2	<p><u>Partner Updates</u></p> <p>NRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rehabilitation works in 164 houses in Abu Salim municipality currently ongoing. Expected to be completed end of March - 2022 planned projects: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rehabilitation of 178 houses in Benghazi, 128 houses in Tripoli and 230 in Tawergha • 10 community infrastructure projects (5 in Benghazi and 5 in Tripoli) - Vulnerability assessments currently being conducted for HH level rehabilitation projects in Benghazi and Tripoli. <p>UNHCR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Winterization distribution in IDP sites was resumed after suspension of activities. NFI's and winter items provided to 388 individuals in IDP sites in Benghazi - Distribution activities in DC's ongoing. NFI's provided to 151 individuals in Ganfouda, Albayda and Ajdabia DC's. - Assessments conducted in IDP sites in Benghazi for the provision of plastic sheets for roof insulation purposes. Assessments were coordinated with site managers 		



<p>CEFA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Continued distribution activities of FI Kit, Hygiene Kit and PPE in Zawiya- 80 out of 254 HH in Zawiya Municipality: to receive NFIs <p>CESVI</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Activities are ongoing in Misrata. Distribution activities have slowed down as stock levels are being replenished- Planned distribution of NFI kits including kitchen sets and cleaning materials to 300 HH in Misrata by Ramadan.- Cash for rent is currently suspended for new cases in Misrata due to cash liquidity issues <p>DRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Ain Zara Returnees/IDPs families – (60 HH) - 48HH out of 60 HH considered and distribution is completed.- Soug Alahad IDPs site (51 HH): Technical assessment for rehabilitation scope completed, and procurement ongoing.- AbuSalim Municipality – Supporting Returnees families DRC –aiming to consider 30-40 HH from Abu Salim for both Shelter materials and NFIs assistance. Assessment phase will may take place by Mid-March 2022- Migrants – Sudanese population at Alkirmia area - (135 Individuals) DRC –Shelter is aiming to assess and respond to single mothers and children for NFIs assistance.- DRC-Shelter secured a fund for Shelter and WASH assistance and funded by German Federal Foreign Office (GFFO) - Shelter response - to improve shelter conditions for 284 IND. <p>IOM</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Distribution activities were conducted in 6 DC’s in the east and 2 DC’s in the west during February- Distribution activities targeting migrants in urban settings in Abu Salim and Al Zawiya- NFI’s provided to 2,300 migrants in February- 196 individuals assisted at disembarkation points <p>IRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Distribution of 294 blankets to sea rescue survivors at the Tripoli naval base- Distribution of NFI’s, winter items and hygiene kits to 597 POC’s in urban sites in Tripoli- Provided baby kits, mattresses and blankets to 5 households- Distribution of 97 dignity kits in Tripoli and 63 in Misrata

Presentation form REACH <ul style="list-style-type: none">- 2022 MSNA kick off process starts in March- The process will include discussion of indicators and consulting relevant stakeholders on the indicators to be used and on the methodology- The MSNA is quite challenging given the uncertainty and the phase out of the HRP- Sectors and sector partners are strongly encouraged to share feedback and inputs regarding the type of data that should be collected for the 2022 MSNA- REACH will work with the sector to agree on indicators to be included in the 2022 MSNA
