#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

- An earthquake of tectonic origin with 7.2 magnitude (Ms) occurred in Region VII on 15 October 2013 at about 8:12 AM with an epicentre at Sagbayan, Bohol
- As of **5:00 PM, 20 October 2013**, PHIVOLCS recorded **2,104** aftershocks, **41** of which were felt

#### II. EFFECTS

##### A. INCIDENTS MONITORED:

- Landslide incidents were reported in the following areas:

    - Barangay Biasong, Loon
    - Dagohoy Hills and Magtangtang in Danao
- Stampede occurred at Barba Sports Complex in Toledo City and Pinamungahan Auditorium both in Cebu

#### C. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB B)

- A total of **703,244 families / 3,542,281 persons** were affected in **1,394** barangays in **54** municipalities and **8** cities in **6** provinces of Regions VI and VII
- Out of the total affected, **78,585 families / 370,495 persons** were displaced and served both inside and outside evacuation centers in the Province of Bohol:

Inside **93** Evacuation Centers: **22,816 families / 113,227 persons**

Outside Evacuation Centers: **55,769 families / 257,268 persons**

#### D. DAMAGES

##### Damaged Structures (TAB C)

- A total of **36,645 houses** were damaged (**8,480 totally / 28,165 partially**) in Bohol, Cebu, Negros Occidental, Negros Oriental, Iloilo, Siquijor and Guimaras
- Seaports, airports, churches, government/public buildings, schools, and hospitals were also damaged in the Provinces of Bohol, Cebu, Iloilo, Negros Occidental, Negros Oriental, Siquijor and Leyte in Regions VI and VII

##### Damaged Roads and Bridges (TAB D)

- A total of **39 bridges** were affected of which **34** are passable and **5** not passable, in the Provinces of Bohol, Cebu and Negros Occidental
- A total of **18 roads** were affected of which **16** are passable and **2** not passable in the Provinces of Bohol and Cebu

#### E. COST OF ASSISTANCE (TAB E)

- The total cost of assistance provided by DSWD, DOH, LGUs and NGOs to Regions VI and VII amounted to **PhP13,063,474.35**

#### F. COST OF DAMAGES (TAB F)

- A total of **PhP759,640,000.00** worth of damaged roads, bridges, flood control, **school buildings and other public buildings** was reported in the Provinces of Cebu (**PhP96,160,000**), Bohol (**PhP655,880,000**), Negros Oriental (**PhP250,000.00**) and Siquijor (**PhP7,350,000.00**)

#### G. STATUS OF LIFELINES:

- As of 5:00 PM, 18 October 2013, power in Tagbilaran City and all brgy poblacion in the forty-seven (47) municipalities of Bohol have been restored; assessment of power in the barangays still being undertaken

## H. STATUS OF SEAPORTS/AIRPORTS OPERATIONS:

- Airports and seaports in Cebu and Bohol are all operational

## I. DECLARATION OF STATE OF CALAMITY

- **Province of Bohol** was declared under the **State of Calamity with Resolution No. 453, Series of 2013**
- **Province of Cebu** still under the **State of Calamity with Resolution No. 1041-13** as declared on 20 August 2013

## III. ACTIONS TAKEN

### A. NDRRMC

1. **NDRRMC-OPCEN** immediately disseminated the information to OCDRCs V, VI, VII, and XI through facsimile, SMS, website and twitter account for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs. Moreover, advised them to undertake precautionary measures and to monitor the situation for any possible effects of said earthquake particularly in areas with reported intensities

#### 15 October 2013

- Secretary Voltaire Gazmin, NDRRMC Chairperson and Secretary of Department of National Defense presided the press conference held at the NDRRMC Conference Room at 12:00 NN, to present the initial effects of the earthquake with epicenter at Carmen, Bohol
- At about 3:00 PM, President Benigno S. Aquino III presided the press briefing held at the NDRRMC Conference Room
- At 6:00 PM, OCD Administrator and NDRRMC Executive Director USEC Eduardo Del Rosario presided a Press Briefing at NDRRMC Conference for updates on the effects of the earthquake

#### 16 October 2013

- OCD Administrator and NDRRMC Executive Director USEC Eduardo Del Rosario presided over two (2) Press Briefings at the NDRRMC Conference Room for the updates on the effects of the earthquake at 10:00 AM and 5:00 PM
- A media briefing was presided over by President Benigno Simeon Aquino III and several members of the cabinet including Secretary of National Defense Voltaire T. Gazmin at the Governor's Mansion, Tagbilaran City, Bohol at 10:00 AM

