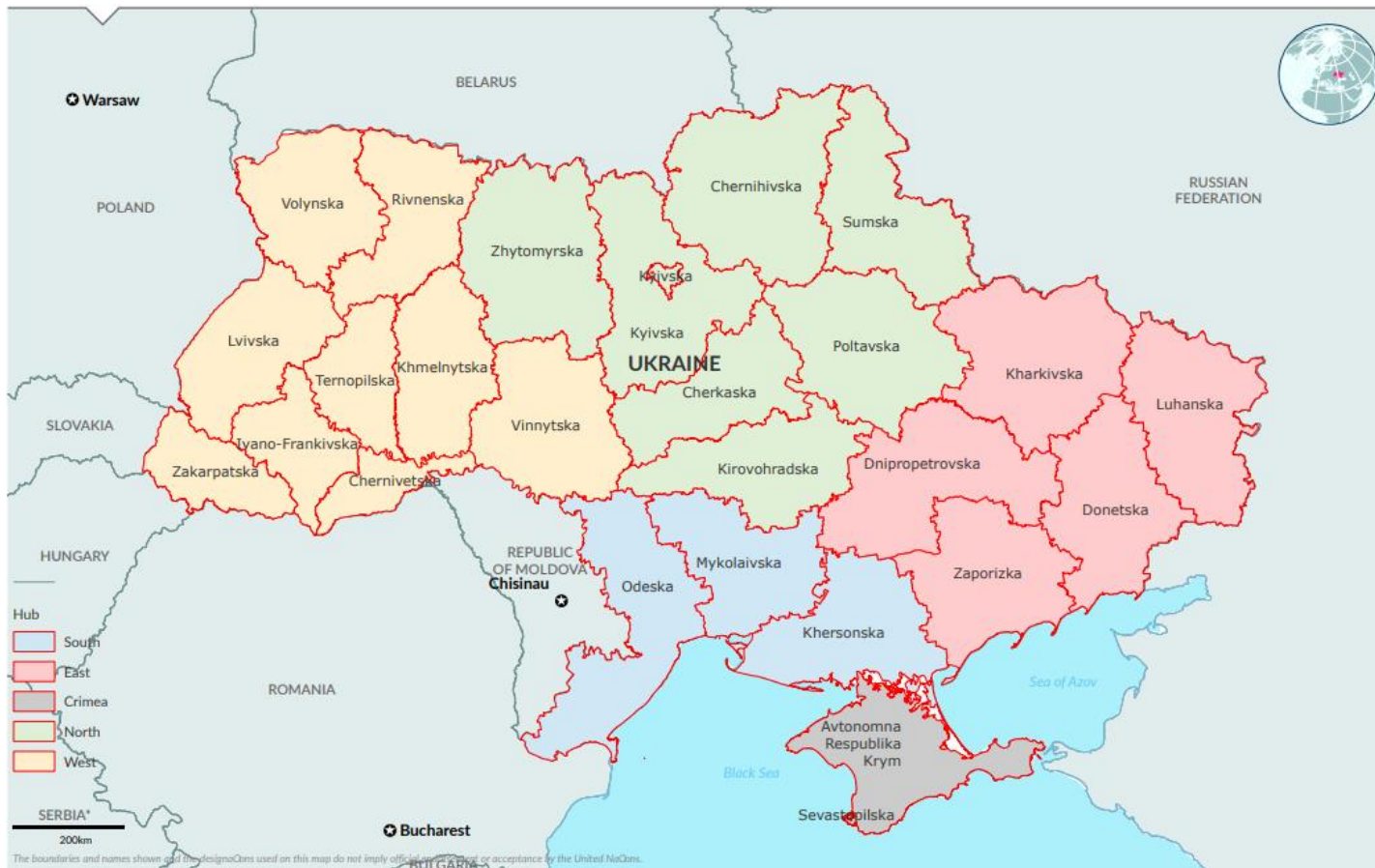

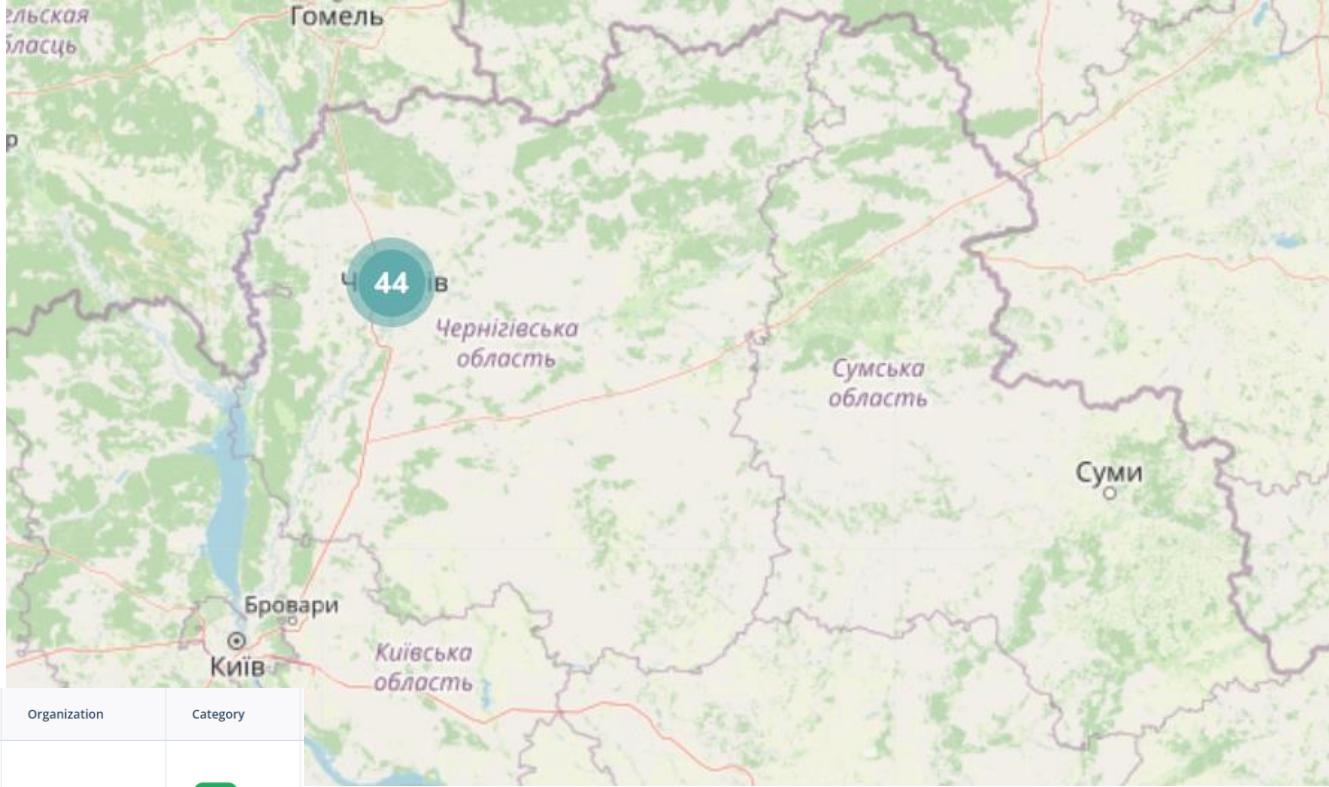



### FEATURED DOCUMENTS



Intense hostilities and fighting since the start of Russia's invasion on 24 February 2022 have left at least 17.7 million people in need of humanitarian assistance and protection

Massive destruction of civilian infrastructure has left hundreds of thousands of Ukrainians without their homes or livelihoods.

Too many are now living in damaged homes or in buildings ill-suited to provide protection for the upcoming harsh cold season, where the sub-zero temperatures could be life-threatening.

