

Overview

As of April 2025, the Mozambique Shelter Cluster has reached 20,075 individuals (13% of the target) affected by conflict across Cabo Delgado. Out of the 219,000 people identified in need, 156,000 were targeted for shelter assistance. However, only USD 1.2 million—just 4.9% of the required USD 24.8 million—has been secured, significantly limiting the scope of the response. A total of 4,015 households have been reached through conflict response, with the majority supported by partners such as CARE (53%), ICRC (38%), and AeA (25%).

The districts with the highest number of households reached include Mocimboa da Praia (1,603), Meluco (1,253), and Metuge (510). The most widely distributed shelter and NFI items were wooden poles (23,000), bamboo (4,000), and fixing tool kits (1,015), followed by plastic sheets, mosquito nets, sleeping mats, blankets, and solar lamps.

Cluster activities to date have included the distribution of 300 emergency shelters, 2,483 NFI kits, and training and technical support for 1,232 households on safe shelter construction.

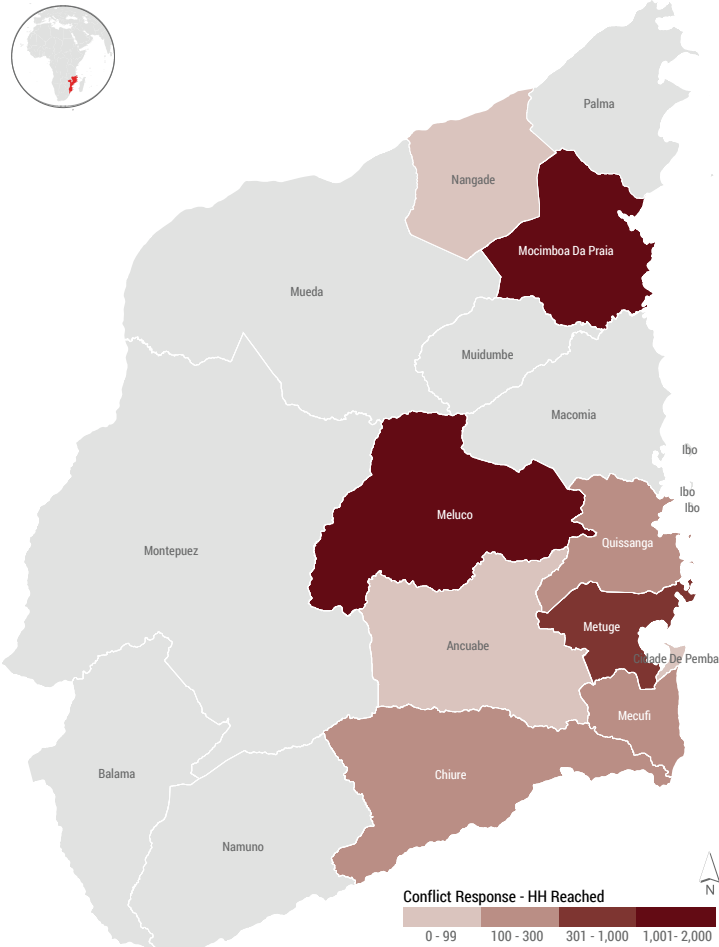

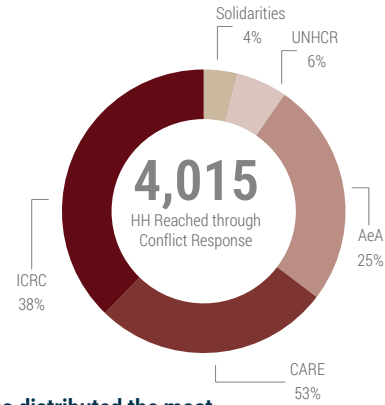

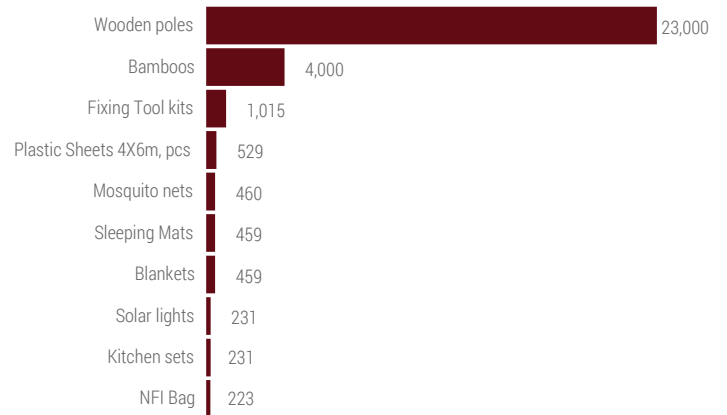
Conflict Response Overview - Cabo Delgado



