Country cluster highlights

Nigeria | Myanmar

Nigeria SC

3.4 M PIN | 1.5 M targeted |

920 K people without adequate shelter

4.6% funding received

Continued partner withdrawal will leave entire locations uncovered

Since January, 55.6 K people across 110 sites in Borno, Adamawa, and Yobe have been directly affected **by fires, floods, windstorms, and evictions**

In July, UNDRR and GSC Green team conducted a **DRR workshop in Maiduguri for cluster stakeholders** (planned a second online webinar in September)

Urgent Priorities

- **\$1.4 M for shelter construction and maintenance kits for 8,925 affected households** and alternative accommodations for IDPs living in flood plains
- **\$1.2 M for NFI for 7,954 HH**



Myanmar SC

5.2 M PIN | 2.5 M targeted | 950.000 people reached

Funding **requirement \$189.8 M** (funded \$16.7M)

91% gap for shelter response

99% of the response emergency shelter and **1% transitional**

5 months since the EQ

NW Needs assessment (June-July 2025):

43K HH affected

14K fully damaged houses

13K partially damaged houses

Shelter top priority in 64 sites

92% of locations reported functioning markets

86% prefers cash as modality

Coordination, interagency support for EQ response – deployments (UNHCR), remote support (NRC co-coordinator, IFRC subnational coordinators) and local secondments CRS (KMSS subnational)

Urgent Priorities

Scale up shelter and NFI response Fund transitional and longer-term shelter solutions to reduce prolonged displacement and enable returns

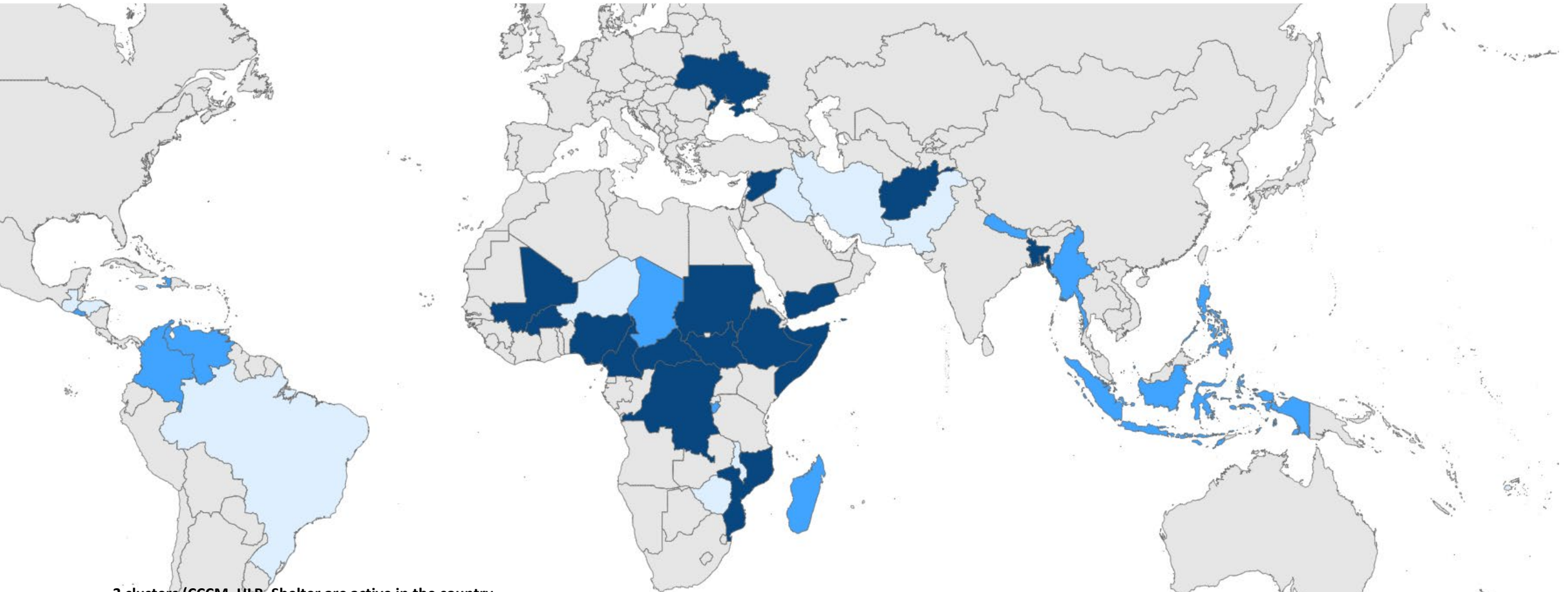

3 clusters (CCCM, HLP, Shelter are active in the country = 17 Countries)



