Review of Action Points from the Last Meeting

Action Points	Status
Since it is clear the needs drastically exceed the available resources, moving forward it is important to have a more strategic response where we focus on a limited number of critical areas and drop the rest. Targeting and prioritization should be improved to ensure a more equitable response. This needs to be addressed in the next cluster strategy update.	Pending
As part of the strategy update there is also a need to examine how can we better track the delivery of assistance to avoid duplication or efforts in the instance of secondary displacement.	Pending
Strengthening reporting within the HRP and ERP monitoring framework is critical as it affects the funding prospects for all partners. The S/NFI Cluster coordination team will reach out to partners to make sure everyone has access to Activity Info and organize a training session to familiarize partners with the reporting tool itself but also with some specific 2022 reporting requirements, public dashboards that can be used for programming and so on (as requested by the participants of the meeting).	Done
Sudan webpage on the GSC website will be improved so that it can be a valuable resource for the partners as soon as the website update process is finalized.	Done
Technical working group is highly recommended to develop and upgrade the shelter design techniques according to the areas and according to the situations. And to improve the shelter approach in the future and to share knowledge learned from the CB construction approach.	Pending

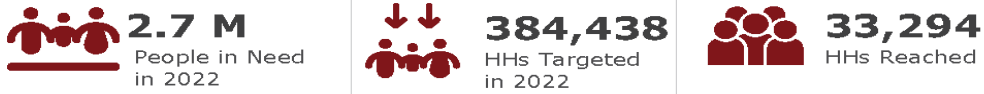

Needs Analysis

According to 2022 Humanitarian Needs Overview (HNO), there are a total of **2.7 million** people in need of shelter and NFI assistance. This includes IDPs, refugees and asylum seekers, vulnerable residents and returnees. However, due to continuous deteriorating economic situation and continued displacements, the shelter and NFI needs continue to increase. The internal displacements and influx of refugees and asylum seekers continue. In the first three months of the year **236,012** individuals have been **internally displaced** mainly in West Darfur and **15,540 refugees** and **asylum seekers** have arrived in the country.

Response

In the first quarter of 2022, the sector partners were able to respond to some of the identified shelter and NFI needs. A total of **7,801 households** were reached with emergency shelter kits, **115 households** were reached with durable shelter assistance and **84 households** received construction materials for the shelter construction. Similarly, **28,729 HHs** received NFI kits. In total, **33,294 households** received shelter and NFI assistance in West Darfur, East Darfur, North Darfur, South Darfur, Kassala, Gedraif, Blue Nile, White Nile and Red Sea states.

Gaps

The Shelter NFI sector is only **4% funded** hence there is a considerable gap in funding. There are limited stocks available for responding to the new and sudden displacements. Further, there is limited partner presence in some states such as West Darfur affecting the capacity of the cluster to respond to the emergencies in timely manner.

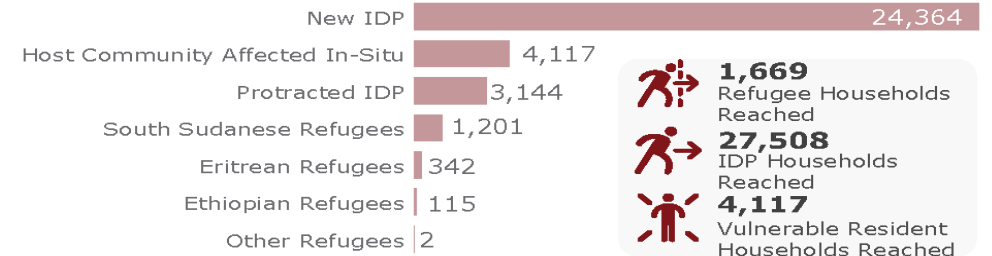
Challenges

Access to some areas especially in the conflict affected and during rains is a constraint for assessing, responding to the needs and monitoring. The local materials used for emergency shelter construction are not available throughout the year and are bulky to store. Hence there is a challenge to provide climate suitable shelter materials especially during rains. Furthermore, the use of local materials such as wooden pole poses a risk to already stressed environment in some states.

Project Objective

- To reduce disaster risks and impacts in Sudan through strengthening national response and preparedness capacities, and the promotion of DRR mechanisms at the local level.
- To improve access to timely and effective life-saving assistance through the establishment of a common humanitarian supply pipeline.
- To strengthen capacity for community based DRR solutions through inclusive participation of the most vulnerable.



IOM Shelter/NFI pipeline (Contd)

Component 1: Establishment of Pre-Positioning Hubs

What is a humanitarian pipeline?

