Modality: Interview with key informant, conversation circles, observation

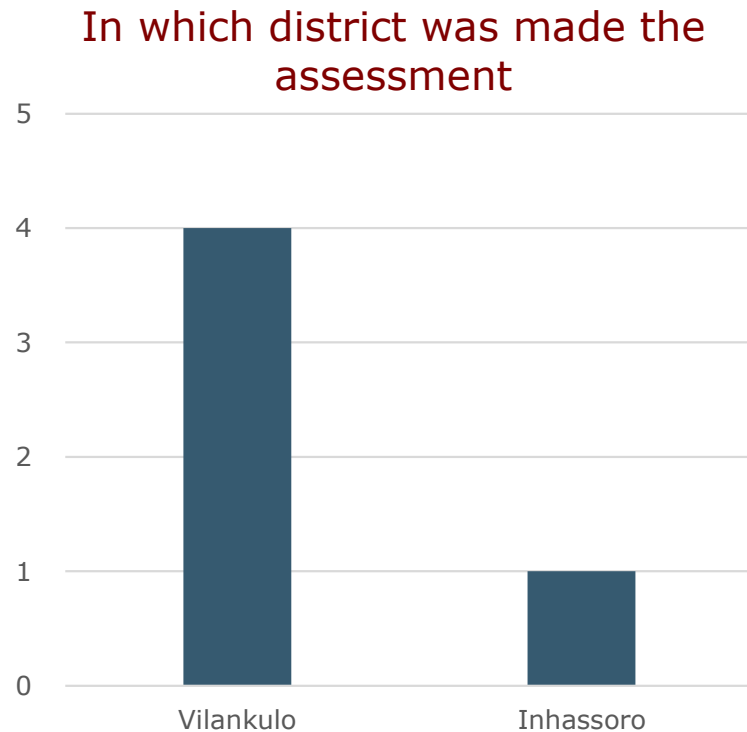
Tool: Initial Shelter and Non-Food Needs Assessment Template