Between May and July alone, more than 5.5 million people who had been internally displaced across Ukraine returned to their homes, mainly in Kyiv, eastern and northern parts of the country. Displacement dynamics are, however, fluid, and nearly 60 per cent of those who returned home do not feel safe. The United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR) estimates that over 6.3 million Ukrainian refugees are living in different European countries as of 3 August 2022.4

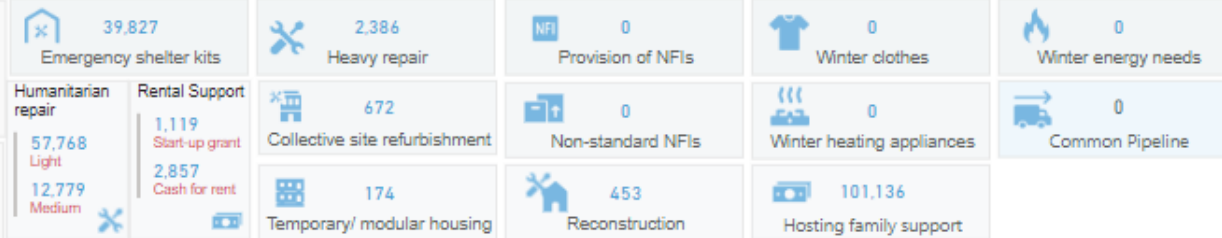

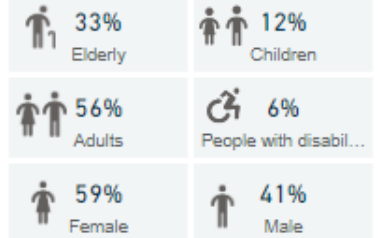

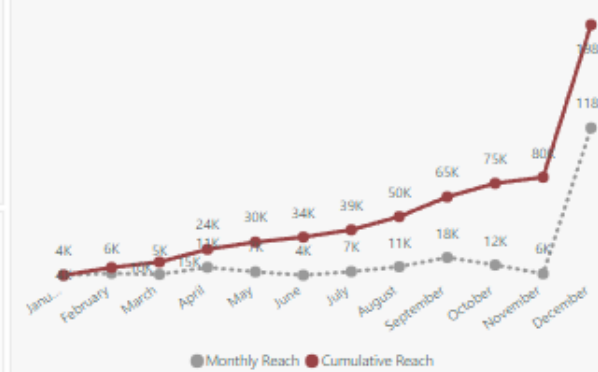

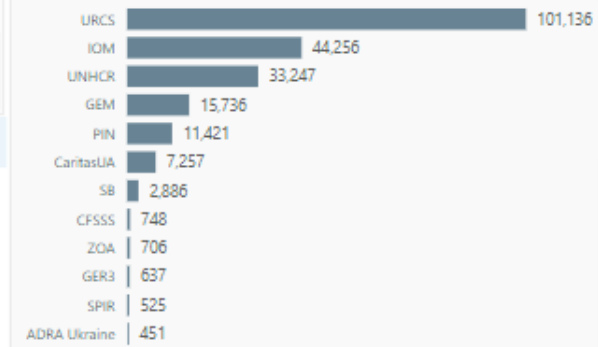
#### Individuals Reached by Month



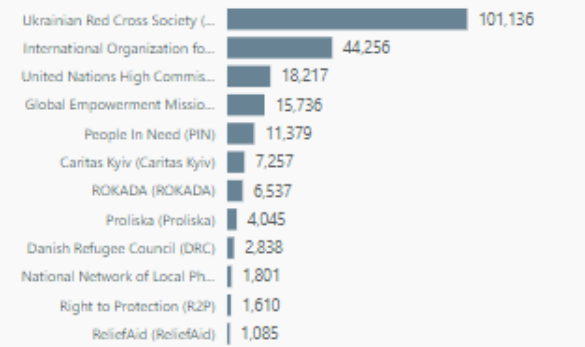
#### Individuals Reached by Activity versus Target

