

Malatya shelter sector meeting was held on Monday 27 March 2023

Action points:

1. Partners to share field observation with Shelter cluster, when possible with photos, and identified shelter related needs.
2. Shelter Sector to compile field observation/needs/gap information and share with partners.
3. Shelter sector/partners to identify priority area (geographic area, type of intervention) for Malatya
4. Shelter Sector to clarify most updated damage data.
5. Partners to continue seek options for summer assistance.
6. Partners to provide inputs to TWiG shelter NFI kit doc, especially on the cooking stove/fuel section.
7. Partners to discuss options to empower rural communities in rebuilding their homes.

Meeting notes:

Shelter Sector:

- Shelter Sector has now hub coordination in 4 provinces – Hatay, Maras, Adiyaman, and Malatya. Malatya will have weekly shelter meeting every Monday 5pm. (to be update if changed)
- Shifted from 3W to Activity info. Contact Heleen (Shelter Sector IM, sheltersectorim1.turkiye@ifrc.org) if partners do not know how to report to Activity info.
- Malatya is the 3rd most affected province in terms of damage, also is one of the province with largest figure of displacement. Shelter intervention - more tents, tarps, shelter improvements are required.
- Cold weather warning later this week – Partners please pay attention, and provide support if needed.
- Some of the large settlement in urban centre are well known with needs, while less or almost no information in remote districts, although needs are reported in DTM round 1

TSS:

- In Malatya, 16,497 containers are plans at 53 locations, 32 in the Malatya city center, 21 in other districts.
- A total of 17,125 citizens were placed in 4,817 containers in 9 locations.
- Serdar will share location of container cities.
- DTM Round 1 data set: 413 locations (fomal/informal site, neighbourhood) in Malatya expressed needs. See Quick mapping exercise on google map for prioritization of response: <https://www.google.com/maps/d/edit?mid=1UJZq6S0lVWewwmKQyta4JrpDLGGRnWA&usp=sharing>

Malatya Şam Derneği :

- Together with CWW, distributing tents, tarps, and NFIs with a focus on 4 districts: **Akcadag, Doganşehir, Yesilyurt, and Battalgazi.**
- Planed – distribute solar lights in Sugar Factory tent site.
- Covering most of needs in **Polat** with tents and NFIs. Pallets are still needed.

UNHCR:

- UNHCR supporting tents and NFIs through AFAD.
- Sandbags are needed for locations such as Malet tent city.
- Cold weather may trigger fire incidents as people will burn more fire for heaters. Should raise awareness on fire incident.
- Will share more information from site visits.

IOM:

- Pallet: 2,088 distributed in Malet and Sugar Factory sites, more pallets are in procurement
- Tarpaulin: 1,000 handed over to Battalgazi, 500 handed over to Dogansehir
- Blanket: 3,000 handed over to Battalgazi
- Mattress: 1,000 handed over to Battalgazi
- Fire extinguisher: 130 handed over to Teknokent container city
- Compile pallets needs in Malatya and share with partners

TWiG Recommendation

- Draft list of Emergency shelter items, HH items are introduced. Partners are requested to provide feedback. Inputs on cooking stoves and fuels are appreciated.
- Supporting to return to lite/no-damaged dwellings: TWiG is discussing options for intervention. Interested partners to participate in Friday TWiG at 4pm.

Summer and Winter Support in Malatya

- Turkey has 7 regions with different climate conditions. In Malatya, humidity is relatively low compared to other region such as Hatay, yet it is more “burning” temperature during summer, reaching to 40 °C. Winter is harsh – can reach down to -10 °C.
- Shading: needed. Communal shading can be an option, yet to consider privacy.
- Tarp or Shading net may work. Continue to identify appropriate materials.
- NFI : fan, cooler box and other items for summer

Support to remote town (for people returning to original farmland)

- Needs: Animal shelters, storage for crops, shelter for families
- Chamber of agriculture can be a key contact point
- Feedback from Maras: Many farmers are keen to have containers at their land. Government process is not clear, but there may be NGOs who can support buying containers. There are already families who bought containers by their own resources.