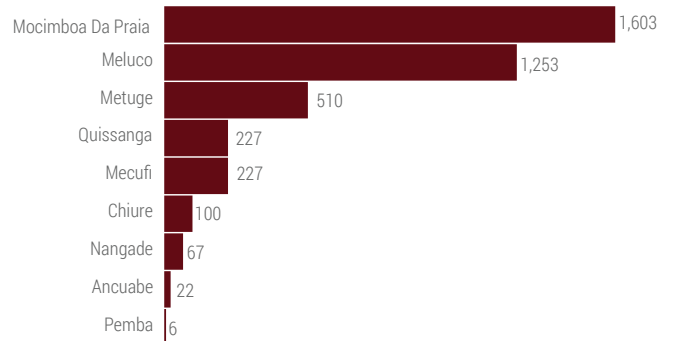
Percentage of Beneficiaries by Partners

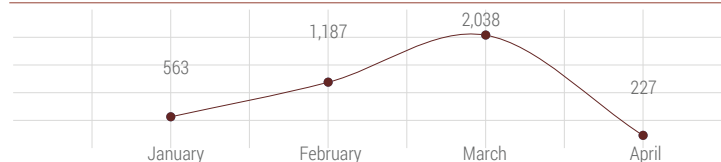
Limitations

The response continues to face several limitations including funding shortfalls, access challenges in conflict zones, and delayed replenishment of key items. The need in some districts far exceeds current reach. The Cluster emphasizes the need for predictable funding, timely logistics, and improved access to meet growing shelter needs.

Situation Overview

Between January and April 2025, Mozambique faced critical shelter needs following multiple cyclones that struck the central and northern provinces. According to the Flash Appeal, an estimated 403,000 people were in need of shelter support, with the Shelter Cluster targeting 315,000 individuals for assistance. As of April, 250,299 people (55%) had been reached.

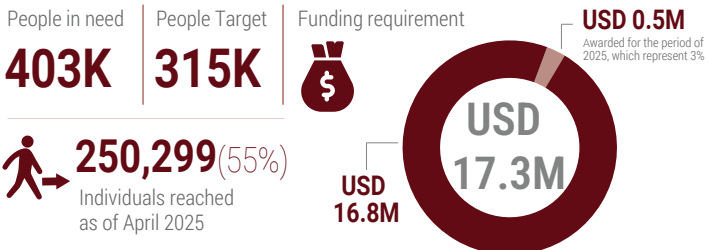
The worst-affected provinces included Cabo Delgado, Nampula, and Zambezia. Districts such as Metuge (16,890 damaged shelters), Mecufi (15,200), and Chinde (12,216) recorded the highest destruction levels. However, many areas remain critically underserved. For example, Monapo had over 53,000 damaged shelters, but only 1,155 households were reached.

A significant funding gap has hindered the response. Only USD 0.5 million—just 3% of the USD 17.3 million required—had been received by April 2025, limiting operational capacity across affected areas.

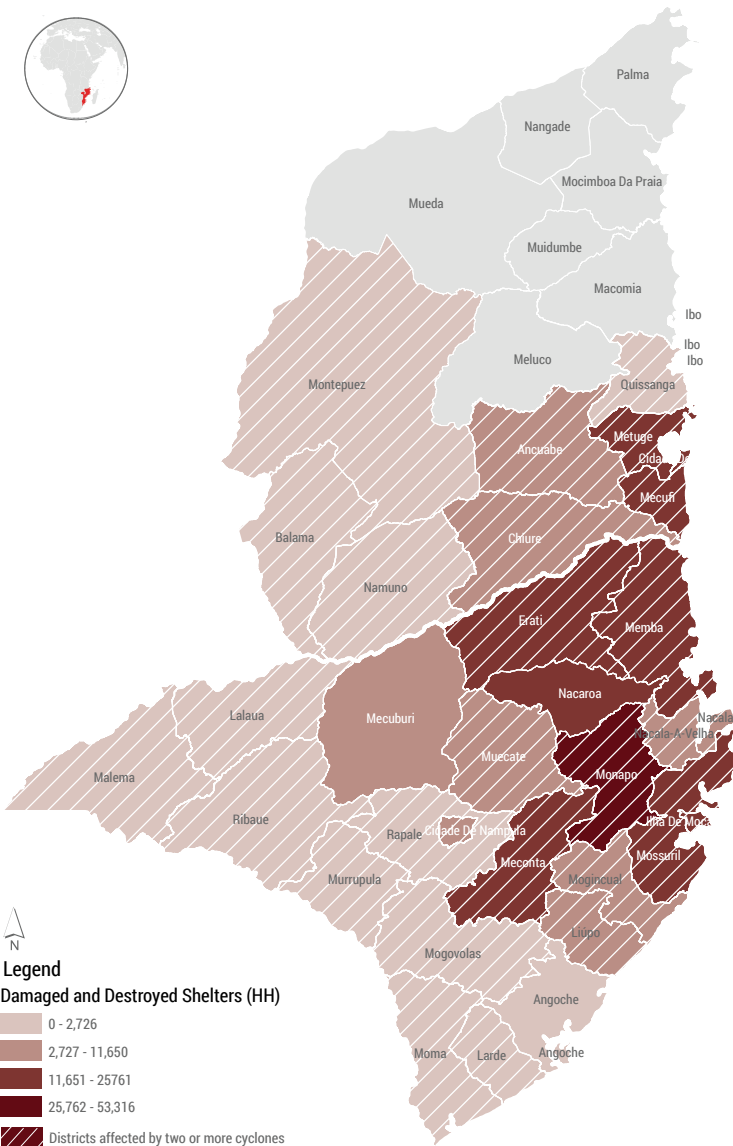
Despite these constraints, 18 partners responded. IOM led with 14,380 households reached, followed by CARE (5,884), ACF (5,293), and others. Cluster activities included distribution of NFI kits (33,888 HH), emergency shelters (15,237 HH), temporary shelters (440 HH), and technical shelter training (495 HH).

