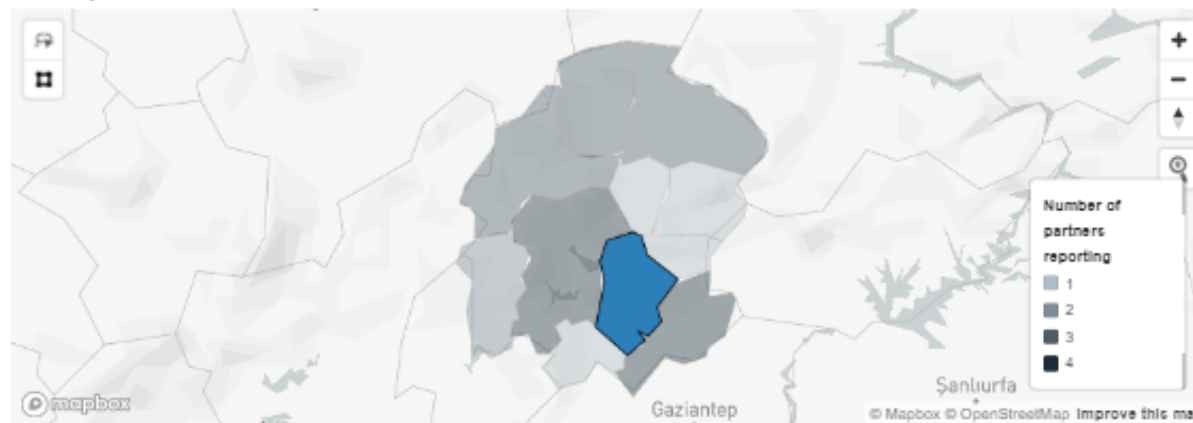

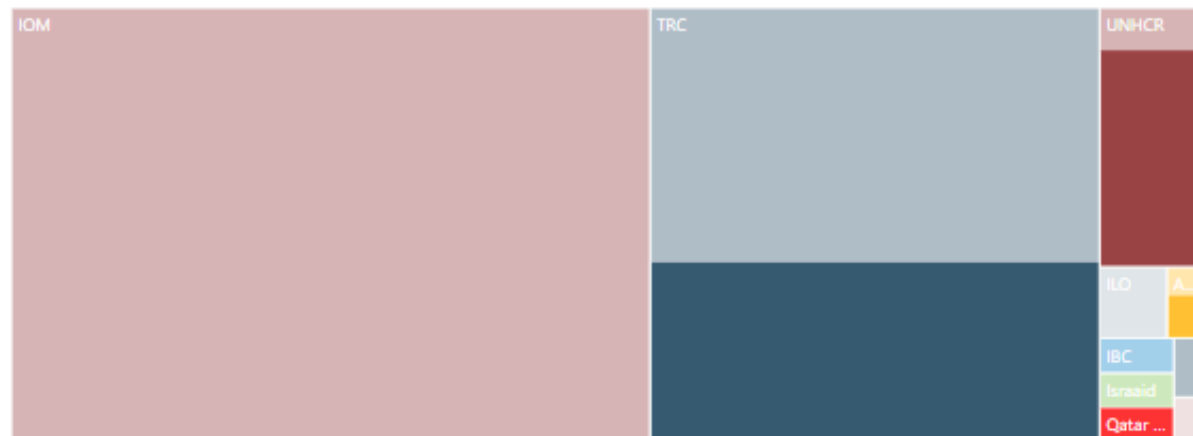

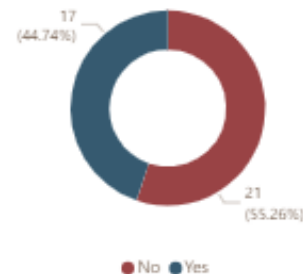

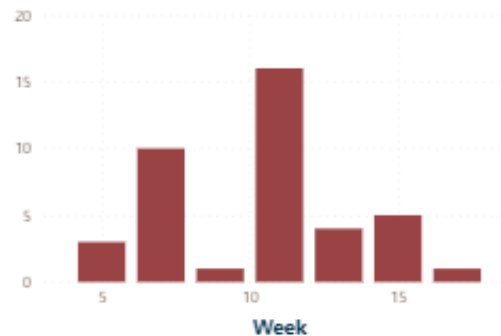

Update on FSL

Hot meals will be phased out in informal sites on 31 May. Below is a list of informal sites that are currently receiving hot meals support. TRC did assessment of those sites and calculates number tents (Maras =2,250) and individuals (Maras =11,400) affected, and availability of water and eligibility for receiving food baskets in those sites. **Presence of kitchen sets was not assessed.