

## BACKGROUND



Emergency shelters situation in IDPs hosting sites

Marib Governorate hosts the largest internally displaced population (IDPs) in Yemen, estimated at 900,000 in February 2023. The majority (80%) are women, children, and older persons, are living in precarious shelter situations and are facing critical challenges. Thirty-eight percent reside in one of the 278 IDP sites, which half of the sites have substandard shelters. While 62% are renting accommodations, who are at risk of eviction. Both shelter situations may lack proper protection, safety, and dignity, leaving vulnerable populations prone to flooding, fire outbreaks, extreme weather, and other hazards. Urgent longer-term solutions is needed to improve the overall well-being, dignity and safety.

## SHELTER SOLUTIONS

Safer and dignified shelters that are appropriate to withstand the harsh weather conditions and mitigate further protection risks.



This localized emergency shelter costs \$800. It is acceptable by the community and provides protection from the elements, safety and dignity as compared to tents and other emergency shelters which have a lifespan of one year and a half. This type of shelter is also used by the host community and the materials are available on the market. It can be constructed within one week and can easily be relocated.



This Transitional Shelter costs \$1,200. It is more durable, provides better protection from the elements, safety, dignity and acceptable by the community. It can be constructed in two weeks and the materials are available in the market which have a lifespan of three years.



This transitional shelter costs 1000 USD. It's designed to provide safe and dignified shelters to displaced families. All the materials required for construction are available in the market, and it takes only a week to build the shelter. The lifespan of this shelter is around three years, and it requires only minor rehabilitation during that time.
