General Updates

Situation Update



- **Exactly a year today** into the SAF-RSF conflict, **6.6 million people** have been forced to flee their homes, continuing the same upward trend.
- Out of those, the estimated number of IDPs across Sudan is **5.1 million**. The current assessment has observed the IDP caseload in all of Sudan's 18 states. The highest proportions of IDPs have been observed in **River Nile** (11%), **South Darfur** (11%), **East Darfur** (10%), **North Darfur** (8%), **White Nile** (8%) and **Gedaref** (7%) and Sennar (7%) states.
- 54% of IDPs were displaced from Khartoum State.
- While over **2 million** people have crossed into **neighbouring countries**.



Situation Update

- **Conflict Expansion:** Fighting between SAF and RSF expanding in Al Jazirah state, near Umm Algura, Alshbarga, and Al-Khayari.
- **Khartoum:** Clashes between SAF and RSF have been ongoing in various locations, including Khartoum, Omdurman, and Khartoum North with recent shelling by RSF in Karari and airstrike by SAF in Soba.
- **South Darfur:** South Darfur is now the highest IDP hosting State due to severe ongoing clashes, including reports of inter-tribal conflict. No response by partners has been reported yet. Also, Tribal leaders convened to sign a reconciliation document, aiming to halt conflict between Habaniya, Al Salamaat tribes, and RSF in Nyala
- **North Darfur:** Clashes erupted between CRB, SAF, and RSF forces in Al Malha area. Tribal clashes involving Arab and African tribes, with casualties were also reported in Al Fasher.
- **Kordofans:** SAF and RSF continue to clash in the Kordofans with El Obeid and Wad Ashana mainly affected. Dispute between Arab nomads and SAF personnel led to heavy gunshots and casualties in Abu Kershola
- **Gedaref:** Clashes and drone attacks in and around Gedaref city and Al Fao. This led to restrictions of movement that were later lifted.
- **Aj Jazirah:** Continued clashes between RSF and SAF mainly in Wad Madani, Umm Adham and Um Al Gura.
- **Fire Incident:** A fire erupted in Abu Alhassan village, resulting in injuries to children and destruction of houses.



