2. PARTNER UPDATE

NRC- Shelter updates

- Third batch of housing rehab in Tripoli with a total of 138 housing units: work is ongoing and expected to be completed at the mid of March.
- Fourth batch of housing rehab in Tripoli with a total of 27 housing units: contract will be signed this week and expected to be completed first week of April.

Projects and targets for 2022:

1. Projects in partnership with UNHCR:

- Shelter rehab for HHs level in urban areas in Tripoli and Benghazi, targets are 50 housing units in each location: vulnerability assessments are ongoing, developing BoQs and SoWs have been started in parallel.
- Community infrastructure solutions in urban areas in Tripoli and Benghazi, targets are 1 infrastructure project in each location: potential infrastructure projects in both Benghazi and Tripoli have been identified in coordination with municipalities, meetings will be scheduled with UNHCR colleagues to agree and select infrastructure projects in both locations.

2. Projects charged/in partnership with other donors:

- Shelter rehab for HHs level in the east with a total of 128 housing units
- Shelter rehab for HHs level in the west with a total of 78 housing units
- Community infrastructure solutions in the east with a total of 4
- Community infrastructure solutions in the west with a total of 4 projects
- Shelter rehab for HHs level in Tawergha with a total of 230 housing units: vulnerability assessments are ongoing, developing BoQs and SoWs have been started in parallel.



2. PARTNER UPDATE



During Feb-22, UNHCR reached 80 HH, 388 Individuals for IDPs in Al Essaf Wa Al Estijaba IDP camp as part of the Winterization distribution plan for IDP camps in Benghazi.

While a total of 151 detainees were targeted at Ganfouda, Albayda, and Ejdabya DCs, in addition to 99 PoC received NFIs assistance before their evacuation flight to Italy.



2. PARTNER UPDATE

1. **Distribution activities of FI Kit, Hygiene Kit and PPE in Zawiya:** on February 28th, and March 1st 2nd and 3rd the fifth monthly distributions of Hygiene, PPE, FI and SNFI kits took place in 4 different districts of the Municipality of Zawiya: **Juddaim, Arewie, Khartoum/Bu Ghalasha and Terfas**. **125 Hygiene Kits, 125 PPE Kits and 125 FI Kits** have been distributed to **98 HHs** for the benefit of up to **329 beneficiaries** among migrants, refugees and asylum seekers in urban settings.

2. **Humanitarian request of SNFI from Zawiya Municipality:** in response to the Humanitarian Request coming from Zawiya Municipality, targeting 254 vulnerable families in urban settings, considering the budget at our disposal, CEFA purposed to the Municipality to provide one distribution for 80 households (approx.. 350 individuals): the municipality is agreed with our proposal and we are waiting for a formal communication from the municipality.

2. PARTNER UPDATE

DRC

- **Ongoing/and Planned activities:**
 - **Ain Zara Returnees/IDPs families – (60 HH) - referred by the municipality for NFIs needs**
 - **NFI assistance:** Assessment completed, 48HH out of 60 HH considered and **distribution is completed.**
 - **Soug Alahad IDPs site (51 HH):**
 - **Technical assessment** for rehabilitation scope completed, and **procurement process is ongoing.**
 - **AbuSalim Municipality – Supporting Returnees families**
 - DRC –Shelter is aiming to consider **30-40 HH** from Abu Salim for both **Shelter materials and Core NFIs** assistance. Assessment phase will may take place by **Mid-March 2022**
 - **Migrants – Sudanese population at Alkirmia area - (135 Individuals)**
 - DRC –Shelter is aiming to assess and respond to single mothers and children for **NFIs assistance.**

UPDATE on DRC-Shelter funding:

