## — Impact of the USG Funding Pause

Activities	Cluster Coordination and Geographical Impact
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>5 Shelter partners impacted due to the USG funding pause.</b></li><li>• <b>Total impacted fund is around \$15M.</b></li><li>• <b>Around 220K beneficiaries will be impacted.</b></li><li>• <b>The impact will be in several governorates including Taizz, Marib, and Al Hudaydah, Saada, Hajjah, Lahj and Aden.</b></li><li>• <b>It will mainly impact life saving activities like:</b><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Distribution of Non-Food Items (NFIs) including energy kits</li><li>○ Emergency Shelter Distribution</li></ul></li><li>• <b>Mitigation Strategies:</b><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Advocacy</li><li>○ Seeking alternative funding</li><li>○ Scaling down operations</li><li>○ Technical guidance on ethical/temporary closure</li></ul></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- One Sub-National cluster coordinator might be impacted. Currently, the hiring partner is looking for alternatives to keep his shelter staff including the Sub-National coordinator.</li><li>- 13 governorates and 104 districts are expected to be impacted by this funding issue.</li></ul>



## — Updates on the YHF 2025 1st SA

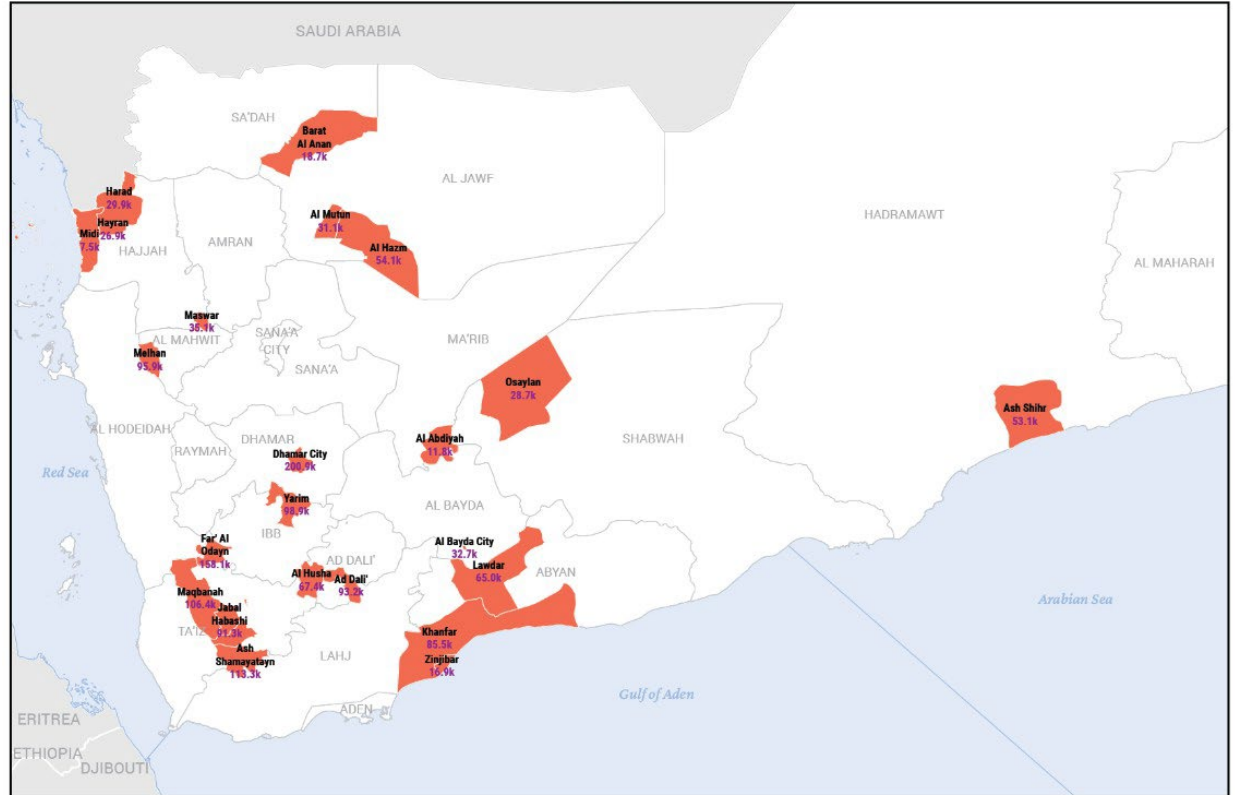
- \$20 million allocation to support the delivery of prioritized life-saving humanitarian assistance
- Total funding for Shelter Cluster is 2.2m representing 11% of the total allocation fund.
- The allocation will focus on 25 districts, out of the 123 districts classified under severity 4 and 5 according to the HNRP inter-cluster analysis.
- Market Place Projects – Allocation Top-Up Approach
- Submission of projects proposals started in 12<sup>th</sup> of March and the deadline is 2<sup>nd</sup> of April.

