**CORE PIPELINE OVERVIEW**

The IOM Core Pipeline has been instrumental in providing vital support to meet the urgent shelter, non-food items (SNFI), and water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) needs of vulnerable communities affected by natural disasters, conflict, and localized violence, including returnees impacted by the conflict in Sudan. The IOM Core Pipeline supplies reached a total of 81,397 households and 490,002 individuals. Of these, 41,257 households were reached with WASH support and 40,140 households were reached with SNFI support across 16 counties. The IOM Core Pipeline processed 29 approved requests for SNFI supplies from 8 partner organizations and 49 approved requests from 19 WASH Cluster partner organizations. Ninety-one percent of the requests for SNFI supplies were for communities displaced by conflict or localized violence, while 9% were for populations requiring humanitarian assistance due to flooding. Additionally, 82% of WASH partner requests were for conflict-related responses, while 18% were for flood responses.

**CORE PIPELINE STOCK STATUS**

While the Core pipeline continues to support SNFI and WASH partners in various responses and plans to preposition for anticipated floods expected between June and August 2024, it is unfortunate to note that the current stock is insufficient and requires immediate replenishment in all the hubs. Otherwise, it may fail to serve its purpose of facilitating timely response during an emergency. Below is the current stock of essential SNFI and WASH items.

**Key challenges and gaps**

The current capacity of the Core Pipeline is not just worrisome, it's a crisis. It falls far short of meeting the impending rainy season's needs and expected floods. As of now, the Core Pipeline has only managed to meet the needs of 246,840 individuals out of the targeted 886,256 for the 2024 HNRP, leaving an alarming gap of 639,416 individuals to be met by the end of the year. With the current capacity at only 120,000 individuals, representing less than 30% of the projected beneficiaries, urgent funding is required for adequate preparedness and timely response. For instance:

1. The delay in funding is affecting the replenishment of the core pipeline. This has forced the cluster to reduce the support to beneficiaries (#targeted) and the number of items. Discussions with various donors to secure funding for the pipeline are ongoing.
2. Donor cuts have significantly impacted cluster response activities, including field-level coordination. Some partners have closed their operations, affecting the presence of the cluster. The downsizing has also affected field-level representation/coordination, following the layoff of some state-level focal points.
3. Without the logistics cluster transporting supplies for partners, responses have been reduced as partners do not have funds to cover transportation costs. However, cluster partners are advised to include transportation costs in their funding proposals.
