Quick summary:

During this meeting, cluster coordinators and Cluster members discussed the HPC process and its expected outcomes, the CCPM evaluations results and the way forward, and the current situations in various regions including challenges faced by partners due to recent floods. They also discussed the upcoming meeting with donors aimed to address funding and resources mobilization issues.

1. HPC update

An overview of the HPC (Humanitarian program Cycle) process was given by the Coordination team. The shelter needs overview is based on the new Shelter Severity Classification which was introduced by the Global Shelter Cluster. The process includes defining the needs through data collections and analysis based on 3 pillars:

- Pillar 1: Shelter Conditions (Safety, Security, Privacy, etc)
- Pillar 2: Living Conditions (access to electricity, abilities to cook, Cooking facilities, etc)
- Pillar 3: Access to services (Water, Sanitation, Transportation, etc)

While the indicators have been discussed and shared with OCHA already, the data collection phase is expected to conclude by the end of August, with data analysis to follow early September.

2. CCPM – Presentation of result-Brainstorming

The Cluster coordination team presented the results of the CCPM for which data collected occurred in between may and august 2024. 7 core functions were evaluated:

- **Supporting Service Delivery:** 78% score considered as satisfactory, with comments on the need for better information sharing and coordination among partners especially on funding opportunities.
- **Informing Strategic Decision Making:** 68% score considered as satisfactory, with a need for improved gap analysis and information sharing with other clusters.

- **Planning and Implementing Cluster Strategies:** 72% score considered as satisfactory with comments on the need for better subnational coordination which has been identified as not working well.
- **Advocacy:** 71% score considered as satisfactory especially on the strategic vision and planning.
- **Monitoring and Evaluation:** 67% score considered as satisfactory.
- **Contingency Planning:** 55% score considered as weak, with a need for better response mechanisms and stock management. An emphasis was made of having rapid response mechanism to reduce delay in assistance.
- **Accountability to Affected Population:** 68 % score considered as satisfactory with comments on the need for better inclusion, feedback mechanisms and advocacy for more access constraint issues.

An action plan will be developed during an upcoming CCPM workshop to address the identified gaps and improve cluster functions.

3. Sub National cluster updates – partners updates activities

- PODR highlighted the situation in Geneina and ALIGHT Organization highlighted the critical situation in South and west Darfur due to floods, with a need for shelter and non-food items.
- Samaritan Aid Organization (SAO) reported on the challenges faced in transporting Non-Food items from Chad to South Darfur due to a broken bridge. They will send detailed information about the location and challenges to the coordination team who committed to reach to the logistics cluster to find a solution for SAO transportation needs.
- National Organization for Humanitarian Services (NOHS) emphasized the need of better coordination and gap analysis at the subnational level.

4. AOB

The coordination team reminded participants about the importance of reporting and the upcoming meeting with donors. The meeting with donors is scheduled for Thursday, 29th August 2024. With a focus on presenting the current situation and informal exchange with donors. The coordination team encouraged the participants to collaborate and share information to improve the overall response. They were also asked to be prepare if any question arise and be very brief due of constrains of time.
