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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sudan webpage on the GSC website will be improved so that it can be a valuable resource for the partners as soon as the website update process is finalized. Technical working group is highly recommended to develop and upgrade the shelter design techniques according to the areas and according to the situations. <p>Updates on situation and Shelter/NFI response and gaps in El Geneina</p>	<p>Situational Overview:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> More than 26,900 HHs were affected in Krenik following the incident that took place on 22 April. A multi-sectoral assessment was conducted and the Shelter/NFI sector partners were part of the assessment team. A sector specific assessment was conducted from 17-19 May to understand the needs of the affected population. The assessment findings revealed that 16,811 shelters were completely burnt in Krenik, Abuja and Umdiwen and 4,175 shelters were partially burnt. Assessment in Umtajok and Murayat was not conducted due to access issue. 	

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • So far, 5,000 NFI kits have been distributed by the sector partners and the distribution of an additional 2,100 NFI kits is underway. Similarly, 500 ESKs have been distributed and the distribution of an additional 2,500 ESKs is underway. For details, please refer to the attached presentation. • In terms of gaps, for NFI kits, there is a gap of 12,786 kits considering the distributed kits and kits in stock. In terms of ESK, there is a gap of 17,798 ESKs considering the distributed kits and kits in stock/pipeline. • Due to lack of resources and lack of availability of ESK, considerable gaps remain especially for ESKs. • TGH informed that they are in final stage of the procurement of ESK and in next 2-3 days, ESKs will be sent to Krenik. • NRC had a plan to respond to 1,400 HHs prior to the incident. Now, NRC plans to conduct a rapid assessment and will respond to the identified needs either through cash or kits. • Shelter/NFI sector has already shared the gaps analysis with OCHA at El Geneina level. • ADRA is planning to respond and will share the details with the sector. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partners to share information on planned/ongoing/completed Shelter/NFI response in relation to Krenik incident with the Shelter/NFI sector in Darfur (ahmedn@unhcr.org & khamuham@unhcr.org), if not already shared.

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<p>Information Management Updates</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Shelter/NFI sector presented the Quarter 1 factsheet and according to the factsheet, 33,294 HHs have been reached. <p>IOM Shelter/NFI pipeline</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Shelter/NFI pipeline is funded by BHA. The main purposes of the pipeline are to reduce the disaster risks and impacts, to strengthen the national response and preparedness capacities, to provide timely and effective life-saving assistance and to strengthen the capacity of the community through inclusive participation of the most vulnerable. IOM has established pre-positioning hubs in the country which has NFIs and WASH items. Common pipeline activities include warehousing, procurement, capacity building, coordination, information sharing and handing over the items. All the response will be coordinated through Shelter/NFI and WASH sectors. All releases will be guided by the sectoral gap analysis. Planning to reach 25,000 HHs. 5 pre-positioning hubs are established. 5 trainings will be conducted on the management of humanitarian supplies. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> IOM to organize a training session on use of online system.

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The pipeline includes 25,000 ESKs (plastic sheets, blankets, mosquito nets and shelter fixing tool kits), 25,000 family hygiene kits, 25,000 water purification tabs, 6,000 emergency latrines and 4,000 emergency showers. • The pre-positioning hubs include Kassala, Khartoum, El Obeid, Nyala and El Geneina. • I/NGOs can request for these stocks. There is an online system managed by IOM. • Partners can register themselves and will be able to see the stocks available in the different warehouses and will also be able to see who is responding where. • There will be a training session organised by IOM on how to use online system. • Partners will have to submit assessment report, distribution report and PDM report. • Shelter/NFI sector will have to confirm the needs and gaps. 	
AOB	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shelter/NFI sector partners should fill in the stock mapping sheet and share with Ibrahim and Enock by 5 June. • The stock mapping will also help to understand the level of preparedness including for the upcoming flooding season. • Shelter/NFI sector focal point in Kadugli mentioned about the available NFI kits (6,000) that are prioritized for new arrivals.
