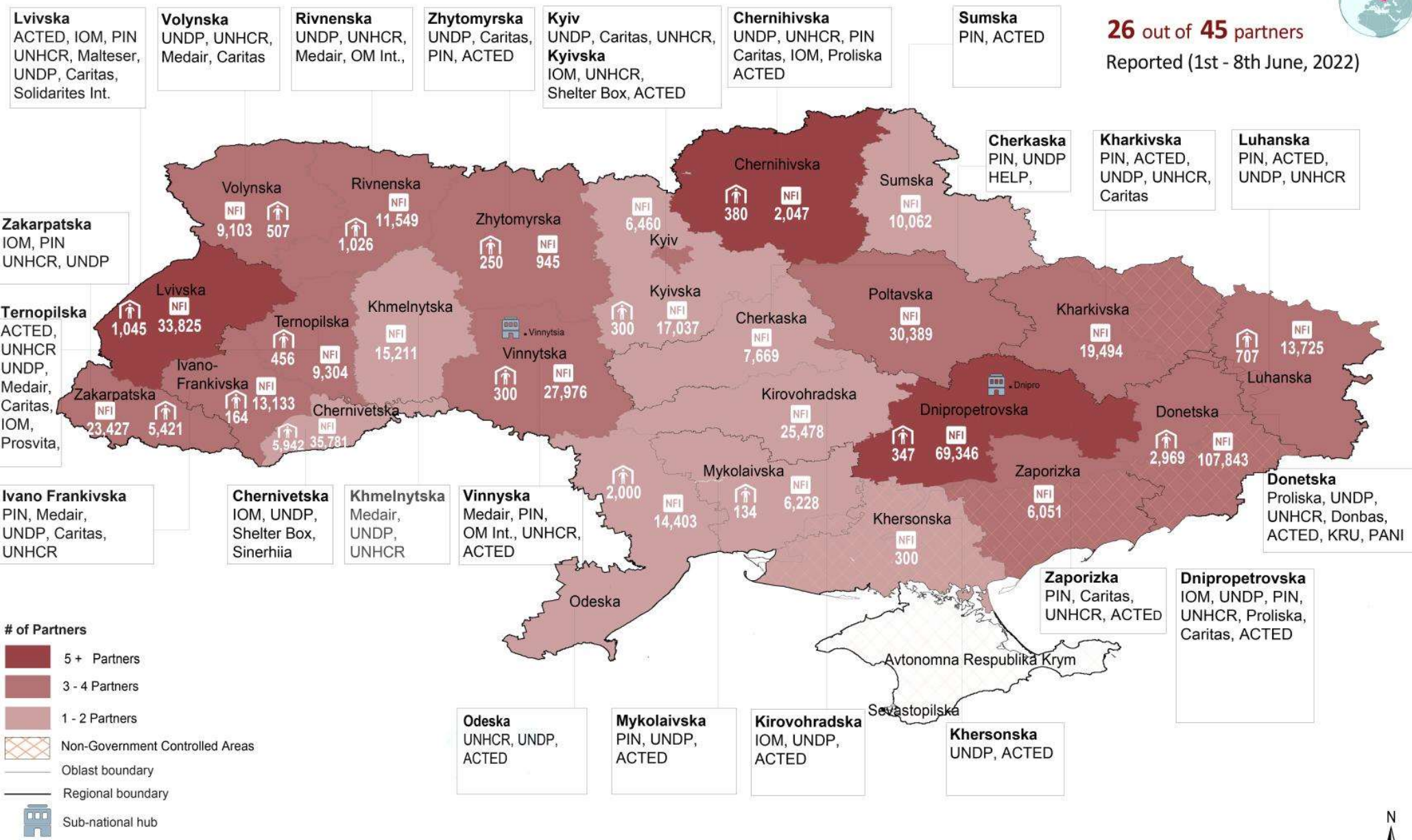