While progress has been made, gaps persist. Stronger coordination and urgent funding are needed to scale up assistance and ensure vulnerable communities receive timely and adequate shelter support

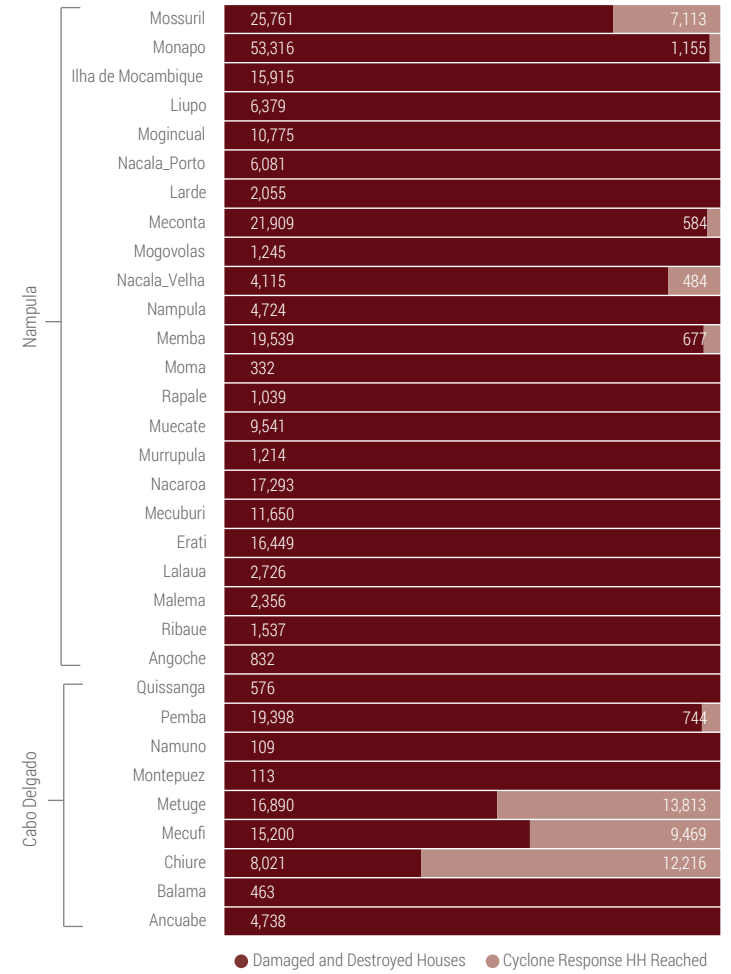

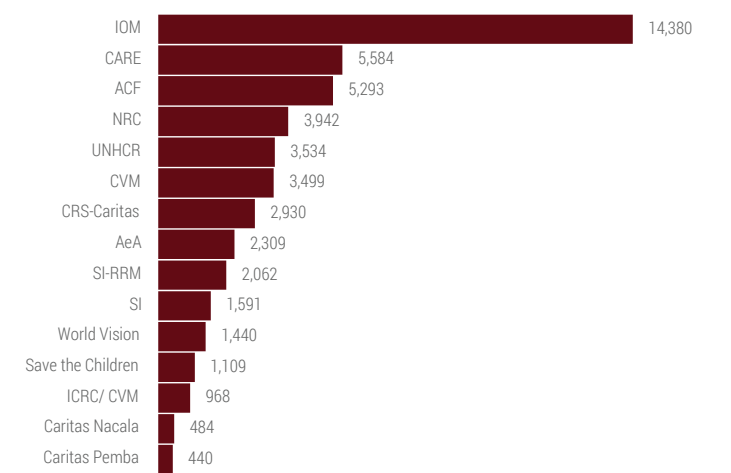
Damaged and Destroyed Shelters - Nampula and Cabo Delgado