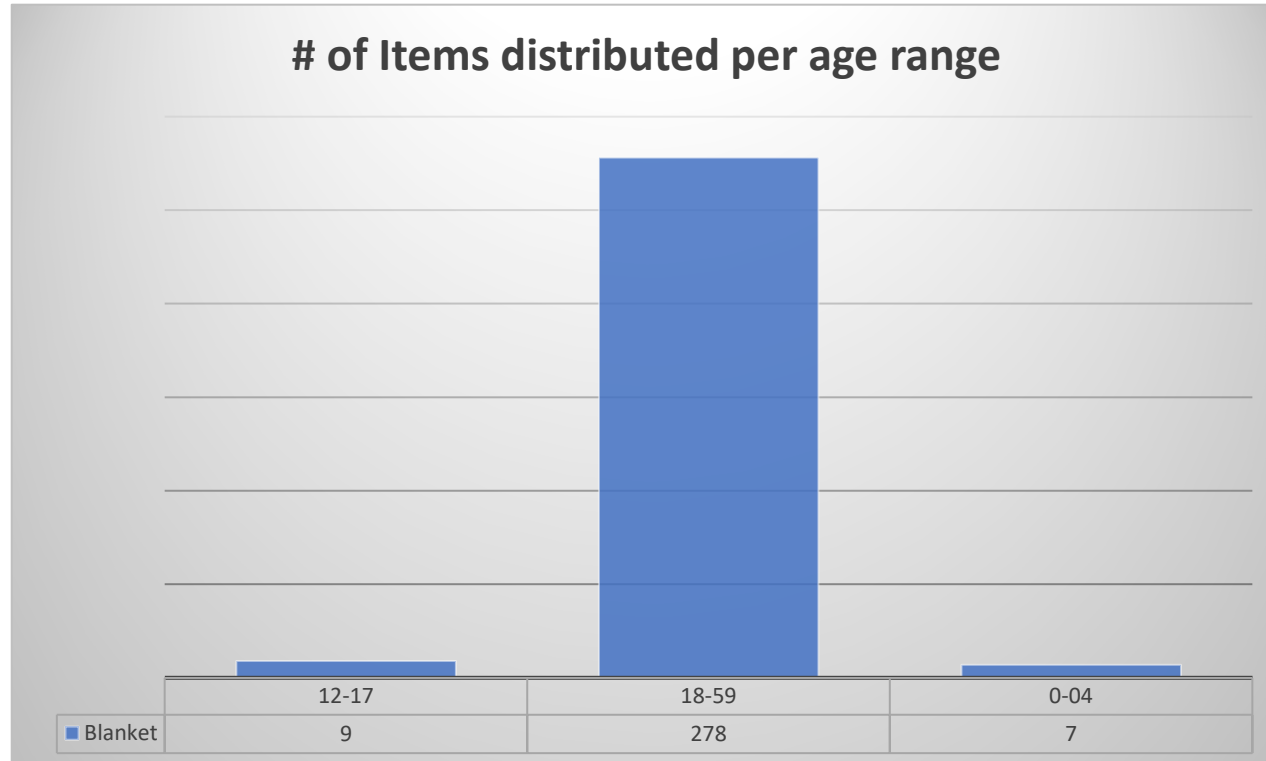
- DRC-Shelter secured a fund for Shelter and WASH assistance and funded by German Federal Foreign Office (GFFO).
- Shelter response-> to improve shelter conditions for **284 IND.**

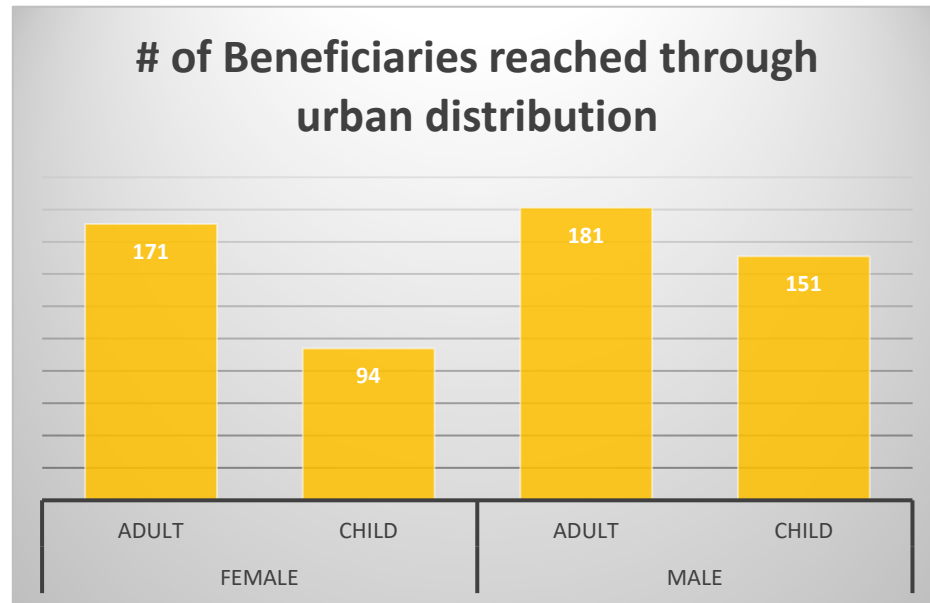
- RaS Distributions, has a total of 294 blankets at TNB and it is classified as follows:

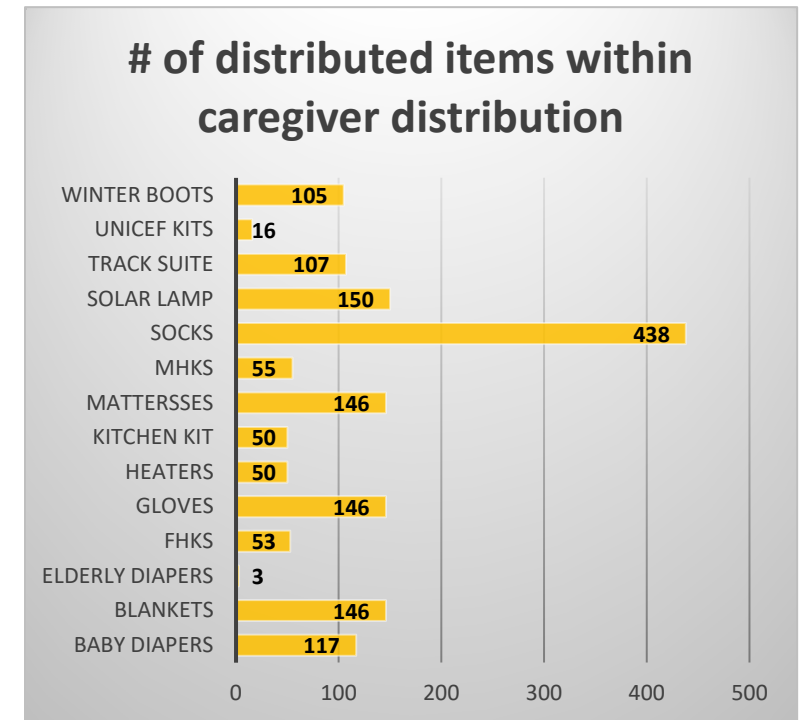
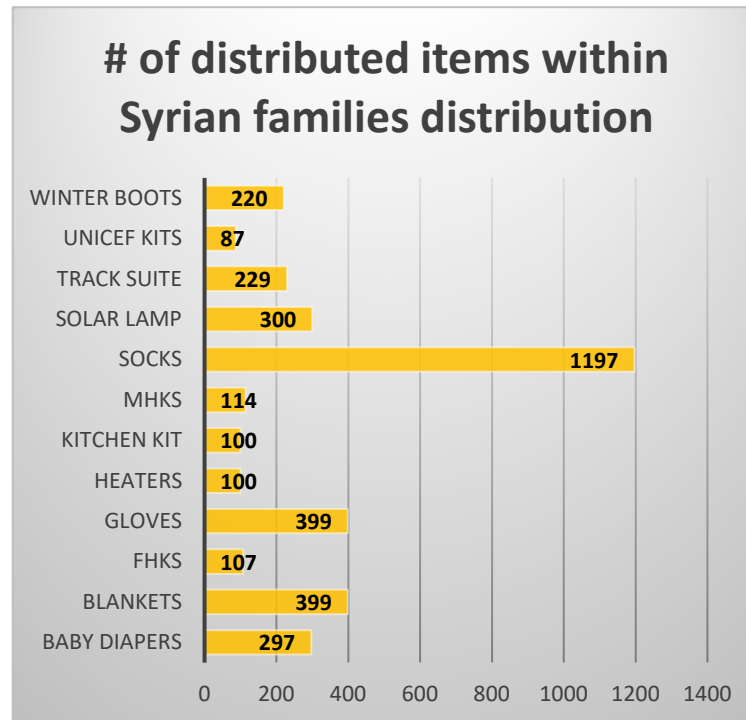
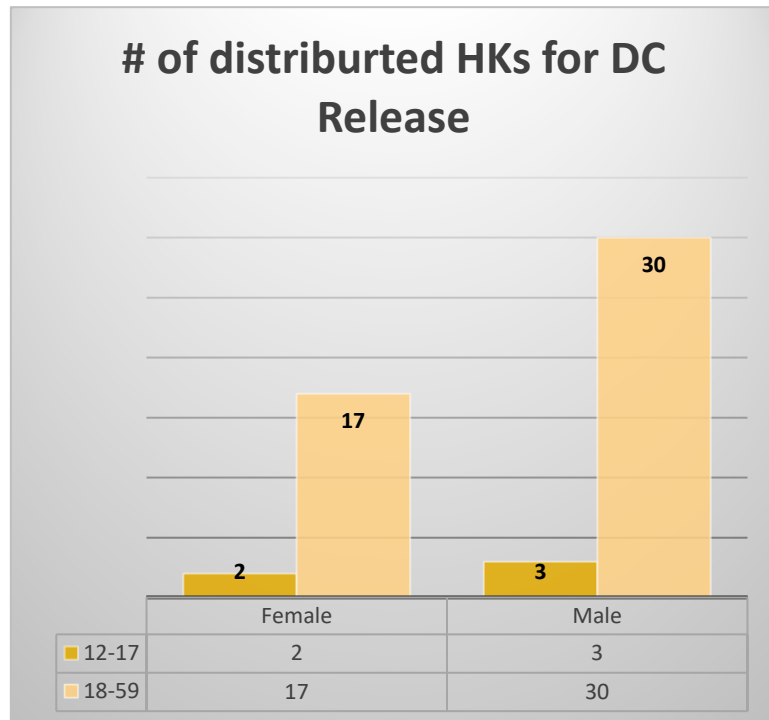
- Urban Distributions, has a total of 597 beneficiaries all of them are POCs, and it was divided into 3 Urban D categories: Syrian community D, Caregivers D and DC Release D. the distributions have been conducted in the Following areas (Krimia, Gurji, AbuSalim, Zanata, Gharghour, Riyadiyah, Ghout Alshaala, Janzour & Al-Serraj). The nationalities of beneficiaries are (Eritrea, Ethiopia, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, and Palestine).

