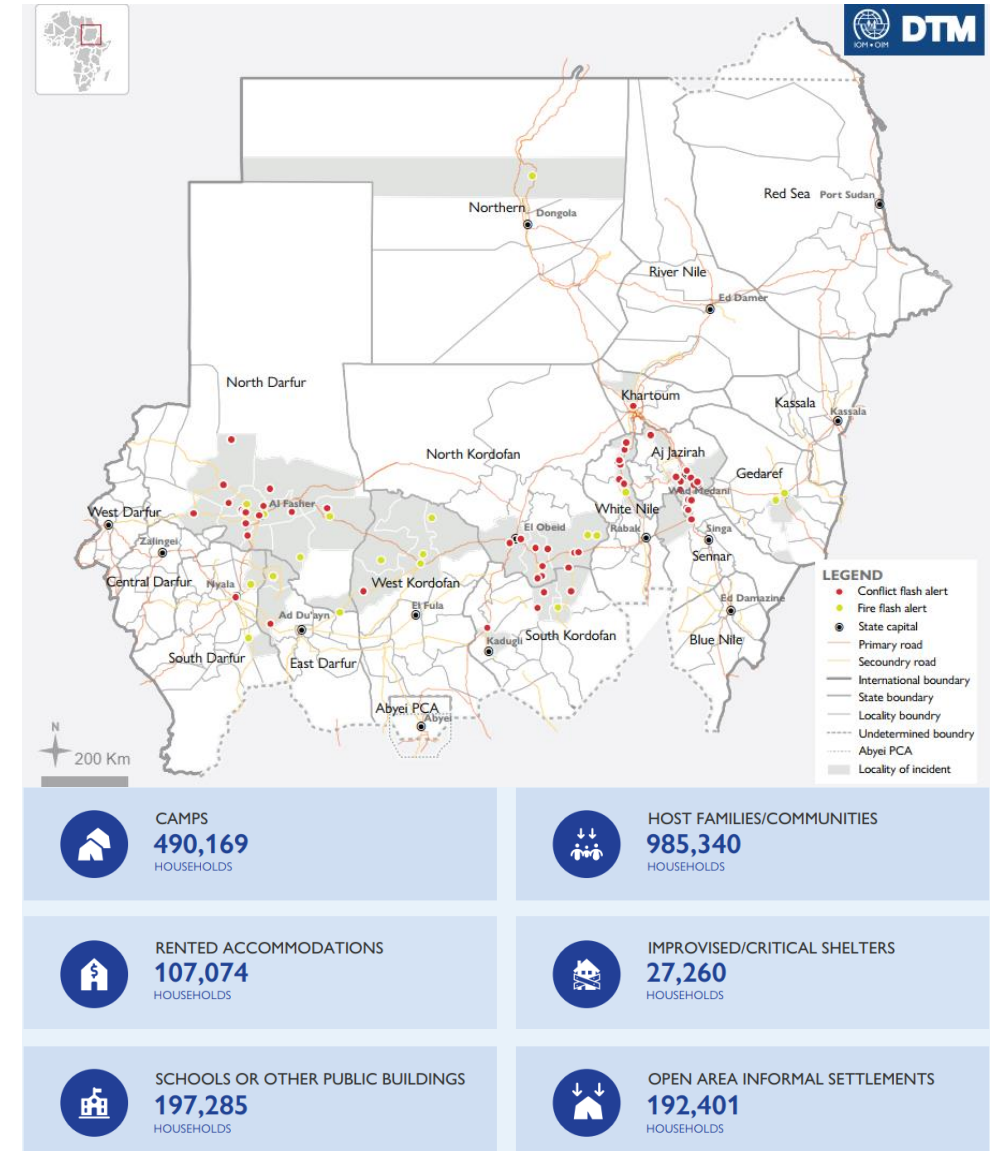

General Updates

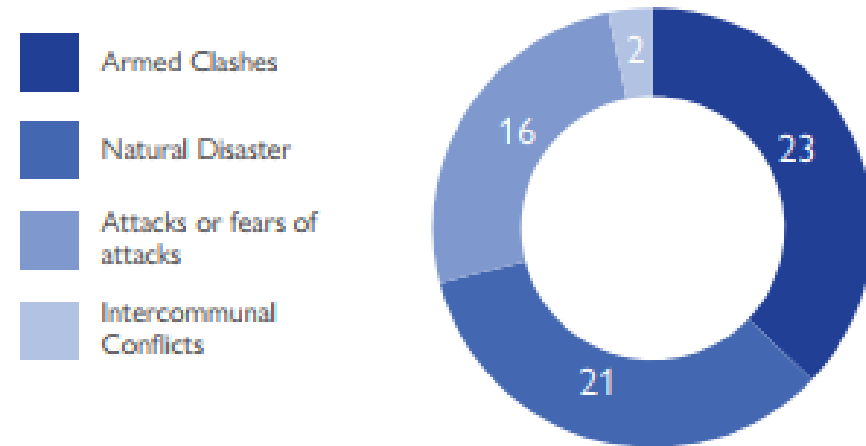
GENERAL UPDATES

- Prior to the onset of conflict on 15 April 2023, Sudan already hosted an estimated **2.8M** IDPs
- Since 15 April 2023, an estimated **7,1M** individuals were displaced internally within Sudan in over 7,296 locations across all 18 states in Sudan.
- Since the outbreak of the conflict on 15 April 2023, an estimated **2,1M** individuals crossed borders into neighbouring countries
- Approximately **49%** of IDP households stayed with host families and communities. Others reportedly stayed in camps (25%), schools or other public buildings (10%), informal settlements or open areas (10%), and private rented accommodation (5%).
- The majority of IDPs in Khartoum and Aj Jazirah reportedly stayed with host families (86% and 84%, respectively). In contrast, IDPs in South Darfur reportedly stayed in camps (62%), with host families (19%), and in schools or other public buildings (14%).



GENERAL UPDATES

- Of the total 62 flash alerts published between 01 April – 31 May 2024, 39 flash alerts (63%) related to incidents of armed conflict, attacks, or increased security concerns. The majority focused on incidents related to the escalation of clashes in Al Fasher town, North Darfur.
- In addition to increased clashes across North Darfur, DTM Sudan observed instances of sudden displacement due to clashes across Aj Jazirah state, including Al Hasahisa, Al Kamlin, Medani Al Kubra, and Janoub Aj Jazirah localities, and in North Kordofan state, including Ar Rahad and Um Rawaba localities.
- These reported incidents displaced an estimated 171,065 individuals.
- Of the 62 flash alerts, 21 alerts (34%) reported on localized displacement due to fires. Fires were primarily reported across western Sudan, in North Darfur (5), West Kordofan (4), South Darfur (2), East Darfur (2), North Kordofan (2), and South Kordofan (1)
- Two flash alerts reported on intercommunal clashes that triggered sudden displacement, including one incident in Dar As Salam locality, North Darfur and one incident in Um Kadadah locality, North Darfur.



