Introduction

The Shelter Cluster Coordinator, Noor Ahmed, welcomed the meeting attendees and presented the agenda of the meeting. The meeting kicked off at 10:05am.

1. Review of action Points

- The Cluster has shared with all Cluster partners and wider audience the Shelter Response profile document.
- IOM is yet to share with the Shelter Cluster the templates and guidelines regarding the common pipeline for review.
- Registration by partners for the common pipeline is still open till end of March 2023.
- NRC shared the concept note and the link for partners to send expression of interest to join the NEAT+ training. The training was conducted on 12th and 13th March in Garowe, and 15th and 16th March Hargeisa, although with low Shelter partners participation. NRC is still willing to organize another session if partners are interested.
- Las Canood response is ongoing. Partners responding are still asked to share plans and reports with the Cluster.
- The Cluster is still available to conduct the new 4W template orientation for any partner who is interested.

2. Update/Plans from the partners

- NRC has commenced the permanent shelter project funded by World Bank targeting 1000 HH in a site called Xodale adjacent to Jilib2 settlement in Garowe. This will include construction for 1.5km access road to the site.
- NRC also plans to construct 500 permanent settlements in Dollow with funds from EU.
- AVORD is currently conducting a vulnerability assessment in Banadir, Baidoa, and El berde and Jowhar in preparation for distribution of 7000 NFIs with UNHCR funds.
- IOM is constructing 1500 transitional shelters in Dollow. IOM is also producing the first prototypes of mud brick shelters in Baidoa by April. IOM also planning the in-kind distribution under first line response in Baidoa and Mogadishu targeting 8000 HH before the end of the week. With regards to Las Cannod crisis, IOM is targeting 5000 HH with plastic sheet and MPCA. Plastic sheet distribution is ongoing in Xidh Xidh and Widh Widh, and planned for Burhudle.

- HAPEN is still undertaking the distribution of 3500 NFI kits and construction of 1000 ESK project in Xudur. It will be completed within the next month.
- HINNA is still undertaking distribution of 1600 NFI kits and construction of 1600 ESK project in Baidoa.
- Mercy Corps is planning to reach 3000 HH with ESK and NFIs for newly drought displaced HH in South Central Somalia through BHA funds.

ACTION POINTS:

- IOM to share their mud bricks prototype in Baidoa with Cluster Partners once they are produced.

3. Cluster IM updates

- By Feb 2023, partners have reached 123,006 with shelter and NFI response against an annual target of 1.4 million people. Of these, 99,000 received NFI and 85,000 received shelter.
- CFRM was established for 69% of the shelter and NFI projects. 10% of the assistance was delivered through cash. The rest was delivered in kind.

4. Lascanood situation update

- According to the information received up to 12th March, up to 200,000 people have been displaced due to the conflict in Lascanood since late December 2022.
- These have mainly been displaced to Sool, Togdheer, Bari, Nugaal, and Mudug.
- Identified needs include emergency shelter and NFIs especially for Boocame, God Qaboobe, and Kalabeydh villages in Sool region where displaced people have been affected by rains.
- 1,450 HH in Kalabeyd and Gumeys in Sool have received NFI kits.
- Access to affected locations in Somaliland is restricted due to insecurity especially in Gumays, Adhe Adeye and yagoori areas. Negotiation for humanitarian access is ongoing.
- The conflict is still active and the IDPs may be face long term displacement.

5. Capacity Building

- The training on Sphere Standards on Shelter & Settlement that was planned tentatively for mid March was not done. The Cluster is planning to do it in mid April.
- Protection mainstreaming training is also planned.
- IOM will conduct another training on common SNFI pipeline

ACTION POINTS:

- The Cluster to send invitation for partners to attend Sphere Standards and Protection mainstreaming training.
- IOM to provide information of when common pipelines training will be conducted.