Response

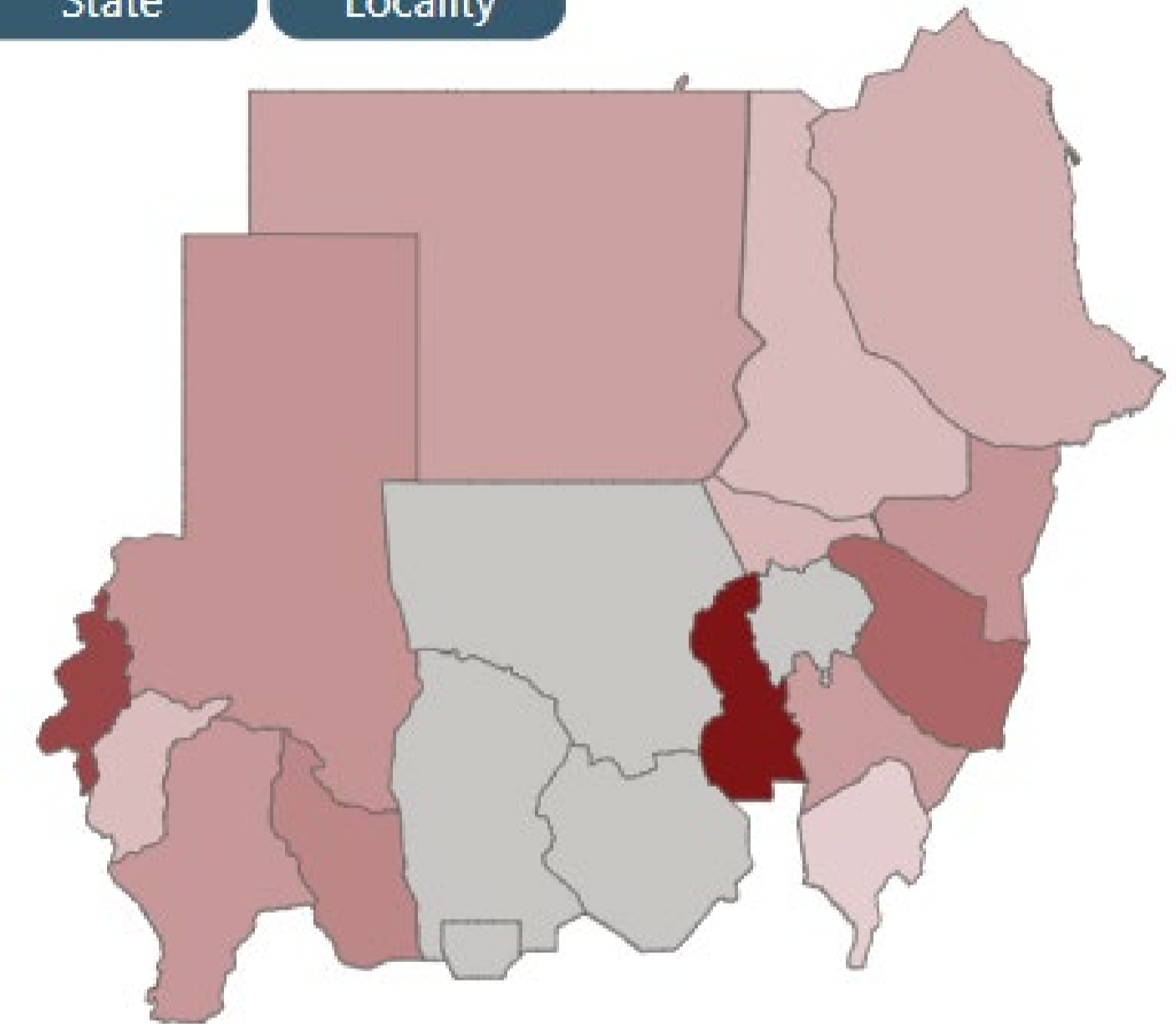
- Overall, the Cluster has reached **285K people (57K households)**, **160K** of which are **IDPs**.
- 18 active partners.
- Responded in **13 out of 18 States** over **50 localities**.
- **White Nile, Gedaref and Kassala** have high responses while Blue Nile has the lowest reach.
- Displaced persons have been reached with **52K (86%) NFI** and **8K (14%) Shelter**.