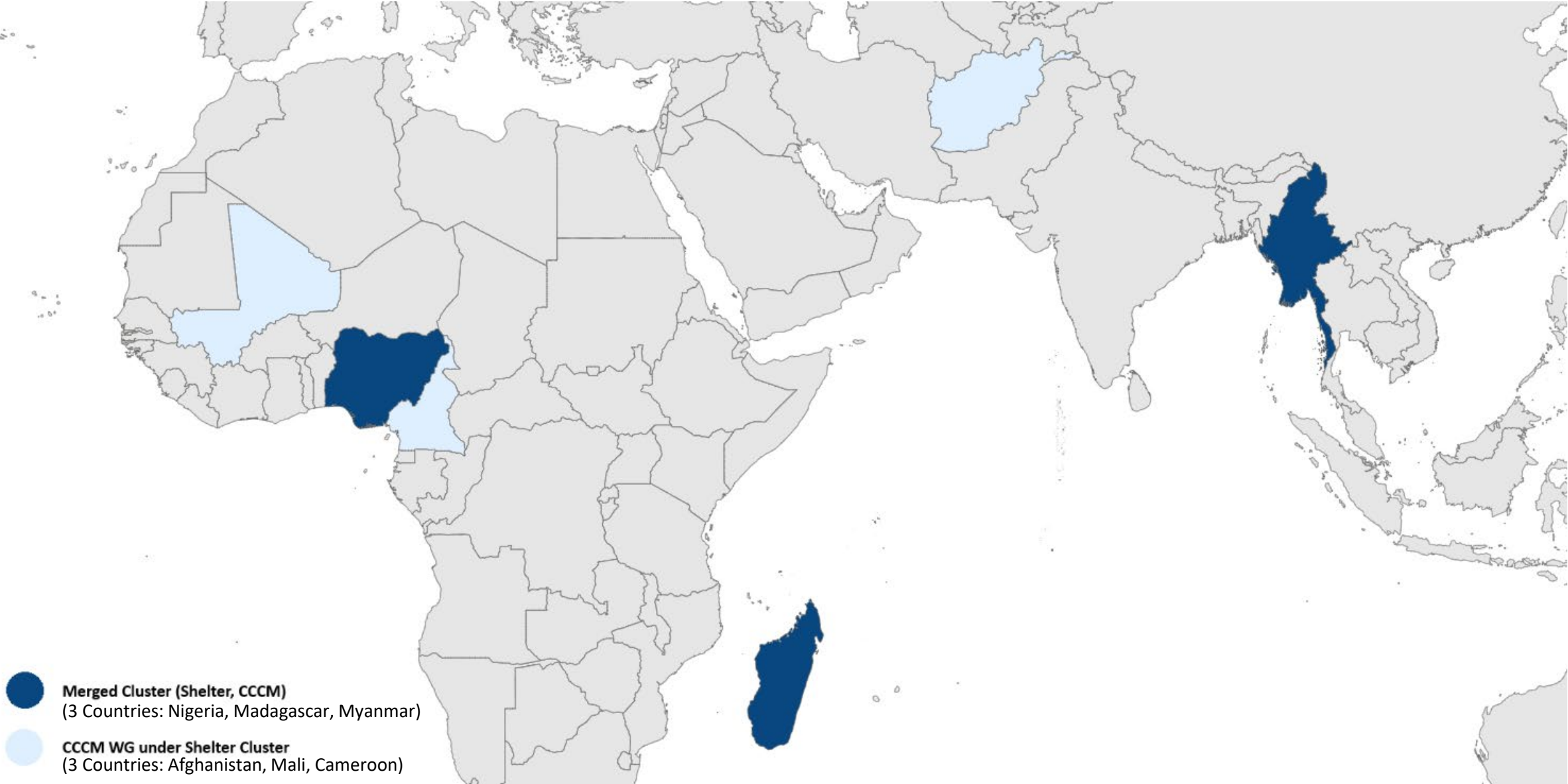
2 clusters (2 out of the 3 entities – CCCM, HLP and Shelter – are active in the country = 12 Countries)



1 cluster (1 out of the 3 entities – CCCM, HLP, Shelter – is active in the country = 14 Countries)