** Partners are encouraged to assess those locations and consider them for distribution of kitchen sets. TRC advised that if shelter partners do registration for kitchen sets distributed then TRC can also complement with food baskets.

Formal tent sites will be provided with hot meals until necessary.

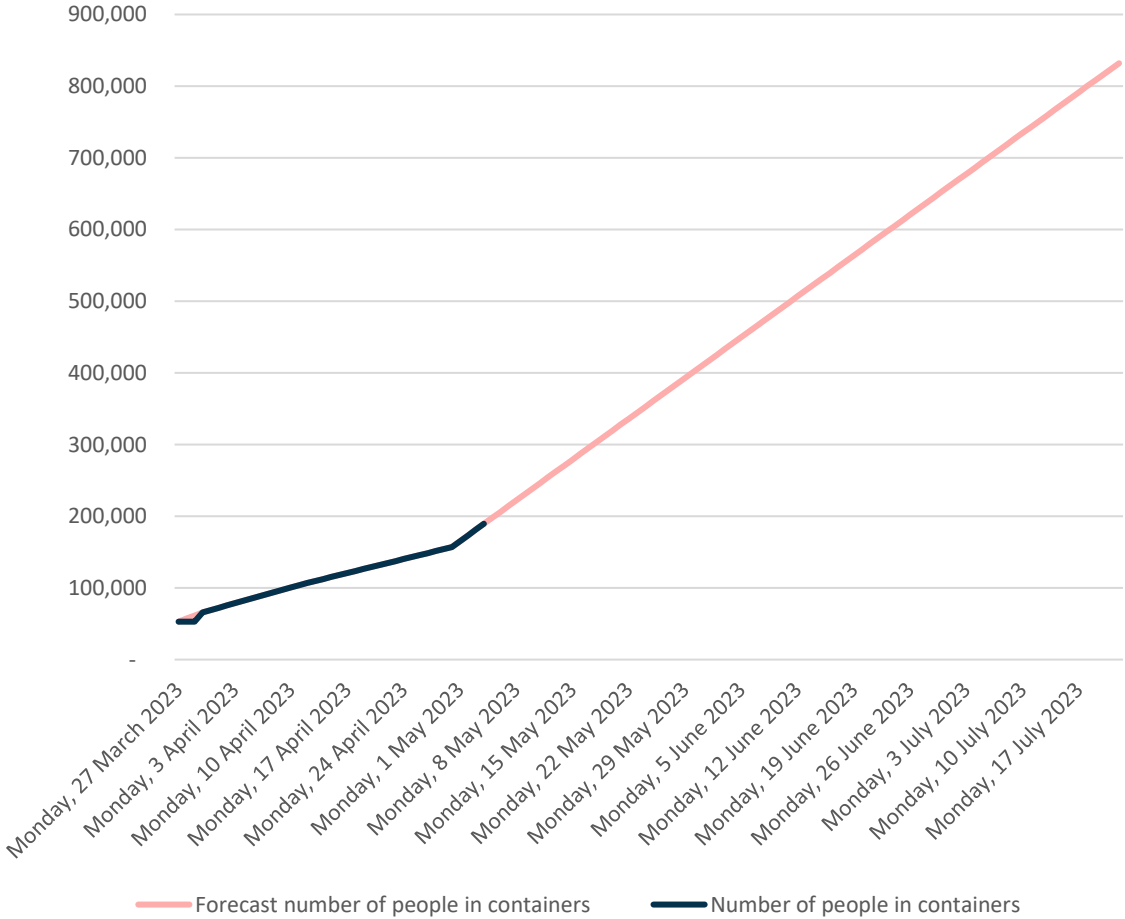

218K applications for a container

With the current speed, everyone who applied for it will be in a container by **22 July 2023**

