COORDINATION UPDATE

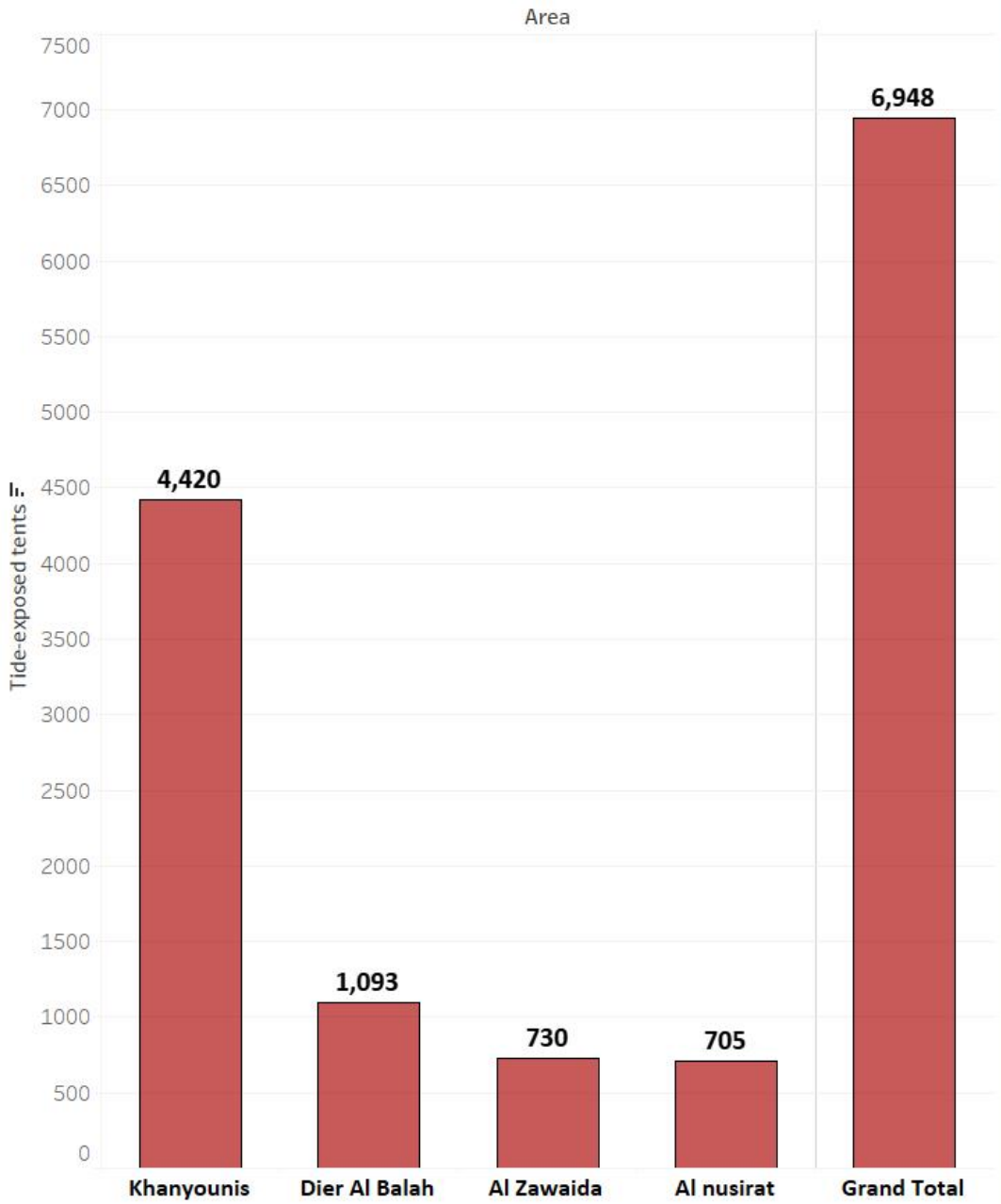
Raising tides and flooding:

- Inter-Sectoral flood taskforce led by OCHA, members are shelter, WASH, and SMWG. Discussions on mapping flood prone locations, identifying coastal sites at risk of raising tides, and mitigation measures, a workshop is planned on Thursday, where technical people from Wash and Shelter cluster will meet and provide IEC related material.
- Results of the preliminary assessment of the coastal sites in the middle area, Khanyounis and Rafah areas by BLDA, and CRS are shared with the SC for mapping and analysis.
- HF – fast track allocation status.
7 projects were submitted, SR started, recommendations for further consideration is made, next steps will include the technical review of the recommended projects.
- HF – monitoring previous allocation visits
1 visit conducted last week, the schedule for October visits is not yet shared with the cluster.