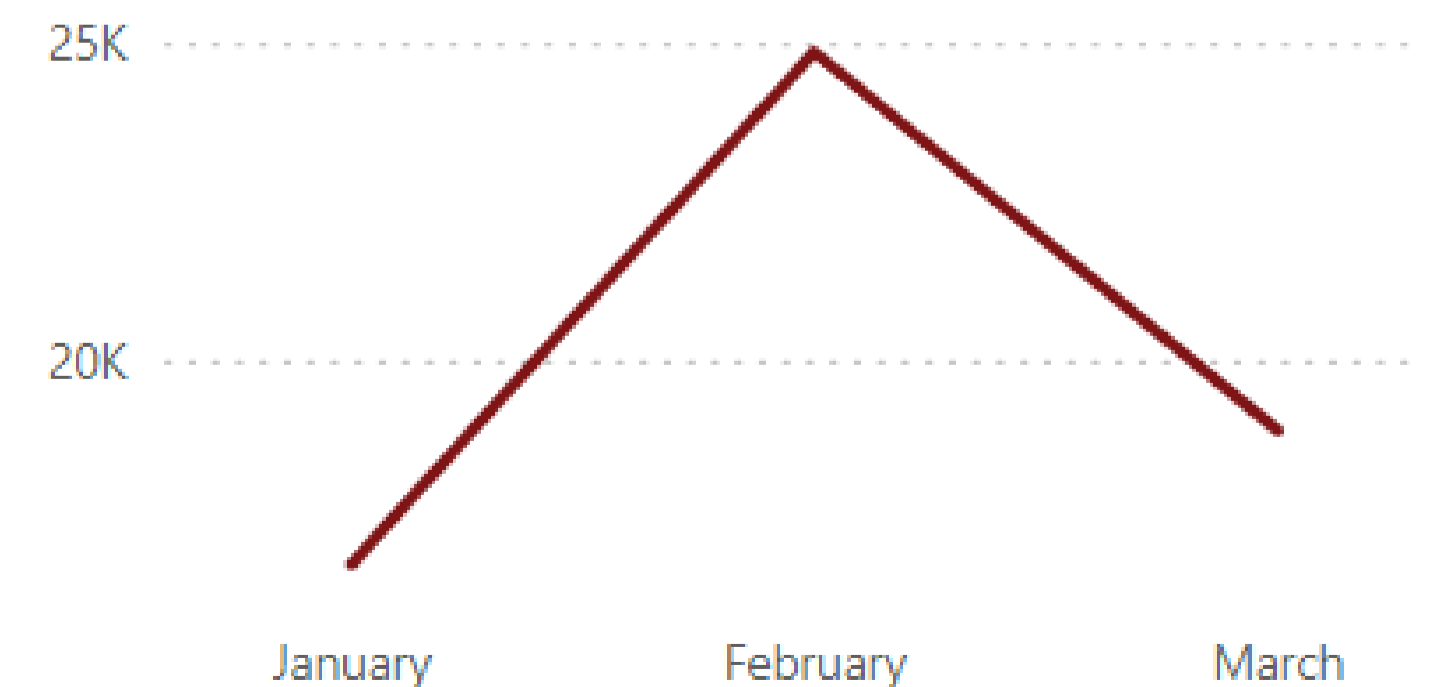
Response Map

OCHA **SHF allocations 2023-2024**

SHF in 2023 - \$86.7M

- 14 March – MSNA in hard-to-reach areas” - \$150,000
- 16 March – NFI – UNHCR - \$2,000,000
- 16 March – emergency response WD, WN- \$7,000,000 revised to \$890,000
- 8 June – Emergencies with focus on Eastern States, as well ERR, Agencies and 48h response - \$48,000,000
- 7 December – Emergencies Darfur and Kordofan states (\$23M), cholera response (6,5M) and top-up 48h response (\$2.5M) - \$33,500,000