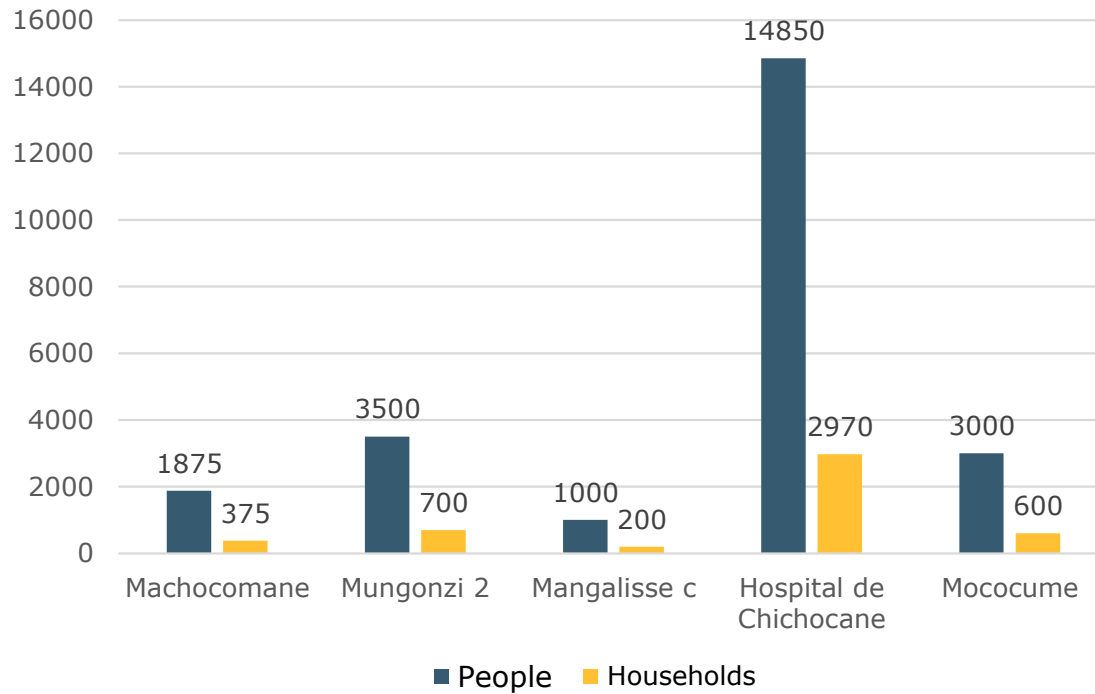

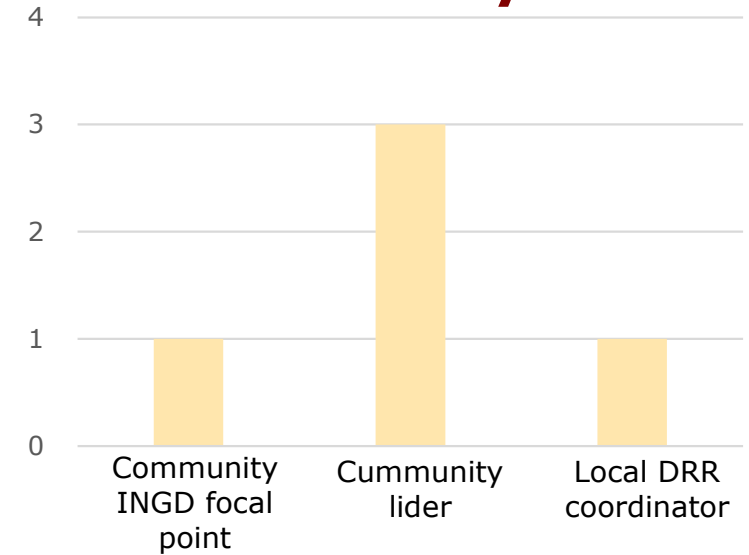

Role of the interviewee in the community

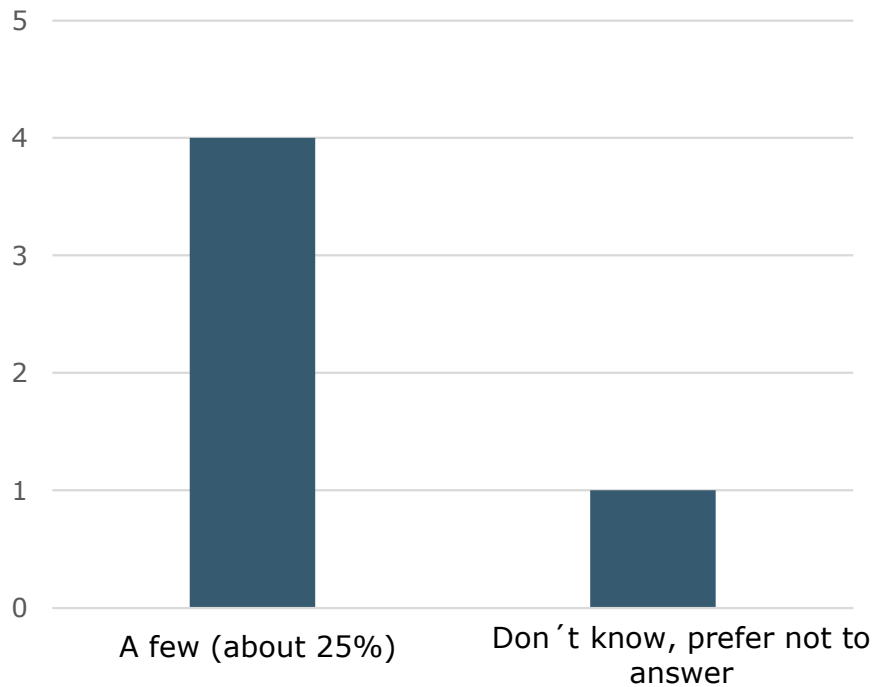


Gender of the person interviewed

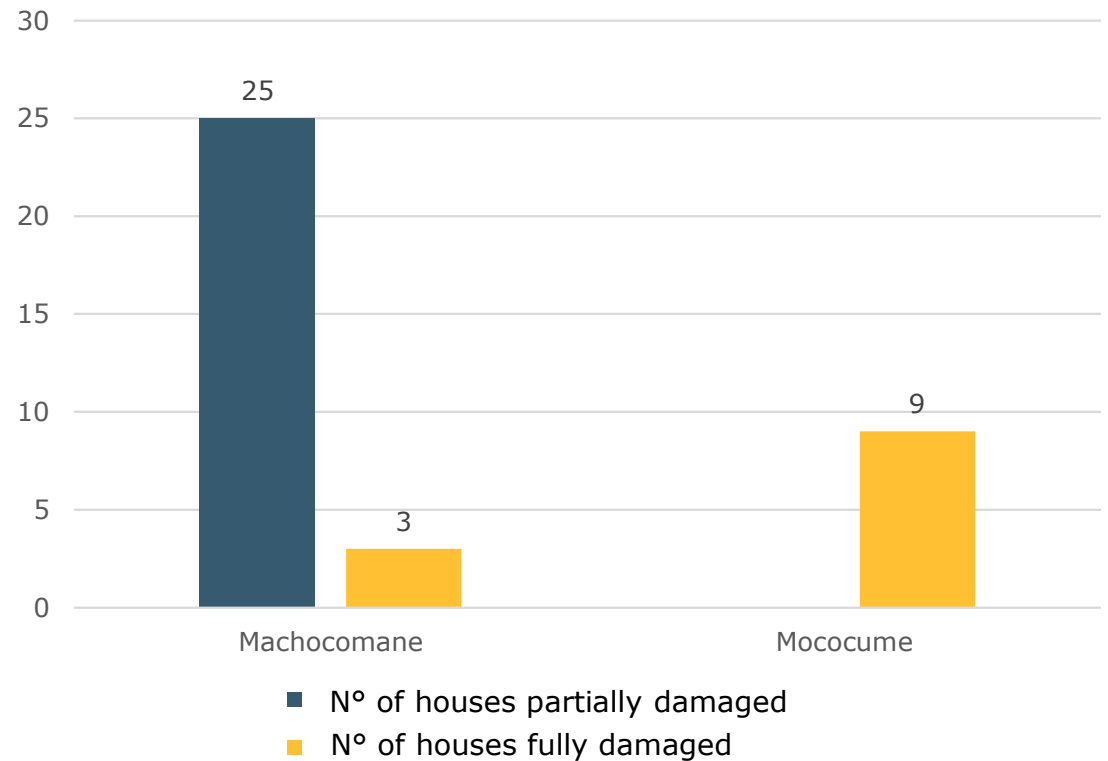

Conclusions

- Tropical storm Filipo has affected people's houses of different communities in Vilankulos and Inhassoro, mainly due to the precarious constructions.
- The needs related to the loss of NFIs for sleeping such as blankets, mats and mosquito nets were due to wetting during the heavy rains that accompanied the storm
- It is still necessary to continue developing needs assessments to facilitate the process of prioritizing vulnerable families to be assisted by the Government and the humanitarian community.
- The main challenges in data collection are associated with the fact that the people at community level, who prepared the lists of those affected were unaware of the need to include key data on the type of impact in the records. In these cases, the humanitarian teams supported by suggesting how to add these questions.
- Humanitarian partners are advised to carry out appropriate verifications prior to distributions.