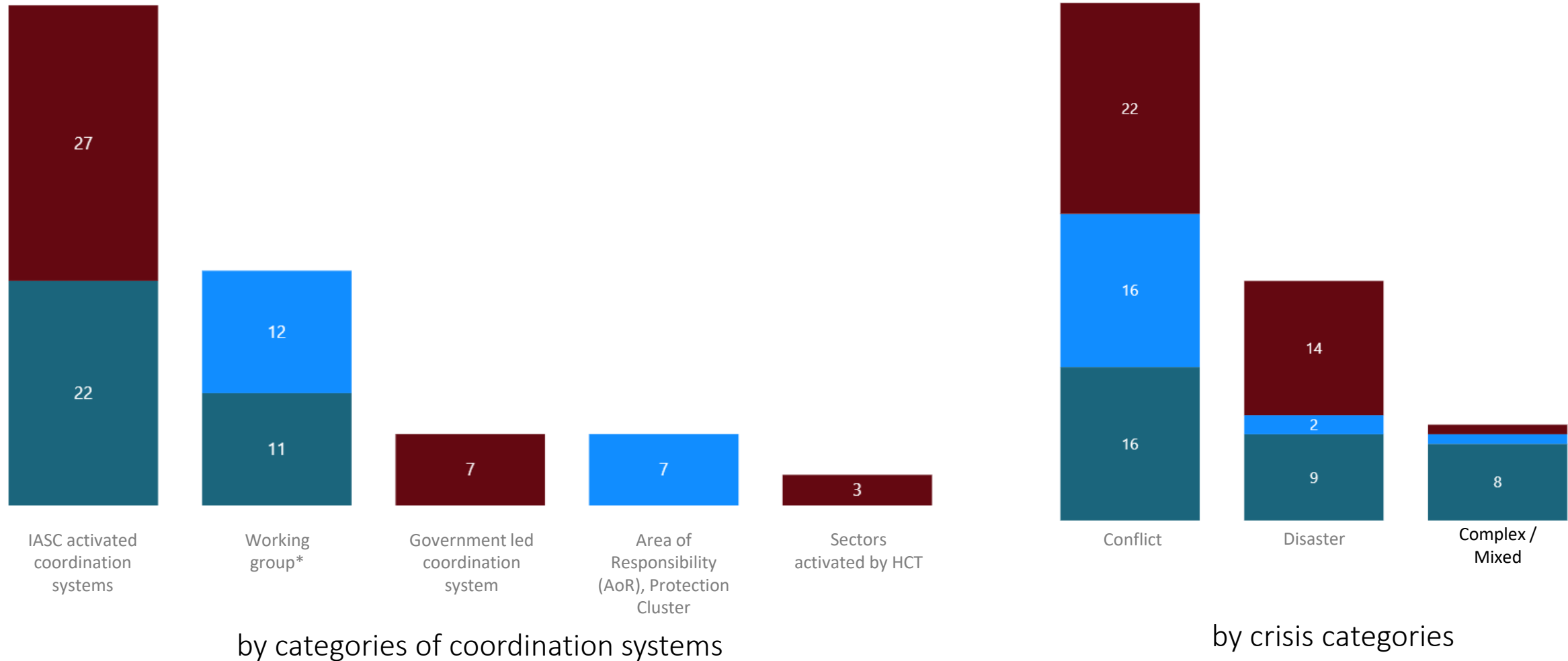
CCCM active in 33 countries

Categories of coordination systems in country

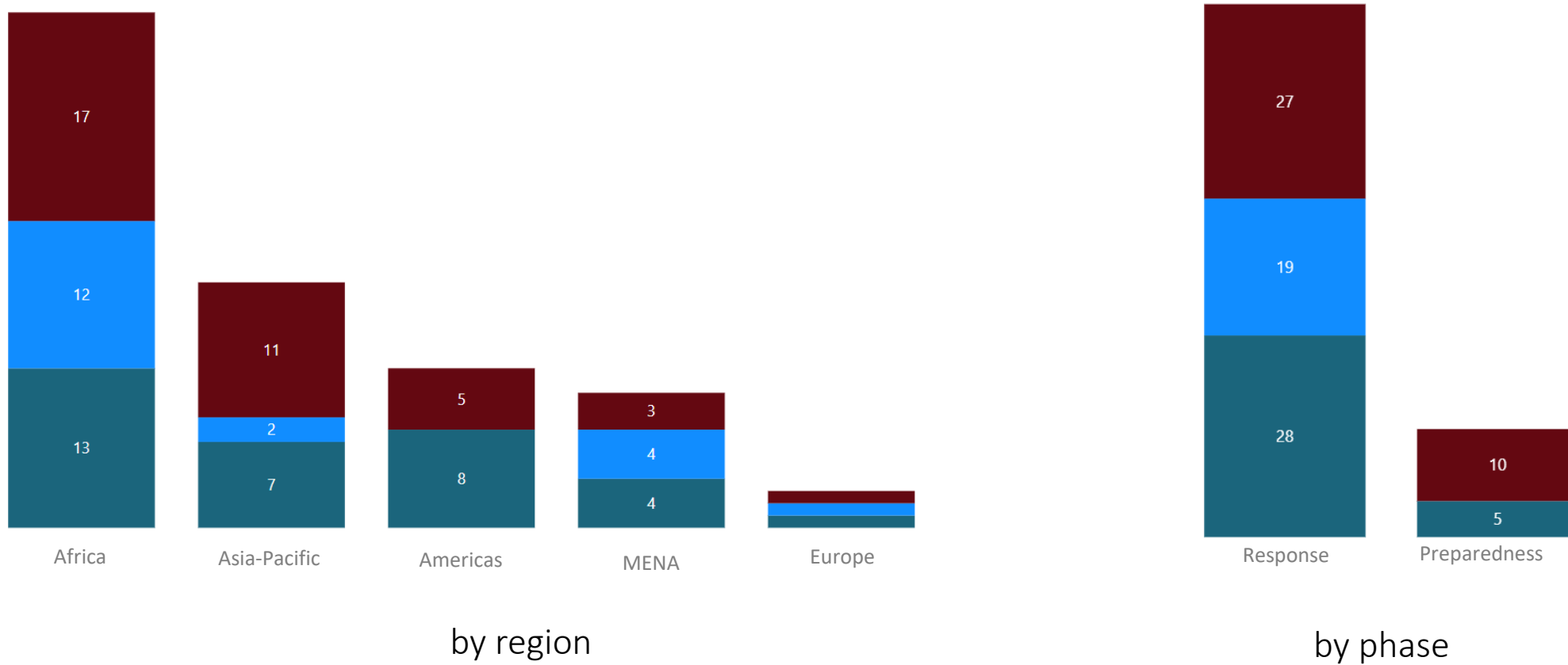

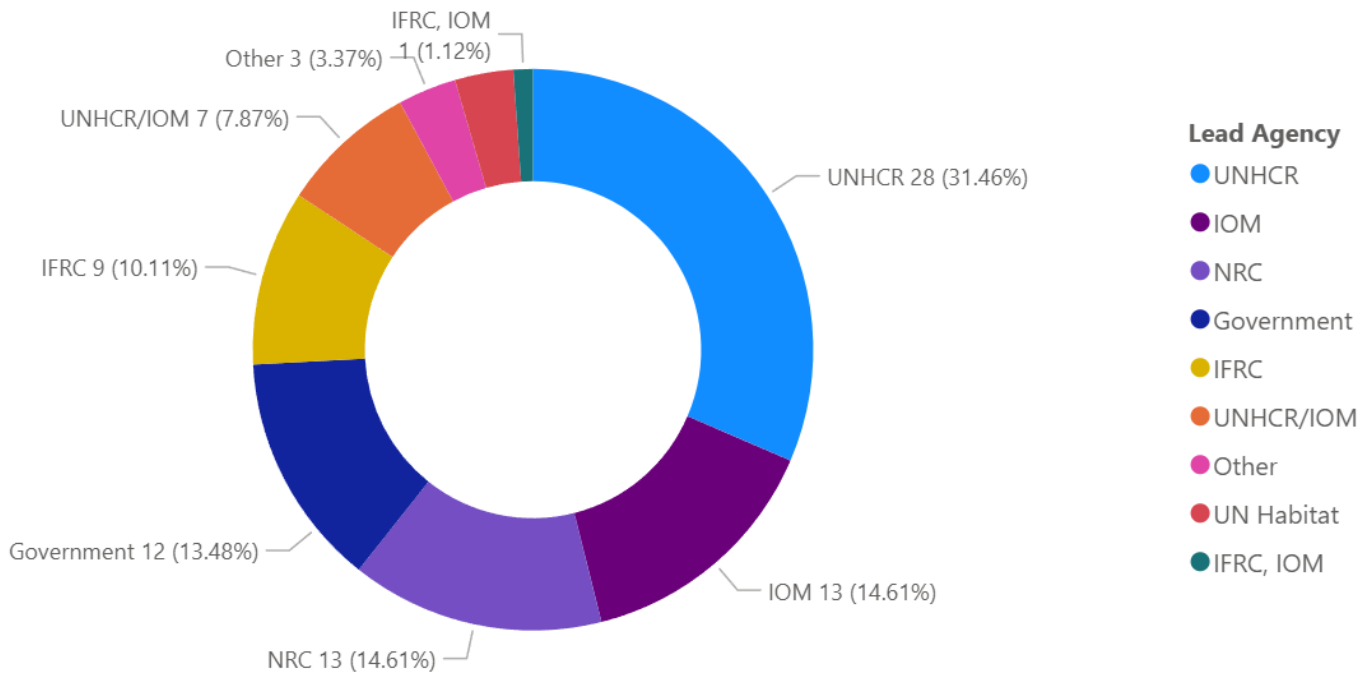