SHF in 2024 - \$39.1M

- 20 March – ERR \$6.5M and Darfur and Kordofan states \$31.5M

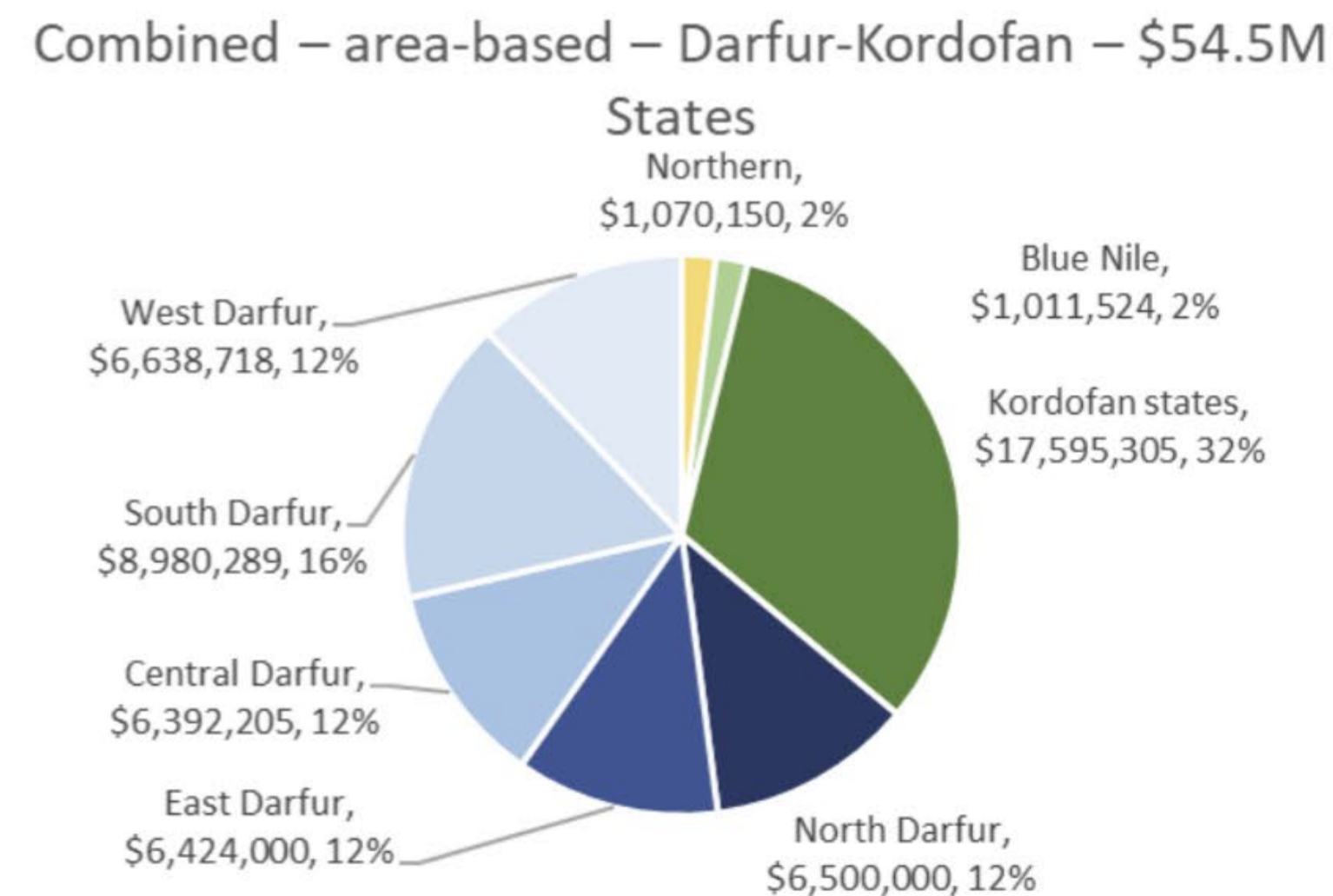
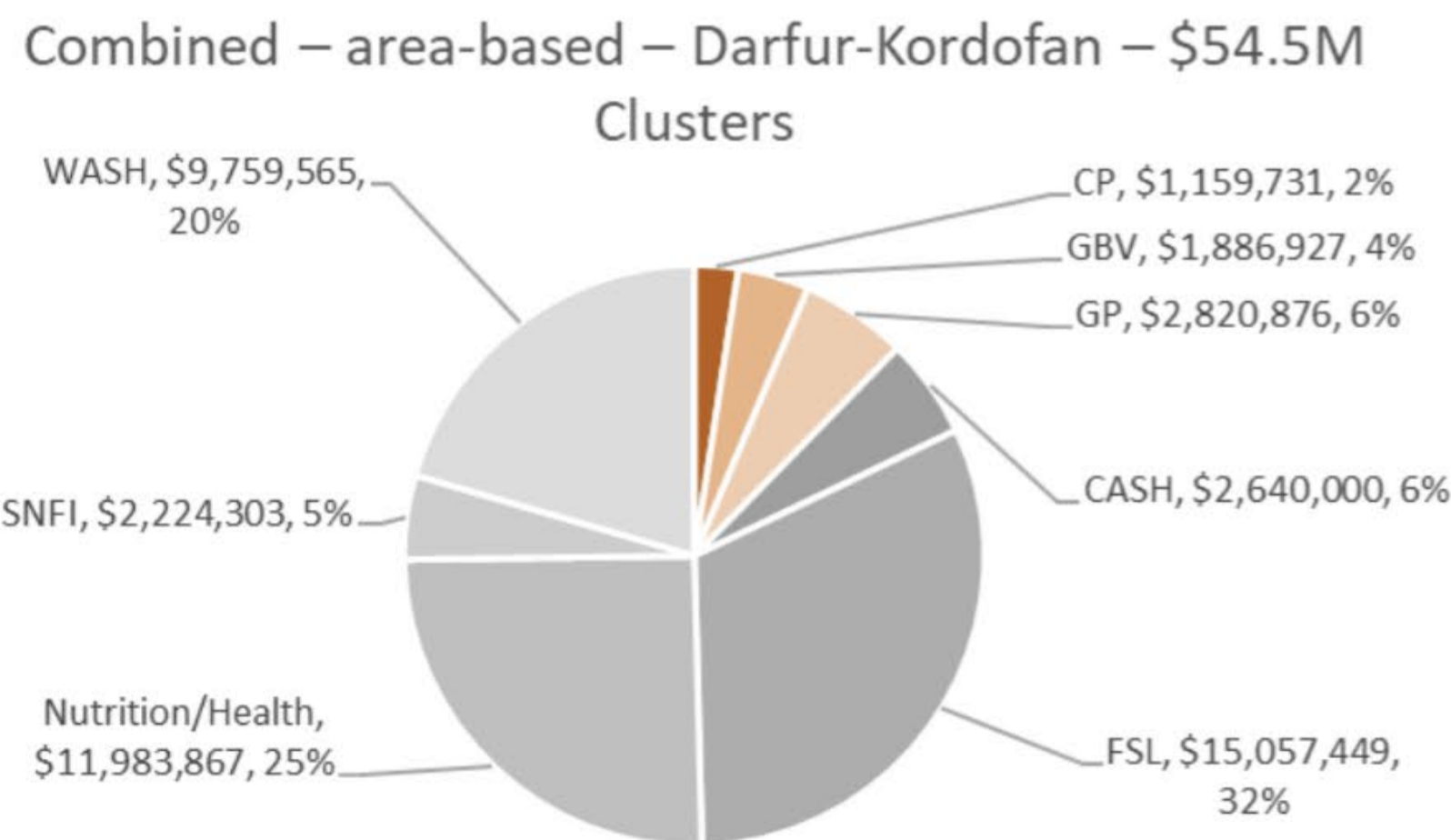
Zoom in : Combined Darfur-Kordofan

