Action points from last meeting

- **Protection Sector** (Ezgi) will refer to STL possibility of deploying volunteers available in Maras (as informed by SARD).
- **OCHA and ACTED** to liaise in relation to a community needing tent and items for children/youth learning space.
- **Protection Sector to connect OCHA** with relevant tent city in relation to family looking for a tent.
- **Shelter sector** to check if there is damage data on neighbourhood level (of building level)? And to check if UNOSAT may have already damage detection maps prepared.
- **Shelter Sector to work with Protection Sector** on map of assistance and gaps that may emerge – and utilise Protection Sector resources that have some work done on this matter.
- **Shelter Sector** to develop best way to share the needs and include option to provide information who responded.
- **Partners** to attend TWiG to discuss support to rural communities (repair to homes) and summer kit.
- **Shelter Sector** to distribute Focal point ToRs and ask for expression of interest.

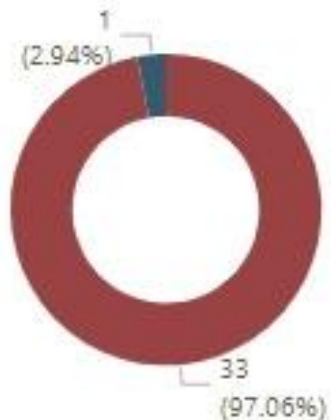

Update from Shelter Sector

- Interesting developments

Government (Army and municipality) replacing makeshift shelters with proper tents in informal (large – 500 tents) sites in Maras.

AFAD is registering displaced people in informal sites (potentially to support them?)

PMM in Hatay is asking NGOs for support by providing man power to set up tents.

Message from Information Manager

- Only 2674 HHs in Adiyaman assisted with improved living space.
- Do Partners know about other organisations working in Adiyaman that we are currently not capturing?
- Next reporting deadline is coming Friday 7 April COB?
- Shelter Sector IM is there to help if Partners need an Activity Info account or if there are any other reporting challenges.

Situation overview

Funding

- Under the [Turkiye Earthquake Flash Appeal 2023](#), the Shelter Sector response plan was budgeted at USD 246.6 million
- According to OCHA Financial Tracking Service (FTS) the [Shelter Sector response plan appeal](#) is **42.2%** funded (**USD 104.7 million**), which is a big increase in the last week but still leaving a considerable gap in resources to meet need.
- From the total funded, **USD 22,9 million (9.3%)** have already been made available to shelter actors.
- The remaining **USD 81,7 million (33.1%)** is to be still to be transferred, putting a considerable pressure on recipient shelter actors to implement their programmed activities within the Flash Appeal (by 17 May 2023).

Gap Analysis

Considering the government relief to recovery pathway and the scale of need, we may see some understandable delays and gaps in assistance to:

- Those along the government relief to recovery pathway, potentially keeping **families in tents** (tent cities) **for a longer period than initially planned**.
- Those **self-settled in tents waiting to access formal accommodation arrangements** (tent cities / other government arrangements).
- Those **self-settled in tents unable or ineligible to access formal accommodation arrangements** (tent cities / other government arrangements)
- Those **self-settled in tents choosing to stay close to their damaged houses**, within their community or their networks of support.

Situation overview

Gap Analysis (continuing)

- Self-settled families in informal sites or close to their damaged houses, in urban, peri-urban and rural areas, will either choose to, or have no other option but, to remain where they are until assistance pathways available to them are clarified and accessible.
- Those falling outside the formal, government-supported population are emerging as a key issue of concern to most in the humanitarian community.
- Ongoing planning is being carried out strategically to monitor the needs of this vulnerable and homeless population, with the aim of providing them with necessary assistance.
- This will require a shift from bulk assistance in kind to improved programming and informed and realistic targeting towards priorities.

	Household Shade	● ● ○ ○ ○	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shading kits distributed at HH level • Can use standard Emergency Shelter Kits (ESKs) • HH led initiative but with technical support if needed
	Tent Shade	● ● ● ○ ○	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fixed shade over whole tent • Can be constructed in rows, steel columns, concrete foundation • Shade netting is lighter and less affected by high wind
	Community Shade	● ● ○ ○ ○	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shade provided in available space per block or unit of tents • Multi-purpose use • Male / female areas depending on community wishes