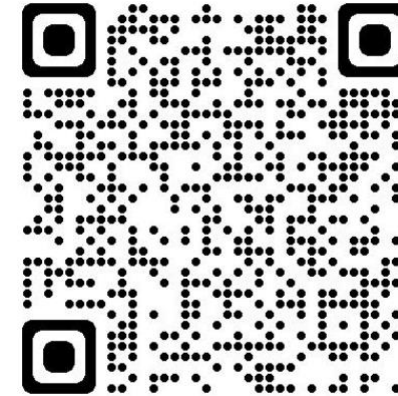

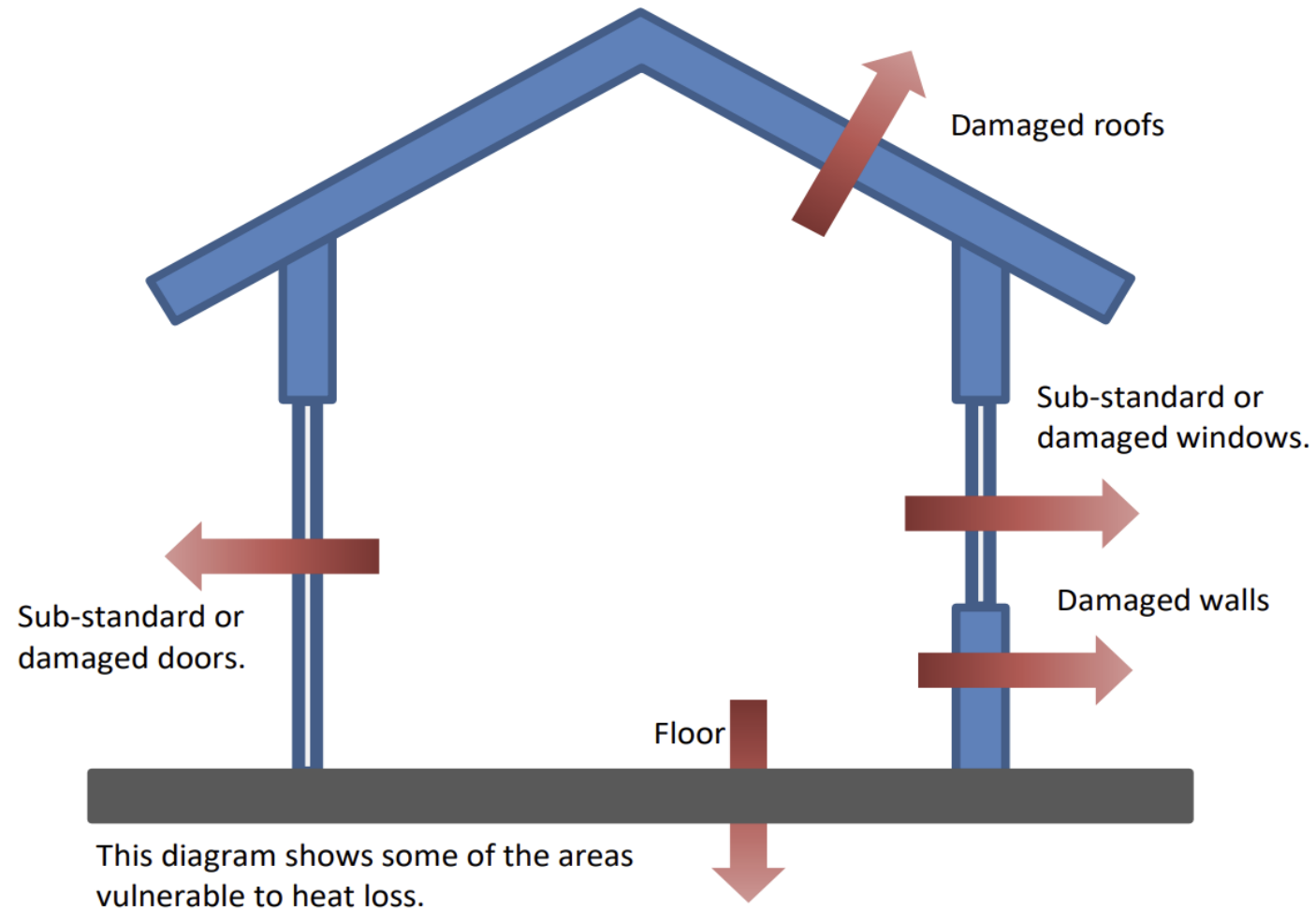

# Provision of emergency construction materials

## The list of emergency construction materials includes:

- reinforced plastic tarpaulins;
- transparent plastic sheet;
- віконні листи з полікарбонату;
- timber battens;
- Oriented Strand Boards OSB;
- mounting foam,
- nails, and/or screws.

