WINTERIZATION: Updates from the hubs

Hub Updates from TSS Colleagues

KAHRAMANMARAS:

- **Tarpaulin and heater** needs
- Communities are requesting for **winter clothes** as well

Malatya (Update from AFAD)

- AFAD shared a list of needs in rural areas for 78 sites. All need tarps and protection from rain. Please reach out to Shelter sector for more info or follow up on the referral sheet.

ADIYAMAN:

TARPAULINS

- The authorities in Gölbaşı requested 1000-2000 tarpaulins, both for some containersites and for the rural areas. TSS made the relevant referrals to the shelter sector, but there is no progress yet.

- Even if the tarpaulins are available in most sites, they are of low quality and torn easily due to excessive wind and rain, etc.

The communities need Sector specification tarpaulins

HEATERS

The governor's office is prioritizing rural areas, and then additional container sites could be given as needed. AFAD expressed the need for 3500 heaters in the Adiyaman center and Gölbaşı

Due to electricity cuts and high bills community started to install wood fired heaters inside the containers in rural areas

Meeting with AFAD Director in Adiyaman- 20 Dec 2023

- 11.000 tarpaulins and iron stakes (for anchoring purposes) delivered to individual containers mainly based at rural areas.
- Reportedly, there is no need for tarpaulin/anchoring in Adiyaman informal/individual site (*but reports from TSS differ [see next slide]*)
- A request was communicated for the Former Adiyaman TAC: coordinate with site management to connect the roofs of the containers with iron bars serving as anchoring of the units.
- AFAD asked for support – replacing the tents and foldable containers based in Sincik Cukan District. Any partner has the capacity may involve and meet the need.
- AFAD communicated the need for communal facilities, child friendly spaces to be constructed in the formal sites (33 based at city center – 21 based at cities).

Updates: Recent Fire Incidents

- **24.11.2023 - Hatay – Samandag (overloading electrical network)**
 - 14 individuals affected no casualty
 - 5 tents destroyed – HHs relocated to prefabricated shelters built by relatives
 - Blankets, Sleeping Items, Clothes were provided by the Sub-Gov. And Municipality.
 - **Need for Cash assistance**
- **28.11.2023 - Malatya - Bagcilar – 1 HH (overloading electrical network)**
 - 1 HH affected
 - 3 individuals were living there no casualty reported
 - **All needs were covered by AFAD**
- **4.12.2023 - Hatay - Defne: Prefab Toki Evler site (AC + heater in use together causing overloading)**
 - 12 HHs affected no casualty reported
 - 4 housing units out of use
 - **HH Appliances are needed**
 - 10 Winterization kits (by UNHCR) - **Cash Support by ACTED and CARE already covered**
- **14.12.2023 - Hatay - Manisa Organize Sanayi Konteyner Kent, Antakya. (Due to electrical overload)**
One affected household. CARE to provide dignity kit. **All household items needs covered (Antakya municipality).**

“The reason is electrical contact. Containers are close to each other. There is a fire hydrant just behind the affected container but site management or the residents are not trained to use it. There were also no hose or hydrant key accessible. Site management also mentioned that they have requested fire extinguishers but not delivered yet.”

FIRE INCIDENTS AND MITIGATION

FIRE INCIDENTS SO FAR (past 4 weeks)

3 fire incidents in Hatay and 1 in Malatya (no casualties). Main reason has been electrical overload

MITIGATION MEASURES:

- TSS reported as per DTM data on their recently completed formal sites survey, around 90% of all sites are equipped with communal fire extinguishers. But only some informal clusters have access to extinguishers.

Additional Updates on Needs in the response

Need for **contingency planning**: contingency stocks for emergency response to fire incidents. Which partners have prepositioned stocks?

Winterization assistance limitations to informal sites: Especially Hatay

- Relocations from tents to foldable container sites is ongoing (600 individuals relocated so far, target: 15,000 refugees from Hatay will be relocated to Uzumdali)
- Some ad-hoc household items distribution has been done for those in tents, but shelter assistance limited/ not permitted.
- Some assistance is not reported to Sector – do not have the full picture

What can be done about this?

Anecdotal information: **resistance to move to foldable container sites**: reason - livelihood opportunities, space constraints in foldable containers (well below Sphere standards)

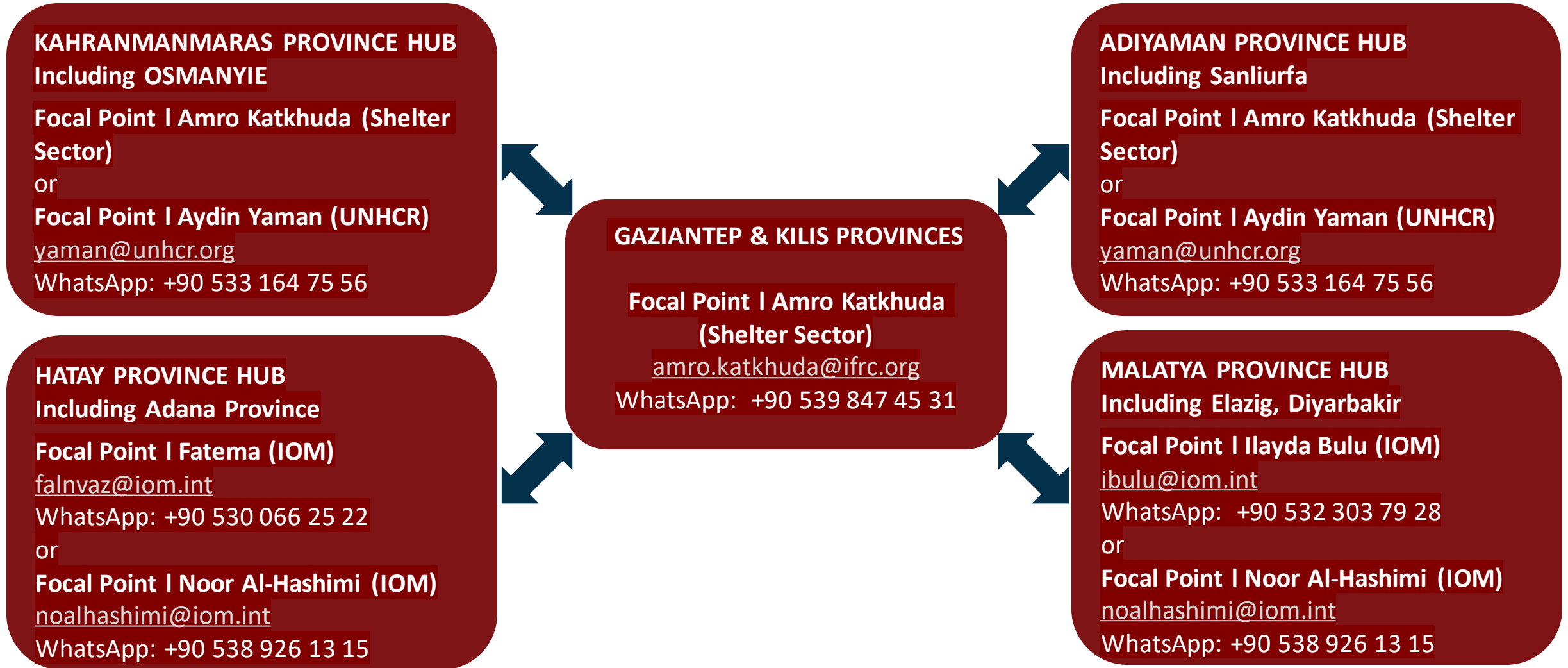