Total DTM Early Warning Flash Alerts, 01 April - 31 May 2024

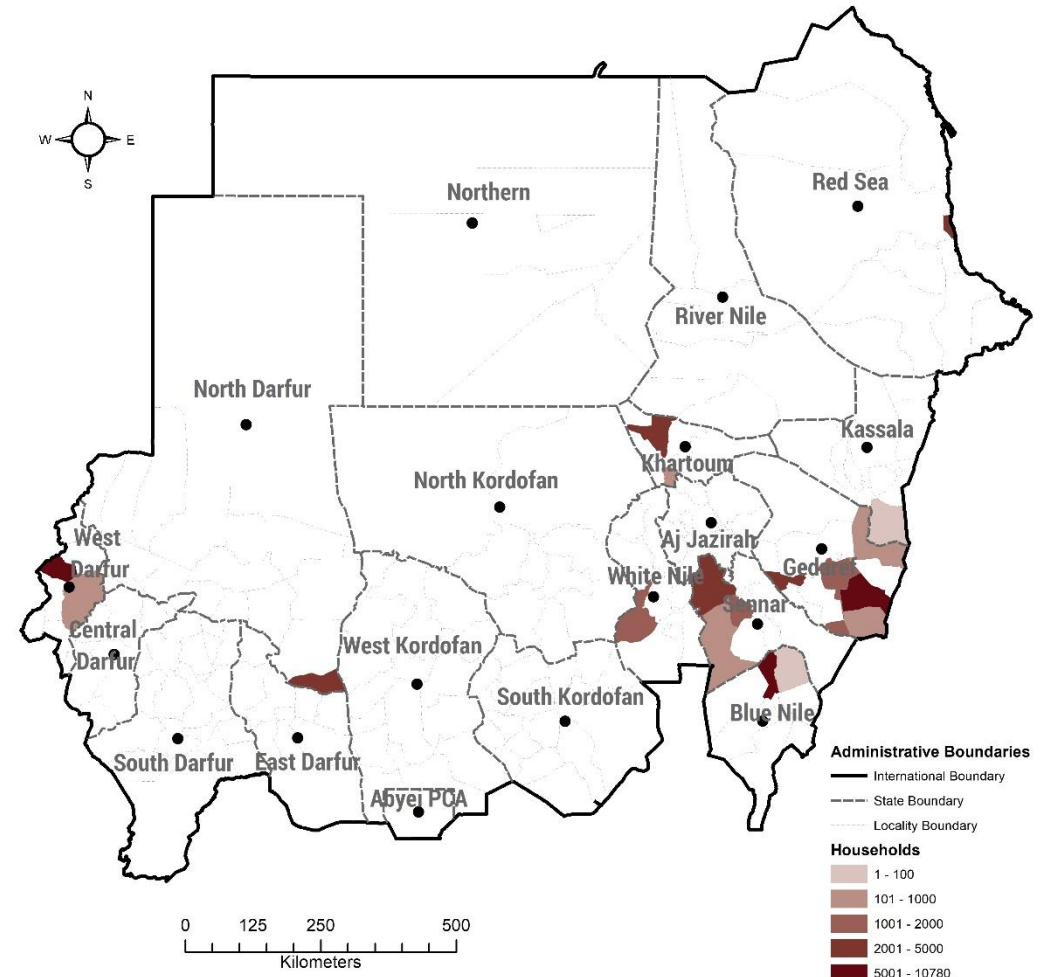
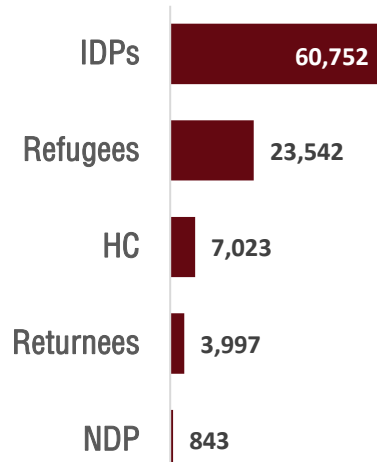
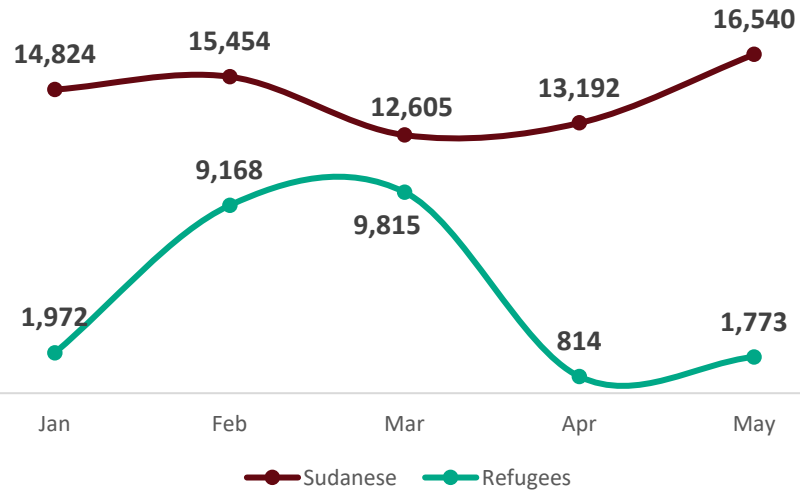
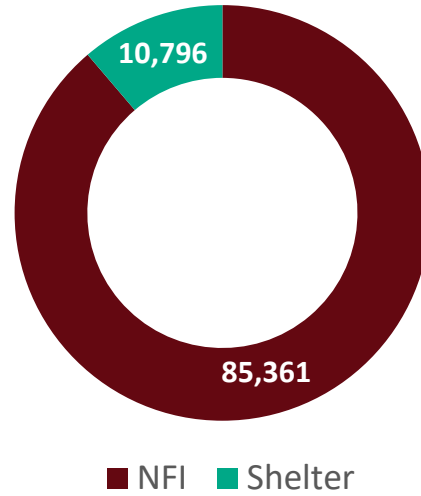

FAMINE PREVENTION PLAN

- FPP is a prioritization of the 2024 Humanitarian Needs and Response Plan and seeks to build on existing and previous physical presence and recent efforts to align the coordination with realities on the ground.
- Shelter & NFI cluster occupies a pivotal yet indirect role in the framework of famine prevention, particularly as it navigates the multifaceted landscape of humanitarian crises in Sudan.
- While the Shelter/NFI Cluster's primary focus is not directly on food production or distribution, its contributions are essential for creating the conditions that allow affected communities to recover, access food, and rebuild their livelihoods

Roundtable on Achievements and Operational Plans

ROUNDTABLE

Objective: Ensure that our collective response efforts are well communicated to partners, donors, media and general audiences!

- **Achievements** – type of interventions, HH reached, locations, timeframe, etc.
- **Challenges** – looting of supplies, access challenges, etc.
- **Procurement** – quantities of stocks arriving to the country, type of stocks, timeframe, where will the stocks be prepositioned – particularly given the incoming flood season.
- **Assessments** – e.g., needs assessments outlining specifics with respect to Shelter and NFI needs as well as market assessments on NFIs, shelter materials, or Cash for Rent.
- **Context and impact** of interventions – e.g., any successes with respect to cash for rent, how is sustainability achieved, what about tenure security?
- **Interventions in the host community** – with 77% of the population staying in host community – what has been achieved so far? Cash for shelter for the families hosting IDPs can be an option, or preselecting landlords to improve their housing in order for them to subsidize rent for IDPs – this can include negotiating longer-term tenure security.