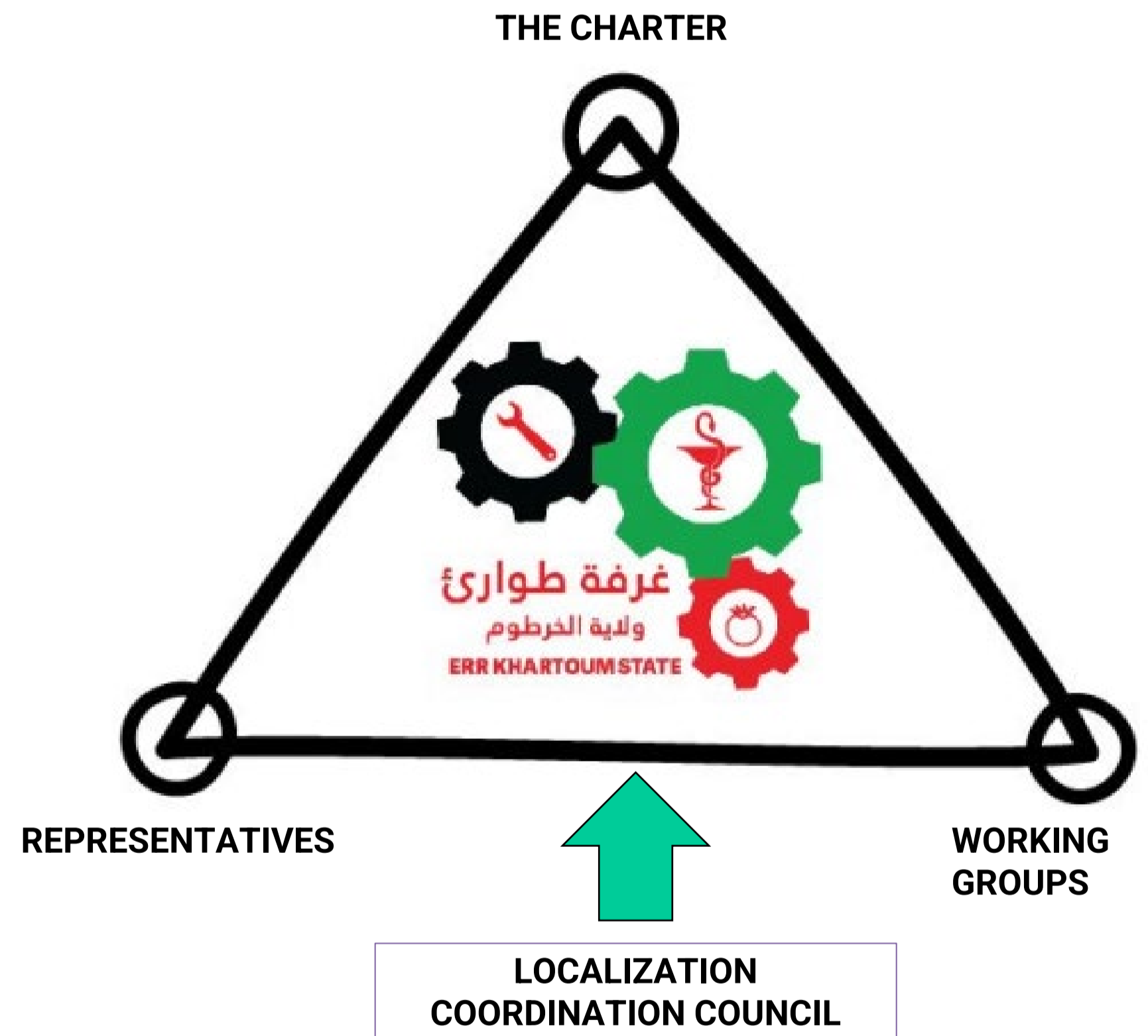
Origin, Structure and Geographical Presence