#### 17 October 2013

- At around 11:00 AM, Dir. Romeo F. Fajardo, Civil Defense Deputy Administrator, presided over a press briefing at the NDRRMC Conference Room for the updates on the effects of the earthquake
- At around 5:00 PM, USEC Eduardo Del Rosario presided over a press briefing at the NDRRMC Conference Room for the updates on the effects of the earthquake

#### 18 October 2013

- NDRRMC Executive Director USEC Eduardo D Del Rosario proceeded to Bohol and conferred with the Provincial DRRMC regarding status of the search, rescue, and retrieval operations as well as relief operations being undertaken; conducted aerial survey in Loon, Maribojoc and Carmen together with Sec. Edwin Lacierda, DILG Secretary Manuel Roxas and DWSA Secretary Corazon Soliman; and proceeded to Loon, Bohol to assess the current situation thereat
- At around 10:30 AM and 4:30 PM, Dir Romeo F. Fajardo, Civil Defense Deputy Administrator, presided over two (2) Press Briefings at the NDRRMC Conference Room for the updates on the effects of the earthquake

#### 19 October 2013

- At 8:00 AM, NDRRMC Executive Director USEC. Eduardo D. Del Rosario presided over a coordination meeting with all responder groups at the Governor's Mansion Conference Room in Tagbilaran City, Bohol; at 10:00 AM USEC. Del Rosario joined the Press Briefing together with DILG Secretary Manuel Roxas and DSWD

Secretary Corazon Soliman to assess the extent of damages regarding the updates on the effects of the earthquake

- Conducted inspection in Sagbayan, Bohol together with DILG Secretary Manuel Roxas and DSWD Secretary Corazon Soliman to assess the extent of damages

### 20 October 2013

- At around 9:30 AM, Executive Director USec. Eduardo D. Del Rosario presided over a press briefing at the NDRRMC Conference Room regarding the updates on the effects of the earthquake
2. **DOST-PHIVOLCS** is continuously monitoring the situation for any significant developments and shall be relayed to all concerned
  3. **DSWD** released PhP10 Million to DSWD-FO VII for the purchase of relief goods for the affected population and operational expenses in the disaster operations; prepositioned 2,000 family food packs (PhP509,720.00) and 100 rolls of laminated sacks amounting to PhP775,608.00 airlifted using AFP-PAF C-130 at about 7:49 AM, 16 October 2013; **prepositioned PhP71.30 million worth of standby funds (PhP12.28 million), 14,314 family food packs (PhP3.46 million), other food items (PhP12.6 million) and NFIs (PhP43.32 million) in Region VI and VII including NROC**

- **DSWD DROMIC** is closely coordinating with concerned DSWD-FOs for significant reports relative to the incident
  - Transported 25,000 lbs of relief goods of DSWD from Manila to Tagbilaran via C-130
  - Deployment of six (6) DSWD-CO personnel to assist DSWD-FO VII specifically along the management of evacuation centers, relief distribution, etc
  - Mobilized all personnel at DSWD FO VII and DSWD DRRROO (Disaster Risk Reduction and Response Operations Office) at the Central Office to assist in the disaster operations
  - FO VII transported 2,000 family packs and 1,250 food packs in Bohol Province
4. **PNP** is continuously monitoring the effects of the earthquake and directed subordinate offices/units to coordinate with their respective CDRRMC/PDRRMC for the activation of Crisis Management Committee; full alert status has been declared directing all PNP personnel to report their respective offices for SAR operations; deployed 271 personnel and 17 vehicles from Cebu CPO, Cebu and Bohol PPO and RPSB7; MPS Cortes, Bohol personnel still providing security on the clearing operations along the national highway; assisted the commuters in boarding the watercrafts crossing Abatan River, and assisted in the distribution of relief goods
    - At 1:00 PM, 16 October 2013, TDPCR directed all RDs (Affected PROs) thru SMS to verify missing persons; secure abandoned houses, warehouses and depots; and secure retail outlets/stores to get supplies and basic necessities
    - At 3:00 PM, 16 October 2013, conducted clearing operations in the affected municipalities in Bohol
    - **PRO VII, VIII, and CARAGA** directed all Unit Commanders to continue monitoring the situation and take appropriate measures as necessary
    - **SILG** directed PNP for **PNP Health Service, NCRPO, RHS Doctors and Adjacent RHS and PPOs** in Visayas to organize and be ready for Bohol deployment