1.77M people still in tents (not considering other solutions such as hosting or rental arrangements, or repairs)



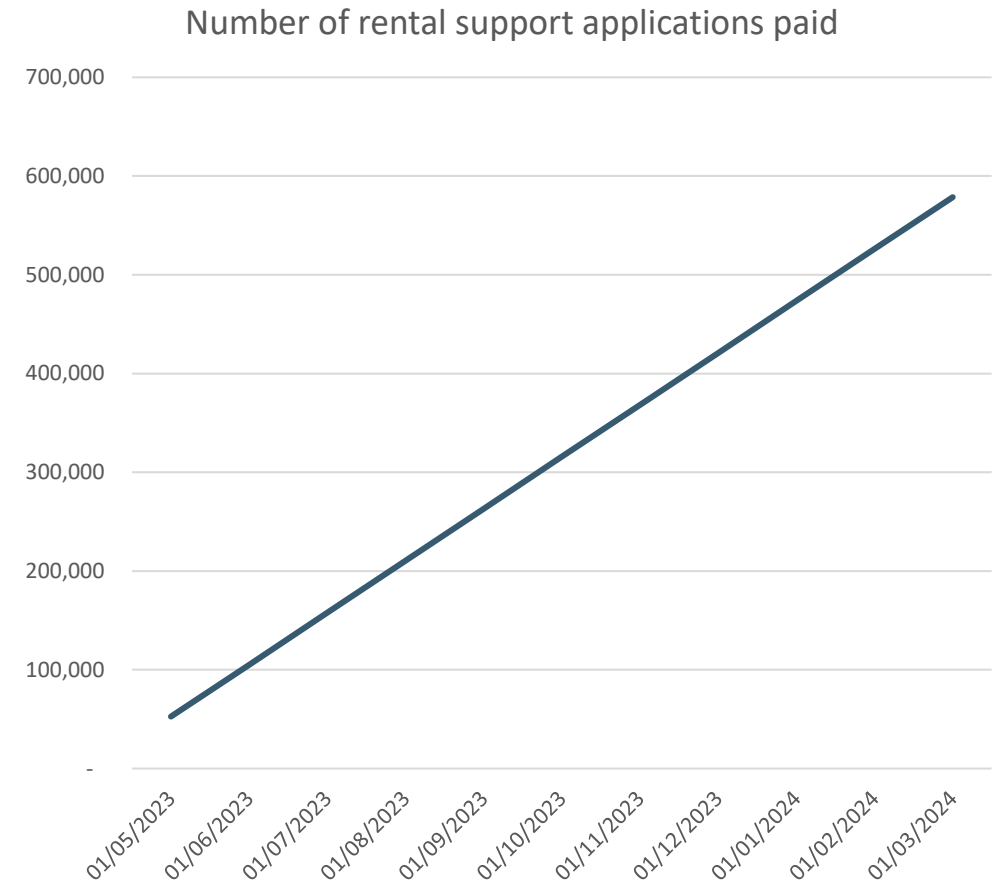
Situation overview - forecast

How long are people staying in tents?

When do people receive rental support?

Assumptions:

- 52,5K families receive rental support each month
- Best case scenario: each family receiving rental support moves out of a tent
- Worst case scenario: 1/4 families receiving rental support moves out of a tent

