- **Planned /Completed activities:**
  - **GFFO project:**
  - Target to assesses roughly resettled Tawerghan family affected by eviction from Alfalfa 1,2 and Sidi Al Sayah Camps for access to safe and appropriate shelter in greater Tripoli.
  - Non-Libyan beneficiaries' assessment on going coordinate with Alswani municipality for accessing to the migrants' sites.



### NFIs

During the reporting period, UNHCR through partners provided NFIs assistance to PoC as below :

#### **IPDs:**

- Urban IDPs: Muruzq IDPs in greater Tripoli, 603 HH(2,979 individuals).
- IDP camps: Hellis IDP camp in Benghazi, 1 HH ( 7 individuals).

#### **Asylum seekers and refugees:**

- CDC: 55 HH (281 individuals).
- Urban distribution: 1,179 individuals.

# 2. PARTNER UPDATE

## NRC- Shelter updates



### - **Projects in partnership with UNHCR:**

#### 1. **HHs level rehab:**

- a. Benghazi: target is 50 housing units- implementation work is completed and all housing units have been handed over to beneficiaries.
- b. Tripoli: target is 50 housing units- Implementation work is in progress, expected to be completed 2<sup>nd</sup> week of November.

#### 2. **Rehab and upgrade of community infrastructures:**

- a. Benghazi: target is 1 project: “Lifting sewage substation tender had been launched then re-advertised as there were no eligible bidders, technical and financial evaluation will be finalized next week, implementation is expected to start last week of October.
- b. Tripoli: target is 1 project, confirmed and agreed about the **(Hey Alzour water pump station rehab in Abouslaim municipality)**, and the technical package is completed, shared with UNHCR, tender evaluation is completed, contracting is ongoing and the implementation is expected to commence 3<sup>rd</sup> week of October

### - **Other shelter projects:**

1. **Other 22 HHs rehab housing units project in Tripoli:** Technical package is completed, implementation will start 3<sup>rd</sup> week of October
2. **Other 122 HHs rehab housing units project in Benghazi project, divided as following:**
  - 50Hhs sub-standard housing units rehabilitation in Benina are completed
  - 50Hhs sub-standard housing units rehabilitation in Sidi Khalifa, in technical package completed and implementation is in progress
  - 22Hhs Sub-standard rehab housing unit in AlSabrie Neighborhood – Vulnerability assessment completed, development of technical documents is ongoing.
3. **Shelter rehab for HHs level in Tawergha with a total of 246 housing units:** Implementation of first batch of 50 houses are in progress, technical package for the second package of 50 houses is completed, implementation will start first week of November



## 2. PARTNER UPDATE



1. **Distribution activities of NFI and Hygiene kits in Zawiya:** on October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> the monthly distribution of Hygiene, and NFI kits took place in 4 different districts of the Municipality of Zawiya (Juddaim, Arewie, Khartoum/Bu Ghalasha and Terfas). **99 Hygiene Kits and 99 FI Kits** have been distributed for the benefit of up to **300 beneficiaries** among migrants, refugees and asylum seekers in urban settings.

## 2. PARTNER UPDATE

### IRC UPDATES



The total number of individuals with NFIs assistance during **September 2022** is **2001** and the total number of distributed items is **7388**.

**LRC Shelter:** for the Libyan Red Crescent shelter, the team reached 17 clients and distributed a total of 21 items.  
(Baby Kit 2, Female HK 8, Male HK 4, Blanket 3, Mattress 3, Kitchen set 1)

**WPE:** the WPE team distributed in the WGSS sites and reached **129** clients and distributed a total of **708** items.  
(Baby Kit 20, Female HK 50, Male HK 34, Kitchen set 44, Mattress 129, Solar Lamp 44,  
Soap bar 258, Blankets 129)

**Urban:** for the urban distributions: the NFIs team conducted two campaigns and reached **1050** clients and distributed a total of **5345** items.  
**First Campaign** (Baby Kit 51, Female HK 117, Male HK 186, Kitchen set 174, Mattress 550, Solar Lamp 177,  
Jerry can 180, Soap 1100) 2535  
**Second Campaign** (Baby Kit 46, Female HK 106, Male HK 202, Kitchen set 237, Mattress 500, Blankets 500,  
Jerry can 219, Soap 1000) 2810

**Detention Centers:** for the DC distributions the Protection team distributed a total of **729** items to **230** detainees.  
( Male HK 34, Mattress 230, Slippers 229, Female HK 7, Track suit 229)

**Disembarkation Points:** for the rescue at sea distributions the Ras team distributed a total of **195** items to **195** survivors.  
( Refreshments 195, MHK195 )

**CDC:** at the community Day Center, the NFIs team reached **380** and distributed a total of **390** items.  
( Adults diapers 10, Baby diapers 37, FHK 132, MHK 208, Blankets 1, Track suit 1, Slippers 1)



## 2. PARTNER UPDATE

### IOM SNFI Distributions : September 2022



- In this month IOM covered in total of 8568 migrants in 12 mantikas which are Al Jabal Al Gharbi, Azzawya, Misurata, Tripoli, Alkufra, Benghazi, Al-jfara, Zwara, Ghat, Sebha, Al-Gatroun, and Bani Waleed.
- In DCs IOM covered 1042 migrants with 2946 kits of Non-food items.
- In Urban settings IOM covered 7256 migrants with 7668 kits of Non-food items.
- In Community centers IOM covered 270 migrants with 1178 kits of Non-food items.
- Total NFIs provided: 11792 kits, generally (Hygiene kits, Mattresses, Blankets, Solar lamps, Jerry cans, and Clothing kits.)