COORDINATION UPDATE

- Still managing to respond to shocks with shelter items – example Jabaliya Al Faluja school
- UNICEF tarps: following up with partners to collect information about targets, locations and HH reached.
- Energy Consultant – Frank.
- Kerem Shalom Shelter Items – we need to know what and whose is there so that the LC can get some items.
- Private Sector – company supplying cooking gas, stoves, blankets (and in future tents, tarps) came to meet us.
- Messaging on Shelter for affected populations.

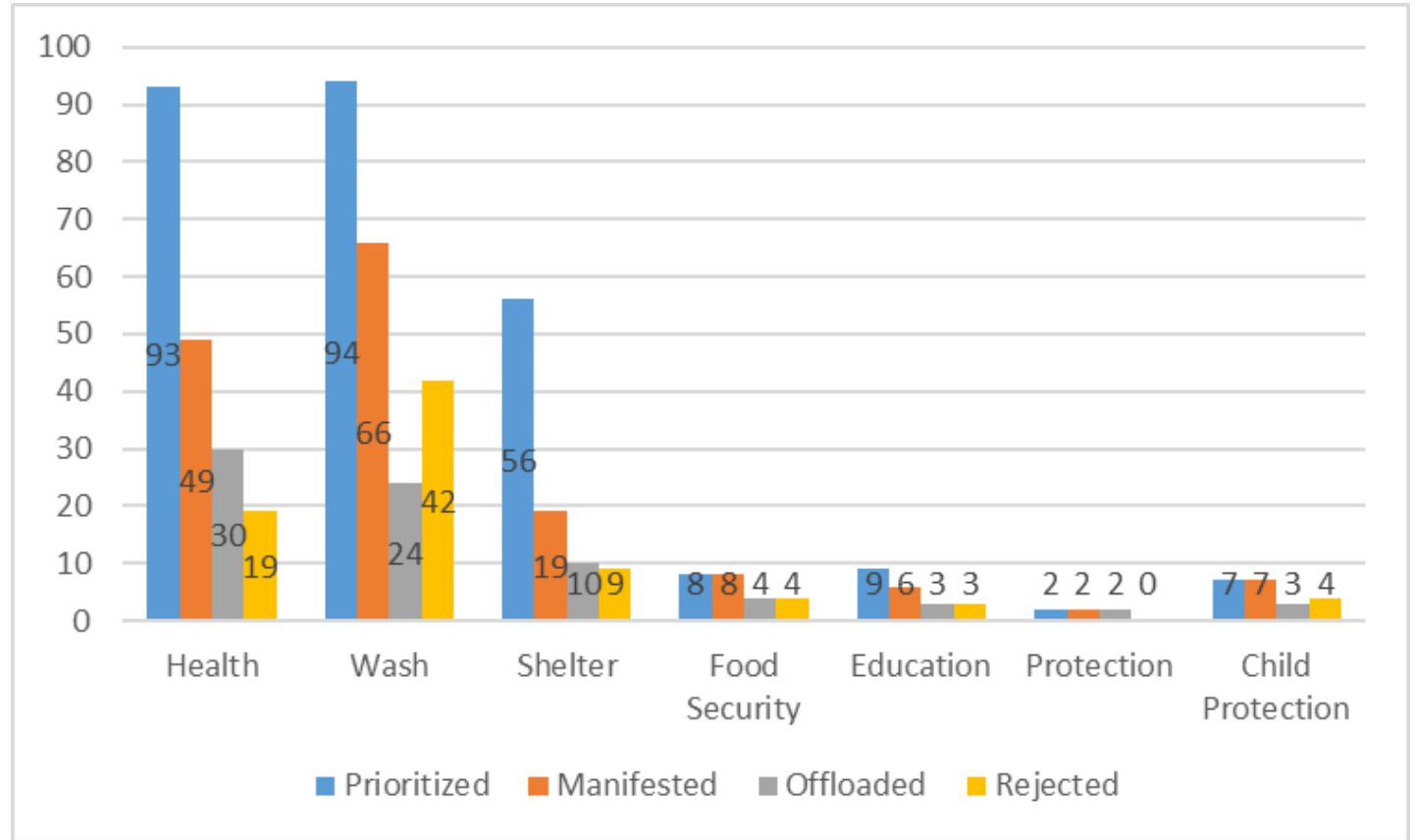
Total number of tents exposed to tide.