## The list of materials is not exhaustive.

They can be used to help owners of private and multi-apartment buildings, as well as for the repair of social infrastructure.

# Light & Medium Repairs

We advise you to follow these guidelines:

- Cash Based Interventions Implementation Guidelines for Light & Medium Repairs of Houses & Apartments [\[ENG\]](#)

Light or Medium repairs of houses with **minor** damage are minimal interventions aimed at closing the thermal envelope and providing living space.

The basic cost of <b>light</b> repairs:	1500 – 2500 USD per private house 500 – 1000 USD per apartment
The basic cost of <b>Medium</b> repairs:	2500 – 4000 USD per private house 1000 – 2000 USD per apartment

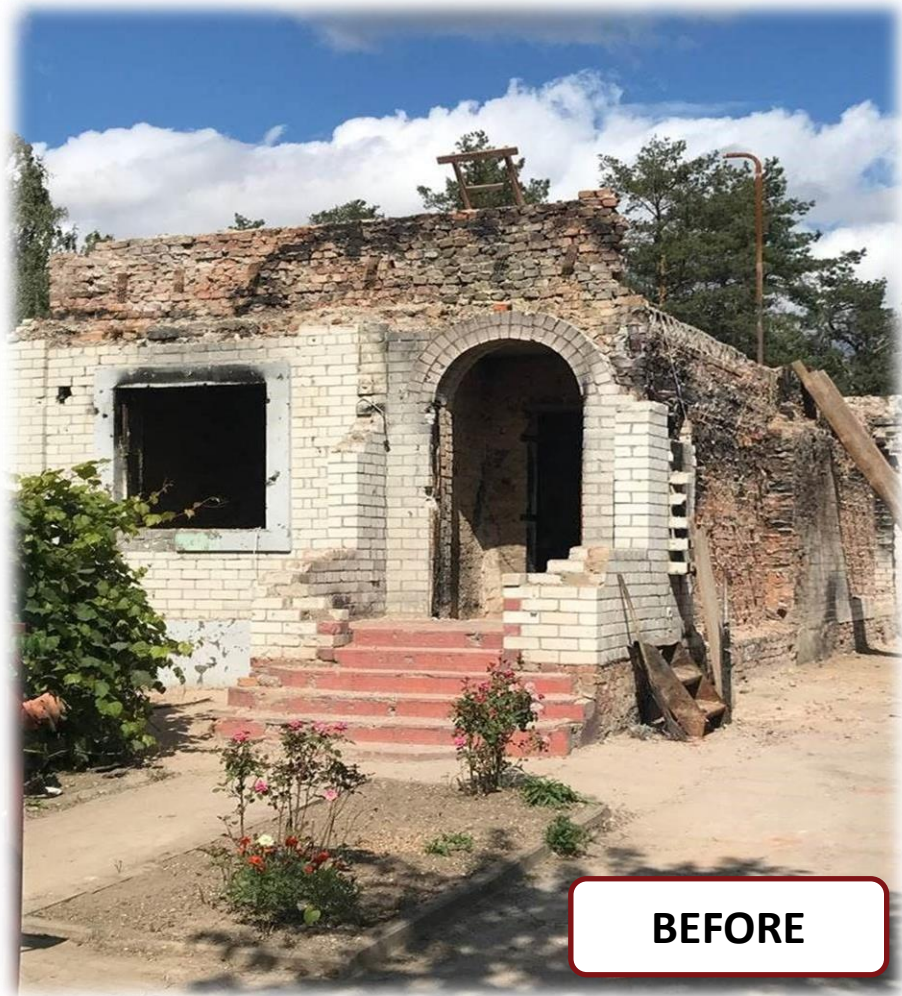
# Heavy repairs in private houses

We advise you to follow the Cluster's guidelines for Structural repairs and reconstruction [\[ENG\]](#)

Structural damage is any damage that affects the integrity of a building. This includes damage to the main components that ensure the stability and safety of the building, such as the foundation, beams, load-bearing walls and other important elements. Structural damage can jeopardise the **stability** and safety of a building, making it unsafe to live in.