# Eviction Task Force Sidi Al-Sayeh IDP Camp

## Context

- 32 HHs - Tawerghan IDPs.
- Governmental land, Private Company - residential camp for workers.
- Eviction notice – Ministry of Interior through Local Council of Tawergha.
- All families left by the end of September 2022.



# Obstacles to return

- Lack of livelihood and daily wage opportunities
- Destruction of houses
- Issues in infrastructure such as electricity and limited basic services



### Response

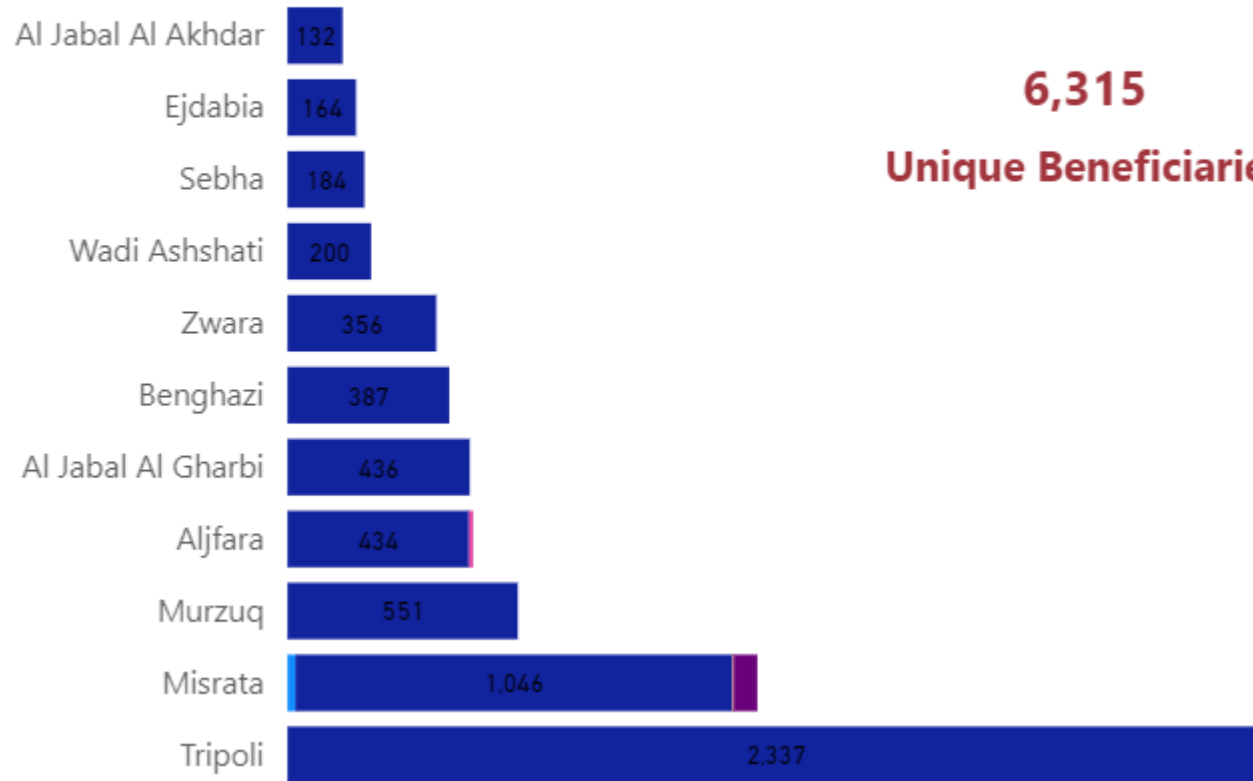
- Verification of figures and situation (DRC, UNHCR)
- Provision of NFIs, HKs, CRIs (UNHCR)
- Provision of MPCA, legal aid, receive referrals to include HHs in the rehabilitation program (NRC).
- Provision of Individual Protection Assistance (DRC – for HHs facing protection risks)

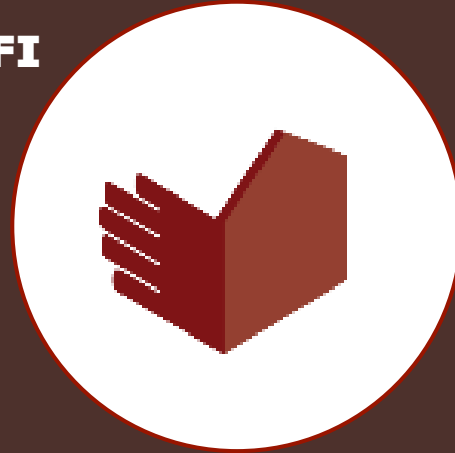