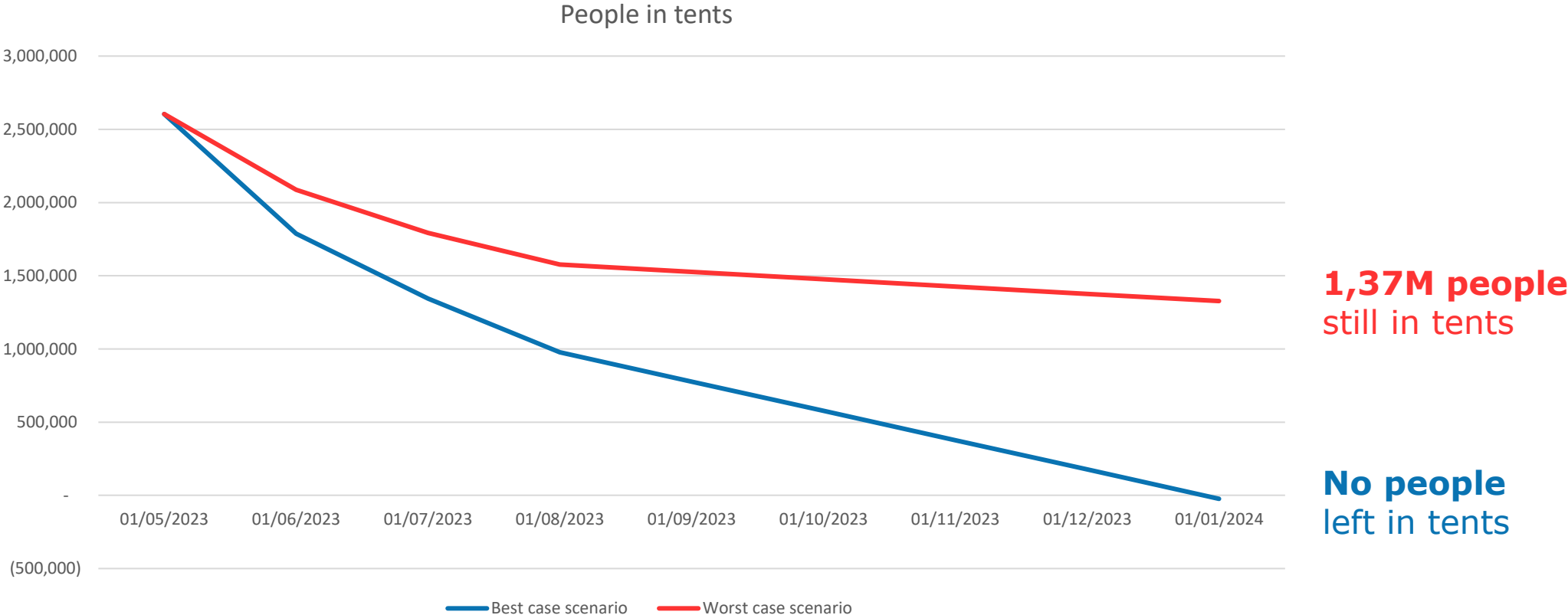


Situation overview - forecast

How long are people staying in tents?

Combining rental support and containers as drivers for people to move out of tents:

Current caseload: **2,6M people** in tents

How long are people staying in tents?

Other factors to consider

- Rental support: no info on how many people have actually received rental support, and if people use that money to move to rental accommodation
- Hosting arrangement: no insight on how many people are considering this and the timeline for it
- Repairs: no insight in how many people with light damaged buildings that are repairable that are still in tents

TWiG Recommendations

- No TWG this Friday, next will be on Friday 26 May at 16:00, in Gaziantep IFRC office and online.

Next priority TWG topics (suggested):

1. Guidance on integrated / area-based approaches for longer term settlements (such as the container cities)
2. Specific guidance for shelter support to people living in tents in informal sites. Many people living in tents in the informal sites are likely to stay in tents during the hot summer months, with basic living conditions and limited services. There are rising concerns for both shelter adequacy and safety for those families, especially regarding:
 - Safe cooking: in areas where the provision of hot meals will end, people will increasingly cook for themselves in the tents. This will require the sectors to think about cooking items, safe cooking devices, fuel and facilities, water for cooking and dishwashing, fire safety and prevention (items, guidelines, awareness messaging).
 - Thermal comfort: both in communal areas and individual shelters (extreme heat mitigation/shading and cooling)
 - Vector control, such as mosquitoes but also increasing reports about snakes and scorpions.

Action points:

1. WWF Turkiye contacts will be shared by the GSC Green Team and WWF US with Shelter Sector Turkiye, along with case studies for similar context that can provide inspiration on NBS and community & livelihood based interventions.
2. TWG sub-group to work on the Shelter Sector Guidelines for Temporary Shelter Support and compendium in one online session on Wednesday 17 May (TBC) and to finalise the draft guidelines by **the 18th May COB**. Editing group members: Shelter Sector Technical Coord, RI, Medair, IOM, UNHCR.