5. **AFP** coordinated with OCD VII and PDRRMCs for updates on situation and damage assessment; directed all OPCOM and OPCON units to prepare and alert their respective Disaster Response Task Units (DRTUs) for possible disaster response operations; alerted 525<sup>th</sup> Engr Construction Bn & 9ID's 15<sup>th</sup> SARU, ARESKOM for deployment (to address collapsed structures); deployed security personnel in collapsed churches and in areas w/ landslides to prevent accidents & looting; assisted in the transportation & distribution of relief goods in evacuation centers; directed C-130 to transport equipment & medicines to Bohol; transported 25,000 lbs of relief goods of DSWD fm Manila to Tagbilaran; convened the AFP Crisis Action Team (CAT) on 15 October 2013, 10:00 AM; PN Vessel AT-295 transported DOH VII & DENR VII Response Teams from Cebu to Tagbilaran City; deployed seven (7) choppers; transported water filtration equipment in Bohol
  - **CENTCOM** deployed two (2) helicopters to Bohol for the conduct of Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis
  - **Bohol Ready Reserve Battalion** together with the 505<sup>th</sup> TAS Group participated in rescue and clearing operations at Dauis Church in Bohol
  - **Disaster Response Team (DRT)** in Naval Forces Central Visayas were deployed at Sto. Nino Basilica
  - **Naval Reserve-Eastern Visayas 82<sup>nd</sup> Marine Brigade** was deployed in Basilica del Nino to assist in the clearing operations of the collapsed bell tower
  - **2<sup>nd</sup> Special Forces Battalion**
    - Provided squad tent and thirty (30) folding beds for use of patients of Cong Simeon Toribio Hospital that were transferred to Carmen Gym
    - Conducted rescue/retrieval ops in:
      - Brgys Biabas & Mayuga
      - Brgy Villaflor, Clarin, Bohol
      - Brgy Cantalid, Balilihan, Bohol
    - Provided transportation assistance to:
      - More or less 50 earthquake victims in Brgy Poblacion, Pilar, Bohol
      - Community in Brgy Poblacion, Pilar, Bohol
    - Assisted in putting up tents at Mayuga National High School, Guindulman, Bohol
    - Assisted PGU personnel in the distribution of relief goods at Bohol Cultural Center, Tagbilaran City
    - Assisted victims and conducted information drive to affected populace in Brgy Nueva Montaña, Buenavista, Bohol
    - Assisted earthquake victims in the following areas:
      - Carmen Sports Complex, Brgy Poblacion Sur, Carmen, Bohol
      - Brgy Poblacion, Loboc, Bohol
      - Brgy Villaflor, Carmen, Bohol
      - Brgys Dusita & Magsaysay, Sierra Bullones and in Brgy Mayana, Jagna, Bohol
    - Provided transportation & manpower assistance on the distribution of relief goods & other basic needs to affected populace in Brgys Santa Fe, San Carlos, Cantubod & Dagohoy, all of Danao, Bohol
    - Conducted rescue operation on a landslide at Brgy Villaflor, Clarin, Bohol
    - Conducted mobile patrol in the municipality of Carmen, Bohol
6. **PCG** sent directives to Coast Guard units nationwide to submit lists of affected areas covering ports, passenger terminals, CG facilities and personnel, vessels/boat, and power/communications breakdown; coordinated with Philippine Port Authority (PPA), LGUs, and local DRRMCs; CGD Central Visayas SAR Teams/Emergency Units are on standby and ready for dispatch; BRP Corregidor (AE-891) is on standby for relief operations in coordination with DSWD and DOTC
  - **PCG Patrol Craft (DF-318)** ferried rescue teams and media personnel from Tagbilaran to Loon, Bohol
  - **SARV-002** proceeded to Cebu City to load another set of relief goods
  - **SARV-003** ferried relief goods of DSWD from Manila to Tagbilaran, Bohol and arrived at Tagbilaran Port on 19 October 2013