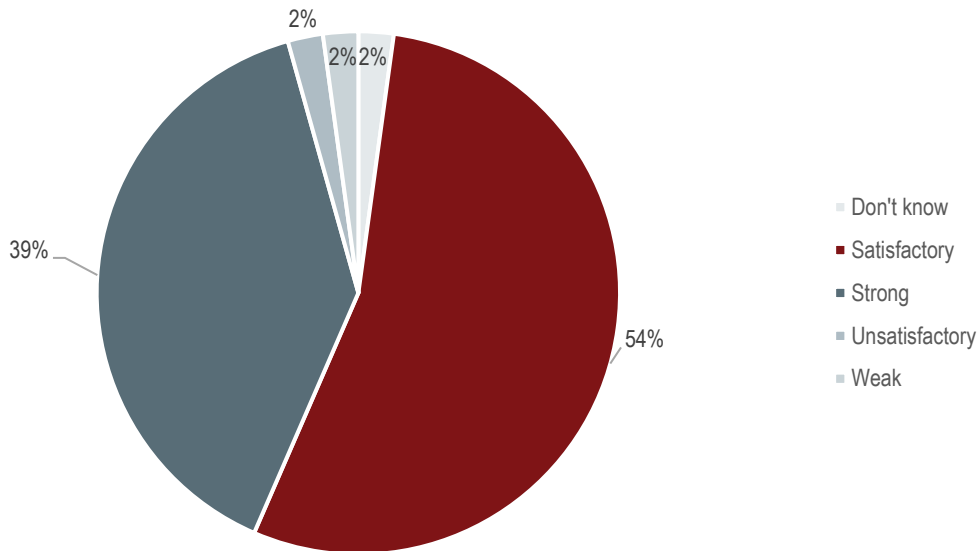





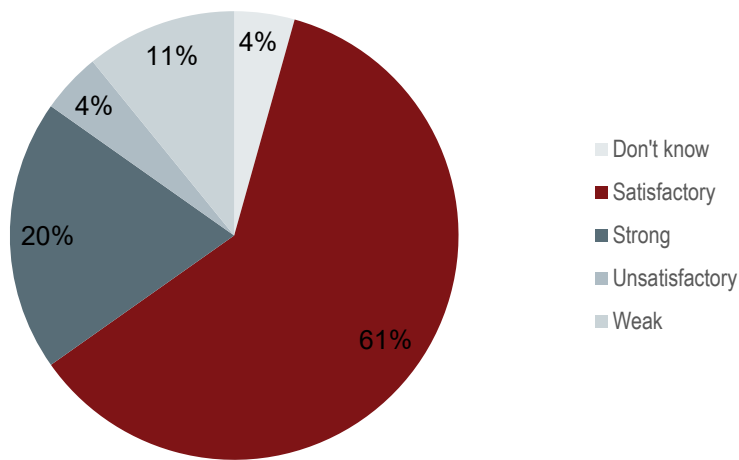



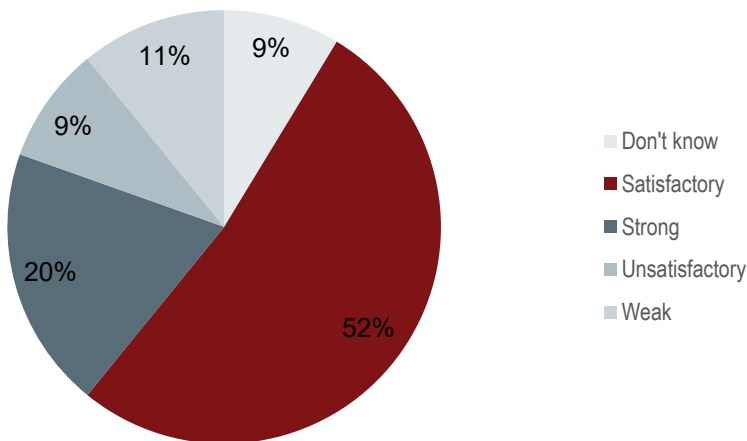

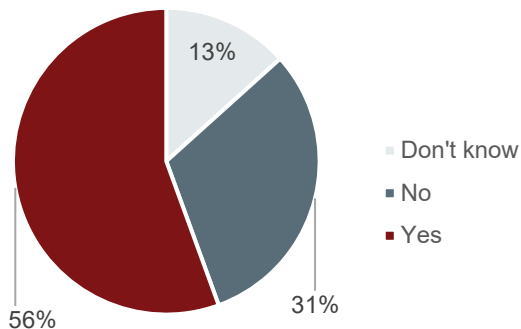

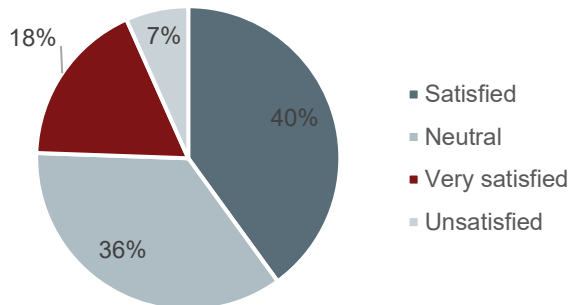

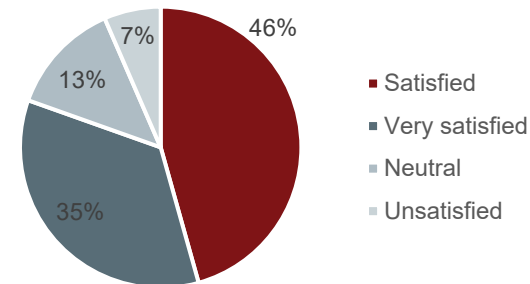
Do you know the current composition of the SAG in your cluster?



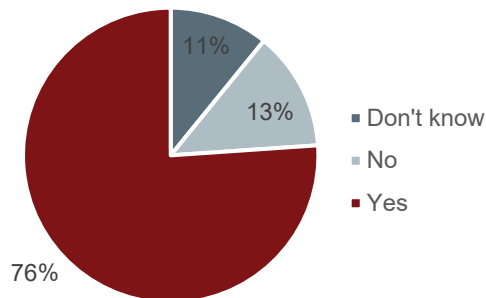
How satisfied are you with the level of representativeness of the SAG?



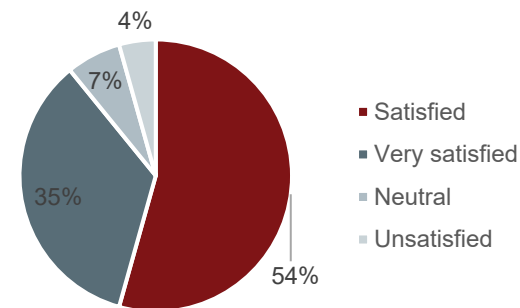
How satisfied are you with the current active TWIGs of the Shelter Cluster?
