

**Minutes of Meeting:** Gaza Shelter Cluster Meeting

<p><b>1- Shelter Cluster's Coordination Update:</b> The cluster coordinator welcomed the partners and thanked them for making time to attend this meeting, and introduced the agenda of the meeting.</p> <p><b>Tracking New IDPs after Evacuation orders:</b></p> <p>A brief update was provided about the different new evacuation orders and the resulting displacement according to information collected from the SMWG, and the feedback from some shelter partners.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1- An evacuation notice for two buildings in Al-Burij was issued on July 23rd. Consequently, out of fear, most of the residents of Block 8 and Block 12 in Al Burij camp evacuated their dwellings/ houses. Latest estimates shared by AoR indicate that UNRWA DES has 42,000 displaced people, either registered or hosted in the DES. Additionally it was reported by one of the shelter cluster partners that 384 HH were registered at 9 informal IDP sites in DeB, the total number of individuals is a round 2,000.

**Inter-Agency Shelter Assessment missions:**

Shelter Cluster is arranging an inter cluster assessment un Gaza and the North, the visit is scheduled on Sunday, 4<sup>th</sup> Aug, 2024. The first is a return area in Gaza, with people living in damaged buildings, identified by the ABC Shelter Cluster FP. The second is a site recently installed by the SC partner PARC. Several clusters expressed their interest in joining this assessment mission including the Protection Cluster, OCHA, UNFPA-GBV, Site Management WG, and UNMAS.

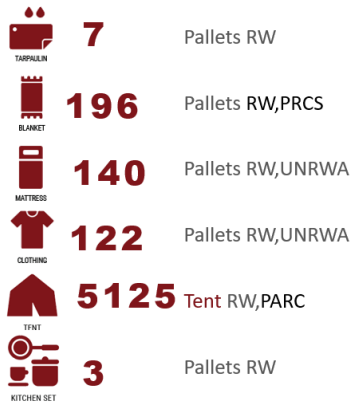

Shelter cluster coordination team attended the ICCG Meeting, SMWG meeting, and participated in the revision of the Welcome points SOPs,

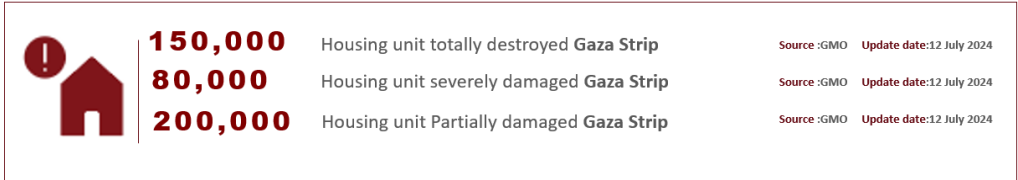
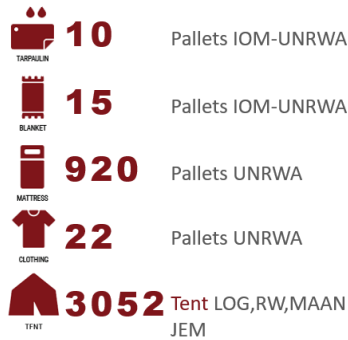

<p><b>3- Updates from Partners</b></p> <p>Partners were requested to share their updates in regards to: Response, Stocks Plans, Winterization, Assessments, Challenges, Partnership and complementarity,</p> <p><b>ICRC:</b></p> <p>During July, ICRC received and distributed 50,000 mattresses in the North, and distributed to households with total destruction in coordination with MOSD and PRCS. Similarly, provided 10,500 tarpaulin sheets to IDPs in Khanyounis and the Middle governorates. Additionally, in the pipeline 19,000 tents, tarps and mattresses are in Al-Arish waiting coordination to enter through KS.</p> <p><b>MAAN:</b></p> <p>Received 477 tents out of 900 that entered KS, distributed 200 tents in Khanyounis, ongoing distribution of 127 tents, and 150 remain in stock.</p> <p><b>SCI:</b></p> <p>The procurement of 4,500 SOK and Bedding kits, is completed, however facing challenges in getting the items into Gaza, private companies are contracted, will provide updates later.</p> <p><b>UNDP:</b></p> <p>Introduced the focal point responsible to update on the development of the Prefab project. UNDP has received funding to implement a pilot project of provision of prefab units. Ongoing discussions with COGAT on what types to be approved, only one type of Prefab units is approved which has no dividers inside and to be used for institutions but not housing.</p> <p><b>IRW:</b></p> <p>Has funding for seasonal winterization project (1.0 m USD). Still did not figure out what items to be provided, last year winter clothes were provided, however still in the planning phase.</p> <p><b>NRC:</b></p> <p>Tents and shelter NFIs<sup>1</sup> + hygienic kits and kitchen sets + jerry cans provided to 38 displaced families from North Gaza. Tents (10) and shelter NFIs + hygiene kits, jerry cans, kitchen sets to 17 displaced families of visually impaired people. Hygiene kits and Kitchen sets to 147 Families displaced from east Khanyounes to UNRWA shelter and sites in khanyounes Mawasi,</p> <p><b>HEKS:</b></p>		

<sup>1</sup> Shelter NFIs include: blankets, mattresses, buckets, jerry cans towels, and mats.

<p>Finalized the procurement of NFIs in Egypt, and conducted assessment to 2 IDP makeshift shelter sites in DeB. Contracted MoveOne company to get the materials into Gaza.</p> <p><b>Anera:</b> Distributed 392 tents (non-standard) to IDPs living in substandard shelters in Middle area, 1800 family tents in the North were taken by people.</p> <p><b>CRS:</b> Distributed 950 bedding sets, in the North were received by people living in destroyed/damaged units in AL TOFAH area.</p>	
<p><b>4- <u>ABC updates:</u></b></p> <p>Partners were requested to share whatever information related to the following, this can be shared bilaterally with the cluster coordination team:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Where do the partners have the materials? Egypt, Jordan, KS, Al Arish, somewhere else...</li> <li>• How are partners getting them into Gaza? (if is the case) Logistic Cluster, UNRWA, Private Sector, other.</li> <li>• Is anyone using the Fenced Road? If yes, please share your experience</li> <li>• Is anyone using MoveOne? Or any other private companies, If yes, please share your experience</li> <li>• Do partners have storage capacity?