- **K9 Team was distributed to various rescue teams to Brgy. Viga, Antequera and Brgy. Villaflor, Clarin to assist in rescue and retrieval operations on the rubble and landslide areas**
  - **CGS Cebu facilitated free transport from Cebu to Tubigon through commercial shipping lines of six (6) officers from PCGA to assist in the relief operations, four (4) personnel from Zion Emergency Disaster Rescue Unit to conduct medical service, and two (2) Elf truck and one (1) pick-up truck with relief goods from Cebu to Tubigon through commercial vessel for the conduct of PCGA relief operations**
  - **CGS Tagbilaran facilitated the loading of 1,000 bottles of mineral water and 1,000 packs of packed lunch from the office of the Chief of Staff of Honorable Board Member Godofredo Tirol to MBca Saint Anne de Beaupre enroute to Catagbacan, Bohol**
  - **PCG VII continuously facilitating the transfer of goods for the victims in Tagbilaran City**
7. **PICE-ASEP** personnel from Manila were deployed to Cebu and Tagbilaran on 16 October 2013
8. **DOH** was initially placed on code red alert status
- **CHD VII** raised code red alert status and conducted Rapid Health Assessment (RHA) in the Region; provided immediate medical needs, securing water sources and sanitation, and psychosocial services to responders; **assisted National Epidemiology Center (NEC) in the conduct of Rapid Health Assessment in Cebu and Bohol**
  - **CHD VIII** provided **WASH, Medical and Psychosocial services to the municipality of Albuquerque, Bohol**
  - **DOH-HEMS** reported that the six (6) hospitals/health facilities in Bohol have sustained cracks in the building but after assessment the hospitals are still be functional and operational
  - Two teams from Manila were deployed on 16 October 2013 to Tagbilaran, Bohol to assist CHD-VII and the hospitals
  - Sent additional one (1) Medical Response Trauma Team in Bohol (7-Man Team)
  - Identified three (3) hospitals in Cebu City with displaced patients: Cebu City Medical Center, St. Anthony Mother and Child Hospital and Vicente Sotto Memorial Medical Center. These structures were inspected by city engineers and currently recommended as unsafe to be occupied
  - Augmented assorted medicines, medical supplies, cot beds, family tents, WASH supplies to CHD VII
  - Conducted the first WASH Cluster Meeting on 18 October 2013 and was attended by PHO, CHD and WASH cluster partners to ensure coordination or responses/interventions
  - Assisted the deployment of mobile water treatment units to affected municipalities where water supply is one of the major identified needs (1 each in Sablayan, Calape, Loon and Maribojoc) and provided briefing to 8-man team from Manila Water Inc. prior to deployment in the Municipality of Calape
9. **BFP** deployed fire fighters, CSSR teams and fire trucks in the affected areas of Regions V, VI, VII, VIII, and XI; assisted in the evacuation, rescue, retrieval and clearing operations in Regions V, VI, VII, VIII and XI; provided assistance in the transport of victims to the nearest hospital; provided Public Safety Information Drive regarding earthquake; conducted inspection and assessment of the damage; provided illumination of the building in Panganiban, Cebu City Medical Center; deployed 12 personnel from SRU and 4 EMS from NCR to Bohol; BFP Fire Stations personnel together with a representative from municipal engineering office conducted a joint-ocular inspection to public schools, market, mall, churches and other establishments
- **BFP** organized Medical Teams for deployment on 19 October 2013 to assist DOH
  - **BFP** responders in Bohol were deployed by PDRRMC to Municipality of Maribojoc on board Coast Guard vessel
  - **BFP VII** accommodates Cebu City Medical Center patients; BFP VII compound was visited by Hon. Manuel Roxas, Secretary of Interior and Local Government, to

personally assess the conditions of CCMC patients and staff and directed the immediate transfer of the patients from BFP grounds to BFP Apparatus floor and tennis court area; **parking area converted into temporary ward for Cebu City Medical Center Hospital patients**