ERRs are grassroots organizations operating at the neighborhood level. Their inception predates April 15th.

Geographical presence: Khartoum, Jazeera, White Nile, Gedaref, Kassala, Sennar, Northern State, River Nile, Darfur States, South Kordofan.

Structure: Decentralized and horizontally structured. Their coordination is both geographical and sector-specific.

Khartoum stands out for its well-defined coordination structure known as the **Localization Coordination Council (LCC)**.

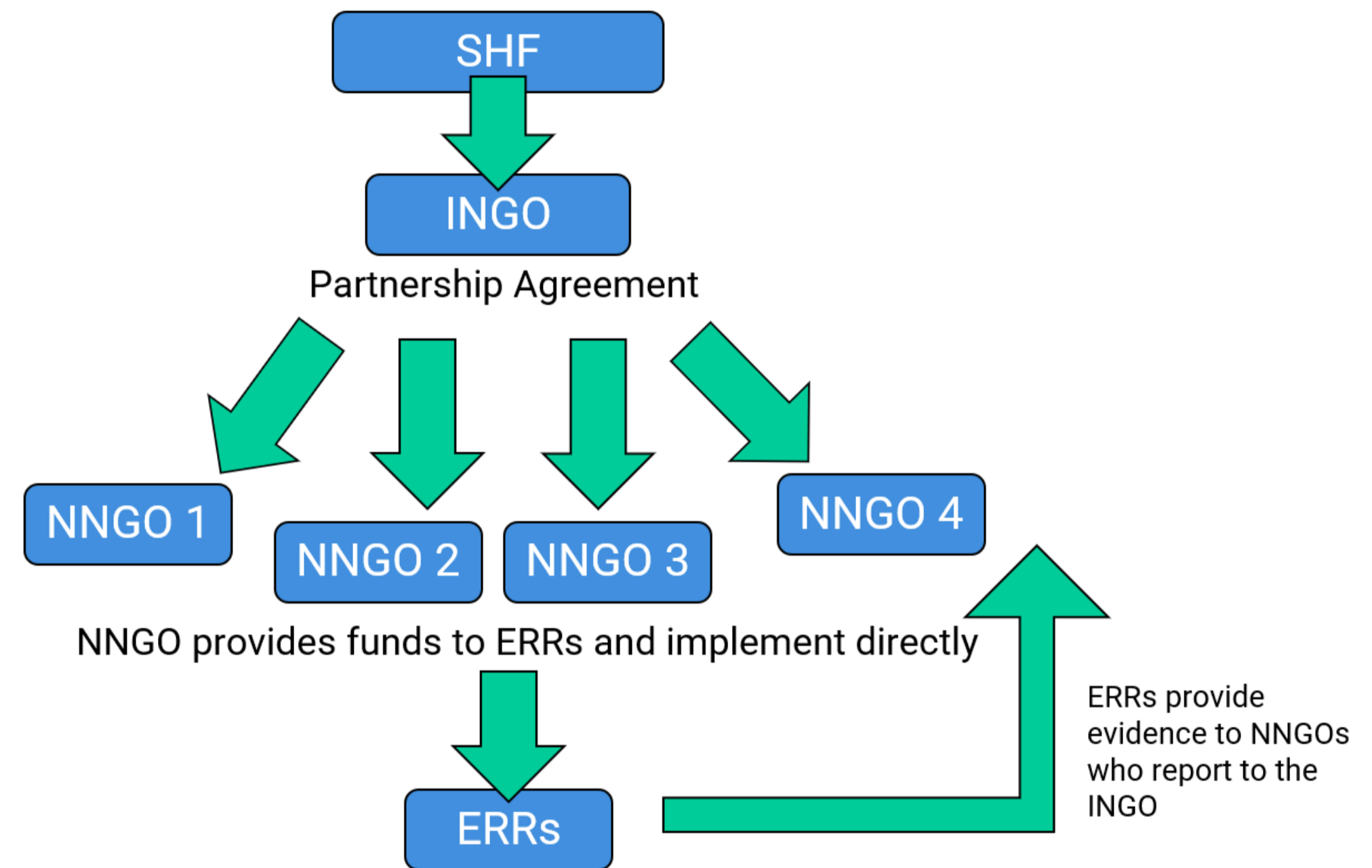

SHF support to the ERRs

- In 2023, SHF supported a total of 63 ERRs and 60 community initiatives: 49 ERRs in Khartoum, 10 ERRs and 17 initiatives in Darfur, 4 ERRs in Sennar, 15 initiatives in West Kordofan, and 10 initiatives in Blue Nile, along with 22 in Eastern Sudan.
- Main modality of support: **cash assistance (donations)**.
- Through these funds, ERRs implemented **Protection, WASH, Health, FSL and ES/NFI activities**.
- Support the creation of the localization coordination council → strengthening coordination
- In 2024 SHF increased financial support for ERRs, raising the allocation from 3 to 6.5 million USD.

Objective: Ensure that our collective response efforts are well communicated to partners, donors, media and general audiences!

- **Achievements** – type of interventions, HH reached, locations, timeframe, etc.
 - **Challenges** – looting of supplies, access challenges, etc.
 - **Procurement** – quantities of stocks arriving to the country, type of stocks, timeframe, where will the stocks be prepositioned – particularly given the incoming flood season.
 - **Assessments** – e.g., needs assessments outlining specifics with respect to Shelter and NFI needs as well as market assessments on NFIs, shelter materials, or Cash for Rent.
 - **Context and impact** of interventions – e.g., any successes with respect to cash for rent, how is sustainability achieved, what about tenure security?
 - **Interventions in the host community** – with 67% of the population staying in host community – what has been achieved so far? Cash for shelter for the families hosting IDPs can be an option, or preselecting landlords to improve their housing in order for them to subsidize rent for IDPs – this can include negotiating longer-term tenure security.
 - **Etc.**