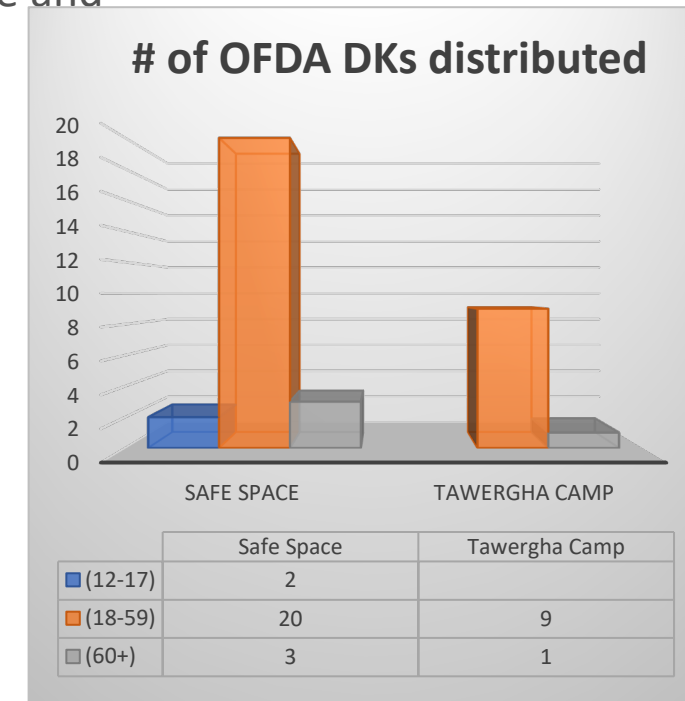
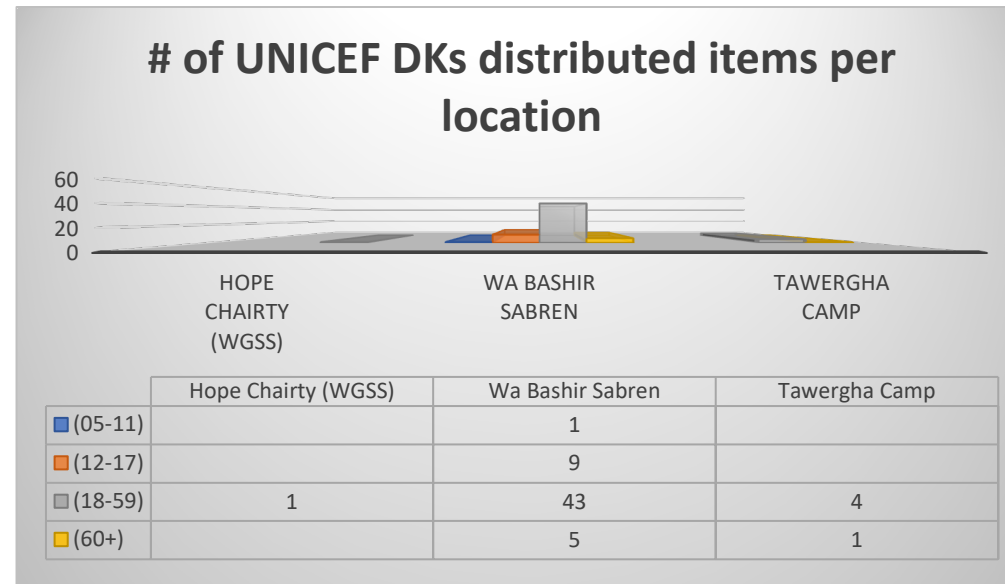
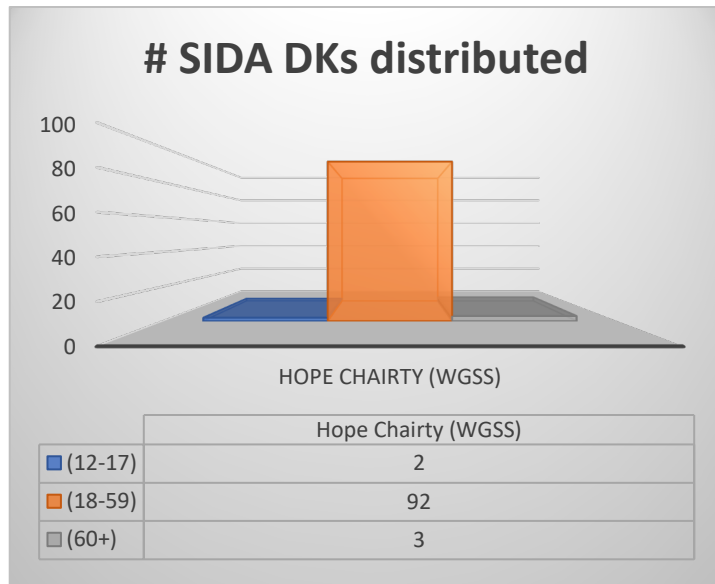
- LRC Distribution, Team distributed the following items:

- Tripoli WPE team at the WGSS Distributions, the team has distributed 97 D Kits under SIDA project, as well as 1 D kit and Blanket under UNICEF funded project, beneficiaries' nationalities are as follows (Sudan 19, Ethiopia 2, Eritrea 9, Chad 38, Nigeria 17, Niger 6, Morocco 3, Ghana 3, Libyan 1).
- Misrata WPE team distributed 63 D kits for UNICEF funded project in the following locations: Tawergha Camp and Wa Bashir Sabren , beneficiaries are nationalities are (Algerian, Egypt, Libyan, Somalia, Sudan), as well as 35 DKs under the OFDA funded Project at Safe Space and Tawergha camp.

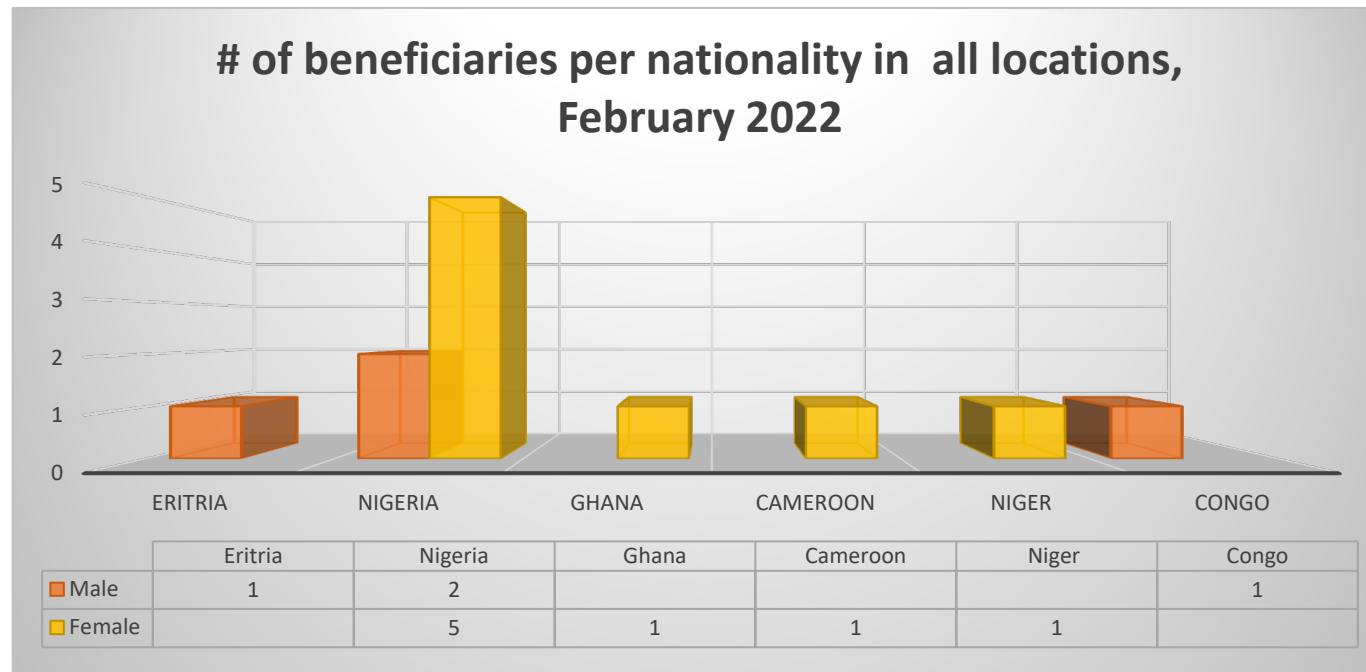


2. PARTNER UPDATE

IRC February, 2022 S/NFI Distributions:

- Under the IPA , the protection teams distributed blankets and Hospital admission kits, at Shara Al zawiya Hospital, Rayan Clinic, Alnokhba Clinic, Reyada Clinic, Aljalaa Hospital, and Alkhadra Hospital.

The total distributed items are: 12 Hospital admission kits, and 12 blankets.

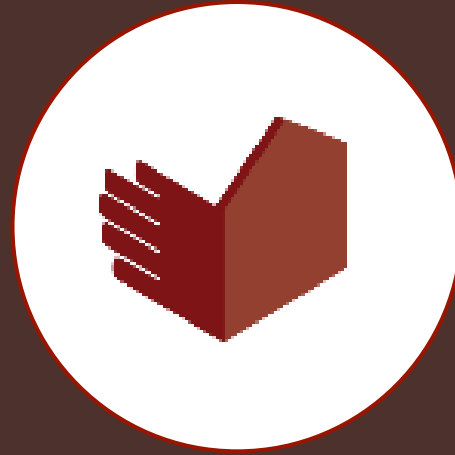
