Humanitarian relief and transitional recovery efforts in Jamaica in response to Hurricane Melissa should incorporate policy and practices which ensure the risk of damage to the environment is minimized, options for improving environmental conditions are maximized, and consideration of climate included in planning and delivering assistance.