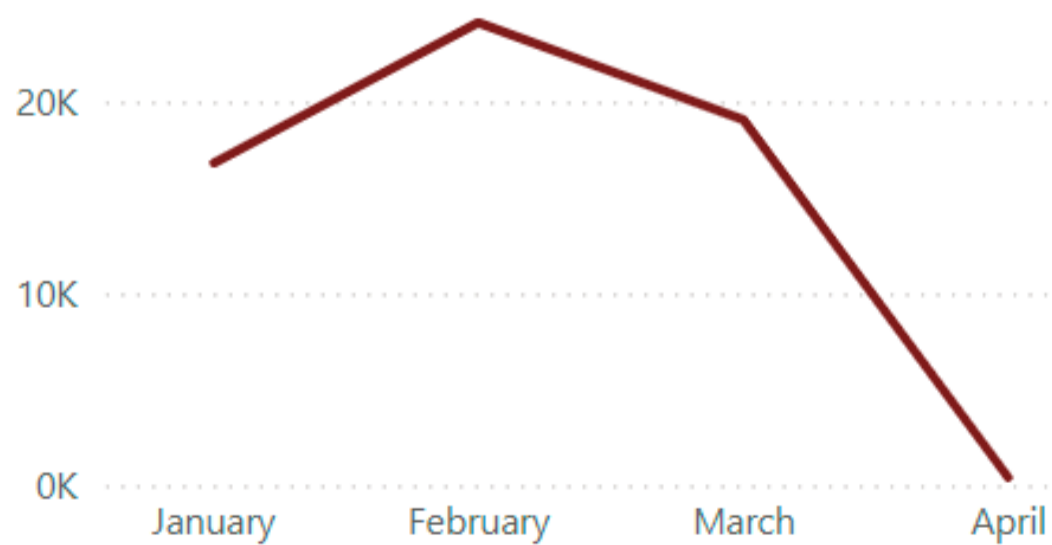

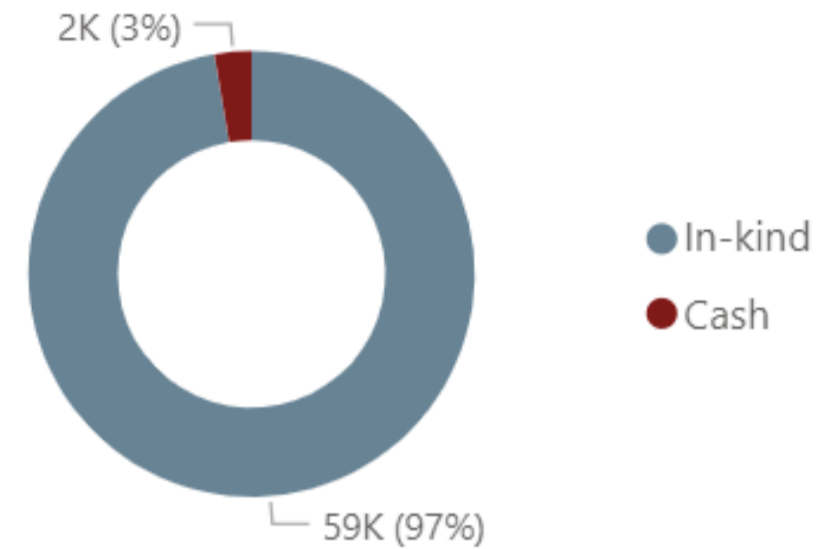

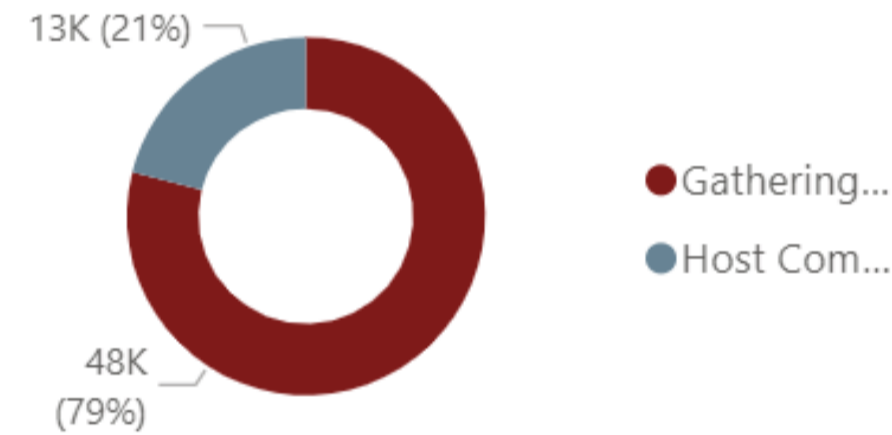

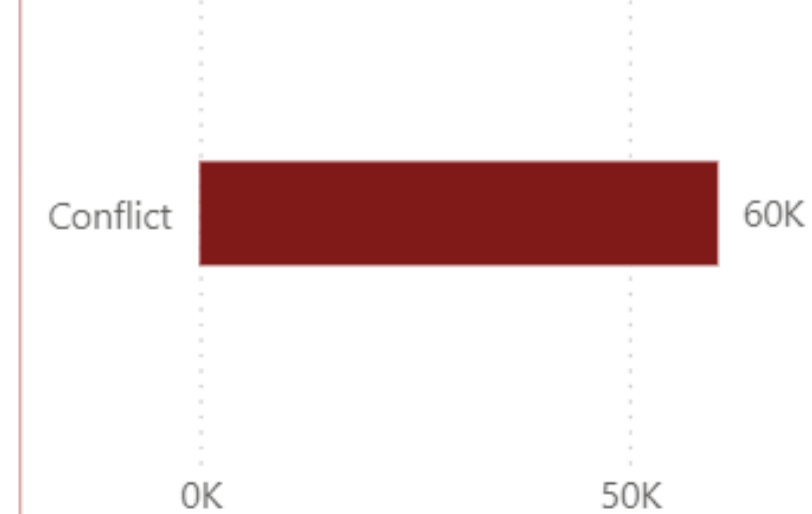