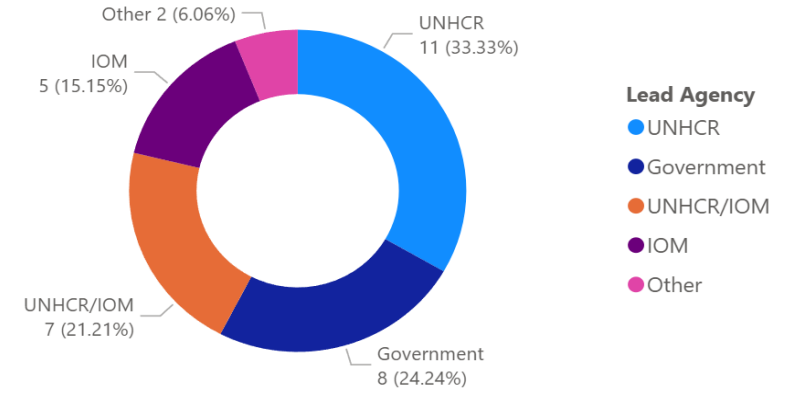


Country level cluster lead agencies 2025

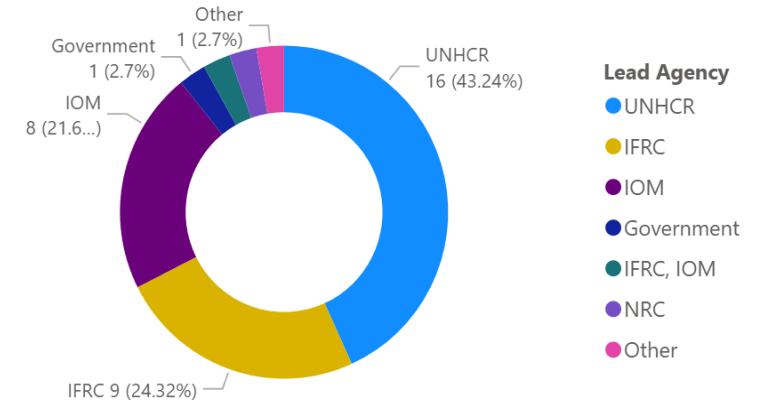

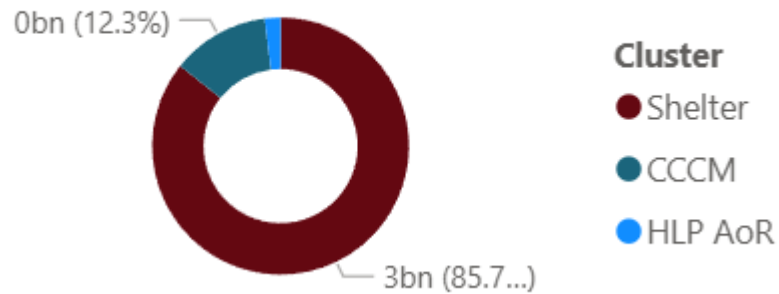

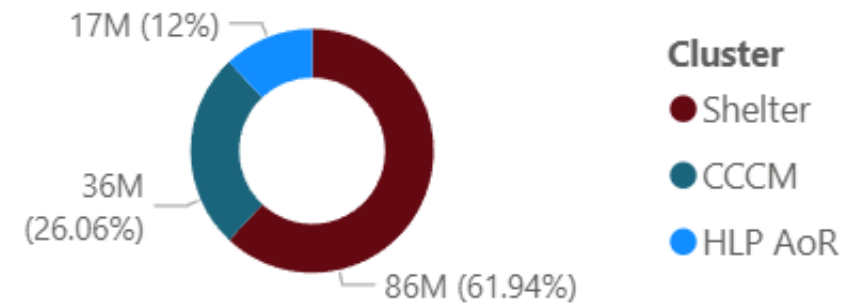