10. **DPWH** deployed personnel to conduct evaluation on the structural soundness of all affected areas
  - **DPWH V** coordinated with District Engineering Offices regarding the effects of earthquake in their area of responsibility
  - **DPWH VII** conducting assessment on the damaged roads, bridges and building in Bohol; engineering teams in Bohol is currently conducting repair of damaged roads and finding passable detour roads
11. **PRC NHQ** is on Alert Level 1 and coordinated with chapters for updates on the situation in their respective area of responsibility; all RCAT and 143 volunteers are on standby and ready for deployment; deployed additional staff and volunteers to augment manpower support; standby non-food items at Central and Mandaluyong warehouses; facilitated shipment of goods/equipment for Cebu and Bohol through C-130; **Social Services established two (2) welfare desks at Gov. Celestino Gallares Hospital and Community Hospital**
  - **PRC Cebu** deployed four (4) teams for assessment and rescue; hot meals served for 500 persons on 17 October 2013 in Brgy. Pasil Elementary School, Cebu City; 13 patients were transported by PRC Cebu ambulance team from one hospital to a different hospital; **served hot meals to 350 persons to Pasil Elementary School and High School; teams deployed in Mandaue Community Hospital, Cebu Sprt Complex-Abellana and Vicente Sotto Medical Memorial Center (VSMMC)**
  - **PRC Lapu-lapu City** deployed two (2) ambulances
  - **PRC Bohol** conducted assessment; served hot meals to 3,000 individuals at the Bohol Cultural Center & Sports Complex; set up two (2) welfare desks at Gov. Celestino Gallares Hospital and Community Hospital in Tagbilaran; served 24 individuals for RFL/Tracing; **deployed assessment team at Loon, Bohol; installed Rub hall at Celestino Gallares Memorial Hospital**
  - **PRC Lapu-lapu/Cordova** deployed ambulances and assessment team and conducted ocular survey in different barangays, malls, hotels and resorts
12. **DepEd** activated their disaster risk reduction and management office and announced the suspension of classes in Cebu City and the whole of Bohol on October 16, 2013 awaiting the results of assessment of the school buildings' safety by their teams; at 10:00 AM, 16 October 2013, started the identification of alternative classrooms in the affected areas for the possible resumption of classes; **engineers are still conducting assessment and are determing cost of damages; classrooms and school facilities that were declared unsafe have been cordoned off; mobilized resources for tents in education cluster and in partnership with LGU; organized debriefing of affected teachers and psychosocial support training to teachers; provided Psychosocial First Aids (PFA) to students**
  - Cebu Provinces, Cities of Dumaguete; classes in Siquijor are suspended until further notice by the LGU while classes in La Carlota and Iloilo City resumed on 17 October 2013
  - DepEd conducts identification of priority areas for safety assessment of schools with other partners
  - Continues to mobilize resources for tents in education cluster. Organizes debriefing of affected teachers and psychosocial support training for teachers
  - As decided by the LGU, the following will hold classes on 21 October 2013: Cities of Guihulngan and Dumaguete, **and Tanjay City in Negros Oriental**; Mandaue City will resume on 04 November 2013, as decided by the LGU to give ample time for assessment of structures
  - **In Bohol Province, classes are still suspended until 23 October 2013 because of the occurrence of aftershocks**
  - **In Cebu Province, five (5) cities and 15 municipalities will resume classes on 21 October 2013**

- Cities of Bogo, Naga and Toledo, **Cebu and Danao**
  - **Municipalities of Aloguinsan, Asturias, Balamban, Carmen, Catmon, Daanbantayan, Madridejos, Medellin, Pilar, Pinamungajan, San Remegio, Tabuelan, Tuburan, Tudela, Sta. Fe**
13. **MMDA** deployed one (1) rescue team to Bohol and one (1) rescue team to Cebu
  14. **DOTC** announced the operationalization of Tagbilaran Seaport for fastcraft only. Also, coordinated with commercial airlines for the availability of seat passengers. While, the cargoes for the rescue operations are requested to be free of charge through PAL and Cebu Pacific
  15. **DTI** linked with the Food Chamber of the Philippines to do assessment of their member manufacturers and distributors located in Cebu and Bohol
    - **DTI Cebu** conducted emergency price and supply monitoring of basic necessities and prime commodities; eleven (11) teams were deployed to monitor prices/supply; released a summary report to the media on the results of the special price and supply monitoring conducted after the earthquake; sixty (60) establishments including wetmarkets were monitored on 16 October 2013 in Cebu City, Mandaue City, Lapu-lapu, Minglanilla, Consolacion and Danao City
      - **DTI Cebu Provincial Office (DTI-CPO)** has decided to relocate temporarily at the National Economic Research and Business Assistance Center (NERBAC) along Lapu-lapu, Cebu City to ensure uninterrupted service for its clients
    - **DTI Bohol** deployed three (3) teams to conduct price and supply monitoring in Bohol on 17 October 2013
  16. **MGB VII** conducting assessment to the landslide-affected areas in Bohol and Cebu
  17. **National Nutrition Council** sent out nutrition teams to different evacuation centers in Bohol and gave out micronutrient supplement to vulnerable sectors
  18. **National Telecommunications VII** provided volunteers to augment the communication in Tagbilaran City
  19. **National Bureau of Investigation DVI Team** on standby for possible deployment in Bohol

## **B. REGIONAL PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE:**

1. **RDRRMCs V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, and XI**
  - Closely coordinating with concerned MDRRMCs and Civil Defense Deputized Coordinators and advised them to be on alert and to monitor any possible effects of earthquake in their areas of responsibility
2. **RDRRMC V**
