

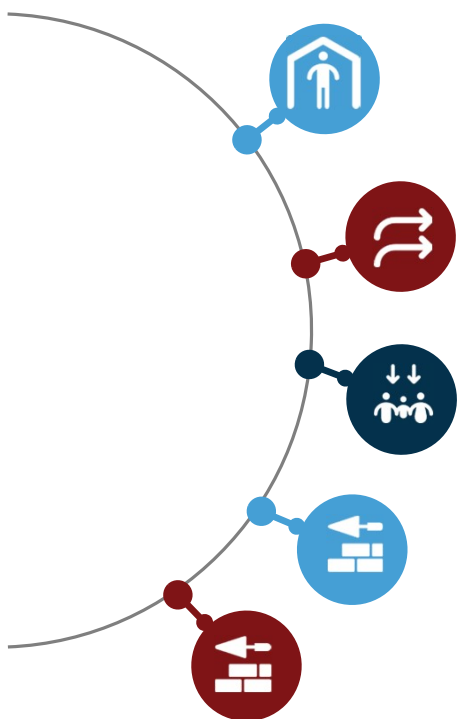

SITUATION UPDATES

- The situation continues to improve in a number of states following the recent retake of Al Jezirah, Boot in Blue Nile and Omudruman and part of Bahari by SAF.
- DTM estimates that 11,585,384 IDPs were displaced to 10,238 locations, in 185 localities, across all 18 states in Sudan as of 5 Feb 2025
- Out of the above 8,856,313 individuals were displaced internally within Sudan since 15 April 2023.
- An estimated 29 per cent of IDPs who were initially displaced prior to the onset of the current conflict experienced secondary displacement.

SITUATION UPDATES

- DTM further estimates that 3,506,383 individuals crossed borders into neighbouring countries since 15 April 2023.
- The top states of origin were Khartoum (31%), South Darfur (18%), and North Darfur (15%).
- The highest proportion of IDPs were hosted in South Darfur (16%), North Darfur (15%), and River Nile (9%) states.
- Over half (53%) of IDPs were reportedly children under the age of 18-years-old.

SUB-NATIONAL UPDATES (DARFUR & KORDOFAN)

- Armed clashes between parties to the conflict continued in North and South Darfur, and South and North Kordofan, resulting in displacement, deaths and injuries.
- In North Darfur, tension in and around El Fasher town, Shagra and Golo in El Fasher Rural locality escalated.
- In South Darfur, air bombardments targeted several areas, including Almatar area, Nyala airport
- SARHO suspended humanitarian activities (except health and water) and asked INGOs and NGOs to register with its offices in East and South Darfur.
- This suspension will likely exacerbate the suffering displaced and host communities.
- The region will be potentially affected by pause in US funding.

SUB-NATIONAL UPDATES (BLUE NILE)

- Blue Nile state total IDPs is estimated to be 484,614 individuals including 353,051 individuals displaced by the ongoing conflict in Sudan.
- The situation of IDPs from At Tadamon locality is concerning following RSF attack, as they reside in open areas at four gathering sites, with the number of households approaching 9,000.
- UNHCR, in collaboration with ADD, provided partial NFI kits and clothing at one gathering site for 845 IDP households displaced from the Tadamon locality (Alkarama, Gathering Site 4).
- AORD will provide 1000 local shelters and 1000 NFI kits - expected delivery time after two weeks.
- RI reported receiving 1000 NFIs and hygiene kits from IOM



SUB-NATIONAL UPDATES (RIVER NILE STATE)

- Participated in an inter-sector rapid assessment in Shandi locality highlighting urgent needs in Shelter and NFI for 66,015 households (33,075 individuals) who are living in open spaces. Their shelter conditions are very poor, offering no protection from harsh weather, and there is a lack of privacy and dignity for the IDPs.
- SCI has an ongoing plan for NFIs distribution to 1,800 households of IDPs in Shandi locality. So far, the registration has reached about 1,400 households, and it is expected to be completed during this week. The distribution will start immediately once the registration is completed.



SUB-NATIONAL UPDATES (GEDAREF STATE)

General Updates :

1. **Slight reduction in IDP numbers.** Specific figures are currently unavailable. Efforts are underway to gather data on IDPs with empty tents and vacated shelters.
2. **Site Relocation:** The government (HAC) has prepared a new site and requested the relocation of IDPs.
3. **Relocation from Schools:** The Ministry of Education has requested the relocation of IDPs currently sheltered in schools to the new gathering site.

SUB-NATIONAL UPDATES (GEDAREF STATE)

Shelter & NFI Cluster Achievements:

- **Contingency Planning:** The Sub-National Cluster agreed to develop a contingency plan for emergencies, focusing on fire response and unexpected caseload increases.
- **Fire Response:**
 - 36 shelters provided and installed for affected families.
 - 20 households received CRIs, with ongoing support for the remaining 32. (Note: 16 households chose to reside on land provided by relatives; this location is not a recommended site and is therefore not receiving cluster shelter support.)

SUB-NATIONAL UPDATES (GEDAREF STATE)

Progress & Challenges:

- **Fire:** Prevention messages planned, fire kits funding explored, centralized tent storage planned.
- **Schools:** Phased relocation (OCHA/MoE/HAC) underway. Phases 1-2 complete, 3-4 ongoing/planned Feb 2024. Needs verified, MoE support secured. No NFIs provided. More support needed for phases 3-4. Empty shelters suggested for reuse. Relocation area pending (SFH funds).
- **E. Al Jazeera:** Distributions paused due to IDP returns.
