Challenges

- There are insufficient supplies locally (provincial and regional levels).
- Port congestion may negatively affect inter-island programme operations.
- COVID-19 makes affected population more vulnerable.

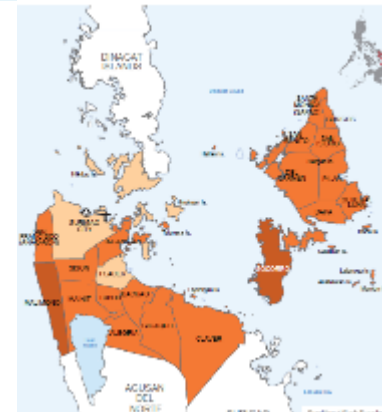

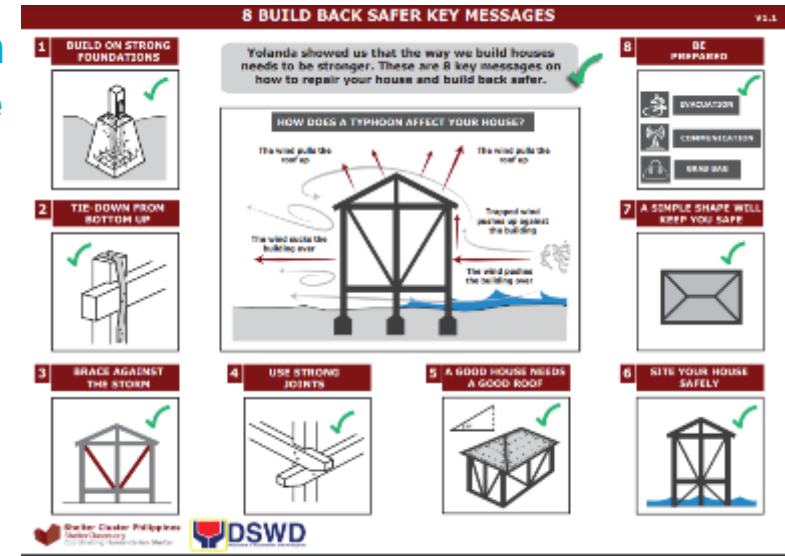

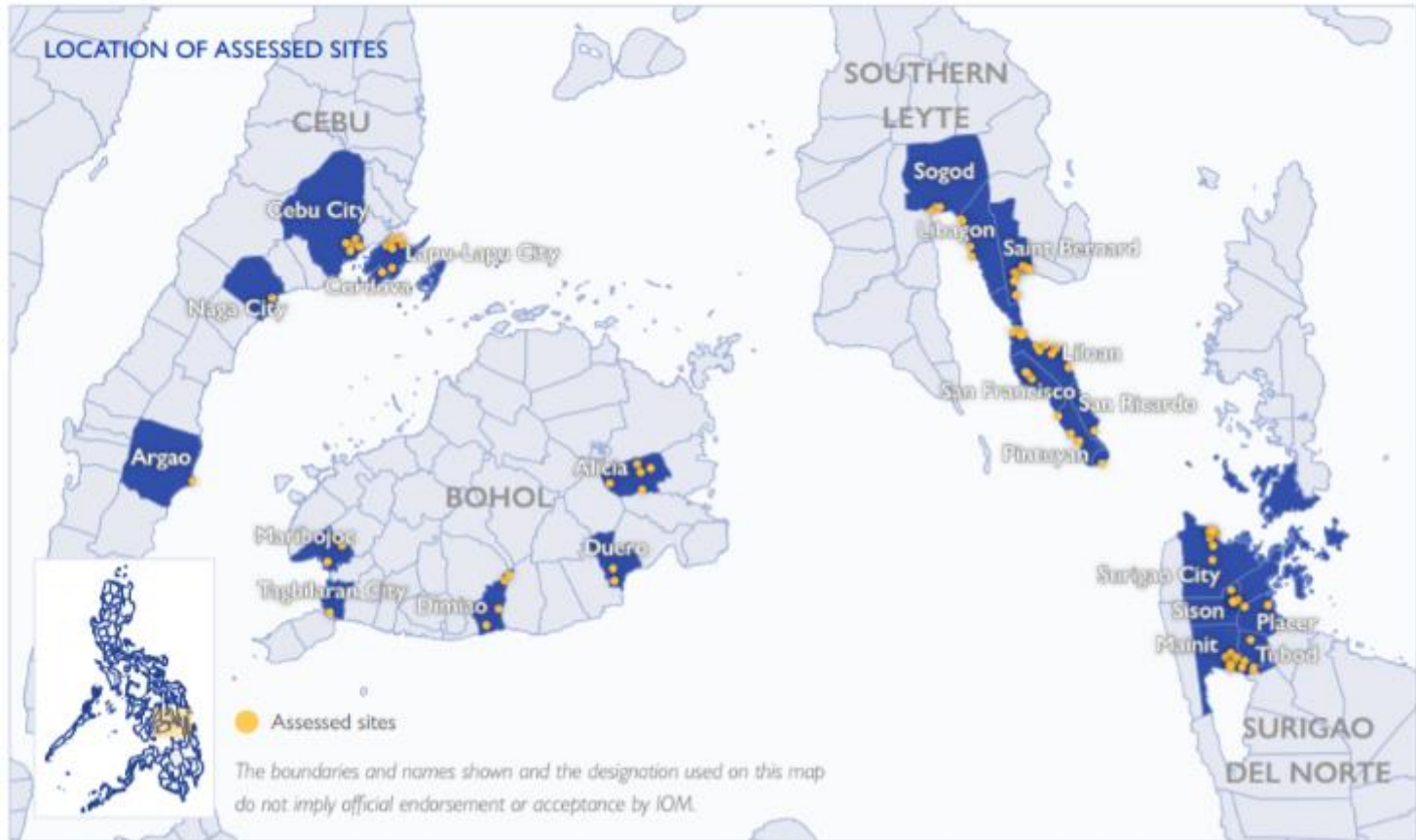

This DTM round is a rapid needs assessment conducted from 12-21 January 2022, to better understand the needs and gaps of IDPs inside evacuation sites. IOM covered 85 open evacuation centres across 22 municipalities in the provinces of Bohol, Cebu, Southern Leyte and Surigao del Norte, as a sample dataset from the total displacement. The key informants are camp managers and local government representatives.

2. SITUATION ASSESSMENT

1. Some 30% of trees collapsed; Electricity and tel. com mainly absent till early Feb. 2022; roads and water supply restored
2. Over 4.000 partial and fully destroyed houses (70-30 %), scattered mainly poor households, also in uplands
3. Households are temporary housed with friends/ relatives

3. *PROGRESS AND NEEDS*

1. Distribution of food packages to 122 prioritized households (600 persons), Dec. 2021- Mid Jan. 2022
2. Pressing wide demand for shelter rehabilitation
3. Documentation and prioritization of victims – waiting list of 400 households
4. Distribution of 90 Roofing sheets (packages of 5 sheets) plus nails to 18 prioritized households ca