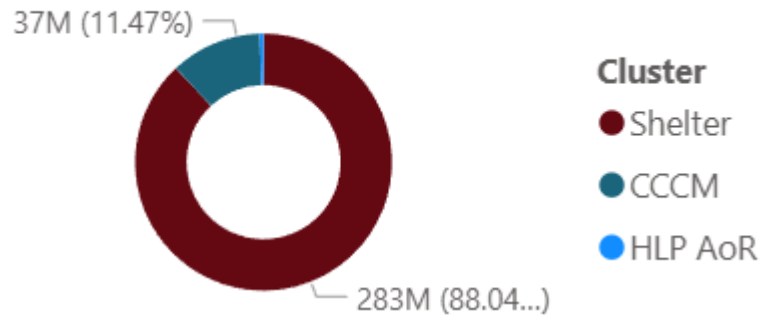

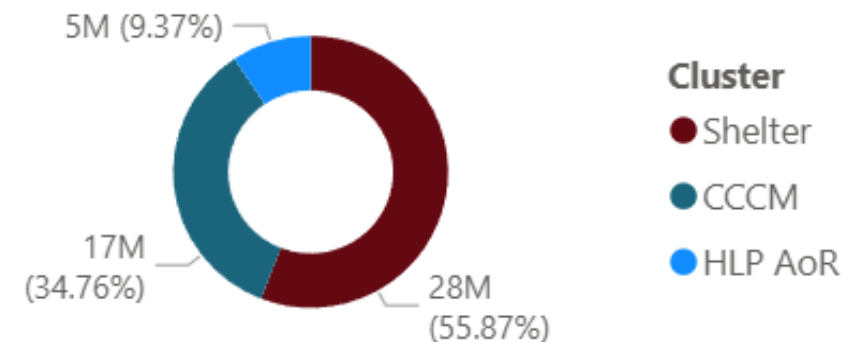
People in Need by Cluster

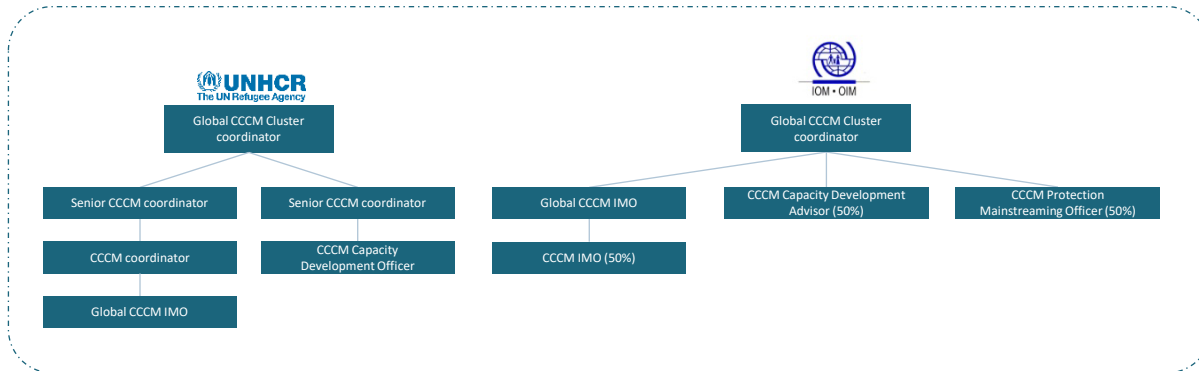
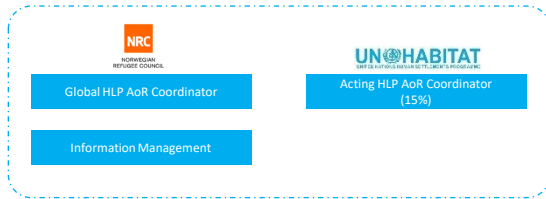

