AGENDA ITEM 1 - Introduction, presentation of participants; 5 min

AGENDA ITEM 2 - Review of the previous meeting decisions, 5 min

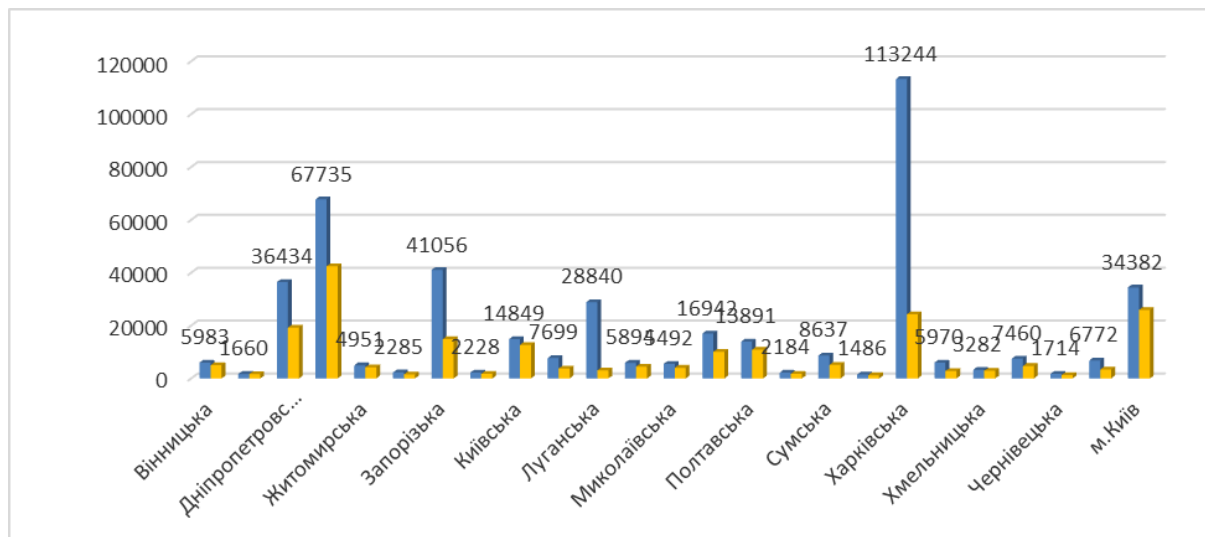
Action points still pending from the previous meeting:

AGENDA ITEM 3 - Update on recent statistics, 5 min

Displacement maps with details up to district were presented for Kyiv region and Kyiv City (for city – comparative analysis of one week change was presented), Kharkiv, Zakarpattia and South part of Donetsk regions.

New statistics under 509 Resolution as of 19 November and SES as of 17 November was presented. Now there is almost 50 % IDPs registered nation-wide (estimated comparison between “old” registration and “new” registration). More than 70 % of registration (note: estimated comparative between two systems figure) in the West is completed. (See chart below)



Unemployment rate nation-wide among IDPs is 41,8 %. The lowest – in Mykolayiv and Kyiv regions – 30%, the highest – Zhytomyr and Zakarpattia. 36 % is in Donetsk region. Luhansk – 52%. Kharkiv – 40%, Zaporozhe 37, Kyiv city – approximately 40%.

As was noted, some IDPs do not officially claim employment, which means many are employed unofficially, while for government authorities they state they have no job. On Luhansk – low registration rate might mean also that many have left for now.



NRC and DRC are planning activities in Northern Luhansk. DRC is planning Protection and demining projects, especially in Severodonetsk.

AGENDA ITEM 4 - Updates on decentralization of coordination

Last Friday (21 November 2014) regional coordination meeting for Kyiv region and Kyiv city was held. The main issues discussed: need for close coordination for cash assistance between ADRA and UNHCR as both implement cash projects in the same area; pros and cons of Collective Center solution; need for volunteers was expressed by representative of Social Protection Department.

Participants have agreed during discussion that CCs should be kept as contingency, it is important to have Collective Centers for the most vulnerable.

AGENDA ITEM 5 - 4W mapping presentation and information sharing tools, 5 min

AGENDA ITEM 8 - Updates from Participants

State Emergency Service of Ukraine: Regarding internally displaced persons as of November 23, 2014: Total number of IDPs is 477,598 persons (173 persons per day), including: ARC – 19,450 persons (2 persons per day); ATO area – 458,148 persons (171 persons per day). Capacity – 1,110 venues able to host 15,618 persons. In Mariupol 571 persons continue living in 37 venues where conditions for accommodation are inappropriate.

Construction of transit camps:

In Kharkiv region (Kharkiv city): To the land section, total area 1.07 ha, 40 trucks with 80 modules arrived. 76 modules have been unloaded, 6 residence buildings were constructed (10 modules each). Stacking of reinforced concrete plates for further construction of 7th residence building (dormitory) has started at the prepared land.

