North Sudan

July 2011

Executive Summary

- In July, 28,329 households were supported with non-food items and emergency shelter from the NFI Common Pipeline in Darfur, of which approximately 96.84 % were IDPs requiring rainy replenishments, 3.04% were disaster-affected populations and 0.1% were newly displaced households. In total 62,818 items were distributed, including 29,163 jerry cans, 28,329 plastic sheets, 112 pieces of women's clothing, 1,758 sleeping mats, 1,728 cooking sets and 1,728 blankets.
- WFPLCU as Sector Lead continues to coordinate response to needs in South Kordofan. Bilateral discussions are ongoing with NFI & ES Sector partners that have access to the area and capacity on the ground to conduct needs assessments and distribution of NFI & ES items. Over 8,700 households have been provided with NFI & ES items from the Common Pipeline since 11 June, by implementing partners UNICEF, SRCS, SC Sweden, UDS, SRCS, in 19 locations in South and North Kordofan.

- IOM has informed WFPLCU that it has loose NFI & ES items in their warehouse in Kadugli which could be supplemented by items from the NFI common Pipeline to make up full kits.
- In preparation for the CERF request for the South Kordofan Multi-Sectoral response, WFPLCU updated the status of the Common Pipeline for donors, with information on funding received, items procured and response to date with the funds received against the contingency planning appeal of October 2010.

Blue Nile State

To ensure preparedness and rapid response to any emergencies in Blue Nile State, WFPLCU has pre-positioned 2000 NFI & ES kits and 500 cooking sets in the GOAL warehouse in Kurmuk, and 500 NFI & ES kits at the SRCS warehouse in Ed Damazin.

Contingency Plan Funding Status

The funding status of the NFI Common Pipeline core partners is shown in the table below. WFPLCU and IOM are fully funded for the operation. UNICEF received another USD 2 million from OFDA in July which will be used for the additional procurement of NFI & ES stocks.

Contingency Plan Stock Status (as of 31 July 2011)

Based on scenarios and figures endorsed by the Humanitarian Country Team, the NFI & ES Sector Referendum Contingency Planning figure for North Sudan was updated from 147,500 households to 118,000 households for Rest of Sudan (ROS) for referendum related displacements. The NFI Common Pipeline has current stocks in El Obeid sufficient to serve 68,686 households (approximately five people to a household) with an NFI package consisting (2 sleeping mats, 1 jerry can, 1 blanket and one plastic sheet). This is sufficient to cover 58% of the revised planning figure. This does not include cooking sets which were not purchased by the Common Pipeline due to lack of funds. UNICEF donated 998 cooking sets to the CP, which

are pre-positioned in El Obeid (498 sets) and Kurmuk, Blue Nile State (500 sets), whilst MC Scotland donated 2,000 cooking sets which are pre-positioned in El Obeid. The Common Pipeline has requested CERF funds for the procurement of 26,000 cooking sets.

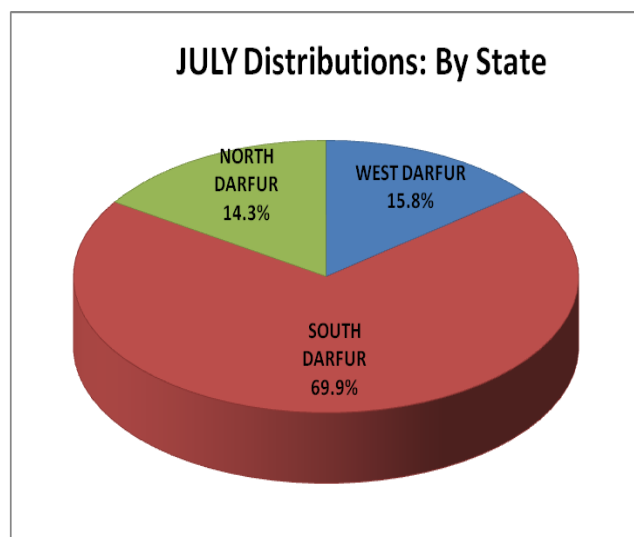
Darfur NFI Common Pipeline

NFI Common Pipeline Management Update

The UNHCR representative working with WFPLCU on the transition of the WFP Special Operation 103422 which includes leadership of the NFI & ES Sector and management of the Common Pipeline visited the WFP field offices in El Geneina, Nyala and EL Fasher office and met with implementing partners and cooperating agencies. As the modalities of the transition are being worked out, the NFI & ES Sector continues to function as usual, ensuring that there are no gaps in coverage until the time the transfer is completed, which is scheduled for the 31st December 2011. WFPLCU has shared procurement plans for NFI & ES items with UNICEF to ensure all items are received in time for the winter season replenishment distributions to IDPs in Darfur, due to begin in October.

July Activities

In total 62,818 items were distributed, including 29,163 jerry cans, 28,329 plastic sheets, 112 pieces of women's clothing, 1,758 sleeping mats, 1,728 cooking sets and 1,728 blankets. NFI & ES Beneficiary Eligibility

The NFI & ES Sector via the Common Pipeline and implementing partners provides life-saving NFI & ES interventions for conflict- or disaster-affected populations. WFPLCU uses the Common Pipeline Guiding Principles (which are endorsed by the Advisory Panel) to determine the beneficiaries that can be served. These are listed below. Distributions to all potential beneficiary households must be supported by needs assessments and appropriate verifications.

Conflict-affected populations are people who have been displaced from their area of origin, and have lost their household possessions. They are entitled to support immediately after the emergency and are subject to targeted distributions as long as they remain displaced.

Internally Displaced Persons: (IDPs) are conflict-generated, displaced persons who have not left their country of origin and cannot return to their area of origin due to on-going insecurity. IDPs can be either newly displaced, re-displaced or IDPs requiring replenishment.

Host Community Affected by Conflict: Subsistence host communities who are not displaced, but supporting IDPs and/or have additional strains on their communities due to conflict.

Organized Returns: -people in the process of returning or recently returned to, their registered place of origin by IOM.

Spontaneous Returns: -IDPs, officially identified by cooperating partners, who have returned to their areas of origin either by their own means or with the support of organizations (other than IOM) or the government.

Returnees will receive NFI support if the following two criteria are fulfilled:

- Verified by the RRWG as voluntary and appropriate return, moving from the areas of displacement to their area of origin.
- NFI needs are identified by an assessment.

Disaster-Affected Populations

Disaster-affected populations are supported directly after and in response to a local disaster, such as flood or fire. These beneficiaries have lost their household possessions and are supplied with 1-time emergency items to help them while they recover.

In July, severe gale winds and storms on the night of 10 July caused severe flooding and damage to a large number of dwellings in Kalma IDP camp.





An inter-agency rapid assessment was undertaken by OCHA, Oxfam America, WFPLCU, UNICEF and WVI to determine the damage caused and assistance required. The areas worst affected were verified and NFI & ES items (2 blankets, 1 cooking set, 2 jerry cans, 1 plastic sheet and 2 sleeping mats) were provided for 650 HHs consisting.