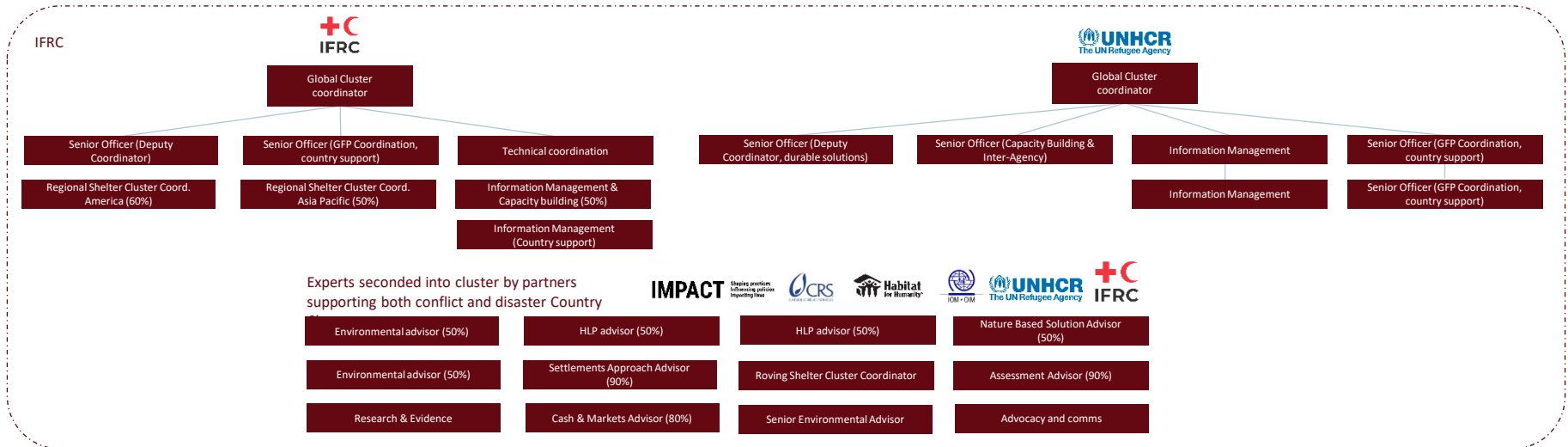
Global staffing as of December 2024

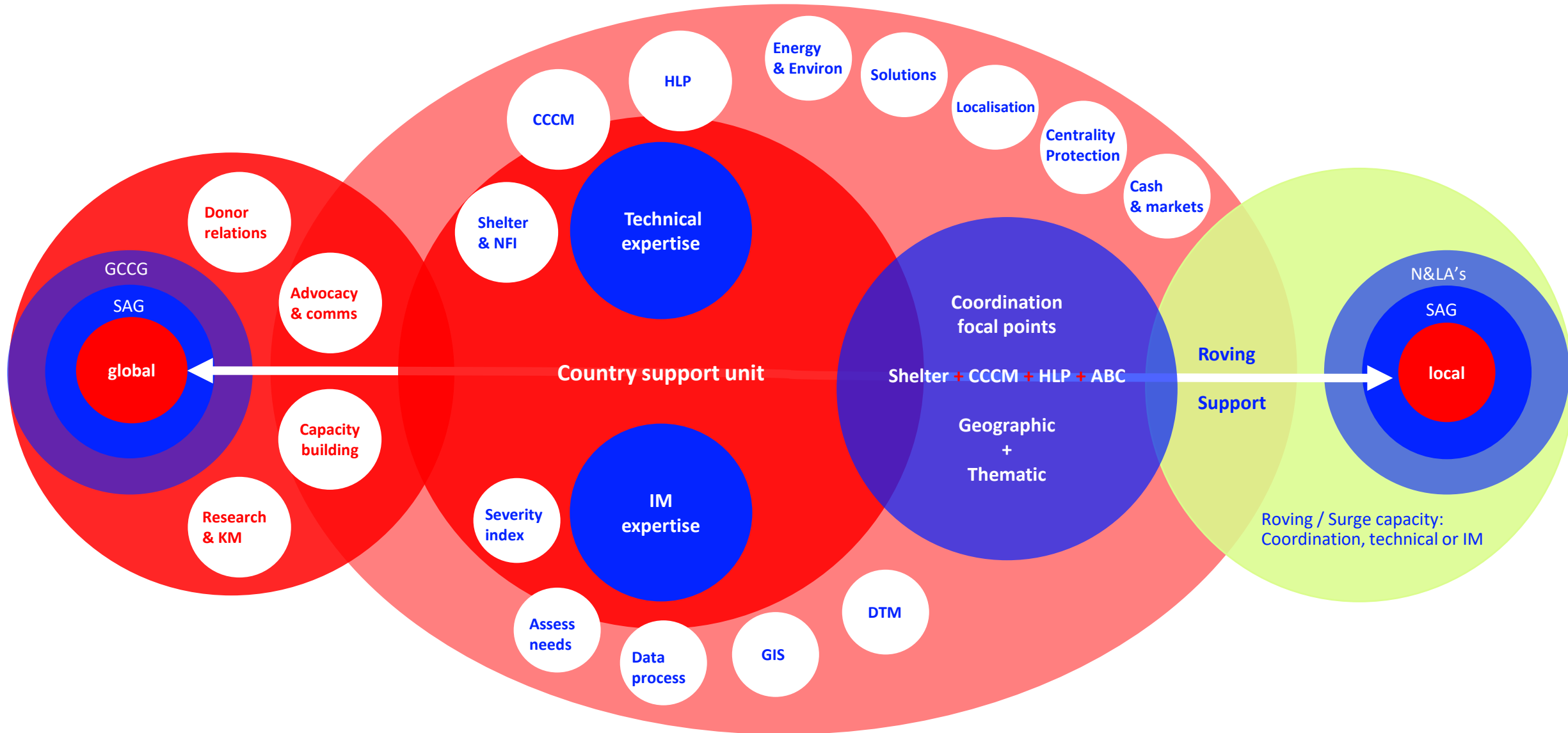

Relationship between Global and Local structures

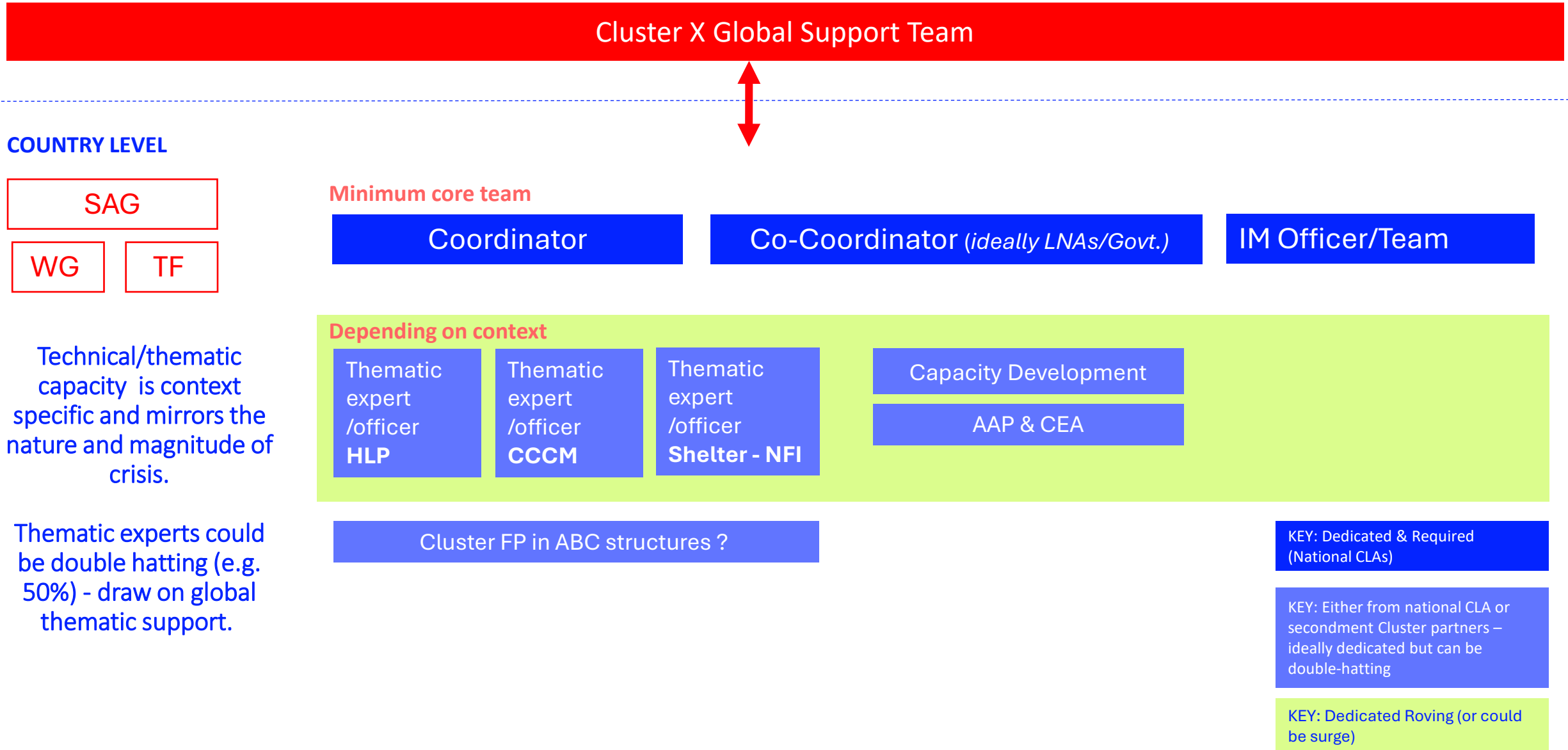

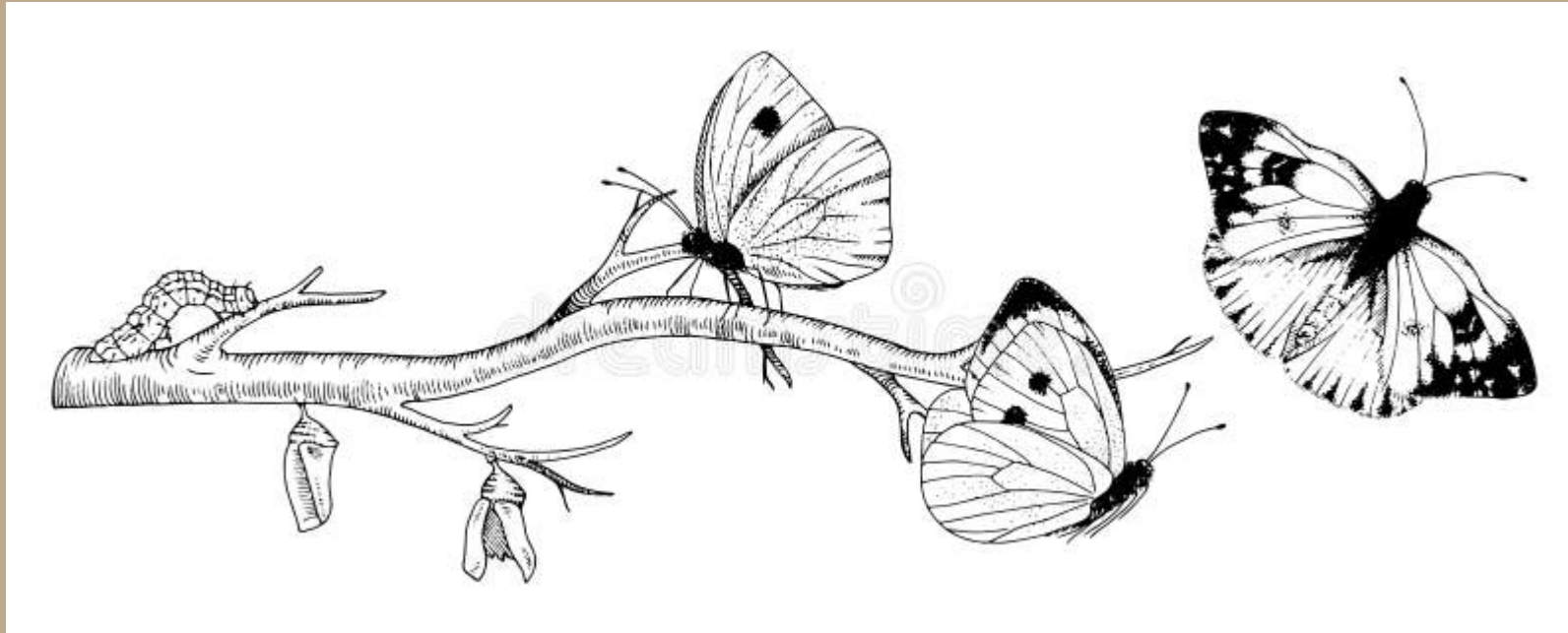
Country clusters: Merger & Transition status

Merger status at country level

- Afghanistan - CCCM to be integrated into the joint CCCM/Shelter/HLP sector.
Transitioning from cluster to sector in parallel
- Somalia – Discussions ongoing
- Ethiopia – Discussions ongoing
- Sudan – Double hatting – Started a consultative process with partnership

Under accelerated transition of humanitarian architecture

- Nigeria – Transition plans and localization strategy – under discussion, HCT only provided the horizon of 2026 / counterpart - NEMA (strategic purposes at national level) and SEMA (operation coordination)
- Cameroon – transition plan under discussion
- Colombia- transition plan under discussion – R4V will take over the coordination
- [Chad] – SC transition plan ready