In Zaporizhzhia region (Zaporizhzhia city): To the land, total area 1.12 ha, 55 trucks with 209 modules arrived. 4 module residence buildings (10 modules each) and 1 module residence building (26 modules) were constructed.

In Dnipropetrovsk region: Preparatory engineering works are carried out at the land with total area 5.17 ha (Dnipropetrovsk city – 0.72 ha, Dniprodzerzhinsk city – 0.8 ha, Kryvyi Rih city – 1.85 ha, Pavlograd city – 1 ha, Nikopol city 0.8 ha). 29 trucks with 126 modules arrived, namely:

- Dnipropetrovsk – 2 trucks with 4 modules;
- Nikopol – 2 trucks with 8 modules;
- Kryvyi Rih – 25 trucks with 114 modules, 36 modules are already assembled. 3 residence houses are already constructed (30 modules).

Emergency humanitarian assistance from Germany has been received and unloaded (warm clothes, household items, etc.) as follows: Dnipropetrovsk regions – 25 trucks, Zaporizhzhia region – 22 trucks, Kharkiv region – 29 trucks.

Agreement on funding of construction of module houses camps between International Cooperation Society “GIZ” and Ukrainian Red Cross Society has been signed.

EUR 740,000 were received out of planned EUR 1,481,000 for implementation of mentioned measures.

Based on latest information as of 23.11.2014: More than 251,000 persons (149,000 families) have been registered in accordance with the CMU resolution #509 as of October 1, 2014 “On registration of internally displaced persons from the temporarily occupied territory of Ukraine and anti-terrorist operation area”; 121,429 families applied for targeted financial assistance, 94,522 families out of them were approved for such assistance, 22,538 families have already received such assistance in accordance with the CMU resolution #505 as of October 1, 2014 “On providing monthly targeted financial support to internally displaced persons from the



temporarily occupied territory of Ukraine and anti-terrorist operation area to cover livelihood, including housing and utilities”.

DRC: Office in Berdyansk has been finally opened. It was noted that IDP population in Berdynask has considerably decreased for the two month period. The same is observed in Dnipropetrovsk.

WJR: Organization to receive funds on 20 projects as it has been mentioned before in mid-December only. Meanwhile, Shpola winterization (IDP center) has been finalized. Provision of mobile heaters and glazing is ongoing.

PiN: Repairs in 5 Collective Centers are completed, three are close to completion, one is ongoing, procurement for one more Collective Center is ongoing. Purchase of coal for 10 CCs (20,000 EUR) and wood for 11 CCs (3,000 EUR) is in process. Moreover, agreement has been signed for two more CCs (1 documents submitted, 3 CC tenders in process, 4 – budget preparation, 3 more – to be identified)Materials are being distributed: wood, slate, glass and nails (44 m² of wood, 2,500 slate for some 50 HHs, 240 glass pieces).

Cash grant for winterization: project approved with Ministry of economics, bank account opened. MoU with Privatbank signed. On Wednesday – people are collecting cards from the bank. First payments planned for Friday. 1900 beneficiaries selected. Plan to cover 4,500 HHs by end of March. DNR has final list of destroyed houses. List is available on ministerial level, 20 houses were identified. Needs are huge in Donetsk; price of 1 slate sheet 82 UAH. Distributions are in process: UNICEF – 400 hygiene kits, and 1,200 hygiene kits with other funds support.

IHRC: Mines which were not exploded are in the wall reported. Also, hospital # 21 (Kuybyshevski district, near airport) – construction materials were provided by Agency for reconstruction (400 m² roofing and some glazing). At the moment contact was established with DNR to open humanitarian corridors and future possible evacuation.

UNDP: The nearest supply to occur end of December, distributions to begin end of December.

OCHA: Last week there was a meeting between municipality of Donetsk and OCHA and list of damaged houses was shared. HNO was finalized. SRP to be discussed with the Government.

ADRA: First payments are being tested. So far there are problems with the support of Host Families (people do not want to share contact details of landlords) – more assistance will be needed with Kyiv region. Small project to support small repairmen teams (20 houses repaired) is on-going.

Save Ukraine: Contact with some 80 settlements is supported – once a week phone calls are made. At the moment we try to make a system of IM. 250 trucks with fuel wood for heating to be distributed. In Luhansk (AGE) effort was made to open 4 canteens to feed 1,000 persons. (Yubileyne, Chervonopartisanks, Sverdlovsk, Khreshchate) Difficulties with deliveries. It is easier to deliver from Russia.

Vostok Kyiv Pomosh: Two boilers were installed, which reduced bills to 18,000 for 145 IDPs.



KrymSOS: Warehouse started work. Blankets from UNHCR are in process of distribution, no HR to work daily. In Kyiv and surroundings some 70 % IDPs are registered.