A logistics solution for efficient and rapid response to large-scale humanitarian needs in complex logistical contexts

Activities:

- Warehouse site selection, management and maintenance
- Procurement of core relief items
- Capacity-building and SIMEX
- Coordination & information sharing
- Request, release, replenish
- Handing over pipeline



IOM Shelter/NFI pipeline (Contd)

Key outputs

- 25,000 households' access timely and effective emergency assistance
- 5 relief item pre-positioning hubs established and operated by key stakeholders
- 5 trainings capacitate stakeholders on the management of humanitarian relief supplies and facilities
- Up to 20 national and international partners participate in the coordination and implementation of activities

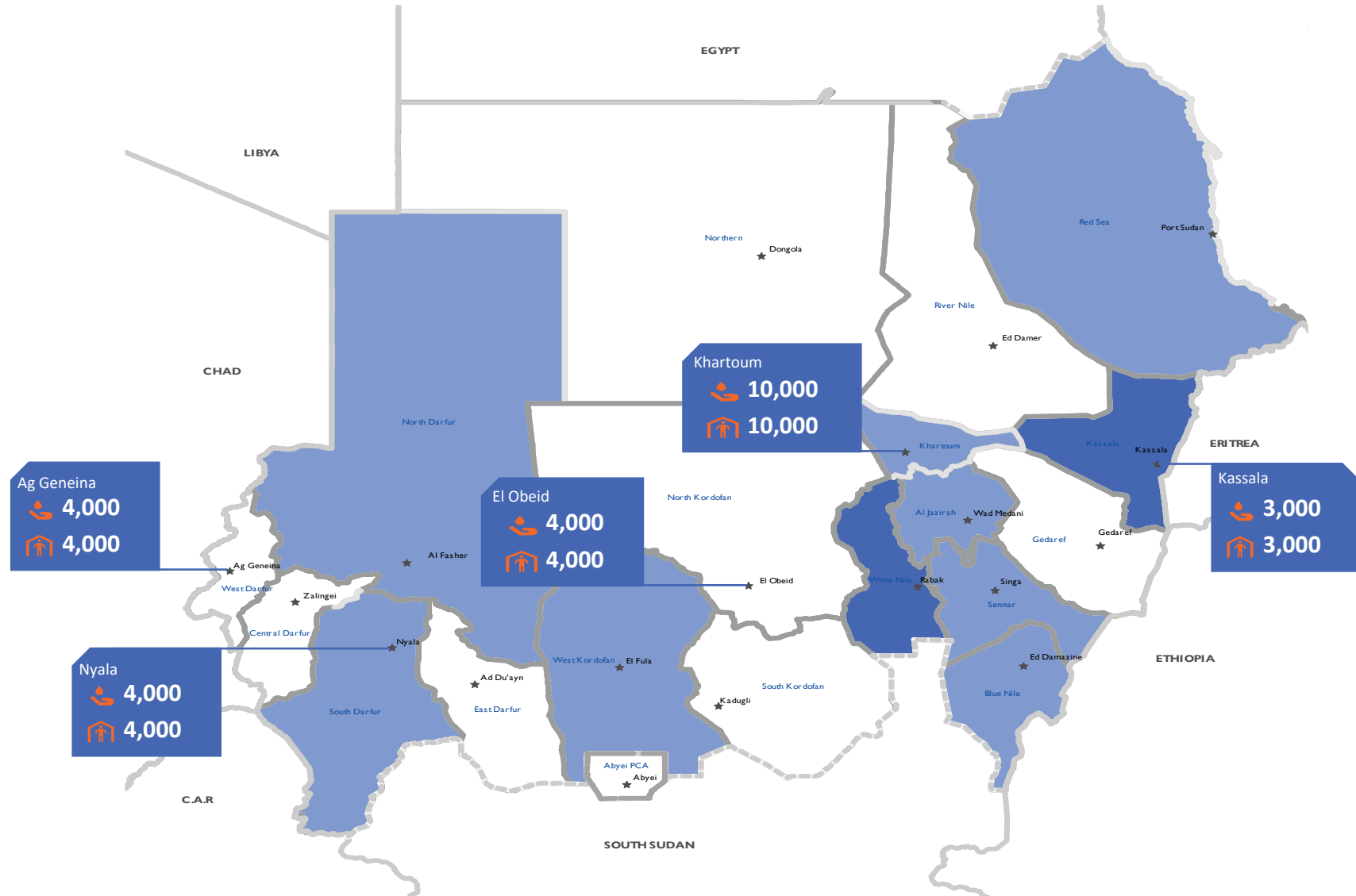