Basic cost of repairs: 5 000 - 15 000 USD per household

# Humanitarian Repair of Common Spaces. Multistorey buildings

The works include repairs to entrances, corridors, roofs, heating, water and electricity systems, stairs and elevators.

Residents of the apartments cannot claim compensation for the restoration from the state if the common areas are not repaired ([Resolution № 381](#)).

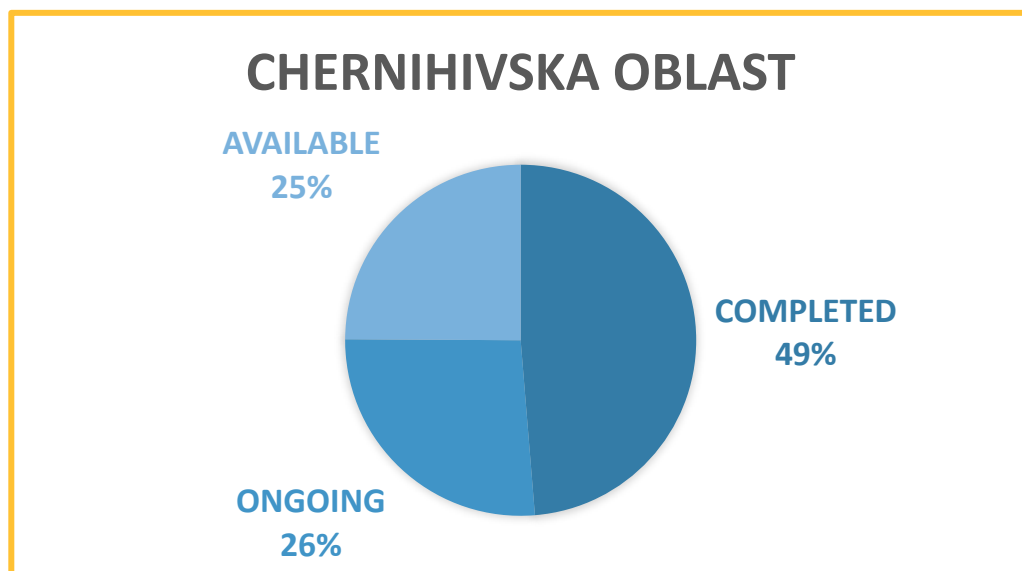

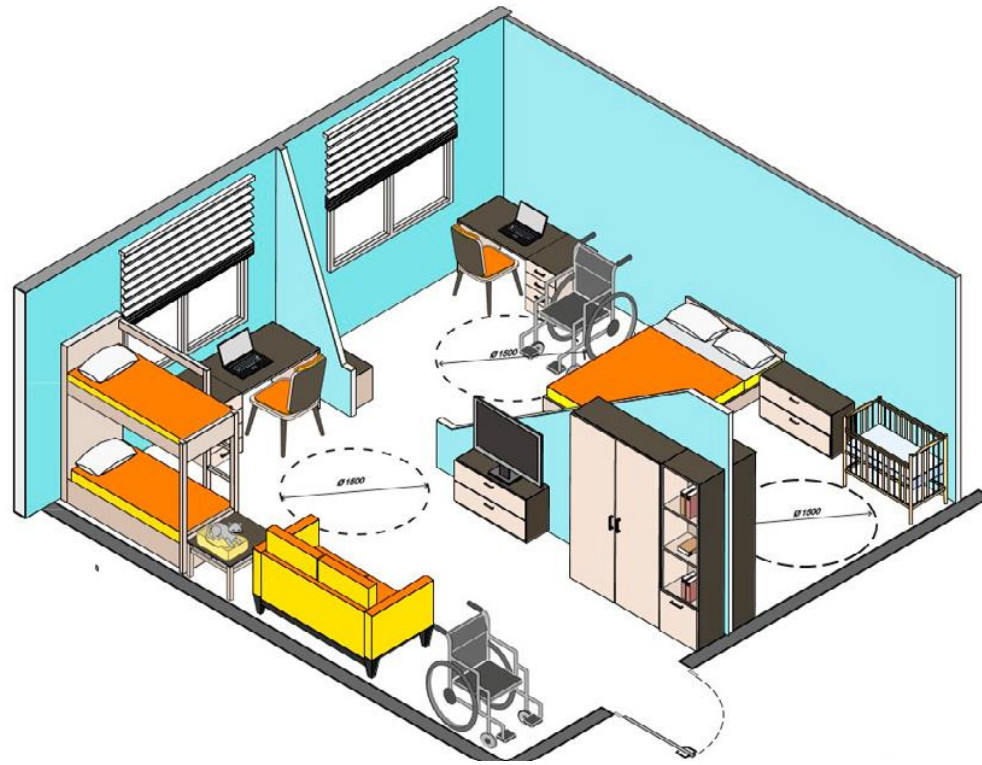
# Some provisions of Resolution №930

- ❑ The building must be equipped with functioning engineering systems..
- ❑ The temperature in the premises is maintained according to the season, but within the range of 18-25°C.
- ❑ The CSs is equipped with means of unimpeded access for persons with disabilities and other groups with limited mobility to the premises, common areas and bomb shelters.
- ❑ Residents of the CSs should be provided with items for the arrangement of sleeping spaces. In particular, a bed, furniture for storing personal belongings, bedding (mattress, pillows, blankets, bed linen), etc.

# Humanitarian Repair of social facilities

We consider social facilities that do not belong to the Education Cluster and the Health Cluster, but which ensure the effective functioning of the population.

The recommended works are the minimum necessary to maintain the functionality of the building and close the thermal envelope (windows, roof, doors). The scope of work should include common areas.

Ensure accessibility for people with disabilities.

Basic cost of repair: 10,000 - 250,000 USD per social facility

# Q&A

▪ **ACTED:** If the 200m<sup>2</sup> of roof in a private house is damaged (roof is cut, battens are damaged; structural elements are not damaged) and the estimated cost of repair is more than 5000 USD, should this be considered a Medium or a Heavy repair?

▪ **Shelter Cluster:**

*According to Light and Medium repair SOPs (Article 4, sub-section "Response Activities"):*

*a) the maximum recommended cost of an average repair is 4,000 USD, which is just indicative and should be intended as a **likely average cost**, rather than as a "ceiling".*

*b) The classification of repairs should always be based on the **type of damage and the type of work performed**, not on the final cost (Article 4, sub-section "Response Activities").*

*Therefore, in this case, the type of repairs is Medium, with a deviation from the Cluster's SOPs. It is acceptable if the **average programme cost of work** on houses remains within the Cluster's SOPs.*

# Q&A

- **Rokada:** *If the repair works in the house have been carried out (the thermal envelope has been closed), but the living conditions inside are uninhabitable (damaged water and electricity networks), which humanitarian response should be provided.*

- **Shelter Cluster:**

*According to [Light and Medium repair SOPs](#) the repairs should ensure the necessary minimum conditions for people to live in the house (p. 4, sub-section "Response Activities").*

*Depending on the nature of the damage to internal networks, they may require light, medium or heavy repairs and are the activity of the Shelter Cluster (p. 3, sub-section "Categorisation of damage").*

*Therefore, it is not recommended for an organization to work with a household if it is unable to complete the full scope of humanitarian work..*

# Q&A

- **ACTED:** *What is the Cluster's standpoint to the donor's requirement to install single-glazed windows?*

- **Shelter Cluster:**

*According to Cluster guidelines single-glazed windows can be used as part of humanitarian assistance (p. 28, sub-section «Opening, doors & windows»).*

*In accordance with the State Construction Norms of Ukraine B.2.6-31:2021 "Thermal insulation and energy efficiency of buildings", the norms on minimum requirements for energy efficiency of buildings **do not apply** to construction works on the rehabilitation of individual building structures in order to eliminate the consequences of emergencies (clause 1.4, section "Scope"). In this case, these are the requirements for the coefficient of resistance to heat transfer of translucent building envelopes.*

*The Cluster's standpoint is as follows: when choosing a technical solution within the framework of humanitarian assistance, be guided by the minimum guidelines of the Cluster and applicable state standards.*
